### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-6) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (7-4)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost a season-high tying two straight games (also April 4-5)...the A's longest winning streak is two games and Oakland has not been more than one game over or one game under .500 this year... have been exactly .500 five times...won two of three at Kansas City to start the week for their first series win of the season...have also lost one series and split one series...this is the A's 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 117th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on their longest homestand of the season, a 10-game stand against Houston (0-1), Texas (three games) and Seattle (four games)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and are 2-3 at home for the season...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last eight games after going errorless over the first three contests...the streak of eight consecutive games with an error is Oakland's longest since a 15-game streak from May 3-18, 2015...have committed 13 errors for the season, which is two more than any other team (Arizona, 11)...made 97 errors last year, which tied for second most in the American League...five of the 13 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is three more than any other team...last year, A's pitchers committed nine errors the entire season...made two errors last night, which led to five unearned runs...have seven unearned runs for the season, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 9).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are in a stretch of 16 consecutive games against American League West competition that began yesterday...in fact, 23 of Oakland's first 26 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the exception was the three-game series at Kansas City to start the week...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 3-5 against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 4-2 when scoring first compared to 1-4 when the opponent scores first...starting pitchers have all five of the A's wins...the five wins are tied for the most by starters in the American League...are batting .059 (2-for-34) with one run scored in the first inning...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the runs scored are tied for second fewest (Boston, 0)...the pitching staff has allowed 47 runs, 14 of which have come in the second inning (14 er in 11.0 ip, 11.45 ERA)...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Gray, Mengden, Smolinski, Wendle)...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players...it marked the first time the A's have opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...five players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents (Casilla, R. Davis, Joyce, Plouffe, Rosales), which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011)...seven had six or more years of service: Madson (11 years, 155 days), R. Davis (9 years, 167 days), Casilla (9 years, 148 days), Lowrie (8 years, 111 days), Joyce (7 years, 123 days), Axford (6 years, 170 days) and Rosales (6 years, 163

days)...those are the most players with six or more years of service on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven...Frankie Montas is the youngest player at the age of 24 years, 13 days...Santiago Casilla is the oldest at 36 years, 252 days.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's went 16-18 (.471), which was the fourth worst record in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, which was fifth worst in the CL...this marks the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...the A's compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...surrendered 37 home runs, which tied for fifth fewest in the CL...had the second fewest strikeouts (247) and tied for the fifth fewest walks (121)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in walks (133), tied for fourth in triples (11) and fifth in on-base percentage (.351)...also tied for the fewest stolen bases (15), ranked third in fewest hit by pitches (10) and fourth in most strikeouts (300)...the strikeouts were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...the defense committed 28 errors, which was fourth fewest in the CL...however, turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors...went 9-7 at Hohokam, 0-1 in Oakland and 7-10 on the road.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

**RADIO AND TV:** Due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or Sharks, the following changes have been made to the radio and television schedules...the game of Thursday, April 18 against Texas has been moved from NBCSCA to NBCSCA Plus...tomorrow's game against Houston can be heard in the Bay Area on KFOX 98.5 FM...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 last night and now have an eight-game losing streak against the Astros...that is Oakland's longest ever against Houston...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...were 6-6 over the first 12 games, but lost each of the final seven...eight of the 19 games were decided in the last at bat and the A's were 2-6 in those games...had a 4-5 record in Oakland and posted a 2-8 mark in Houston...are 15-24 against Houston over the last two years...have won nine of the last 16 games in the Coliseum but have lost 10 of the last 12 at Minute Maid Park...lead the all-time series 46-37...19 of the 37 losses have been by one run...are 25-17 in Oakland and 21-20 in Houston.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jed Lowrie** has a 65-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...**Adam Rosales** has hit safely in each of his four games (4-for-11, .364)...**Marcus Semien** had his fourth two-walk game of the season last night and now has 10 walks, which is tied for the American League lead...in the department of unique pitching lines, **Ryan Dull's** line last night (1.0 ip, 1 h, 3 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 2 so) was just the third such line by a Major Leaguer since 1913 (second Athletic: Paul Lindblad on May 19, 1974) while **Raul Alcantara's** line (2.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 1 so), was the fourth such line (last: Frank Williams, July 5, 1984)...of the two to match Dull, Dull was the only one to not allow a home run...of the three to match Alcantara, two also had a hit batter and none had a balk.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1924** Al Simmons collects his first major league hit off the Senators Walter Johnson in the A's 4-0 loss to Washington on Opening Day...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley records his 100th career save in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle...with 100 saves, he becomes just the sixth pitcher in major league history with 100 saves and 100 victories...in **2006** Eric Chavez, Frank Thomas and Milton Bradley hit back-to-back-to-back home runs on three consecutive pitches off Vicente Padilla in the sixth inning of the A's 5-4 win over Texas.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-1, 7.15 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...is on his first Opening Day roster and is beginning his second season in the majors...made both his Triple-A and Major League debut last year, his third professional season.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) April 4 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas last Sunday...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score.

**MANAEA vs. HOUSTON:** Is 0-1 despite a 1.69 ERA (21.1 ip, 13 h, 6 r, 4 er, 8 bb, 20 so, 1 hr) in four career starts, all last year...had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win in Oakland on April 29...

allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth...also had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at Houston on July 10...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter...left with a 1-0 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save and Hendriks surrendered a run in the 10th for the loss...took the loss in a 6-0 decision at Houston on August 29...left the game after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid...issued back-to-back bases loaded walks to Marisnick and Springer in the second inning but both of the runs were unearned...had another no decision in the A's 2-1 loss in 10 innings in Oakland on Sept. 20...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings...allowed just two base runners to advance as far as second base and retired each of the final seven batters he faced...left after six innings with a 1-0 lead but Axford allowed a run in the seventh for the blown save.

**2016 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...allowed a .248 opponents batting average and walked 37 batters for a .298 on-base percentage...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .263 (117-for-445) against right-handers...based on a minimum of 140 innings pitched, the mark against lefties was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history (previous: .185, Norris, 1980)...allowed 17 of his 20 home runs and issued 33 of his 37 walks to righties for a .754 OPS...had a .526 OPS against lefties, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980)...opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .152 average with RISP and two outs...held the three hitter to a .197 average, which was fifth lowest in the AL...13 of his 20 home runs came after his 60th pitch in a game...yielded a .430 batting average and .733 slugging percentage when the opponents put the first pitch in play but had a .157 opponents average with two strikes.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** Went 4-4 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in 13 games after the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 starts before the break...had the fifth lowest post-break ERA in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

**INNING BY INNING:** Had a 1.59 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.21 ERA and .283 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...among pitchers with 20 or more innings, he had the lowest first inning ERA in the majors (1.13) and the fourth lowest second inning ERA (1.44)...his first inning ERA was third lowest in Oakland history using the 20 inning minimum.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 24 starts and went 0-6 with a 3.90 ERA in those contests...in his four no decisions with support of one run or fewer, he has scoreless outings of 8.0 innings, 7.0 and 6.0 and one outing where he allowed one run in 7.0 innings.

**THIS AND THAT:** Tied for eighth in the AL with three pickoffs and opponents were successful in 3-of-7 (42.9%) stolen base attempts off him...the A's were 11-13 (.458) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 19 of his 24 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 13 times.

**MORE FROM 2016:** Was selected from Nashville April 29 and made his ML debut that day against Houston after just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win, allowing four runs on four hits and four walks in 5.0 innings...was credited with his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland when he allowed a run on four hits in 6.2 innings...was on the disabled list from June 14 to 28 with a left pronator muscle strain...fired 5.2 shutout innings for the win in his first start following his return on June 29 against San Francisco...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on July 10 at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance July 17 against Toronto...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay July 22 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks...had a streak of 30.2 consecutive innings without a walk from July 10 to Aug. 2, which was the longest single season streak in Oakland history...left his start on Aug. 29 at Houston after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid...did not go on the DL, but would not pitch again until Sept. 14 at Kansas City...went 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in his final four starts following his injury, including a career-high 15.1 inning scoreless streak from Aug. 29 to Sept. 26.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts in his Triple-A debut...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his April 29 promotion...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...struck out 21 while walking just four...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 against left-handed hitters.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Jharel Cotton (1-1, 3.97 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the eighth of his career...combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in his last start, a 2-0 A's win at Kansas City on Monday (7.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 6 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Houston, a start in the A's 4-2 loss in Oakland last year on Sept. 19 (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so)...went 3-0 with a 4.35 ERA in six starts this spring...held opponents to a .208 batting average, but issued 11 walks in 20.2 innings...was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers at the 2016 trading deadline and made his ML debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings (1.23 per nine innings)...combined with Oklahoma City and Nashville for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 2-for-3 (66.7%)

- The A's bullpen ranks fifth in the American League in ERA and third in innings pitched...has issued 11 walks, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.
- Earned its second save of the season Monday after going five straight games without a save opportunity...are tied for the second fewest save opportunities in the AL...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves...last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Are one of three AL teams without a win by a reliever (Kansas City, Toronto)...two total decisions by relievers are tied for the fewest in the AL with Minnesota (1-1).
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
