ON THIS DATE

1977 - The Mariners turn their first triple play in franchise history against the Kansas City Royals at the Kingdome (6-3-2). **1993** - Chris Bosio hurls the second no-hitter in Mariners history, beating the Boston Red Sox 7-0 in the Kingdome. Bosio walked the first two batters, then tossed a double play ball to start a string of 26 straight batters retired. **2003** - Mike Cameron belts a walk-off grand slam at Safeco Field to beat the Indians, 8-5. The blast marks the sixth time in franchise history a Mariner has hit a walk off grand-slam. **2013** - Felix Hernandez recorded his 100th career victory in the Mariners 7-1 win at Houston. Felix became the 6th-youngest pitcher to record his 100th victory among players who began their career since divisional play began in 1969.

VS. OAKLAND

The Mariners and Athletics meet in the 3rd of 19 games this season (0-2)... after this series, will meet again May 15-17, July 6-9 and Sept. 1-3 in Seattle and Aug. 8-9 and Sept. 25-27 in Oakland...Seattle went 12-7 vs. the A's last season, the fourth straight year winning the season series (13-6 in 2015, 10-9 in 2014, 11-8 in 2013).

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-game, 11-day, 3-city road trip tonight with the third of four games vs. the Oakland Athletics (0-2)...also travel to Detroit (3 G) and Cleveland (3 G) during the second road trip of the season...Seattle was 6-3 on its just concluded season-opening 9-game homestand vs. Houston (1-2), Texas (3-0) and Miami (2-1)...today's game will be televised live in HD on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle has lost 2 straight...have won 5 of last 8 and 6 of last 11 after opening the season 1-6...are 6-3 at home, but 1-8 on the road...17 of the club's first 26 games - and 23 of the first 38 - will be played on the road.

- **In the Nick of Time** - in his last 4 appearances (5.2 IP), **Nick Vincent** has retired each of the 17 of the last 18 batters he has faced, including 8 via strikeout...during that span, he has also stranded all 5 of his inherited runners.
- **Motter Pop** - in his last 9 games (4/11-c), **Taylor Motter** is 11-for-37 (.297) with 6 runs, 5 doubles, 4 home runs and 8 RBI...despite making just 10 starts at shortstop, his 4 home runs as a shortstop rank T1st in the Majors along with Francisco Lindor (4)...his 9 extra-base hits (5 2B, 4 HR) are T6th in the AL (also: 7 others).
- **A Pitcher's Best Friend** - the Mariners rank 1st in the Majors with 26 double plays turned...have turned at least 1 double play in 15 games of their 18 games, including 9 games with at least two double plays.
- **#Mariners40** - during the 2017 season, the Mariners will commemorate the 40th anniversary of the club's inception in 1977, celebrating four decades of team and individual accomplishments.

EARTH DAY...Seattle is 18-18 all time playing on Earth Day...have won the last 2 Earth Day games and are 11-7 on April 22 dating back to 1997...this will be the sixth time that the Mariners and Athletics have squared off on this date: Seattle won 4-0 at Safeco in 2011, lost 2-8 at Oakland Coliseum in 2004, won 5-2 in the Kingdome in 1990, won 5-4 in the Kingdome in 1980 and lost 0-3 in the Kingdome in 1978.

FEELING BETTER...shortstop **Jean Segura** (AA Arkansas) and RHP **Steve Cishek** (AAA Tacoma) both made rehab starts last night...**Segura**, who was placed on the 10-day DL on April 11 with a strained right hamstring, made his first rehab start with Arkansas going 0-for-3 with a walk leading off as the starting DH...**Cishek**, who was placed on the 10-day DL on March 31 recovering from surgery to repair left hip labrum tear on Oct. 12, 2016, made his 2nd rehab appearance, his first with Tacoma...he allowing 0 runs, 1 hit and 2 walks recording 2 outs in the first inning...he threw 20 pitches, 10 strikes...Cishek tossed a 1-2-3 first inning on April 17 at San Antonio with AA Arkansas.

LET THERE BE LIGHT...Seattle is 3-1 this season during day games and have won 10 of their last 12 day games, dating back to Sept. 10, 2016...overall this season, the Mariners are batting .306 (41x134) with 33 runs scored, 12 doubles, 4 home runs, 30 RBI, 5 HBP, 19 walks and 4 stolen bases in 4 day games...Seattle has averaged 8.3 runs per game and has recorded at least 10 hit in 3 of 4 games...**Guillermo Heredia** (.750/3x4, 3 R, HR, RBI), **Nelson Cruz** (.438/7x16, 2 R, 2B, 4 RBI, 2 BB), **Mitch Haniger** (.438/7x16, 7 R, 2 2B, 2 HR, 10 RBI, 3 BB), **Robinson Canó** (.400/6x15, 4 R, 2 2B, HR, 5 RBI, 4 BB), **Kyle Seager** (.385/5x13, R, 3 2B, 6 RBI, 2 BB) and **Jarrod Dyson** (.375/3x8, 3 R, 2B, BB) are each hitting above .375 during day games this season.

HE JUST HITS...Mitch Haniger has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games (4/6-current), batting .345 (20x58) with 13 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 16 RBI, 1 HBP, 9 walks and 1 stolen base...during this stretch he leads the American League in runs scored and RBI, while also ranking 2nd in slugging percentage (.655), T2nd in hits, T5th in home runs, 6th in on-base percentage (.441) and 8th in average (.345).

DUCKS ON THE POND...over the last 6 games (4/16-current), the Mariners are batting .309 (17x55) with 6 doubles, 2 home runs, 24 RBI and 14 walks with RISP...the Mariners hit .157 (17x108) with 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 31 RBI, 1 HBP and 15 walks with RISP over the first 12 games of the season (4/3-4/15)...**Guillermo Heredia** (.333/1x3), **Mitch Haniger** (.313/5x16, 2B, HR, 10 RBI, HBP, 4 BB), **Carlos Ruiz** (.333/1x3, 2B, RBI) and **Kyle Seager** (.308/4x13, 2B, 11 RBI, 6 BB) are each hitting over .300 with RISP this season...**Seager's** 11 RBI this season currently rank T3rd in the AL, while **Canó** and **Haniger** rank T8th with 10 RBI with RISP.

AGAINST THE A'S...Nelson Cruz currently has a 10-game hitting streak vs. the Athletics dating back to Aug. 13, 2016...during this stretch he is batting .375 (15x40) with 6 runs scored, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 8 RBI, 3 walks and 2 stolen base...Cruz has also reached base safely in 19 consecutive games vs. the A's, including at least 1 hit in 18 games...during this stretch, dating back to April 9, 2016, he is batting .419 (31x74) with 11 runs scored, 5 doubles, 13 RBI, 7 walks and 2 stolen bases.

MR. LEFTY...left-handed reliever **Marc Rzepczynski** has allowed only 1 hit over his first 7 relief appearances this season (4.2 IP)...dating back to Aug. 5, 2016, Rzepczynski has not allowed an earned run in 28 of his last 29 appearances...during this stretch he is 0-0 with a 0.84 ERA (2 ER, 21.1 IP), while limiting opponents to a .186 (13x70) average, walking 11 and striking out 14...limited left-handed batters to a .116 (5x43) average with 3 walks and 11 strikeouts during this stretch.

ROAD HOMERS...since 2015, **Nelson Cruz** (53), **Kyle Seager** (38) and **Robinson Canó** (33) have combined to hit 124 home runs on the road...Cruz's 53 road home runs since 2015 lead all Major League players, while Seager ranks 9th and Canó ranks T19th...during this stretch as a team, the Mariners have hit 221 home run on the road, trailing only the Toronto Blue Jays (228) and the Baltimore Orioles (226) for most home runs on the road...Cruz has 11 career home runs at the Oakland Coliseum, including 8 home run over his last 24 games.

AS YOU MIGHT KNOW...Nelson Cruz is batting .340 (66x194) with 30 runs scored, 10 doubles, 11 home runs, 39 RBI, 3 HBP and 23 walks in 52 day games, dating back to the start of the 2016 season...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?...**Cruz's .340 average during this stretch is the highest in the American League?...he also ranks among the AL leaders in OPS (3rd/.974), slugging percentage (4th/.562) and on-base percentage (5th/.413) during day games since last season.

ABOUT ARIEL...

- 28-year-old left-hander is making his 16th career appearance, 14th career Major League start, today vs. the Athletics.
Born in Havana, Cuba and signed by Baltimore as a minor league free agent on May 27, 2015.
Made his pro debut with the GCL Orioles in the Gulf Coast League on June 22, 2015.
Played in Cuban National Series for 7 seasons (2007-2013), compiling record of 22-25 with a 3.78 ERA (162 ER, 386.0 IP) with 274 strikeouts and 151 walks in 80 career games (64 starts).
Acquired by the Mariners from the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for LH Wade Miley on July 31, 2016.

LAST OUTING...

W #1 April 17, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings vs. Miami in 6-1 Seattle win...allowed just 4 hits and did not walk a batter while striking out 5...has walked 1 or fewer in 7 of 13 career starts.

WINNER...

the Mariners have won 7 of his last 9 starts dating back to Sept. 2, 2016 (Miranda is 5-2 with a pair of no-decisions).

LIMITING DAMAGE...

allowed 3 earned runs or less in 11 of his 13 career starts, 2-or-less in 7 of 12 starts.

HE'S BACK...

recalled from AAA Tacoma on March 31 after LHP Drew Smyly was placed on the 10-day disabled list...was optioned to Tacoma on March 25.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...

was 0-2 with a 5.03 ERA (11 ER, 19.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts in 7 appearances, including 5 starts, in Cactus League Play.

CUBAN-BORN MARINERS PITCHERS...

Miranda is the 4th Cuban-born pitcher to make an appearance with Seattle (3rd to make a start with Mariners)...Miranda joins Roenis Elias (51 games, 49 starts), Diego Segui (40 G, 7 GS) & Tony Fossas (23 G).

2016 SEASON RECAP...

was 5-2 with 3.88 ERA (25 ER, 58.0 IP) with 44 strikeouts in 12 games, 10 starts with Seattle and Baltimore...had a 3.54 ERA (22 ER, 56.0 IP) with 40 strikeouts in 11 games, 10 starts with Seattle.

STREAKING SUCCESS...

won four consecutive starts (Sept. 2 vs. Los Angeles-AL, Sept. 7 vs. Texas, Sept. 12 at Los Angeles-AL & Sept. 18 vs. Houston), going 4-0 with a 2.16 ERA (6 ER, 25.0 IP) with 20 strikeouts...he's 1 of just 3 Mariners rookie pitchers in club history to win 4 games in September, joining Mark Langston (4-1, 1984) & Gil Meche (4-0, 1999).

FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN...

W #1 in Seattle's 6-5 15-inning win vs. Detroit on Aug. 9, 2016...pitched in relief in 15th inning, allowing a solo-home run to Victor Martinez...was his first Major League win.

MAKING THEM EARN IT...

allowed a solo home run in top of 3rd inning on Sept. 18, 2016 vs. Houston, the first earned run he had allowed since 1st inning on Sept. 2 vs. Angels; streak of 19.0 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run was 5th-longest such streak by a Mariners rookie pitcher in club history...the club record for consecutive innings without allowing an earned run as a rookie is held by Matt Young (23.1 IP, 5/3/83-5/24-83).

MARINERS DEBUT START...

made his first Major League start for Seattle on Aug. 4, 2016 vs. Boston...went 6.0 innings allowing 2 runs on 8 hits, while striking out 5 and walking 1...joined Adrian Sampson (6/18 at BOS) as one of two Mariners to make their first ML starts last season.

SEATTLE NOTICED...

over his final 7 starts with Norfolk before the trade to Seattle last year, Miranda went 3-0 with a 1.93 ERA (9 ER, 42.0 IP), 33 strikeouts and 11 walks...went at least 6.0 innings in 5 of his last 7 starts...held opponents to 2 or fewer earned runs in 5 of his 7 starts and 3 or fewer earned runs in each of his 7 starts...limited opponents to 5 or fewer hits in 5 of the 7 starts.

MLB DEBUT...

made MLB debut on July 3, 2016 at Seattle with Baltimore...allowed 3 runs on 4 hits while striking out 4 over 2.0 innings in relief (2.0,4,3,3,0,4).

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER...

in parts of 2 minor leagues seasons in the Orioles organization, is 10-10 with a 3.80 ERA (72 ER, 170.2 IP) with 158 strikeouts and 57 walks in 33 starts (he was optioned to AAA Tacoma by Seattle last season but didn't make an appearance there)...limited opponents to a .239 (152x637) average against...began his professional career with the GCL Orioles on June 22 2015...recorded his first professional win on July 19, 2015 w/A Frederick vs. Potomac (6.0,0,0,0,2,6).

in 7 seasons from 2007-2013 with La Habana, Mayaguez, Industriales and Isla dela Juventud, went 22-25 with a 3.78 ERA (162 ER, 386.0 IP) with 274 strikeouts and 151 walks in 80 career games (64 starts).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP YOVANI GALLARDO (0-1, 6.19)

31-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 4th start of the year tomorrow at Oakland...has gone 5.0+ IP in each of his starts this year...L #2 in last outing, 4/18 vs. MIA, allowing 4 ER in 6.0 IP; finished day with 3.0 shutout innings...
WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC: Made one start for Mexico in WBC vs. Italy on March 9 (4.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R, 4 ER, 0 BB, 5 K, 3 HR) ...
2016: Went 6-8 with 5.42 ERA (71 ER, 118.0 IP) with 85 strikeouts in 23 starts with Baltimore last season...made his 250th career start on June 24 vs. Tampa Bay, becoming the 4th Mexican-born pitcher to make 250+ career starts (also: Fernando Valenzuela, 424; Esteban Loaiza, 333 & Ismael Valdez, 288)...earned his 105th career win last season on June 29 at San Diego, passing I. Valdez for 3rd-most by Mexican-born pitcher (enters 2017 with 108 career wins)...trails F. Valenzuela (173) and E. Loaiza (126)...posted an 8.61 ERA (22 ER, 23.0 IP) in the first inning of his 23 starts, surrendering 29 hits (including seven home runs) and 18 walks in the first frame...placed on the 15-day disabled list with right shoulder bicep tendinitis on April 23, his first DL stint since 2013...activated from the DL on June 18 after rehab assignments with advanced-A Frederick and AAA Norfolk...
CAREER: In parts of 10 Major League seasons with Milwaukee (2007-14), Texas (2015), Baltimore (2016) and Seattle (2017-), has compiled a career record of 108-85 with a 3.81 ERA (681 ER, 1607.2 IP) with 1441 strikeouts in 273 career games (270 starts)...originally selected by Milwaukee in 2nd round (46th overall) of 2004 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Trimble Tech (TX) High School...vs. OAK: Making his 7th career start against the A's but is 0-5, 5.29 (20 ER, 34.0 IP) with 11 walks and 29 strikeouts in his career against Oakland...is 0-2, 3.71 in 3 GS in Oakland Coliseum (17.0 IP, 7 ER).
