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### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-31) VS. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (34-19)

SATURDAY, JUNE 3, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost two straight and six of the last seven games and are a season-high eight games under .500 at 23-31 (.426)...that is the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 15½ games...the only other time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 15½ or more games this early in the season was in 2001 when they were 16 games out after 54 games (remained 16 games out after a win in game 55 but dropped to 16½ out following an off day after game 55)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 12 days in fifth.

**ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON:** The A's played their 54th game of the season last night, which is the one-third mark of the season...are on pace to finish the season 69-93, which would match last years record and be their third straight 90 loss season...the offense is on pace to set Athletics record for most strikeouts (1503) and fewest triples (12)...the .233 batting average would be the lowest in Oakland history (.236 in 1982) and the .302 on-base percentage would tie for the lowest (1979)...are on pace for 639 runs, which would be the fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (573), and 234 home runs, which would be fourth most in Oakland history and the most since 2000 (239)...the pitching staff is on pace for 93 wild pitches, which would set an Athletics record, and 69 hit batters, which would set an Oakland record...are on pace for 120 unearned runs, which would set an Oakland record and be the most by an A's team since 1942 (122)...are on pace for 165 errors, which would rank fourth in Oakland history and be the most since 1979 (174).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 1-2 in interleague play (1-1 vs. Miami, 0-1 vs. Washington)...will also host Atlanta (June 30-July 2) and San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to Miami (June 13-14), New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last year, which was the fifth worst record in the majors and the worst mark by an American League team...it was the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the first time since 2011 and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...are 199-168 (.542) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this six-game homestand against Washington (0-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 13 of the last 19 home games...are 15-11 (.577) at home compared to 8-20 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-21)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 18 of the last 23 road games...have not lost a series over their last six home series (5-0-1)...have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 5-1-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

**THE LONG BALL...:** The A's have hit 78 home runs, which ranks fourth in the American League and is second most in Athletics history after 54 games...the 2000 A's had 79 (hit two in game 55)...Chris Davis leads the A's with 16 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 15...the 31 combined home runs match the most by a Major League duo (Bour and Stanton, MIA)...each of the A's last six runs and 116 of their 213 runs (54.5%) for the season have come on home runs...are 22-21 when homering, 1-10 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-14)...despite allowing five home runs last night, the pitching staff has yielded just 57 for the season, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are 18-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-22 when they don't.

**...AND THE STRIKEOUT:** The A's have struck out 101 times over the last eight games (12.6 strikeouts per game), which is an Oakland record for strikeouts over an eight-game stretch...it includes a franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game on Tuesday (19) and 17 on Thursday...

have 501 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 588).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high tying three errors Thursday (fifth time, third time in last 10 games) and now have 55 errors for the season, which is 15 more than any other team...the errors have led to a Major League leading 40 unearned runs (ATL, 35)...have allowed a ML leading 48 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 41).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .196 (44-for-225) with 20 runs scored over the last seven games (2.9 runs per game) and are 3-for-40 (.075) with runners in scoring position...for the season, rank second to last in the American League in runs scored (213), batting average (.233) and on-base percentage (.302) to Kansas City (182/.232/.290)...have the fourth most extra base hits in the AL (172)...rank last in the majors in batting with the bases loaded (.139) and second to last in the AL in batting with runners in scoring position (.208)...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.160) and second to last in on-base percentage (.242)...designated hitters rank last in the AL in RBI (18) and slugging (.350).

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed a season-high 13 runs on a season-high 20 hits last night, topping the previous highs of 12 runs on May 21 against Boston and 19 hits on May 23 against Miami...have allowed 37 runs over the last four home games and opponents are batting .356 (58-for-163) over that stretch...have compiled a 5.94 ERA (62 er in 94.0 ip) over the last 11 games overall and now have a 4.58 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL in wild pitches (31) and are tied for the lead in hit batters (23)...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.399).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 8-19 with a 4.75 ERA (103 er in 195.0 ip) over the last 36 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 17-24 with a 4.44 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.393) and have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.244)...are tied with St. Louis for the fewest home runs in the majors (34).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 2-8 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 10-6...through games of Thursday, the A's success ratio of 20.0% was second worst in the majors (MIL, 1-6)...have used a different lineup in each of their last 49 games...have used 52 different lineups overall in 54 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...the went 12-15 (.444) in the month of May, which was the third worst record in the American League...have now posted a losing record in seven consecutive months, which is their longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had seven straight months with a losing record (excludes October).

**A's vs. NATIONALS:** The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 last night and are now 3-4 all-time against the Nationals...this is just the third series between the two clubs...last met in 2014 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland, May 9-11...the A's were swept in the first meeting in 2005 at RFK Stadium, June 7-9...Oakland is the only team that has never played a game at Nationals Park...the A's also swept a three-game series from the Expos in 2003 and are 6-4 all-time against the Nationals/Expos.

**Yonder Alonso** is tied for fifth in the American League with a career-high 15 home runs...leads AL first baseman in on-base percentage (.385) and slugging percentage (.671), is tied for the lead in home runs (15) and ranks third in RBI (32)...**Khris Davis** has homered six times in his last 17 games and is tied for second in the AL in home runs (16)...**Chad Pinder** has six home runs in his last 15 games and seven for the season, which is tied for third among AL rookies.

**THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY**  
In **1980**, the A's trail 4-1 entering the ninth inning at Cleveland when Dave Revering, Mitchell Page and Tony Armas hit consecutive home runs to send the game into extra innings...the A's would go on to lose 6-4 in 10 innings...in **2004** the A's tie an Oakland record by playing their third straight extra inning game, a 2-1 win against Toronto in 11 innings.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-1, 13.50 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Monday and will be making his second start of 2017...began the season on the 10-day disabled list following right foot surgery on Feb. 8...started a rehab assignment with Nashville on May 8 and made three starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is scheduled to make the 16th start of his career today and it will be his fifth against a National League team...is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four interleague starts compared to 1-7 with an 8.17 ERA in 11 starts against the American League.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is scheduled to make his first home start of the season today...is 0-7 in his career in the Coliseum and his seven-game career-opening home losing streak is tied for second longest by an Athletic since at least 1913 with Wally Burnette (July 24-Sept. 9, 1956)...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hastly (Sept. 11, 1919-Aug. 11, 1921)...it is tied for third longest in Oakland history at any point in the season and is the longest since Mike Mohler also lost seven straight home games from Aug. 16, 1996-May 28, 1997...last year, he went 0-7 with a 6.86 ERA in eight starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 6.06 ERA in six starts on the road...is just the third Athletics pitcher since at least 1911 to go 0-7 or worse at home...joins Tom Sheehan (0-7 in 1916) and Rip Coleman (0-7 in 1959)...tied for fifth in the AL in home losses.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is schedule to make his second day start of the season today...took the loss in his first start and is now 0-7 in seven career starts during the day...last year, he was 0-6 with a 4.50 ERA in six starts during the day compared to 2-3 with an 8.29 ERA in eight starts at night...is the first A's pitcher to go 0-6 or worse during the day since Diego Segui went 0-9 for the Kansas City A's in 1965...tied for fourth in the AL in day losses.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland on Monday...allowed three home runs, which marks the first time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in a start...yielded a leadoff home run to Jackson in the third inning and then surrendered four runs in the fourth inning on back-to-back homers by Santana and Encarnacion, a RBI singles by Gomes and a Jackson sacrifice fly.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Was 2-1 with a 2.21 ERA in four starts...went 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA and five walks in 7.1 innings over his first two starts and was 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA and no walks in 13.0 innings over his final two...allowed a .189 opponents batting average, including .167 (8-for-48) against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (6-for-26) against right-handers...held opponents to a .150 batting average and no walks when leading off an inning and surrendered his only two home runs in that situation.

**START-BY-START WITH NASHVILLE:** Began his rehab assignment on **May 8** against El Paso and took the loss in a 5-4 decision...allowed two runs in the third inning on a Carlos Asuaje RBI double and a Nick Buss sacrifice fly...left with two outs in the fourth inning and the Sounds trailing 2-1...had a no decision in a 7-3 Sounds win over Albuquerque on **May 13**...faced one batter over the minimum over the first three innings, issuing a one-out walk to Tony Wolters in the first...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth inning on a Wolters leadoff home run and a Domonic Brown RBI single...left with a 4-2 lead and two outs in the fourth after throwing 76 pitches...picked up his first win in Nashville's 13-3 win at Fresno **May 18**...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when he surrendered a leadoff home run to Max Stassi in the bottom of the third...combined with Chris Smith on a three-hit shutout in Nashville's 10-0 win over Omaha **May 23** in Nashville...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits...did not walk a batter.

**SURGERY:** Had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...he fractured his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner.

**2016 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut with Oakland in his third professional season after beginning the year with no experience above Single-A...went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts with Double-A Midland, 8-2 with a 1.67 ERA in 13 starts with Triple-A Nashville and 2-9 with a 6.50 ERA in 14 starts over two stints with Oakland...his ERA with the A's was second highest in the majors among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched (Blair, ATL 7.59)...his .182 winning percentage was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more decisions (Morgan, PHI .154) and sixth lowest in Oakland history...tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (72.0) and strikeouts (71).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .284 opponents batting average, which included a .283 (39-for-138) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .286 (44-for-154) against right-handers...yielded a .212 opponents batting average and one home run the first time through the lineup, .333 and eight home runs after that...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position but that mark dropped to .207 with RISP and two outs...held the opponents number five hitter to a .143 batting average, but then seven through nine hitters in the order combined to bat .353.

**THIS AND THAT:** Combined for a 2.57 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in innings one and two...had a 9.00 ERA and .316 opponents average from the third inning on...was 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts before the All-Star Break, 1-5 with an 8.42 ERA in eight starts after the break...received 22 runs of support in his two wins (13.50 RSA) and just 18 runs of support in his other 12 starts (2.83 RSA)...the A's were 3-11 (.214) in his starting assignments.

**MORE WITH OAKLAND:** Was selected from Nashville June 11 and made his ML debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...allowed two runs in 5.2 innings but took the loss in a 2-1 decision...struck out the first batter he faced (Zack Cozart)...fanned a career-high nine batters and tossed a career-high 108 pitches but fell to 0-3 in a 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22...joined Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillellet (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...earned his first big league win in his fourth start on June 27 at San Francisco...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and allowed just two runs in the A's 8-3 win...became the eighth pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...was 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA in four starts in June...then went 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA in five starts in July...that was the second highest July ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Steve Karsay, 9.36 in 1997)...fell to 1-4 with a loss in his fifth start on July 3 against Pittsburgh...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000...was optioned to Nashville July 26 but returned to Oakland Sept. 3...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in a 14-5 win on Sept. 15 at Kansas City to snap his career-high four-game losing streak...logged a 9.39 ERA and .328 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned seven starts from July 3 to Sept. 9...went 1-4 with an 8.10 ERA in five starts in September...tied for second in the AL in September losses.

**2016 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP:** Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Midland and Nashville...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for second in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...his opponents batting average included a .190 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 against right-handers...surrendered all four of his home runs to righties...issued 19 of his 29 walks to lefties...three of the four home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .165 with a .232 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...compiled a 0.53 ERA over innings one through four...had a 3.56 ERA from the fifth inning on...the RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 10-3...his teams combined for a 14-3 (.824) record in his 17 starts.

<b>RHP Sonny Gray (2-2, 4.72 ERA):</b>	Is 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 7.02 ERA and .284 opponents average in three starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road...is 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA in two starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 6.35 ERA in four starts at night...has allowed all five of his home runs at night...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-4 A's loss at Cleveland last Tuesday (4.2 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Washington, a start in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win in Oakland on May 10, 2014 (7.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 4-5 with a 3.40 ERA in 13 career interleague appearances, including 12 starts...went 0-0 with a 15.75 ERA and .353 opponents batting average in two starts this spring...went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts last year.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 10-for-17 (58.8%)

- The bullpen allowed seven runs (5.1 ip) last night after allowing nine runs over their previous seven outings (18.2 ip, 3.86 ERA).
- Has recorded just two saves in its last six chances dating back to May 12, a span of 20 games...overall, are 10-for-17 (58.8%) in save chances and has the sixth lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Six wins by relievers are tied for the fewest in the American League.
- In the month of May at home, the bullpen sported a 4-0 record with a 3.00 ERA (16 er in 48.0 ip) in 10 games...had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on May 21...road ERA in May was 6.35 (28 er in 39.2 ip).
- Has allowed 22-of-67 (32.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the seventh highest percentage in the AL.
- Relievers rank first in the majors in stolen bases allowed (19).
- Tied for second in the AL in unearned runs (12), and tied for fourth in wild pitches (12) and fourth in runs (107).

- Has allowed at least one run in four of his five outings this season, 6 earned runs in 4.2 innings.
- Was reinstated from the disabled list May 21 after missing 42 games and has pitched in five games since then.

- Is 11-for-40 (.275) over his last 12 games...went 8-for-28 (.286) over his first seven games but was 9-for-58 (.155) in 21 games in between.
- Has made 33 of his 34 starts in games started by a right-handed pitcher...is batting .237 (27-for-114) against right-handers but is just 1-for-12 (.083) against lefties.
- Is hitting .310 (9-for-29) during the day, .196 (19-for-97) at night.
- Has committed six errors, which is tied for the lead among American League catchers and is one short of his career high of seven from last year.
- Opponents have been successful in each of their last 15 stolen base attempts off him and he has tossed out just 2-of-30 (6.7%) for the season...the stolen base percentage is the worst mark in the majors and the 28 stolen bases are tied for the most.

**Last Year:** Played in a career-high 137 games and hit .251 with 14 home runs and 56 RBI...also had career bests in hits (123), doubles (30) and extra base hits (46)...was named to his second consecutive American League All-Star team.
