### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-17) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (16-18)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have won each of their last three games, which is their second longest winning streak of the season (5, April 18-22)...have won four of the last five games after losing eight of the previous nine contests...are 15-17 (.469) for the season, which is tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...are in a three-way tie for second place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by six games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, four days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**THREE STRAIGHT WALK-OFFS:** The A's recorded their third consecutive walk-off win last night, which marks the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have logged three straight walk-off victories...the last time was June 1-3, 2004...each of the last two walk-offs have come on home runs (Lowrie last night, Healy on Sunday), marking the first time the A's have won back-to-back games on walk-off home runs since June 1-2, 2004 against Chicago-AL (Kielty and Kotsay)...in Oakland history, the A's have never recorded walk-off wins on four consecutive days...had a walk-off win in four consecutive games once (Sept. 24-28, 1972) and had a walk-off win in five consecutive home games once (May 22-June 3, 2004)...the A's three walk-off wins are tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 4)...the wins are also the A's first last at bat victories of the season after going 0-2 over the first 29 games...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is also tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 3).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit eight home runs in the last three games and have 42 for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...Oakland is 14-10 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is the worst in the AL...the pitching staff has allowed 15 home runs in the last 10 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...have yielded 31 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...are 11-6 when out-homering the opponent.

**OFFENSE:** The A's did not draw a walk last night, marking the 19th time in Oakland history they did not walk in an extra inning game (last: May 10, 2014)...are batting .264 (48-for-182) with 27 runs scored over the last five games (5.40 runs per game) after hitting .204 with 28 runs scored over the previous 11 contests (2.55 runs per game)...lead the American League in extra base hits (100) and rank third in doubles (55)...however, have the third most strikeouts (283), the fourth fewest runs (123) and the fourth lowest batting average (.234)...are hitting .215 (46-for-214) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** Ryon Healy's game-ending home run Sunday was the first home run of any type by an A's designated hitter since Healy homered in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles)...it snapped a 28-game homerless streak by A's designated hitters...A's designated hitters rank last in the American League in RBI (6), second to last in batting (.174) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (2).

**LEADOFF HITTERS:** The A's have started five different batters in the lead-off spot and they are hitting a combined .178 (23-for-129) with 15 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .267 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the American League (KC, .173 and .221)...leadoff hitters are 4-for-29 (.138) with three walks, a double and home run to start the game.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last six games (nine errors total) and have 14 errors in the last 12 contests...have made a Major League leading 31 errors for the season and the errors have led to a ML leading 24 earned runs...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...six of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...six have been made by outfielders, which is the most in the AL...outfielders are tied for the AL lead in double plays (3).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.08 ERA (13 er in 38.0 ip) in the first four games of the homestand after posting a 5.05 ERA on the last road trip...have a 4.27 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.383)...have hit the most batters in the majors (18) and rank second in the AL in wild pitches (16).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-8 with a 4.62 ERA (38 er in 74.0 ip) over the last 14 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 4.17 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...have allowed just 16 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.236) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.368)...have the most hit batters (12), the second most decisions (24) and the third fewest innings pitched (172.2)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors.

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been successful in 24-of-31 (77.4%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...the stolen base percentage is third highest in the AL...the A's offense has stolen just 11 bases, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...went 5-4 on the last homestand and are 10-7 (.588) at home for the season...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-10 (.333) on the road...begin a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games) on Friday.

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's are 4-3 in one-run games and the seven one-run decisions are tied for third fewest in the American League...are 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more...the 10 losses are the most in the majors and the 13 games are tied with Cincinnati and Texas for the most...have a season run differential of -35, which is tied with Kansas City for the lowest in the AL.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Phegley, Semien, Smolinski)...Phegley is on the 7-day concussion DL and Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's are 3-5 against the Angels this year...at the conclusion of this series, Oakland will have played 10 of its first 34 games against Los Angeles...have yet to play seven American League teams...are 3-2 in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Anaheim April 25-27...have won five of the last seven games in the Coliseum but have lost six straight, nine of the last 10 and 22 of the last 31 games at Angel Stadium...three of the five losses this year have been by one run...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 27-38 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 424-359 against the Angels...that includes 221-169 in Oakland and 203-190 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 473-436 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Yonder Alonso** is batting .346 (9-for-26) with five home runs and 10 RBI in seven games in May after hitting .279 with four home runs and 14 RBI in 23 games in April...hit his ninth home run of the season Sunday, which matches his career high established in 155 games in 2012...**Khris Davis** has tied the Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a non-pitcher (19)...**Jed Lowrie** had his third career two-homer game last night but it was his first since Oct. 3, 2010 vs. New York (AL)...went 651 games between two-homer games...now has four home runs in 31 games this year after hitting two in 87 contests last year.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972** the A's score 10 times in the fourth inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Milwaukee...the first seven batters reach base and score in the A's 10-2 win...in **1988** Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley combine on a four-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 3-1 for what was then a club record 14<sup>th</sup> consecutive victory...the A's would go on to win an Oakland record 104 games and their first division title since 1981...in **2010** Dallas Braden pitches the 19<sup>th</sup> perfect game in Major League history in the A's 4-0 win over Tampa Bay on Mother's Day.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (3-3, 4.64 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his team-leading seventh start of the season...it will be the 12th start of his career...has a decision in each of his six starts this year and has alternated wins and losses in each start.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Leads American League rookies in games started (6), innings pitched (33.0) and strikeouts (28) and is tied for the lead in wins (3)...among all AL pitchers, he is tied for third in wild pitches (3), tied for eighth in wins (3) and tied for ninth in losses (3).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) and .169 (11-for-65) opponents batting average in three starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.36 ERA (13 er in 14.0 ip) and .371 (23-for-62) opponents average in three starts at night...has allowed all three of his home runs during the day...is now 5-0 with a 1.67 ERA (6 er in 32.1 ip) in five career starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 5.40 ERA (18 er in 30.0 ip) in six starts at night.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-1 with a 2.60 ERA (5 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 6.89 ERA (12 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...last year, he had no decisions and a 3.60 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .194 (6-for-31) batting average to hitters leading off an inning but has issued four walks (.286 on-base percentage)...opponents are batting .225 (16-for-71) with the bases empty, .321 (18-for-56) with runners on base...however, all three of his home runs allowed have been solo shots as have six of his seven career home runs...has surrendered all three of his home runs this year to left-handed hitters...has walked 15 batters in 33.0 innings this year (4.09 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings).

**THIS AND THAT:** Has received four runs of support in his three losses (14.0 ip, 2.57 RSA) and 12 runs of support in his three wins (19.0 ip, 5.68 RSA)...has allowed five runs in the first inning (4 er, 6.00 ERA) and five in the second inning (7.50 ERA)...last year he did not allow a run in the first inning and yielded just three in the second (2 er, 3.60 ERA).

**FIRST START:** He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5 in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...retired the first four batters before allowing three runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Simmons and a two-run single by Espinosa...also allowed RBI singles to Trout and Pujols in the fifth.

**SECOND START:** He combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...walked three...allowed just three baserunners to advance into scoring position.

**THIRD START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on April 17 in Oakland...allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI double to Mazara in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0.

**FOURTH START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle April 22 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...yielded a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third but the A's got that run back in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Montas to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 4-2.

**FIFTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed three unearned runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Beltran and Gurriel and a RBI double by Gattis...the A's scored once in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a Springer RBI single in the fourth and two more runs in the fifth, including a Gattis RBI single.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at Minnesota last Thursday...struck out a career-high nine batters and yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a pair of solo home runs in the bottom of the second to Rosario and Santana...also yielded an unearned run in the fourth inning when Rosario scored on a Gimenez single and Jaff Decker error...left after six innings with a 6-3 lead.

League debut last year, a 4-1 A's victory on Sept. 7 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two hits to become the first Athletics pitcher with more than six innings and two hits or fewer in his debut since Porter Vaughan on June 16, 1940 (7.0 ip, 2 h)...retired the side in order in each of the first three innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to retire at least each of the first nine batters he faced...struck out Cowart to end the second inning for his first strikeout...allowed a leadoff single to Simmons in the fourth inning for his first hit...surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Cron in the seventh.

**2016 RECAP:** Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...yielded a .324 slugging percentage...his opponents batting average included a .146 (7-for-48) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 (13-for-60) against right-handers...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...opponents hit .163 the first two times through the lineup, .273 after that...the A's were 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in four of his five starts (walked two in the other), allowed one earned run or fewer four times and three hits or fewer three times...was rated as the A's No. 4 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade and went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts with the Sounds...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)...had career highs in wins, games, starts, complete games, shutouts, strikeouts and inning pitched (135.2).

**RHP Andrew Triggs (4-2, 2.34 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...made six starts in his Major League debut last year...is 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA and .269 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average over his first three starts...ranks fourth in the American League in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.26), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.280), tied for fifth in wins (4), sixth in opponents OPS (.555), seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (1.82) and 10th in ERA (2.34)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's loss to Detroit last Friday here in Oakland (5.1 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 1-0 with a 0.82 ERA (11.0 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 3 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts, against Los Angeles...including a win in his only start this year, a 5-1 A's win on April 6 (5.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 0 er, 3 bb, 1 so).

- The bullpen did not allow a run last night for the first time since April 27 at Los Angeles-AL...five of the 11 scoreless outings by the bullpen this season have been against the Angels.
- Have a combined 11 stolen bases against, which is second-most in the American League.
- A's relievers have tossed at least four innings 11 times this season...they have pitched three or more innings in 23-of-32 games.
- Are 7-for-10 in save chances...have converted five of their last six after starting the season 2-for-4...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 5; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- The A's relievers have allowed eight unearned runs this season, which is tied for second-most in the AL.
- Are tied for third in the AL in wild pitches with seven.

- Has not allowed a hit in nine of his 13 games and opponents are 5-for-41 (.122) with six walks...has the 10th lowest opponents batting average among American League relievers.
- Opponents are hitless in eight at bats with runners in scoring position.
- Picked up his 39th career win on Sunday in his 578th game...it was his first win since July 23, 2016 at New York-AL.
- Is 5-for-6 in save chances this season after going just 4-for-8 in save opportunities to end last season.
- His four stolen bases allowed are tied for the second-most in the AL among relievers.

- Has committed three errors, which are tied for the most among American League catchers...has tossed out 2-of-17 (11.8%) attempted base stealers...the 15 stolen bases are tied for second most in the AL (16, Perez KC) and the caught stealing percentage is second lowest (McCann, DET 9.1%).

**Last Year:** Played in a career-high 137 games and hit .251 with 14 home runs and 56 RBI...also had career bests in hits (123), doubles (30) and extra base hits (46)...was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team.
