OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-2) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (2-1)

THURSDAY, APRIL 6, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of their last two games after winning the opener...this marks the sixth time in the last seven years the A's have started the season 1-2...are 1-2 on this season-opening four-game home-stand against Los Angeles...leave following the game today for the first road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Texas (three games) and Kansas City (three games)...this is the A's 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4044-3763 (.518) record over the previous 49 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 117th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8759-9235 (.487) in their previous 116 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the first three games of the season for the first time since 2004...last went four games without an error to start the season in 2003...are one of four American League teams with no errors...are tied for the AL lead with six double plays...turned just 23 double plays during the spring, which was the fewest in the Cactus League and tied for third fewest in the majors.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's will play 23 of their first 26 games (the month of April) against American League West competition...the exception is a three-game series at Kansas City next week...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed John Axford on the disabled list yesterday and now have six players on the DL...began the season with five players on the DL for the second consecutive season (Bassitt, Gray, Mengden, Smolinski, Wendle)...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players...it marked the first time the A's have opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...13 players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Alonso, Axford, Canha, K. Davis, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Hendriks, Lowrie, Madson, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...six other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Alcantara, Cotton, Coulombe, Healy, Manaea, Triggs) and one was in the A's farm system (Montas)...five were signed as free agents (Casilla, R. Davis, Joyce, Plouffe, Rosales), which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for Oakland prior to 2014 without playing for another team (Doolittle since 2012, Vogt since 2013)...four other players played for Oakland prior to 2014 but have played for other teams in between: Santiago Casilla (2004-09), Rajai Davis (2008-10), Adam Rosales (2010-13) and Jed Lowrie (2013-14, 16)...Sean Doolittle has the longest uninterrupted tenure with the A's organization as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...he is followed by Raul Alcantara, who was acquired from Boston on December 28, 2011, and Ryan Dull, who was drafted in 2012.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had three rookies on the Opening Day roster (Alcantara, Cotton, Montas)...had one last year and five in 2015...seven players had six or more years of service: Madson (11 years, 155

days), R. Davis (9 years, 167 days), Casilla (9 years, 148 days), Lowrie (8 years, 111 days), Joyce (7 years, 123 days), Axford (6 years, 170 days) and Rosales (6 years, 163 days)...those are the most players with six or more years of service on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.24 years...that is Oakland's second oldest Opening Day roster over the last 13 years (29.28 last year)...Frankie Montas is the youngest player at the age of 24 years, 13 days...he is followed by Raul Alcantara (24 years, 120 days), Sean Manaea (25 years, 61 days), Jharel Cotton (25 years, 74 days) and Ryon Healy (25 years, 83 days)...there were 10 players that are at least 30 years old...Santiago Casilla is the oldest at 36 years, 252 days and two other players are also 36: Ryan Madson (36 years, 218 days) and Rajai Davis (36 years, 166 days).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's finished the spring with a six-game losing streak and went 16-18 (.471) overall, which was the fourth worst record in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, which was fifth worst in the CL...this marks the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...the A's compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...surrendered 37 home runs, which tied for fifth fewest in the CL...had the second fewest strikeouts (247) and tied for the fifth fewest walks (121)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in walks (133), tied for fourth in triples (11) and fifth in on-base percentage (.351)...also tied for the fewest stolen bases (15), ranked third in fewest hit by pitches (10) and fourth in most strikeouts (300)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...the defense committed 28 errors, which was fourth fewest in the CL...however, turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors...went 9-7 at Hohokam, 0-1 in Oakland and 7-10 on the road.

RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its seventh season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or the Sharks, the following games will air in the Bay Area on different stations: Saturday at Texas (KBLX 102.9 FM) and next Wednesday, April 12 at Kansas City (KFOX 98.5 FM)...additional updates will be announced once the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules are determined.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have lost two of the first three games of the season series...lost the season series last year after going 7-12 against the Angels...were 3-6 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 25-35 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 422-356 against the Angels...that includes 219-169 in Oakland and 203-187 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 471-433 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis became the second player in Oakland history with two Opening Day home runs Monday night (Jason Giambi, 2000)...last year, he hit six home runs against Los Angeles, matching the most by an Athletic against the Angels over the last 47 years...**Rajai Davis** is on his 10th consecutive Opening Day roster...has 199 career doubles and needs one more for 200 career...**Jed Lowrie** is 5-for-12 (.417) over the first three games and is now a .312 (167-for-535) career hitter in April, which is his best mark for any month.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1982** an Opening Day crowd of 48,348 watches the A's defeat the California Angels 3-2 in 11 innings...the A's score the winning run when Davey Lopes walks with the bases loaded to force in Dwayne Murphy with the go-ahead run...in **2015** Sonny Gray tosses eight shutout innings of one-hit ball and combines with Evan Scribner on a one-hit, 8-0 shut-out of the Texas Rangers to snap the A's Major League record 10-game Opening Day losing streak.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (1-1, 4.31 ERA in 2016)

FOR STARTERS: Begins his second Major League season and is on his first Opening Day roster...is scheduled to make his first start of the season and the seventh of his career.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-3 with an 8.10 ERA in seven games, including five starts...allowed a .299 (29-for-97) opponents batting average but issued just five walks in a team-leading 23.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings)...allowed five home runs...started in each of his final five outings (21 er in 19.1 ip, 9.78 ERA) after pitching in relief in his first two appearances (0 er in 4.0 ip).

TRIGGS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-0 with a 1.69 ERA (5.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, both last year...the start came in a no decision in Oakland on June 18 in a 7-1 loss...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Trout in the fourth...was relieved by Dull after tossing 3.0 innings and 50 pitches...also pitched in relief on Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (2.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 1 so).

2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...the stints were April 25-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-Aug. 1) and Aug. 5 through the end of the season...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers...issued 9 of his 13 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .144 batting average with two strikes...the three hitter in the order batted .429 but he allowed a .160 batting average against the clean-up hitter.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in his six starts, 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents average in 18 relief appearances...walked just one batter in 25.2 innings as a starter...first batters faced hit .176 with no extra base hits and one walk (.222 on-base percentage)...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

HOME AND AWAY: Had an 0-1 record and a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road...surrendered four of his five home runs on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Logged a 0.93 ERA and .183 opponents batting average over innings one through three compared to a 6.08 ERA and .289 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...pitched fewer than five innings in three of his six starts and his longest start was six innings...the A's were 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in all but two appearances.

MORE 2016: Was recalled from Nashville April 25 and made his ML debut that day at Detroit...retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so) and struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...did not pitch during his second stint, which lasted one day (April 29)...pitched just once during his third stint when he was the 26th man for the May 7 doubleheader at Baltimore...struck out the side in the ninth inning of the night game...was recalled a fourth time May 10 and allowed at least one run in seven of his eight appearances for a 9.00 ERA and .338 opponents batting average...including June 3 at Houston when he had career highs in hits (7) and runs (5)...was optioned to Nashville June 4...returned for stint number five June 18 and made his first big league start that day against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a run on three hits in 3.0 innings and had a no decision in a 7-1 A's loss...was sent back to Nashville the following day...did not allow a run in two games during stint number six from June 30 to July 1 (3.2 ip)...stint number seven began July 4 and he allowed at least one run in each of his three appearances before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL) and was optioned Aug. 4...was brought back the next day when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and went 1-1 with a 2.92 ERA and .191 opponents average in seven games (five starts) during his final stint...allowed just one home run and walked two batters in 24.2 innings before a lumbar strain ended his season in early September...pitched in relief in each of the first two outings of his eighth stint but his final five appearances of the season were starts...was charged with his first career loss Aug. 11 against Baltimore when he allowed three runs on five hits in 4.0 innings...tossed a career-high 89 pitches in a career-high 6.0 scoreless innings Aug. 22 against Cleveland but had a no decision in a 1-0 loss...was credited with the first win of his career in the A's 7-4 win at St. Louis Aug. 28...struck out a career-high eight batters in a career-high tying 6.0 innings...left his final start on Sept. 2 against Boston after one inning and did not pitch again due to a lumbar strain.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Triple-A Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not surrender a home run...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...had a .125 batting average and .222 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .273 with runners in scoring position...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip) and five appearances during the day (5.2 ip)...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times...including each of his first three games (3.0 ip) when he picked up his only two wins of the season (April 8 against Oklahoma City and April 13 against Colorado Springs)...surrendered a season-high four runs on a season-high four hits in a season-low 0.1 innings for his only loss April 14 against Colorado Springs...his most pitches in a game came on April 20 at Colorado Springs (40)...had a 5.14 ERA in six games before his first promotion to Oakland on April 25...compiled a 1.59 ERA in 10 games after that...recorded his first save of the season May 1 at Round Rock with a scoreless ninth inning...matched his season-high with three strikeouts in the second game of a double header on June 9 at Oklahoma City (also April 11 against Colorado Springs)...was credited with his second save June 12 at Oklahoma City.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Raul Alcantara (1-3, 7.25 ERA in 2016): Begins his second Major League season and is on his first Opening Day roster...is scheduled to make his first start of the season and the sixth of his career...it is his third career start against Texas...is 1-1 with a 4.63 ERA (11.2 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 3 hr) in two career starts against the Rangers, both last year...was 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in seven games during the spring, including three starts...yielded a .247 (22-for-89) opponents batting average...made both his Triple-A and Major League debuts in 2016...started the season at Double-A Midland, where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Triple-A Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts when he was promoted to Oakland Sept. 5...went 1-3 with a 7.25 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's, all against American League West competition.

- The A's bullpen compiled a 3.99 ERA last year, which ranked 10th in the American League...were fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.308) and seventh in batting average (.245) and slugging percentage (.385).
- Has converted 1-of-2 save chances this season...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves...last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
- Allowed 27.6% of inherited runners to score, which was the fourth lowest percentage in the AL and seventh lowest by an A's team since 1974...ranked third in the AL in inherited runners (243).

- Begins his 14th Major League season and is in his second stint with the A's...pitched in 152 games for Oakland from 2004-09 and 414 for San Francisco from 2010-16.
- Is on his ninth Opening Day roster (2008-09 with Oakland and 2011-16 with San Francisco).
- Earned the save Monday in his first appearance of the season...over his final 15 appearances last season with San Francisco, went 0-2 with four blown saves in eight chances.
- Had no decisions and a 13.50 ERA in seven games, including one start, this spring...allowed a .346 (9-for-26) opponents batting average and issued five walks in 6.0 innings.
- Monday was his first appearance against the Angels since May 2, 2015 (0.1 ip, 2 h).
- Has a 1.58 ERA (14 er in 79.2 ip) in 80 career appearances in April, which is his lowest ERA for any month of the season.
- Signed as a free agent to a two-year contract on Jan. 20, 2017.

Last Year: Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.

- Begins his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.
- Went 0-3 with a 5.79 ERA in nine spring training appearances...allowed nine runs over his first five games (12.71 ERA) but just one over his final four (1.08 ERA).
