LEADING OFF: Today the Angels play the fourth and final game (2-1) of a four-game road trip to open the regular season against the Oakland Athletics...**Halos are looking to win three of first four games of season for first time since 2008.**

RICHARDS UPDATE: Garrett Richards exited last night's game in 5th inning after experiencing right biceps cramping...He was removed for precautionary reasons...Tossed 4.2 scoreless innings and allowed three hits with one walk and four strikeouts.

SCHEDULE NOTE: Saturday night's game vs. Seattle will begin at 7:17 p.m. at Angel Stadium...The Angels will host a pregame ceremony recognizing **Mike Trout** for his 2016 American League MVP and Silver Slugger Awards.

ESPINOZA'S BLAST: Tuesday night, **Danny Espinosa** had his first hit in an Angels uniform with a three-run go-ahead home run in the 9th inning...According to STATS LLC, the Santa Ana native became the third player to have a go-ahead HR in the 9th inning or later for his first hit in an Angels uniform, joining **Billy Parker (1971)** and **Gary Pettis (1982)**, who both hit walk-off homers for their first hit...Last Major Leaguer to do so for his first hit with a team was **Hank Conger** for Houston in 2015.

MORE ELITE COMPANY: Tuesday, **Mike Trout** became the sixth player in A.L. history to log 500 RBI & score 600 runs before his age-26 season, joining: **Ty Cobb, Joe DiMaggio, Jimmie Foxx, Mickey Mantle & Alex Rodriguez**

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** enters 2017 as the longest tenured manager in the Majors (18th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .541 (1,492-1265) winning percentage and 1,492 wins are both tops in franchise history...With the Angels win last night, **Scioscia passed Hall-of-Famer Clark Griffith for 22nd on all-time managerial win list).**

SALT LAKE EXTENSION: The Angels announced Tuesday that the Club has extended its affiliation with Triple-A Salt Lake through the 2020 season...The Bees are the longest running minor league partnership for the Angels (since 2001).

VS. OAKLAND: Angels have homered in 17 of last 19 meetings with Oakland...Halos have won 32 of last 49 overall meetings...Last season, **Mike Trout** batted .418 (28/67) against Oakland, including two doubles, five home runs and 12 RBI...LAA won 2016 series 12-7 and has won three consecutive season series against A's (2014-16).

REVERE IS MR. 1000: Monday night, **Ben Revere** became the 1,000th different player in Angels history with his pinch-hit appearance in the 9th inning...The Angels entered 2017 having used 995 different players in franchise history... Newcomers **Cameron Maybin, Danny Espinosa** and **Martin Maldonado** were all in Halos starting lineup...**Bud Norris** made Angels debut with relief appearance in 7th inning.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Angels minor league affiliates will kick off their seasons, as Triple-A Salt Lake, Double-A Mobile, Advanced-A Inland Empire and Class-A Burlington all play their Opening Day games today.

START WITH A BLAST: With a home run Monday, **Mike Trout** has tied **Joe Rudi** and **Tim Salmon** for the Angels franchise record with three career Opening Day home runs (also homered on Opening Day in 2014 & 2015).

VETERAN SQUAD: The Angels Opening Day roster did not feature any rookie players for the first time since 2012.

NEW HALOS: Angels Opening Day active roster featured eight players new to the organization: **Jesse Chavez, Danny Espinosa, Martin Maldonado, Cameron Maybin, Bud Norris, Blake Parker, Yusmeiro Petit & Ben Revere.**

HOT SPRINGS: The Angels concluded Spring Training with a 20-14-1 record...Halos have posted a winning record in Spring Training for the 13th time in the last 16 years and reached the 20 Spring Training win mark for fourth time in franchise history (also, 1996, 2005 & 2009).

ANOTHER RECORD FOR TROUT: With a start in center field on Monday night, **Mike Trout (2013-17)** became the first player in Angels history to make five Opening Day starts in CF...**Gary Pettis (1984-87), Jim Edmonds (1995-98) & Darin Erstad (2001-03, '06)** each had four Opening Day starts in center.

April 6
(1973) Frank Robinson hit a home run in his first at-bat as an Angel...In that same game, Tom McCraw appeared as the Angels' first-ever designated hitter; **(1977)** In the first game of the season, Frank Tanana hurled a complete game shutout at Seattle...The following night, Nolan Ryan accomplished the same feat, making the Angels the sixth team in ML history since 1901 to open a season with consecutive shutouts; **(1993)** J.T. Snow homered vs. Milwaukee in his first game as an Angel; **(2009)** Four Angel hurlers combined on a 3-0 Opening Day shutout of the A's at Angel Stadium...It was the sixth all-time Opening Day shutout for the Halos, first since 1978.

- Making first start of season...Entering fifth Major League season (third with Angels)...Makes Opening Day roster for second time in career (also, 2014).
- **2017 SPRING TRAINING:** Made three Cactus League starts and went 1-1 with a 1.35 ERA (6.2 IP – 1 ER).
- **2016 RECAP:** Made 10 starts for Angels last season in return to action after missing entire 2015 season (Tommy John surgery; Aug. 13, 2014)...Went 3-4 with a 4.17 ERA (49.2 IP – 23 ER) with 50 strikeouts and 23 walks.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Tossed 5+ innings in minor league Spring Training start on March 30 against the Giants Triple-A squad, tossing a total of 92 pitches...In last Cactus League action, earned the win on March 25 vs. Arizona after tossing four innings and allowing one earned run on four hits with no walks and three strikeouts.
- **WINNING SEASON DEBUTS:** Has been winning pitcher in his first Major League start of each of his four previous big league campaigns...**In his four season debuts, is 4-0 with a 0.65 ERA (27.2 IP – 2 ER)...**Has active streak of **25.2 consecutive scoreless innings during his first start of a season.**
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In two career games vs. Oakland (both in 2014), is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (12 IP – 8 ER) and nine strikeouts.
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Made only career start at the Coliseum on May 31, 2014 and was charged with loss after allowing four earned runs on five hits with five walks and seven strikeouts across six innings pitched.

Schugel** to the Arizona Diamondbacks.
