## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-6) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (8-10-1)

THURSDAY, MARCH 16, 2017 – GOODYEAR BALLPARK – 1:05 P.M. MST

A'S WEBCAST

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning six in a row...are 8-3 over the last 11 games and 10-6 (.625) overall...have the best record in the Cactus League and fourth best in the majors...have scored 65 runs over the last seven CL games (9.3 per game) after tallying 37 runs over the first nine contests (4.1 per game)...however, have allowed 66 runs in the last nine games (64 er in 80.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) after yielding 24 over the first seven contests (3.25 ERA)...have committed 13 errors, which is second fewest in the CL (Arizona, 11)...are 6-3 at Hohokam and 4-3 on the road...this is the A's 49th Spring Training in Arizona, their third since returning to Mesa in 2015 after a 36-year absence...after training in Bradenton, Florida in 1968, the A's came west to Arizona in 1969 and trained in Mesa from 1969-78...moved to Scottsdale in 1979 and then spent 33 seasons at Phoenix Municipal Stadium from 1982-2014...are scheduled to play 34 games this spring plus an exhibition game against Italy's World Baseball Classic club...the total includes 31 games in Arizona and three in the Bay Area against the Giants (March 30-April 1)...the A's went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League... it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999).

**YESTERDAY:** The A's had the day off...on Tuesday, Oakland dropped a 4-3 decision to Colorado at Mesa...Sean Manaea started for the A's and shutout the Rockies on seven hits in 3.2 innings...however, Oakland was blanked on one hit over the first four innings...the A's scored all of their runs in the fifth inning on RBI singles by Josh Phegley and Jed Lowrie and a sacrifice fly by Matt Joyce...Simon Castro (0.1 ip), Ryan Madson (1.0 ip), Sean Doolittle (1.0 ip) and John Axford (1.0 ip) followed Manaea with scoreless relief and the A's took a 3-0 lead into the ninth inning...Daniel Coulombe, who retired the side in order in the eighth, allowed a two-run home run in the ninth and was relieved by Kyle Finnegan with runners on first and second and one out...Finnegan allowed both runs to score, handing Coulombe the loss.

**A's vs. INDIANS:** This is the third and final meeting between the A's and Indians this spring...the first two games were played in Mesa, with the A's winning 5-4 on February 28 and losing 15-5 on March 4...the A's lost both games last year, dropping a 10-8 decision at Goodyear on March 18 and a 6-4 game in Mesa on March 28.

PLAYER NOTES: Yonder Alonso is tied for fourth in the Cactus League in walks (7)...has reached base safely in each of his last seven games (7-for-13, four walks) after going 1-for-6 (.167) with three walks over his first four contests... Franklin Barreto is 4-for-6 (.667) over his last four games and 10-for-21 (.476) in 14 games overall...has appeared in nine games at shortstop and six at second base...*Mark Canha* has appeared in four games in right field, three in left field and one in center field ... Matt Chapman (NR) is 4-for-9 (.444) with four walks, four runs scored and five RBI over his last seven games... Khris Davis had his first two-hit game last Saturday against Texas and is 3-for-8 (.375) with two doubles over his last three games after going 2-for-15 (.133) over his first six contests... Ryon *Healy* has driven in at least one run in six of his nine games and is tied for fourth in the CL in RBI (10)...is 6-for-17 (.353) over his last six games after going 1-for-8 (.125) over his first three contests...went 3-for-3 with a double, home run and three RBI last Saturday against Texas...has appeared in four games at designated hitter, three at first base and two at third base... Matt Joyce has reached base safely in eight of his nine games and is tied for the CL lead in walks (8)...Jed Lowrie has driven in a run in each of his last three games (3 RBI total)...went 3-for-4 a week ago today against Cincinnati...*Matt Olson* has four hits this spring, all for extra bases (one double, one triple, two home runs)... Chris Parmelee (NR) is 4-for-5 (.800) over his last four games after starting the spring 1-for-14 (.071)...Josh Phegley is 3-for-9 (.333) over his last four games after going 0-for-5 over his first three contests... Trevor Plouffe went 0-for-3 Monday at Cincinnati to snap his six-game hitting streak (8-for-14, .571)... Adam Rosales has appeared in six games at shortstop and two at second base...*Marcus Semien* is 6-for-13 (.462) over his last five games after going 3-for-15 (.200) over his first five contests...is tied for eighth in the CL in RBI (9).

**IN CAMP:** The A's have 48 players in camp...the total includes 35 players on the 40-man roster, which is full, and 13 non-roster invitees...the breakdown includes 22 pitchers, six catchers, 12 infielders and eight outfield-

ers...began the spring with 70 players in camp, which were the A's most players in camp since 1982 when they had 78 (35 roster, 43 non-roster).

**WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC:** Non-roster invitee Cesar Valdez made his first appearance of the WBC last Sunday for the Dominican Republic in a 10-3 win over Colombia (1.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...the Dominican Republic has advanced to Pool F play at San Diego and plays against Venezuela tonight at 7:00 MST...non-roster invitee Ryan Lavarnway started all six games for Israel in the World Baseball Classic and hit .444 (8-for-18) with five walks, two doubles, one home run and six RBI...he is tied for seventh in the WBC in hits and RBI...he earned Pool A MVP honors after going 5-for-9 (.556) with four walks, a home run and three RBI in three games in Seoul...minor leaguer Joey Wagman also pitched for Israel and made one appearance against the Kingdom of the Netherlands (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...minor leaguer Jake Sanchez pitched twice for Mexico (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 1 so).

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doo-little for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

MEDIA INFORMATION: The A's clubhouse at Hohokam Stadium will be open to members of the media with proper credentials beginning approxi-mately one hour prior to team stretch...stretch time varies from day to day; media are asked to check @AsMediaAlerts on Twitter daily for updated clubhouse hours...the clubhouse may close for team meetings, etc. at certain times...please do not lounge or conduct interviews in the weight room/ exercise area...once games begin, the clubhouse also will open to media during games for access to players who have completed their work for the day...A's manager Bob Melvin will be available to the media in the first base dugout during team stretch time...Melvin will also be available on the field immediately following the game ... media are permitted in the dugout area and foul territory behind home plate extending down to (but not past) first and third base until the batting cage is removed from the field of play, at which point media will be asked to leave the field...the A's dugout will remain accessible to the media until 45 minutes before game time...TV camera crews and still photographers with proper credentials must stay in assigned areas at all times...no roving is permitted...TV camera crews are not allowed in the clubhouse pregame, or in the training room or weight room at any time ... still photographers are not allowed in the clubhouse, training room or weight room at any time...lunch is available for \$8 to media members with proper credentials in the landing area at the top of Section 209...the A's provide complementary parking to members of the media in the Center Street Lot (Lot D), located behind home plate and to the right as your enter the parking lot at the home plate entrance.

A's MEDIA ALERTS: The A's Media Relations Department will provide frequent updates through its media-only Twitter account...for clubhouse hours, interview times and other media alerts, please follow @AsMediaAlerts...player transactions and other relevant game information will continue to be posted at @Athletics.

A's ON THE AIR: The A's radio network and flagship station 95.7 FM The Game has seven remaining broadcasts this spring, including three games against San Francisco in the Bay Area...the schedule includes all remaining Saturday and Sunday games, plus the March 30 and 31 games at San Francisco (31st on 102.9 FM KBLX)...Ken Korach returns for his 22nd year in the broadcast booth and will be joined by Vince Cotroneo (12th) and Ray Fosse, who enters his 32nd season in the booth...Comcast SportsNet California has one remaining broadcast on April 1 against the Giants in Oakland (12:05 pm)...Glen Kuiper joins Fosse in the broadcast booth for that telecast...all games not broadcast over the air can be heard live via the club's web site...in addition, five remaining games will be televised by MLB Network...two of those will air in the Bay Area, including: Mar. 21 at Seattle (10:00 PM PDT) and Mar. 24 vs. Chicago-AL (Mar. 25 at 6:00 AM PDT).

# STARTING PITCHER #60 ANDREW TRIGGS RHP (0-0, 1.23 ERA)

Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and second start of the spring...pitched in relief in his first two outings (4.0 ip, 1 uer) before making his first start in his last outing Saturday against Texas...was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring last year and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...had three oneday stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...his opponents batting average included a .235 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 against left-handers...went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Nashville, all in relief...did not surrender a home run in 18.2 innings...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 against left-handed hitters compared to .271 against right-handers.

#### #48 ROSS DETWILER LHP (1-0, 5.40 ERA)

The non-roster invitee surrendered his first runs of the spring in his last outing on Sunday against Chicago-NL (1.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so) after tossing 4.0 scoreless innings over his first four outings...was on the Cleveland Indians Opening Day roster in 2016 but finished the season with the A's...in between, he combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, with Triple-A Columbus and Triple-A Nashville...had no decisions and a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances with Cleveland and was 2-4 with a 6.14 ERA in nine games (seven starts) with Oakland... combined for a 6.10 ERA in 16 big league games overall...struck out 26 batters in 48.2 innings for a career-low average of 4.81 strikeouts per nine innings...was 2-3 with a 4.70 ERA and .283 opponents batting average in his seven starting assignments, 0-1 with an 11.32 ERA and .340 opponents average in nine relief appearances...allowed 1-of-4 (25.0%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 2-for-8 (.250) with a walk...opponents hit .296, including .237 by left-handed hitters and .311 by right-handers

#### #31 LIAM HENDRIKS RHP (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

Has not allowed a run in his two Cactus League appearances (2.0 ip), including his last outing Sunday against Chicago-NL (1.0 ip, 2 h)...also faced Italy in an exhibition game March 8 and retired the side in order (1.0 ip, 1 so)...compiled a 3.76 ERA and .270 opponents batting average in 53 relief appearances in his first season with the A's last year...had an 8.27 ERA and .394 opponents batting average in 11 games before going on the disabled list in early May with a strained right triceps...logged a 2.23 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in 42 games following his return from the DL...struck out 71 batters in 64.2 innings for the second consecutive season and matched his career high in strikeouts...has an average of 9.88 strikeouts per nine innings over his last two seasons after posting a mark of 5.87 over his first four seasons...walked just 14 (1.95 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.07...posted a 0-4 record after going 5-0 in 2015...allowed just 5-of-34 (14.7%) inherited runners to score, which was the fourth lowest mark in the AL...first batters faced hit .231 with one walk (.245 on-base percentage)...his opponents batting average included a .228 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .297 against righthanders.

#### #58 CHRIS SMITH RHP (0-1, 3.86 ERA)

The non-roster invitee has allowed one run in three of his four appearances, including his last outing Saturday against Texas (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er)...opponents are 5-for-26 (.192) with no walks...began the 2016 season in the starting rotation at Triple-A Nashville but finished it in the bullpen with Oakland...was 6-8 with a 3.93 ERA in 22 starts with the Sounds when he was selected by the A's Aug. 7...had no decisions and a 2.92 ERA in 13 relief appearances with Oakland...it was his first Major League action since 2010 with Milwaukee...held the opposition to a .165 batting average but allowed almost as many walks (13) than hits (14) for a .270 on-base percentage...struck out 29 batters in 24.2 innings (10.58 per nine innings)... allowed a .151 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .188 against left-handers...yielded a .176 average with runners in scoring position, .103 with two outs and .058 with two strikes...first batters faced were 0-for-8 but he walked four and surrendered a sacrifice fly for a .308 on-base percentage ... while at Nashville, he ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in opponents batting average (.239), sixth in strikeouts (121) and ninth in ERA.
