OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-17) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (15-13)

SATURDAY, MAY 6, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games and nine of the last 11 and are a season-high tying five games under .500 at 12-17 (also 11-16 on May 3)...that is the third worst record in the American League and it matches the A's worst record after 29 games over the last eight years... were also 12-17 in 2015 (lost game 30)...the loss last night dropped the A's into sole possession of last place in the AL West for the first time this year...have spent one day tied for first, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, two days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 7½ games (also May 3).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.51 ERA (58 er in 94.2 ip) over the last 11 games after logging a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 4.43 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League... did not allow a home run last night after surrendering 10 in the three-game series at Minnesota...that matched their most home runs allowed in a three-game series over the last 16 years (also Aug. 23-25, 2011 at NYY)... have allowed 13 home runs in the last seven games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...have allowed 29 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.389)...have hit the most batters in the majors (17).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-8 with a 4.91 ERA (32 er in 58.2 ip) over the last 11 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 4.23 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...have surrendered six home runs in the last four games after yielding no home runs over the previous six contests... have allowed 15 home runs for the season, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.228) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.307) and slugging percentage (.360)...have the most hit batters in the AL (11), have the second most decisions (24) and the third fewest innings pitched (157.1)... have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors (CIN, LAA).

OFFENSE: The A's scored two runs last night and have been held to two runs or fewer in seven of the last 11 games...have scored 31 runs over that span (2.8 per game) and 106 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League (KC, 81) and third fewest in the majors (SF, 103)...have struck out 10 or more times in nine of the last 11 games (113 strikeouts total) and have 257 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for third most in the AL...have the third lowest batting average (.234) but are tied for third in doubles (48)...are hitting .214 (42-for-196) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters have just one home run, which matches Detroit for the fewest in the American League...the only home run by an A's DH was by Ryon Healy in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles), giving A's designated hitters a 27-game homerless streak...had a 29-game streak without a homer last year from June 18 to July 23...Chad Pinder had a RBI single in the second inning Thursday to snap a 12-game streak without an RBI by the A's DH...have four RBI for the season, which is five fewer than any other team (KC, 9)... are batting .173 (19-for-110), which is second lowest in the AL (KC, .168).

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .190 (22-for-116) with 14 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .280 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the American League (KC, .175 and .228)...leadoff hitters are 4-for-26 (.154) with three walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed nine errors in the last nine games after a six-game errorless streak...have made 26 errors for the season, which is tied with Boston for second most in the majors (MIL, 27)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 20 unearned runs...six of the A's errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors... six have been made by outfielders and four by catchers, both of which are the most in the American League...outfielders had their third double play last night, which is tied for the most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 23-of-29 (79.3%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...the stolen base percentage is second highest in the AL...the A's offense has stolen just nine bases, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's fell to 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more with the loss last night...the 13 games and 10 losses are the most in the majors...are 2-3 in one-run games...the two wins are tied for the fewest in the majors and the five games are tied for second fewest (CWS, 3)... have a season run differential of -39, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (0-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-7 (.500) at home...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-10 (.333) on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's fell to 1-5 in replay challenges last night and their success ratio of 16.7% is the lowest in the majors...have played just one extra inning game, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (ARI, CLE, DET, MIN)...lost that game and are one of five teams in the majors without an extra inning win (DET, KC, MIN, SEA)...are 0-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are the only team in the majors without a last at bat win... are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is second fastest in the American League (Kansas City 2:59)...are 11-10 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Phegley, Semien, Smolinski)...Phegley is on the 7-day concussion DL and Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 12 times this year, which is tied with Boston and Texas for second most in the majors (15, LAD)...have had at least five players on the DL every day and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 11-14 (.440) in the month of April, which tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last five years they finished with a losing record in the first month (9-14 in 2015)...led the majors in fewest home runs allowed (19) and tied for third in the AL in most home runs hit (31)...the 31 home runs by the offense were the A's most in April since 2006 (34)...the offense struck out 221 times, which was third most in the AL and set an Oakland record for the month of April (previous: 211 in 2010).

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lost to the Tigers for the 1000th time last night... the only team of the other seven original American League franchises the A's have not lost to 1000 times are the Brewers/Browns/Orioles (941)... Oakland lost the first meeting of 2017 last night after losing the season series last year, 3-4...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...are now 40-39 against the Tigers dating back to the start of the 2007 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 252-247 against the Tigers...that includes 140-111 in Oakland, 110-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 920-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is batting .348 (16-for-46) with five home runs and 12 RBI over his last 15 games...has six home runs for the season, which is one short of his season total from last year and three short of his career high of nine in 2012...leads American League first baseman in RBI (19), is tied for the lead in home runs (6) and ranks third in batting (.309)... **Khrris Davis** has a nine-game hitting streak against the Tigers (13-for-37, .351)... **Jed Lowrie** is batting .346 (18-for-52) over his last 14 games after hitting .171 over his previous 12 contests...is a .327 (36-for-110) career hitter against Detroit, which is his best average against any AL team.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Claudell Washington homers off California's Ed Figueroa for the 1000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses his third consecutive complete game as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 6-0 in 1 hour and 49 minutes...that is the A's fastest game since August 12, 1979.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-2, 2.53 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 but has started in each of his last four appearances...is 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) and .159 (11-for-69) opponents batting average over his last three games after going 0-1 with a 3.75 ERA and .271 opponents average over his first two.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.274) and ranks ninth in batting average (.205) and on-base percentage (.266)...has allowed just one home run in 32.0 innings and his average of 0.28 home runs per nine innings is third lowest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no support in three of his five starts this year and is 0-2 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) in those three starts...has four starts with two runs or fewer and eight in his other start...his season run support average of 2.81 (10 rs in 32.0 ip) is fourth lowest in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed three of his 10 runs in the first inning for a 6.75 ERA (4.0 ip)...has a 1.93 ERA (6 er in 28.0 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are 5-for-52 (.096) with two strikes...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number nine hitter (0-for-12)...has allowed a .308 (8-for-26) average with runners in scoring position.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (1 er in 6.0 ip) and .100 (2-for-20) opponents batting average in one start in Oakland, 0-2 with a 2.77 ERA (8 er in 26.0 ip) and .227 (22-for-97) opponents average in three games on the road...last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 6-4 with a 2.97 ERA (33 er in 100.0 ip) in 16 starts in Oakland, 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA (43 er in 75.0 ip) in 14 games on the road.

FIRST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City April 13...allowed two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Cain and Perez, and another in the third on a Moss sacrifice fly...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas on April 19 in Oakland, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning and surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Gallo in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's leading 8-1.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) on April 25...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...walked Trout in the first, allowed a one-out single to Simmons in the fifth and walked Maybin in the eighth...none of the base runners advanced past first base...Ramirez (7.0 ip), Parker (1.0 ip) and Hernandez (1.0 ip) shutout the A's on two hits over the first nine innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Houston last Sunday...allowed a RBI double to Correa in the first, a RBI double to Gattis in the fourth and a two-run single to McCann in the fifth...left after six innings trailing 4-0...Keuchel shut out the A's on two hits over the first seven innings before Oakland scored single runs in the eighth and ninth.

HAHN vs. DETROIT: Is 3-0 with a 1.64 ERA (22.0 ip, 14 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, all starts...the Tigers are the only team he has defeated more than once in his career and his ERA is his lowest against any team that he

has faced more than once...is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in one start at Comerica Park and 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (3 er in 6.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...picked up the win in his only start last year, a 12-3 A's victory in Oakland on May 28...issued a career-high tying four walks...blanked the Tigers on three hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a wild pitch in the fifth inning...Oakland increased its lead to 3-1 before he allowed a two-run home run to V.Martinez in the sixth...the A's then scored five times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...tossed his first career complete game in his first outing, a four-hit, 4-0 shutout on May 25 in Oakland.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...his career splits are .214 (100-for-468) against righties, .270 (126-for-467) with 15 of his 18 home runs against lefties...has a .418 career slugging percentage against lefties, .276 against righties...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that...opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .500 with RISP and two outs...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .300 average with two strikes and a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 9-4 with a 2.39 ERA (28 er in 105.1 ip) in 17 day games, 7-12 with a 4.59 ERA (73 er in 143.0 ip) in 27 night games.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents were successful in each of their seven stolen base attempts off him after going 5-for-9 (55.6%) over his first two seasons...the A's were 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just three of his nine starts...has done that in just 12 of 41 starts in his career...the bullpen blew a save in three of his nine starts.

NASHVILLE: Went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings...however, issued 34 walks (4.59 per nine innings) and struck out just 46 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35...allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .255 against right-handed hitters compared to .304 against left-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties...went 0-7 with a 4.71 ERA in 10 starts at home where he allowed all four of his home runs...yielded a .175 batting average and .246 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents batted .222 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs...made one postseason start and had a no decision in the Sounds 10-7 win in Game 1 of the PCL Semifinals Sept. 7 at Oklahoma City (4.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 7 so).

RHP Sonny Gray (0-1, 6.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make the 100th appearance and 98th start of his career...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...went 2-0 and did not allow a run in two rehab starts (11.0 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 13 so) before he was reinstated from the DL May 1...made his 2017 debut the next day at Minnesota and was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 3 hr)...is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (16.0 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career regular season starts against Detroit...went 0-0 with a 15.75 ERA in two spring training starts...opponents went 6-for-17 (.353) with four walks...struck out seven batters in 2.0 innings...went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts last year in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons.

- The 14 home runs allowed by the bullpen are tied for fourth in the AL...only Detroit, Los Angeles and Seattle have allowed more.
- Relievers have factored in just one decision over the last 13 contests, a loss by Madson on April 25...their one win is the fewest in the majors and their five total decisions are second fewest in the AL.
- A's relievers have tossed at least five innings seven times this season... they have pitched three or more innings in 20-of-29 games.
- Are 7-for-10 in save chances...have converted five of their last six after starting the season 2-for-4 ..three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 5; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 20 holds, which is the second most in the AL.
- On April 25, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)...last year, A's relievers surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors.
