OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-16) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (14-13)

FRIDAY, MAY 5, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday but are now 2-8 over the last 10 games after winning a season-high five straight...are 12-16 (.429) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it matches the A's worst record after 28 games over the last eight years...were also 12-16 in 2015 (lost game 29)...the four games under .500 are one short of the season low (11-16 on May 3)...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...that is one game short of the season-high of 7½ (May 3)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, two days in fourth and two days tied for fourth.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 10 home runs in the three-game series at Minnesota, which match their most home runs allowed in a three-game series over the last 16 years (also Aug. 23-25, 2011 at NYY)...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last six games (13 home runs total) after surrendering just 16 home runs over the first 22 contests...have allowed 29 home runs for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.385)...have compiled a 5.67 ERA (54 er in 85.2 ip) over the last 10 games after logging a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the AL...lead the majors in hit batters (17)...rank fourth in the AL in fewest strikeouts (204)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-7 with a 4.89 ERA (29 er in 53.1 ip) over the last 10 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...have surrendered six home runs in the last three games after yielding no home runs over the previous six contests...have allowed 15 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (KC, PIT)...have walked nine batters in the last three games (15.1 ip) after issuing just one walk over the previous five games (25.1 ip)...have the lowest opponents batting average (.224) and on-base percentage (.305) in the American League and the second lowest slugging percentage (.352)...have the most hit batters in the AL (11), the second most decisions (23) and the third fewest innings pitched (152.0)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors (CIN, LAA).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 12 runs in the last two games after tallying 17 runs over the previous eight contests...have been held to two runs or fewer in six of the last 10 games and have 104 runs scored for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...have struck out 10 or more times in eight of the last 10 games (103 strikeouts total) and have 247 strikeouts for the season, which is third most in the AL...have the third lowest batting average (.233) but are tied for second in doubles (47) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (84)...have a .215 (40-for-186) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters have just one home run, which matches Detroit for the fewest in the American League...the only home run by an A's DH was by Ryon Healy in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles), giving A's designated hitters a 26-game homerless streak...Chad Pinder had a RBI single in the second inning yesterday to snap a 12-game streak without an RBI by the A's DH...have four RBI for the season, which is five fewer than any other team (KC, 9)...are batting .179 (19-for-106), which is third lowest in the AL.

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the lead-off spot and they are batting a combined .171 (19-for-111) with 14 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .268 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is fifth lowest...leadoff hitters are 4-for-25 (.160) with three walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last eight games after a six-game errorless streak...have made 24 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to 17 unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 18)...six of the A's errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...six have been made by outfielders and four by catchers, both of which are the most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 22-of-28 (78.6%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the Ameri-

can League and tied for third most in the majors...the A's offense has stolen just nine bases, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 3-9 in games decided by five runs or more...the nine losses are the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied with Texas for the most...are 2-3 in one-run games...the five games are second fewest in the American League and the two wins are tied for second fewest...have a season run differential of -34, which is second lowest in the AL (Kansas City, -38).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Detroit (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 (.538) at home...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-10 (.333) on the road

IN APRIL: The A's went 11-14 (.440) in the month of April, which tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last five years they finished with a losing record in the first month (9-14 in 2015)...led the majors in fewest home runs allowed (19) and tied for third in the AL in most home runs hit (31)...the 31 home runs by the offense were the A's most in April since 2006 (34)...the offense struck out 221 times, which was third most in the AL and set an Oakland record for the month of April (previous: 211 in 2010)...had a .297 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...batted .229, which was fourth lowest in the AL and Oakland's second lowest April batting average over the last 22 years (.211 in 2012).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Phegley, Semien, Smolinski) and have used the DL 12 times this year...Phegley is on the 7-day concussion DL...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lost the season series last year as they went 3-4 against the Tigers...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...are 40-38 against the Tigers over that span, which dates back to the start of the 2007 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 252-246 against the Tigers...that includes 140-110 in Oakland, 110-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 920-999 against the Tigers...with one more A's loss, the Tigers will be the sixth team to defeat the A's 1000 times...the only other of the original eight American League teams that has not beat the A's 1000 times is the Brewers/Browns/Orioles (941).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is batting .333 (14-for-42) with five home runs and 10 RBI over his last 14 games...has six home runs for the season, which is one short of his season total from last year and three short of his career high of nine in 2012...leads American League first baseman in RBI (17), is tied for the lead in home runs (6) and ranks second in batting (.299)...**Khris Davis** hit safely in each of his seven games against Detroit last year and now has an eight-game hitting streak against the Tigers (12-for-33, .364)...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .347 (17-for-49) over his last 13 games after hitting .171 over his previous 12 contests...is a .327 (35-for-107) career hitter against Detroit, which is his best average against any AL team.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1939** Sam Chapman hits for the cycle and then homers in his first two at bats the following day...in **1949** Bobby Shantz tosses nine hitless innings of relief in the A's 5-4 win over Detroit...Wally Moses hits a two-run home run in the 13th inning after Shantz allows a run in the top of the inning...in **1971** Vida Blue tosses a four hit shutout and strikes out 11 in the A's 5-0 win at Detroit...in **2000** the A's score 16 runs at Texas but lose 17-16, setting an AL record for runs scored in a loss...all 18 starters in the game score at least one run, an AL first.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (4-1, 1.84 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Picked up his fourth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for third in the American League...the four wins match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time, last: Gray and Kazmir in 2014)...had just one career win entering the season...also ranks third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.241), seventh in ERA (1.84), eighth in on-base percentage (.250) and 10th in batting average (.194)...his 1.84 April ERA was second best by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015)...has surrendered just one home run in 29.1 innings and his average of 0.31 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .087 (4-for-46) average against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (17-for-62) with his lone home run against right-handers...opponents are 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a hit to the opponents clean-up hitter (0-for-14) and has surrendered just one to the leadoff hitter (1-for-12, .083).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (19.0 ip) in three starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 5.23 ERA (6 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts during the day...his 19.0 innings pitched at night are the most in the majors among pitchers with no earned runs allowed at night.

EARNED RUNS: Has not allowed an earned run in four of his five starts...has not allowed an earned run after the third inning (14.1 ip)...began the season with a 17.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and the 12th of his career...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first five starts while tossing at least 4.0 innings in each outing...that matches the longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history (Chad Gaudin, 2007; Mike Norris, 1980)...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...had won each of his first three starts to become the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts in a season since Tommy Milone in 2013.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City April 12...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

THIRD START: He improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on April 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

FOURTH START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle April 23 in Oakland...yielded a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

LAST START: He picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 2-1 victory at Houston last Saturday...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings...allowed five runners to advance into scoring position, but set down each of the final 10 batters that he faced.

TRIGGS vs. DETROIT: Is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so) in two career appearances, both in relief last year...retired the side in order in the eighth inning at Detroit on April 25 in a 7-3 A's loss (1.0 ip, 1 so)...pitched the ninth inning in a 4-1 loss in Oakland on May 27 (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...allowed a RBI triple to J.D. Martinez.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-3 with an 8.10 ERA in seven games, including five starts...allowed a .299 (29-for-97) opponents batting average but issued just five walks in a team-leading 23.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings)...allowed five home runs...started in each of his final five outings (21 er in 19.1 ip, 9.78 ERA) after pitching in relief in his first two appearances (0 er in 4.0 ip).

2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...the stints were April 25-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-Aug. 1) and Aug. 5 through the end of the season...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers...issued 9 of his 13 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .144 batting average with two strikes...the three hitter in the order batted .429 but he allowed a .160 batting average against the clean-up hitter.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in his six starts, 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents average in 18 relief appearances...walked just one batter in 25.2 innings as a starter...first batters faced hit .176 with no extra base hits and one walk (.222 on-base percentage)...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

THIS AND THAT: Had an 0-1 record and a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road...surrendered four of his five home runs on the road...logged a 0.93 ERA and .183 opponents batting average over innings one through three compared to a 6.08 ERA and .289 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...pitched fewer than five innings in three of his six starts and his longest start was six innings...the A's were 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in all but two appearances.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Triple-A Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not surrender a home run...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...had a .125 batting average and .222 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip) and five appearances during the day (5.2 ip).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Hahn (1-2, 2.53 ERA): Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 but has started in each of his last four appearances...is 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .159 opponents batting average over his last three games after going 0-1 with a 3.75 ERA and .271 opponents average over his first two...is tied for fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.274) and ranks 10th in on-base percentage (.266)...has allowed just one home run and his average of 0.28 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the AL...has received no support in three of his five starts and his season run support average of 2.81 is fourth lowest in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's loss at Houston last Sunday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 3 er, 6 so)...is 3-0 with a 1.64 ERA (22.0 ip, 14 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, all starts, against Detroit.

- The 14 home runs allowed by the bullpen are tied for third in the AL...only Detroit and Los Angeles have allowed more.
- Relievers have factored in just one decision over the last 12 contests, a loss by Madson on April 25...their one win is the fewest in the majors and their five total decisions are second fewest in the AL.
- A's relievers have tossed at least five innings seven times this season... they have pitched three or more innings in 19-of-28 games.
- Are 7-for-10 in save chances...have converted five of their last six after starting the season 2-for-4 ..three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 5; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 20 holds, which is the second most in the AL.
- On April 25, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)...last year, A's relievers surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors.
