OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-23) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (21-19)

FRIDAY, MAY 19, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:35 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games after losing each of the previous four contests...are 7-7 over the last 14 games but are 18-23 (.439) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is one game worse than last year (19-22) and four better than 2015 (14-27)...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 11 games...that is one-half game short of the season high of 11½ on May 17...this marks just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 11 games after 41 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and seven days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Boston (1-0) and Miami (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...are 12-8 (.600) at home compared to 6-15 (.286) on the road...have the worst road record in the American League and are tied for second worst in the majors...have won five of the last six home games and 10 of the last 13 but have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 4-1-1 in home series...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in 11 of their last 12 games and have 24 home runs total over that span...now have 58 home runs for the season, which is one short of the American League lead (NYY and TB, 59)...it is second most in Athletics history after 41 games (63 in 2000)...six of the A's last seven home runs and seven of the last nine have come with runners on base...85 of the A's 162 runs (52.5%) have come on home runs...are 17-15 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-9) and third worst in the majors (MIA, 1-11)...the pitching staff has allowed 40 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (SF, 38)...the A's are 14-8 when out-homering the opponent, 4-15 when they don't.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (37) and are tied with San Diego for the lead in unearned runs (28)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...five have been made by catchers, which is tied for the most in the AL...the A's have allowed 34 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (PIT, 38).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .261 (53-for-203) with 31 runs scored (5.2 per game), nine doubles and 12 home runs over the last six games...have 129 extra base hits, which is second most in the American League (TB, 132)...however, have the second most strikeouts (355), third fewest runs (162), third lowest batting average (.236) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.307)...are 12-for-61 (.197) with runners in scoring position over the last 10 games and are batting .213 (58-for-272) with RISP for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .208).

PITCHING: The A's allowed three runs in the first game of the homestand last night after posting a 5.29 ERA on the last road trip...have a 3.86 ERA (78 er in 182.0 ip) at home compared to 4.88 (96 er in 177.0 ip) on the road...have a 4.36 ERA overall, which is third highest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.381)...lead the majors in hit batters (22) and rank second in the AL in wild pitches (21).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-11 with a 4.55 ERA (64 er in 126.2 ip) over the last 23 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 13-16 with a 4.23 ERA for the season...that includes 6-5 with a 2.55 ERA (25 er in 88.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 7-11 with a 5.32 ERA (81 er in 137.0 ip) by everyone else...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (22) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.367)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.234).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face left-handed starting pitchers in each of the final three games of this series after facing right-handers in each of the previous 10 games...are 5-5 in games started by

left-handers, 13-18 against right-handers...are batting .248 against left-handed pitchers, .232 against right-handers.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .195 (30-for-154) with three home runs and nine RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the AL, the home runs are tied for the fewest (DET, HOU) and the batting average is second lowest (KC, .185).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .174 (29-for-167) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .257 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .170/.210)...leadoff hitters are 6-for-37 (.162) with four walks (.244 on-base percentage) to start the game.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 10-7 (.588) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 8-16 (.333) in games decided by three runs or more...are tied for the fourth best record in the American League in games decided by two runs or fewer but have the worst record in the majors in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-5 (.444) in one-run games...are tied for the third fewest one-run games in the AL and have the fourth worst record...have a season run differential of -40, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -42).

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's played their first game against an American League East team last night...it began a stretch of 28 consecutive games against teams from the Eastern Time Zone, including 17 against the AL East, seven against the National League East and four against Cleveland...last year, the A's went 16-17 against the AL East.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-5 on Friday, which is tied with Boston and Cleveland for the worst Friday record in the majors...are 2-5 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-4 against Oakland...have used a different lineup in each of their last 36 games...have used 39 different lineups overall in 41 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off wins (3)...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is second fastest in the American League (KC, 3:01)...however, it is currently second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RED SOX: Oakland won the first meeting of 2017 last night after going 1-5 against Boston last year...that marked the second consecutive season the A's went 1-5 against the Red Sox...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Boston...were outscored 67-20...have lost 11 of the last 14 games...have dropped five of the last eight games in the Coliseum and each of the last six games at Fenway...are 237-291 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 143-120 in Oakland, 93-170 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 879-1072 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis hit his 12th home run last night, matching **Yonder Alonso** for the team lead...the 24 home runs are the most by an American League duo and second most by a Major League duo (Harper and Zimmerman, WAS 26)...**Trevor Plouffe** has an A's season-high nine-game hitting streak (14-for-33, .424).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue tosses a three-hit shutout and Rick Monday and Reggie Jackson homer in the A's 3-0 win over Milwaukee...in **2004** Bobby Kielty homers twice and drives in four runs as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-2...in **2006** Dan Haren and Huston Street combine on a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat San Francisco, 1-0.

17 YONDER ALONSO

Current Streak: 0 for 12
Seattle Series: 0-8, r, 4 bb, 5 so
Last Road Trip: 2-19, 2 r, hr, 2 rbi, 5 bb, 8 so

- Left the game on Wednesday night in Seattle in the seventh inning with soreness in his left knee...did not play last night.
- Is 2-for-21 (.095) with a home run, two RBI and seven walks over his last seven games.
- Leads the majors with eight home runs in the month of May and is tied for second in the American League with 15 RBI...the home runs are his most ever in a month, topping his four in April of 2017 and May of 2014.
- Has six home runs in his last 11 games and 12 for the season, which is a new career high...his previous high of nine came in 155 games in 2012.
- Ranks second in the AL in batting with runners in scoring position (.448), tied for third in home runs (12), fourth in slugging (.619), tied for fifth in RBI (29) and tied for 10th in extra base hits (17).
- Leads AL first baseman in home runs (12), RBI (29) and slugging (.624) and ranks second in on-base percentage (.370).
- Is batting .298 (28-for-94) against right-handed pitching, .167 (4-for-24) against left-handers...each of his four hits off lefties are for extra bases (one double, three home runs).
- Has hit safely in each of his four career games against Boston, all last year...is 5-for-15 (.333) with three doubles and three RBI.

Last Year: Batted .253 with 34 doubles, seven home runs and 56 RBI in 156 games in his first season with Oakland...had career highs in games and runs scored (52)...ranked second among AL first baseman with a .997 fielding percentage.

20 MARK CANHA

Current Streak: 0 for 2
Seattle Series: 3-7, 2 r, 2b, hr, 3 rbi, bb, 3 so, sb
Last Road Trip: 5-12, 2 r, 2 2b, hr, 4 rbi, bb, 3 so, sb, gidp

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 9 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 7-for-17 (.412) with two doubles, a home run and four RBI in six games, four starts (two in center field, one in left field, one in right field), since his return.
- Has made each of his last two starts in center field, his first two career starts in center...has started nine games this year at four different positions (five in right field, two in center field, one in left field, one at designated hitter).
- Is 5-for-16 (.313) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in five career games against Boston.
- Recorded three hits on Tuesday at Seattle...it was his first three-hit game since Sept. 15, 2015 at Chicago (AL).
- Had a go-ahead pinch-hit double a week ago tonight at Texas, his second career pinch hit...is 2-for-19 (.105) as a pinch hitter in his career.
- Was on Oakland's Opening Day roster and went 2-for-19 (.105) in six games before he was optioned to Nashville April 15.
- Hit .300 over his first 13 games with Nashville but was 1-for-19 over his final six games before his return to Oakland...was 7-for-15 (.467) with runners in scoring position...appeared in 15 games in right field, three in center field and one at DH...his complete 2017 minor league stats:

Last Year: Missed nearly the entire season after undergoing surgery on his left hip on May 24...appeared in just 16 games and batted .122 with six RBI...collected five hits but three of those were home runs.

2 KHRIS DAVIS

Current Streak: 1 game (2 for 3)
Boston Series: 2-3, r, hr, rbi, bb, gidp
Last Road Trip: 1-20, r, hr, 2 rbi, bb, 4 so, hbp

- Homered for the second time in his last four games last night after going homerless in each of his previous 12 contests...has two homers in May after hitting 10 in the month of April.
- Went 2-for-3 last night after going 2-for-32 (.063) over his previous eight games...is now batting .156 (15-for-96) with 16 walks over his last 27 games after hitting .340 with three walks over his first 12 contests.
- Is tied for third in the American League in home runs (12) and go-ahead RBI (9)...however, has the second lowest batting average with runners in scoring position (.100) and is tied for fifth in strikeouts (49).
- Is a .400 (16-for-40) career hitter against Boston with six doubles, two home runs and six RBI in 10 games.
- Is hitting .148 (9-for-61) with 20 strikeouts in 15 games in the month of May...the average is currently his lowest for any month of his career (.186 in Sept. 2016 and July 2015).
- Is batting .351 (13-for-37) during the day, .170 (18-for-106) at night.

Last Year: Batted .247 with 42 HR and 102 RBI in 150 games in his first season with the A's...became the fifth player in Oakland history and seventh in Athletics history to hit 40 home runs...tied for third in the American League in home runs.

11 RAJAI DAVIS

Current Streak: 1 game (2 for 5)
Boston Series: 2-5, 2b, rbi, so, cs
Last Road Trip: 4-17, 4 r, 2b, 2 bb, so, cs, gidp

- Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 2 and is batting .226 (12-for-53) in 15 games since his return...hit .214 over his first 15 games.
- Was caught stealing for the fourth time last night and is 4-for-8 (50.0%) in stolen base attempts...the caught stealings are tied for second most in the American League and the on-base percentage is tied for fourth lowest.
- Has 120 career stolen bases as an Athletic, which ranks ninth in Oakland history, one behind Mike Davis.
- Has 33 career stolen bases against Boston, which are second only to his 36 against Chicago (AL).
- Is batting .218 (17-for-78) in 18 games in the leadoff spot, .375 (6-for-16) in six games hitting ninth.
- Was placed on the 10-day DL April 25 retroactive to April 22 with a strained left hamstring and missed eight games.

Last Year: Played for the American League Champion Cleveland Indians and hit .249 with 12 HR and 48 RBI in 134 games...had career highs in runs (74), home runs and walks (33)...led the AL and ranked fourth in the majors with 43 steals.

25 RYON HEALY

Current Streak: 6 games (8 for 24)
Boston Series: 1-4, r, 2 so
Last Road Trip: 7-23, r, 2b, hr, 2 rbi, bb, 6 so, cs

- Is batting .314 (16-for-51) with four home runs over his last 13 games after hitting .228 with three home runs over his first 27 contests.
- Is hitting .389 (14-for-36) with three home runs against left-handed pitching compared to .216 (25-for-116) with four home runs against right-handers...ranks fourth in the American League in batting against lefties.
- Is batting .323 (21-for-65) with five of his seven home runs and 12 of his 16 RBI at home compared to .207 (18-for-87) on the road.
- Has made 38 starts at three different positions (21 at designated hitter, nine at third base, eight at first base)...is batting .193 (16-for-83) with two home runs and four RBI in 22 games at designated hitter...has a .333 (23-for-69) average with five home runs and 12 RBI in his other 18 games.
- Has hit safely in each of his last 11 starts when playing a position on the field...is batting .432 (19-for-44) with four homers and 10 RBI during that span.
- Has committed at least one error in each of his last three games at third base (four errors total).

Last Year: Was called up by Oakland July 15 and started 72 of the A's 73 games after the All-Star Break at third base in his ML debut...led ML rookies in doubles after the break (20) and topped AL rookies in hits (82) and extra base hits (33).

23 MATT JOYCE

Current Streak: 1 game (1 for 3)
Boston Series: 1-3, r, bb, so
Last Road Trip: 6-23, 3 r, 3 hr, 7 rbi, bb, 4 so, gidp

- Is batting .250 (13-for-52) over his last 14 games after hitting .162 over his first 22 contests.
- Has three home runs and seven RBI over his last seven games after tallying two home runs and 10 RBI over his first 29 games...four of his last seven RBI gave the A's the lead...had no go-ahead RBI prior to that.
- Is batting .316 (6-for-19) against left-handed pitchers, .178 (18-for-101) with all five of his home runs, all 17 of his RBI and all 12 of his walks against right-handers...his average against righties is fourth lowest in the American League...has made 29 of his 32 starts this year and 364 of his 379 starts over the last five years against righties.
- Is hitting .140 (7-for-50) at home, .243 (17-for-70) with all five of his home runs and 15 of his 17 RBI on the road.
- Nine of his last 16 hits are for extra bases (five doubles, four home runs).
- Has not committed an error in 35 games in the outfield...now has a 129-game errorless streak as an outfielder dating back to his last error on May 30, 2015.
- Recorded his first three-hit game since June 24, 2016 last Sunday afternoon at Texas, going 3-for-5 with a homer.

Last Year: Spent the entire season with Pittsburgh and batted .242 with 13 home runs and 42 RBI in 140 games...added 59 walks for a career-high .403 on-base percentage...set a Major League record with 21 pinch-walks.

8 JED LOWRIE**Current Streak:** 1 game (2 for 4)**Boston Series:** 2-4, r, hr, 2 rbi, so**Last Road Trip:** 4-25, 2 r, 2 2b, rbi, 2 bb, 4 so, gidp

- Snapped a 0-for-13 streak in the first inning last night with his fifth home run of the season...had just two home runs in 87 games last year.
- Is 6-for-35 (.171) with four walks over his last nine games...is batting .233 (14-for-60) in May after hitting .292 in April.
- Is batting .296 (32-for-108) with all five of his home runs and 10 of his 11 RBI at night, .195 (8-for-41) during the day.
- Has hit all five of his home runs this year off right-handed pitching...each of his last 10 home runs have come against righties...his last homer off a lefty came on Aug. 31, 2015 against Seattle (Nuno).
- Is batting .125 (3-for-24) with runners in scoring position...last year, he hit .483 with RISP over his first 34 games through May 27.
- Has committed just one error and ranks fourth among American League second basemen in fielding percentage (.993).

Last Year: Returned to the A's and batted .263 with two home runs and 27 RBI in 87 games in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list...has missed 152 games during three stints on the DL over the previous two seasons.

19 JOSH PHEGLEY**Current Streak:** 1 game (1 for 3)**Seattle Series:** 1-3, rbi**Last Road Trip:** 1-5, rbi, so

- Was activated from the 7-day concussion DL a week ago today and is 1-for-5 (.200) in two games, one start, since his return.
- Has appeared in 14 games this year, including 10 starts (eight against left-handed pitching and two against right-handed pitching)...is hitting .143 (3-for-21) against lefties, .278 (5-for-18) against righties.
- Is 6-for-19 (.316) with four doubles in six career games against Boston.
- Has tossed out 3-of-8 (37.5%) attempted base stealers.
- Was batting .206 with a home run and three RBI in 12 games when he was placed on the concussion DL May 4...missed seven games.

Last Year: Hit .256 with a home run and 10 RBI in 26 games in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right knee (May 10-26 and July 2-end of season)...his batting average was the best of his four ML seasons.

18 CHAD PINDER**Current Streak:** 1 game (1 for 4)**Boston Series:** 1-4, r, hr, 2 rbi, 2 so**Last Road Trip:** 1-4, r, 2b, bb, 2 so

- Is 9-for-28 (.321) over his last 12 games after going 2-for-11 (.182) over his first six contests.
- Is batting .350 (7-for-20) with all three of his home runs against right-handed pitchers, .211 (4-for-19) against left-handers.
- Struck out as a pinch hitter Wednesday and is 0-for-4 with three strikeouts in the pinch.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 16 and has started 11 games at five different positions (four at second base, four at designated hitter, two at shortstop, one in right field).
- Was batting .324 in nine games with the Sounds at the time of his promotion.

Last Year: Made both his Triple-A and Major League debuts in 2016...hit .256 with 14 home runs and 51 RBI in 107 games with Nashville and .235 with a home run and four RBI in 22 games with Oakland.

3 TREVOR PLOUFFE**Current Streak:** 9 games (14 for 33)**Boston Series:** 3-4, 2 r, 2 2b, rbi, so**Last Road Trip:** 5-18, 5 r, hr, rbi, 2 bb, 3 so

- Had his first three-hit game of the season last night to extend his hitting streak to an A's season-high nine games...is 14-for-33 (.424) with eight runs, four doubles, two home runs and four RBI during the streak.
- Is batting .333 (15-for-45) in May after hitting .207 in April.
- Is hitting .333 (12-for-36) against left-handed pitchers, .220 (20-for-91) with all six of his home runs against right-handers.
- Is batting .313 (20-for-64) with five of his six home runs and 11 of his 13 RBI at home compared to .190 (12-for-63) on the road.
- Is hitting .329 (24-for-73) with five of his six home runs with the bases empty, .148 (8-for-54) with runners on base...his mark with runners on base is tied for fifth lowest in the American League.
- Is tied for third in the AL in grounded into double plays (8).

Last Year: Batted a career-high .260 with 12 home runs and 47 RBI in 84 games with Minnesota in a season interrupted by three stints on the DL...missed a total of 65 games while on the DL and his 84 games played were his fewest since 2011.

16 ADAM ROSALES**Current Streak:** 1 game (1 for 4)**Boston Series:** 1-4, rbi, 2 so**Last Road Trip:** 5-17, r, hr, 2 rbi, bb, 5 so, sh

- Is 2-for-12 (.167) over his last four games after hitting .316 over his previous 11 contests.
- Is batting .345 (10-for-29) against left-handed pitching, .228 (18-for-79) against right-handers.
- Has started 28 of the A's 30 games at shortstop since the injury to Semien and is batting .247 (24-for-97) in 30 games total over that span.
- Is tied for third among American League shortstop in errors (4).

Last Year: Batted .229 with 13 home runs and 35 RBI in 105 games with San Diego...posted career highs in games, runs (37), doubles (12), triples (3), home runs, RBI, walks (29), slugging percentage, OPS (.814) and extra base hits (28).

10 MARCUS SEMIEN**Current Streak:** 1 game (1 for 2)

- Was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 16 retroactive to April 15 with a right wrist contusion...it is his first career stint on the DL...was diagnosed with a fractured scaphoid bone and had surgery to insert a screw into the bone April 18...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 20.

Last Year: Played in all but three games and batted .238 with 27 HR and 75 RBI in 159 games...is the fifth shortstop in Athletics history to hit 20 home runs...the home runs tied for first in the majors and tied for fourth in Athletics history by a shortstop.

21 STEPHEN VOGT**Current Streak:** 0 for 6**Boston Series:** 0-3, r, bb**Last Road Trip:** 5-15, 2 r, 2b, hr, 3 rbi, 4 bb, 2 so

- Is 5-for-15 (.333) over his last five games...went 8-for-28 (.286) over his first seven games but was 9-for-58 (.155) in 21 games in between.
- Has made 27 of his 28 starts in games started by a right-handed pitcher...is batting .236 (21-for-89) against right-handers but is just 1-for-12 (.083) against lefties.
- Is hitting .381 (8-for-21) during the day, .175 (14-for-80) at night.
- Has committed four errors, which is tied with Derek Norris (TB) for the most among American League catchers...has tossed out 2-of-23 (8.7%) attempted base stealers...the 21 stolen bases are the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Cervelli, PIT 27)...the caught stealing percentage is second lowest (McCann, DET 5.3%).
- Snapped his career-high 27-game homerless streak with a two-run homer Monday at Seattle (previous: 25, Sept. 1, 2015-April 13, 2016).
