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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-29) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (27-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a four-game losing streak, which is one short of the season high of five (April 23-28)...the losing streak has dropped the A's a season-low seven games under .500 at 22-29 (.431)...that is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 14 games...this marks just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 14 or more games before the start of June...the other time was in 2001 when they trailed by 14 games as early as May 29...have never trailed by more than 14 games in the month of May...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and nine days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this seven-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (0-2)...went 1-5 on the last road trip and have lost 17 of the last 21 road games...have lost each of the last six road series, which is their longest such streak since June 3-July 10, 2011 when they also lost six straight...have not lost more than six straight road series since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 7-19 (.269) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-20), compared to 15-10 (.600) at home...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Washington (three games) and Toronto (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 13 of the last 18 home games...are 1-7-0 in road series compared to 5-1-2 in home series.

IN MAY: The A's offense has set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of May with 244...last month, set a franchise record for strikeouts in April (221)...have hit 43 home runs, which is three short of the Athletics record for home runs in May (46 in 2000)...it is tied for the seventh best total in any month in Athletics history and is the most since August of 2001 when they also had 43...rank fourth in the American League in home runs this month...are 11-15 (.423), which is the third worst record in the AL...however, have matched their May win total from each of the previous two seasons (11-17 last year, 11-19 in 2015)...pitchers have 211 strikeouts, which is the second best May total in franchise history (230 in 2015).

OFFENSE: The A's struck out 19 times last night to tie the Athletics franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game (June 24, 1997 at Seattle)...have struck out 65 times in the last five games, which matches the most in Oakland history over a five-game stretch (July 28-Aug. 1, 2012)...have 465 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League but 107 fewer than Tampa Bay (572)...have the second fewest runs scored (207), the second lowest on-base percentage (.306) and the third lowest batting average (.237)...have the third most extra base hits (165) and the fourth best slugging percentage (.424)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest mark in the majors...are batting .216 (75-for-347) with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's had their streak of consecutive games with a home run snapped at a season-high tying 10 last night...have now homered in 20 of their last 22 games (40 home runs total) and have 74 home runs for the season...that is second most in Athletics history after 51 games to the 2000 club, which had 75 (did not homer in game 52 in 2000)...rank fifth in the majors in home runs hit and tied for second in fewest home runs allowed (51)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 16 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 14...the 30 combined home runs are the most by a Major League duo...13 of the A's last 22 home runs have come with runners on base...110 of the A's 207 runs (53.1%) have come on home runs...are 21-20 when homering, 1-9 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-14)...are 17-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-18 when they don't.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 51 errors, which is 12 more than any other team (LAD, 39)...have 35 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (ATL, 36)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but

they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...the A's lead the majors in errors by catchers (10) and outfielders (10)...the 10 errors by catchers match the most by Oakland catchers over the last five years (2014, 2015)...the A's have allowed 47 stolen bases, which is seven more than any other team (CHI-NL, 40).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.96 ERA (45 er in 68.0 ip) and .282 (75-for-266) opponents batting average over the last eight games...now have a 4.50 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (23), have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.391) and the third most wild pitches (28).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-17 with a 4.79 ERA (95 er in 178.2 ip) over the last 33 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 16-22 with a 4.45 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the American League and the A's 277.1 innings pitched are third fewest...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.390) and have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.244)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (31)...have used nine different starting pitchers, which is tied for second most in the AL (SEA, 12).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters have hit five home runs in the last 11 games after belting just two home runs over the first 40 contests...are batting .214 (41-for-192) with seven home runs and 18 RBI overall...the RBI are the fewest in the American League and the batting average is third lowest.

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting .157 (33-for-210) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .233 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest (KC, .170/.204)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-47 (.149) with four walks (.239 on-base percentage) to start the game.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-7 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 8-6...have used a different lineup in each of their last 46 games...have used 49 different lineups overall in 51 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 5-6 (.455) in one-run games, including 1-5 on the road...the 11 one-run games are second fewest in the American League (MIN, 9) and the record is fourth worst...have a run differential of -51, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -52)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2017 after losing the season series last year, 4-2...went 2-1 in Oakland and 0-3 in Cleveland...now have a five-game losing streak at Progressive Field, which is the A's third longest in this ballpark (9, May 27, 1994-June 11, 1996; 6, April 13, 2008-July 4, 2009)...over the previous six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, 13, 16) and won three (2012, 14, 15)...are 22-23 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 270-238 against the Indians...that breaks down to 143-104 in Oakland and 127-134 in Cleveland...including 42-65 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 905-1031 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso leads the majors with 10 home runs in the month of May...is the seventh player in Oakland history to hit 10 home runs in May, the second in the last two years (Davis, 11 in 2016)...**Daniel Coulombe** has not allowed a hit to a first batter faced in his last 13 appearances (0-for-11, bb, hbp)...**Ryon Healy** is batting .330 (30-for-91) over his last 23 games after hitting .228 over his first 27 contests...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .419 (18-for-43) with six doubles and two home runs over his last 11 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire homers twice in the A's 9-5 loss at New York...the two homers give McGwire 15 in May, an Oakland record for homers in one month...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 home runs en route to Rookie of the Year honors...in **2006** Bobby Crosby hits a solo home run in the fourth inning of the A's 7-0 victory over Kansas City, the 6000th home run in Oakland history.

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TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-3, 4.35 ERA)

BACK-TO-BACK WINS: Has won each of his last two starts and has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) and a .205 (9-for-44) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 11...it marks the second two-game winning streak of his career (Sept. 14-Oct. 2, 2016).

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his eight starts this year...also surrendered five hits or fewer in each of his final six starts last year...has a streak of 14 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more...that matches the second longest such streak by an American League pitcher since at least 1913...the longest is 15 games by Tom Gordon from June 24-Sept. 2, 1992...it is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over that span.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .065 (2-for-31) batting average compared to .218 (26-for-119) by right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 20 or more innings...his career splits are .153 (20-for-131) against lefties. .254 (143-for-564) against righties...has a .485 career OPS against lefties, .735 against righties...held lefties to a .180 batting average last year, which was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .526 OPS against lefties last year, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .187 (28-for-150) opponents batting average, which is second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...opponents are batting .149 (14-for-94) with the bases empty compared to .250 (14-for-56) with runners on base...however, they are 6-for-33 (.182) with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...opponents are 6-for-83 (.072) with two strikes...they are 3-for-35 (.086) when leading of an inning but he has walked five and hit three for a .256 on-base percentage...has held the opponents two, three and four hitters to a .130 (7-for-54) batting average...however, has issued nine walks and hit two for a .277 on-base percentage...has a .274 (17-for-62) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .125 (11-for-88) after that...has a .117 (11-for-94) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .304 (17-for-56) average with 15 of his 18 opponents RBI with two outs

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has hit four batters, which is tied for fourth most in the American League and matches his season total from last year (144.2 innings)...has surrendered just three home runs in 41.1 innings, an average of 0.65 per nine innings...that is sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 40 or more innings.

THE SECOND INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 23 runs in the second inning for a 14.63 ERA (13 er in 8.0 ip)...has a 1.89 ERA (7 er in 33.1 ip) in all other innings...opponents are batting .410 (16-for-39) with a .452 on-base percentage (3 bb) in the second inning, .108 (12-for-111) with a .238 on-base percentage (15 bb, 4 hbp, 0 sf) in all other innings.

THE DISABLED LIST: Is 2-1 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 15...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled pitch on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 7.30 ERA (10 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts on four days rests compared to 2-1 with a 3.10 ERA (10 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 5.59 ERA (12 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 7-3 with a 3.08 ERA (36 er in 105.1 ip) in 18 career games in the Coliseum compared to 3-9 with a 5.13 ERA (46 er in 80.2 ip) in 15 starts on the road.

2017 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) **April 4** in Oakland...left trailing 4-2 after six innings but the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas **April 9**...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...had a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston in Oakland on **April 15**...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against

Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Seattle **April 21** in Oakland...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...the longest is a five-game streak by Mike Norris in 1980...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple...retired the side in order just once: the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth and then scored twice in the sixth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 26**...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second...was relieved by Montas to start the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle on **May 15**...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings...issued bases loaded walks to Valencia and Gamel in the first inning and allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the second...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced following the Cruz home run...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 8-3 victory over Boston **May 20** in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Ramirez home run and a Rutledge RBI ground out, but Oakland came back to tie the game in the bottom of the second...allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Pedroia RBI single but the A's scored five times in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win at New York (AL) last Friday...tossed a career-high tying 106 pitches...pitched 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just four hits and a walk...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...Tanaka blanked the A's over the first seven innings but Oakland scored twice in the eighth and ninth innings for the win.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (3-5, 5.56 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start since being recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with Oakland this year...took the loss that day at New York (AL) in a 3-2 A's loss (5.2 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 3 bb, 5 so)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...is 2-2 with a 3.13 ERA and .207 opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 1-3 with an 8.27 ERA and .321 opponents average in four starts in Oakland...suffered his first career loss in a day game in his last start...is 3-1 with a 2.55 ERA and .159 opponents batting average in four starts during the day this year compared to 0-4 with an 9.47 ERA and .369 opponents average in four starts at night...has never faced the Indians in his career.

- The bullpen has allowed six earned runs over its last six games (16.1 ip, 3.31 ERA) after surrendering 12 earned runs over its previous two outings.
- Has recorded just one save in its last five chances dating back to May 12, a span of 17 games...overall, are 9-for-16 (56.3%) in save chances and has the third lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Six wins by relievers are tied for the fewest in the American League.
- In the month of May at home, the bullpen is sporting a 4-0 record with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in ten games...had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on May 21...road ERA in May is 6.69 (28 er in 37.2 ip).
- Has allowed 21-of-62 (33.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the sixth highest percentage in the AL.
- Relievers rank first in the majors in stolen bases allowed (19).
- Rank third in the AL in unearned runs (11), and tied for fourth in wild pitches (12) and runs (97).
