WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the A's last night, 4-3, and have dropped 4 of last 5 to match season low point at 4 games under .500 (also after Sunday loss)...club is 3-4 in last 7, 4-5 in last 9, and 5-6 in last 11 after opening the campaign at 0-3...club has yet to win the 1st 2 G in any series in '17, and has a 1-4 record in the 2nd game of series this year...team has gone 3-5 entering the finale of this 9-game, 9-day road trip to LAA (2-1), SEA (0-3), and OAK (1-1)...club has opened season with a 5-9 record this year after going 8-6 in 2016, as this marks fewest wins thru 14 G since 2010 (5-9)...Texas was 9-6 after 15 G in 2016 and 6-9 in 2015, but have not started at 5-10 or worse since 2002 (4-11).

• The Rangers are 4.0 games back in the A.L. West behind division leader HOU for a 3rd straight day, and in 5th place in the division for a 3rd time this year...current 4.0-game deficit matches largest of the season.

ON THE LINE: Texas will play a rubber game series finale for the 3rd time in the last 4 series...Rangers are 2-2 in series finales, 2-0 in rubber games, winning on 4/9 vs. OAK and 4/13 at LAA...with a win today, Rangers could take 2 of the 3 series on this road trip, and also win a series for the 3rd time in last 4 tries overall...Texas is 2-2-0 in its 1st 4 series in 2017, winning a rubber game series finale in the 2 victories and getting swept in the 2 defeats.

ON THE ROAD: Rangers have opened this season with a 3-5 road record, and have already secured a losing mark on this 1st trip of the year...Texas was 4-3 on the 1st road trip in 2016, and had a 4-4 road mark thru 8 away games last year...the Rangers were 42-39 (.519) in road games in 2016, T3rd-best in the A.L...club has winning road records in 2 straight and 5 of last 6 seasons.

STAYING WEST: The Rangers' first 42 games - over a quarter of the way into the 2017 season - are scheduled to take place in the Central and Pacific Time Zones, as each of those contests will be played in just 3 states: Texas, California, and Washington...the Rangers' 1st game outside of those 3 states, or in the Eastern Time Zone, does not come until a 3-city road trip from May 19-28 to DET, BOS, and TOR.

VS. OAKLAND: Texas is 3-2 vs. A's in 2017, playing OAK in 2 of 1st 5 series this season...Rangers have a 2-7 mark against all other teams so far this year...teams also play 5/12-14 at TEX, but then do not meet again until late August...Rangers have won 9 of 13 and 13 of last 19 overall...Texas won season series 10-9 last year, 4th straight season for TEX/OAK season series to be decided by 10-9 margin...Texas clinched division on 9/23/16 at OAK...club is 6-5 at the Coliseum since the start of 2016, but has won 6 of last 7 in this facility...all-time, Rangers lead 356-342, but A's have 178-169 edge at the Coliseum.

SUN COME THROUGH: Entering today's series finale, the Rangers are 2-1 in day games this season and 3-8 in night tilts...club has scored 23 runs in the 3 day contests, posting at least 7 runs in all 3...club is batting .255 (27-106) in daytime with 6 HR, an .814 OPS, and a .333 (9-27) mark with RISP...the club's lone day loss was a walkoff defeat on Sun. at SEA, when bullpen had 2 blown saves.

HEADED HOME: After today's game, the Rangers are scheduled to fly to the DFW area and begin a 9-game, 10-day homestand on Friday night with the 1st of 4 games vs. KC...Texas went 2-4 during the season-opening homestand from 4/3-9...team is slated to play 15 of its 24 April games in Arlington...Rangers were 6-1 against the Royals in 2016, winning the final 6 straight after a loss on 7/22/16 in KC...the current 6-G win streak is T2nd-longest ever against the Royals (7 in 1998-99; 6 in 2009-10)...Texas also won the season series vs. KC in 2015, 4-to-3.

ELVIS IS ALWAYS THE HEADLINER: Elvis Andrus had 2 of the Rangers' 3 hits last night, driving in the club's 1st run and scoring its 2nd run after a pair of stolen bases...it was Andrus' 36th career multi-steals game, extending his club record, and the 36 instances since 2009 are T5th-most in MLB in that span.

• Both Andrus steals last night came in the 6th inning, the 1st multi-SB frame for a Ranger since 9/17/15 vs. HOU (8th inning - also Andrus)...Elvis' 20 career multi-steal innings are easily the most by a Ranger going back to at least 1984 (credit Elias).

MAZARA AGAIN: Nomar Mazara's RBI in the 6th inning last night gave Texas a 2-0 lead...he has RBI in 3 straight and 5 of his last 6 G...Mazara's A.L.-high 17 RBI rank 2nd in MLB to only MIA's Marcell Ozuna (18) and he is just the 3rd player in Rangers history with at least 17 RBI through 14 team games, joining a pair of Texas teammates in 1998: Juan Gonzalez (18) and Lee Stevens (17)...since 2014, the only other ML batters with so many RBI after 14 team games were WAS' Bryce Harper (21 in 2016) and Ozuna (18 in 2017).

THINGS WERE GOING SO WELL: Entering the bottom of the 6th inning last night, Texas had just taken a 2-0 lead, and the pitching staff had opened the series with 14 consecutive scoreless innings to match a season high...it was the Rangers' 5th loss when having a lead at some point in 2017, 3rd such defeat on this road trip.

KELA'S BACK: Keone Kela has finished each of the 1st 2 games of this series, retiring 6 of 7 batters faced (one BB)...the only other Texas reliever this season with consecutive hitless/scoreless outings of 3+ outs is Jeremy Jeffress (4/12 and 4/14).

DAYS GO BY: Martin Perez enters today's contest with a career 3.19 ERA (53 ER/149.1 IP) in 24 G/23 GS in day contests, a figure nearly 1 1/2 runs lower than his ERA at night (4.65)...in his last 21 day starts beginning 8/11/13, he has gone 10-6 with a 2.90 ERA (43 ER/133.1 IP)...Perez has posted 2 of his 3 career complete games in day tilts, with his last being a CG SHO in day contest on 4/23/14 at OAK (9.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R).

BETTER AGAINST STARTERS: Texas had 3 hits and scored 2 unearned runs against A's starter Andrew Triggs last night, but then went 0-for-9 against the OAK bullpen to end the game...the Rangers have slashed .237/.307/.453/.760 against opposing starting pitchers this season, but own .187/.264/.308/.571 marks versus bullpen arms...relief pitchers on this road trip have a 2.79 ERA (9 ER/29.0 IP) against Texas, with the Rangers batting .155 (16-103) off bullpens in that span.

A BIG INNING AGAINST YU: All 4 OAK runs scored in the 6th inning last night, and all were charged to Yu Darvish, although 2 of them scored after Darvish left the game...it was just the 6th time in Darvish's MLB career to allow 4+ runs in an inning...the others: 6/7/12 at OAK (4 in 4th), 7/14/12 at SEA (4 in 1st), 8/1/12 vs. LAA (6 in 3rd), 6/22/14 at LAA (4 in 4th), and 8/9/14 at HOU (4 in 5th).

SHORTS: Last night was the Rangers' 1st game without an XBH in '17, ending a season-opening 13-game streak...Texas has a 1-6 record in games started by Darvish and Hamels...Rangers' .357 win pct. is 2nd-lowest in A.L. (TOR-.154, 2-11) and T3rd-lowest in MLB...team's 5 wins are T2nd-fewest in MLB to only TOR...club's 3 shortest games time-wise have been played over the last 4 days...7 of the Rangers' 9 SB in 2017 have come over the last 6 contests...after hitting HR in 1st 9 G this season, Texas has gone deep in just one of the last 5 contests beginning Friday.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#33 Martin Perez, LHP
(1-1, 2.20)

TODAY: The 26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 4th start and appearance of the season in today's series and road trip finale in Oakland...has allowed just one run in 10.1 IP his last 2 starts, and his 2.20 ERA is lowest among Texas starters...has thrown 162 of his 282 pitches for strikes (57.45%), ranking as 6th-lowest pct. in MLB (2nd-lowest in A.L. - James Shields: 56.66%) among pitchers with 3+ starts...will be working on regular 4 days' rest after taking a no-decision in Rangers' 2-1 loss on Fri. at SEA, a matchup with Felix Hernandez...will be facing Oakland for 2nd time in span of 3 starts, as he earned his lone win in rubber game series finale on 4/9 vs. OAK in Arlington...pitched for Team Venezuela in the 2017 World Baseball Classic won by the United States...dating back to 2016, has allowed 3 ER-or-less in 8 of his last 9 outings in the regular season, but since 8/21/16 has gone 3-4, 4.81 (32 ER/63.0 IP) in 11 G/GS...is in Rangers' season-opening rotation for the 3rd time in his career (also Game 2 in both 2014 and 2016)...made a team-best 33 starts in 2016, the only member of the Texas rotation to not miss a start last season...matched a career high with 10 wins and pitched a career-high 198.2 innings...signed a four-year contract on 11/7/13 through 2017 with club options for 2018, 2019, and 2020.

LAST START: Took ND in Rangers' 2-1 loss on Fri. at SEA (5.0 IP, 6 H, 1 R-ER, 4 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 98 pitches/53 strikes), a matchup with Felix Hernandez (W, 7.1 IP, 1 R-ER)...matched season high with 4 BB and pitched season-low 5.0 innings...threw 34 pitches in the 4th inning, when he retired the 1st 2 batters before permitting 4 straight baserunners, including a HR by Nelson Cruz to begin that span...pitched to 2 batters in the 6th, allowing both to reach (BB, 1B) before Jose Leclerc stranded the runners with 3 consecutive K's...Leclerc would allow a run in the 7th, however, to take the loss...LH batters went 3-for-6 off Perez.

VS. OAKLAND: Will be facing Oakland for 2nd time in span of 3 starts, as he earned his lone win in rubber game series finale on 4/9 vs. OAK in Arlington - an 8-1 victory (5.1 IP, 6 H, 0 R-ER, 3 BB, 6 SO, 0 HR, 92 pitches/55 strikes)...faced a lineup comprised entirely of batters hitting from the right side...set down the 1st 8 batters of the game...last 4 starts vs. As: 3-0, 2.84 (8 ER/25.1 IP) w/ 5 BB/17 SO...has gone 3-2, 4.03 (17 ER/38.0 IP) in 6 G/GS here at the Coliseum, including 3-1, 3.44 (13 ER/34.0 IP) in 5 G/GS in 5 GS at this park since the start of 2013...has more wins (6), starts (13), and SO (46) vs. OAK than any other opponent...one of his 2 career CG SHO's came on 4/23/14 at OAK (9.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R), which was a day contest.

HARD SUN: His career 3.19 ERA (53 ER/149.1 IP) in 24 G/23 GS in day contests is nearly 1 1/2 runs lower than his figure at night (4.65)...last 21 day starts beginning 8/11/13: 10-6, 2.90 (43 ER/133.1 IP)...made 6 road day starts in 2016, going 0-4, 5.94 (24 ER/36.1 IP), when he averaged 2.23 runs of support per 9 innings...has posted 2 of his 3 career complete games in day tilts, with his last being a CG SHO in day contest on 4/23/14 at OAK (9.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R).

ON THE ROAD: Will be making his 2nd road start of 2017 after his no-decision on Fri. at SEA (see above)...went 2-8 with a 5.78 ERA (58 ER/90.1 IP) over 15 road starts in 2016...was the 3rd-highest road ERA by a Texas starter behind only Kevin Brown in 1994 (5.82) and Rick Helling in 2001 (6.82)...opponents batted .277/.351/.413 on the road compared to .265/.325/.396 at Globe Life Park...was one of just 3 ML pitchers to log 2-or-fewer wins in 15 road starts last season, joining NYY's Michael Pineda (2-7) and MIL's Chase Anderson (2-6)...picked up one of his 2 road wins on 9/6 at SEA, snapping a season-high 5-game losing streak with the victory.

BY THE NUMBERS: Robinson Chirinos caught 1st 2 starts (1-1, 2.38, 3 ER/11.1 IP), and Lucroy caught last start...has permitted just 3 XBH through 3 starts...batters leading off an inning are hitting .250 (4-16) with 2 BB...opposition is 2-for-14 (.143) with RISP...opponents hitting .320 (8-25) with men on base.

STARTING STRONG: In April outings, has made quality starts in 5 of 8, and 8 of last 12 since 4/13/14...is 6-4, 3.24 (32 ER/89.0 IP) in 14 G/GS in career in April, lowest ERA, opp. SLG (.354), and most GIDPs (26) of any month...has thrown 2 of his 3 career CG in the month of April (last 4/23/14 at OAK).

LEFT SIDE, STRONG SIDE: Opposing left-handed batters have a career .233 (97-417) mark against Perez, including .198 (41-207) since his return in 2015...held lefties to a .176 average (24-136) in 2016, lowest in the A.L. and 4th-lowest in MLB...HR by David Ortiz on 7/6/16 at BOS snapped a run of 107 PA without a HR by a LHB (last Kyle Seager on 9/9/15 at SEA)...his last HR to a LHB at Globe Life Park was on 5/10/14 vs. BOS (also Ortiz).

TO THE GROUND: His career ground ball percentage of 52.8% is 8th-highest in the A.L. among pitchers with 400+ IP since 2012...ranked 4th in the A.L. with a 54.0% ground ball percentage in 2016, 7th-highest in MLB...induced an MLB-leading 36 GIDPs in 2016, a Rangers single-season record (previously 31 by C.J. Wilson in 2011)...tied HOU's Dallas Keuchel (36 in 2014) for most in the last 12 seasons...allowed an average of 0.82 HR per 9 innings (18 HR/198.2 IP) in 2016, 2nd-lowest pct. in the A.L. (TOR's Aaron Sanchez - 0.70) and 9th-lowest in MLB.

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC: Pitched for Venezuela in the 2017 WBC won by the United States...team finished 2-5 and advanced to the second round of competition at Petco Park in San Diego before being eliminated...went 0-1 with a 7.50 ERA in 2 starts (6.0 IP, 10 H, 6 R/5 ER, 2 BB, 6 SO)...returned to Rangers camp 3/20 and made final spring appearance on 3/24 vs. SD...started on 3/18 vs. Puerto Rico in Team Venezuela's 13-2 loss in the second round...allowed single runs in the 1st and 3rd

innings, with an error leading to an unearned run in the 3rd inning...started Venezuela's 11-10, 10-inning opening round win on 3/11 vs. Italy in Mexico...allowed runs in 3 of 4 innings pitched and surrendered solo HR to Alex Liddi in the 4th.

SPRING TRAINING: Went 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA (3 ER/9.2 IP) in 3 'A' game starts...was also 0-1, 7.50 (5 ER/6.0 IP) in 2 starts for Team Venezuela in the World Baseball Classic...last outing was a simulated game on 3/29 in Surprise (6.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R).

2016: Made a team-best 33 starts, the only member of the Texas rotation to not miss a start...matched a career high with 10 wins...pitched a career-high 198.2 innings, the 6th-most by a Texas pitcher age 25 or younger and the most since Jose Guzman threw 206.2 in 1988...set a club record with a major league-high 36 GDP...Rangers went 18-15 in his 33 starts, including 16-8 in his last 24.

CAREER: Saw two seasons cut short in 2014-15 following 'Tommy John' ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow on 5/19/14...produced a breakout April in 2014 and appeared to be on the verge of a strong season before his elbow issues arose...was selected the 2013 Rangers Rookie of the Year after posting 10 victories in his first extended major league action...made his major league debut in 2012 at the age of 21, and was rated as one of the Rangers' top five prospects by *Baseball America* in five straight seasons from 2009-13.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER — RHP ANDREW CASHNER (0-1, 5.06 ERA in one game/start)
