TODAY'S MEDIA AVAILABILITY

The Astros clubhouse will open this morning at 10:00 a.m...manager AJ Hinch will be available at approximately 10:45 a.m.

TODAY'S GAME: Today is the finale of this 4-game set here at Rickey Henderson Field at the Oakland Coliseum...rookie RHP David Paulino (1-0) will start for the 'Stros tonight as he takes on A's RHP Jesse Hahn (3-4).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros topped the A's last night, 5-1...RHP Mike Fiers (5-2) earned the win (6 IP, 3 H, 1 ER, 3 BB, 5 SO)...the game was scoreless through 5.0 innings before the Astros tallied 3 in the 6th and never looked back...Carlos Correa (2x5, HR), Evan Gattis (2 RBI) and Yuli Gurriel (2x4) contributed offensively.

MAN ON FIERS: RHP Mike Fiers is now 4-0 in his last 5 starts with a 1.72 ERA (6ER/31.1IP)...his 1.42 ERA (4ER/25.1IP) in June ranks 3rd in the Majors among starters...Roadie: Fiers also has won 7 straight decisions on the road, going 7-0 in his last 11 road starts with a 3.81 ERA (25ER/59IP).

ROAD WARRIORS: Today is the 4th game of a 7-game road trip during which the Astros visit OAK (4g) and SEA (3g, Fri-Sun), respectively...**the Astros are 11-2 in their last 13 road games and have a ML-best 26-8 (.764) record overall on the road in 2017.**

AT THE COLISEUM: The Astros have won 9 straight games here at the Oakland Coliseum and 14 of their last 15 overall vs. the A's...**the current streak here at the Coliseum is the Astros longest at a road ballpark since winning a franchise-record 11 straight at Great American Ball Park in CIN, 2007-09...Role Reversal:** The A's won 15 of the 1st 16 matchups vs. the Astros when the two clubs first began play in 2002.

SWEEPSTAKES: A win today would give the Astros their 7th series sweep of the season and their 5th series sweep on the road...it would also be their 3rd cons. series sweep here in OAK...**4-Gamers:** Last 4-game sweep was 5/14-17/2015 vs. TOR; Last 4-game road sweep was 5/31-6/3/2013 at LAA.

BEST RECORD IN BASEBALL: The Astros have the best record in baseball at 49-24 for a .671 winning pct...the Dodgers (47-26, .644) are second.

BEST START EVER: At 49-24, the Astros are off to their best 73-game start in club history...previous best of 45-28 occurred in 1998.

CATCHING CAL: Carlos Beltrán's HR Tues. night was the 431st of his career, tying him with Cal Ripken, Jr. for 48th place on the all-time ML HR list.

LEADING MAN: George Springer tied his own franchise record with his 8th leadoff HR of the season Tues. night...Springer had 8 leadoff HR in 2016 (Craig Biggio also had 8 in 2001)...the ML record for leadoff HR in a season is 13 set by Alfonso Soriano in 2003 for NYY.

ALL-STAR UPDATES: In the updated All-Star fan voting results released Tuesday by MLB, Jose Altuve (1st), Carlos Correa (1st) and George Springer (3rd) all continue to hold starting positions...the Astros have not had three All-Star starters elected via the fan vote in a single All-Star Game...HOU did have 3 All-Star starters in 2004, but just one (2B Jeff Kent) was elected via the fan vote...OF Lance Berkman replaced an injured Ken Griffey, Jr., and RHP Roger Clemens was the starting pitcher (source: J. Kaplan)...the Astros hosted that '04 game at Minute Maid Park.

SPRINGER'S DINGERS: Monday night, George Springer became the 1st Astros hitter to reach 20 HR prior to the A.S. Break since Carlos Lee (21) and Lance Berkman (22) in 2008...the franchise record for HR in a season prior to the break is 29 set by Berkman in 2002.

STEERING THE SHIP: With a win Sat. night vs. BOS, Astros Manager AJ Hinch (219-177, .553) surpassed Jimmy Williams (215-197) for 9th place in franchise history in managerial wins...next on the list in eighth-place is Terry Collins (224-197), who managed the Astros from 1994-96.

SLUGGERS: As a club, the Astros lead the AL in runs (396) and slugging pct. (.476) and are T-1st in HR (115)...the Astros 115 HR are the most in franchise history through 73 games.

PITCHING IN: The Astros lead the American League in team ERA (3.62) and lead the Major Leagues in strikeouts (738)...Houston's been boosted by a strong rotation, despite a bevy of injuries, as the group owns a 3.51 ERA, close to a half run better than their closest competitor...AL rankings below:

LAST START - 6/17 VS. BOS: earned his 1st career Major League win after holding Boston to 1 run on 3 hits in 6.0 innings...struck out 4 with 1 walk...the 6.0 innings pitched marked a career-high.

ABOUT PAULINO: 23-year-old rookie right-handed pitcher is making his 5th start of the season today...it will also be his 6th career start and his 8th career MLB appearance.

- while this is his 1st stint on the Astros active roster in 2017, he did begin the year on the Major League DL (right arm inflammation)... activated and optioned to the minor leagues on May 12.
- is currently ranked as the Astros No. 3 prospect and the #48 prospect in all of baseball by MLB.com...also named by *Baseball America* as the Astros No. 3 prospect entering the 2017 season.

FROM THE HEAVENS: at 6-foot-7, owns the highest release point in the Major Leagues per Statcast...his 6.99-foot release point sits directly ahead of Yankees LHP Jordan Montgomery (6.97 ft.) and Rangers RHP Tyson Ross (6.92 ft.).

SEASON DEBUT: in his 1st start of the season, became the 3rd starter in franchise history to strike out at least 8 batters in 4.0 innings-or-less... the other 2 were LHP Erik Bedard (4/21/13 vs. CLE) and RHP J.R. Richard (7/27/73 at LAD).

THIS SEASON IN THE MINORS: went 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (7ER/14IP) in 3 starts for Fresno this season...limited opponents to a .208 batting average, while recording 13 strikeouts in 14.0 innings pitched... right-handed hitters were only 4x27 off him this season at Triple A for a .148 average.

THIS SPRING: had a solid Spring Training prior to his injury, posting a 3.86 ERA (3ER/7IP) in 3 games...in his final official outing, tossed 3.0 scoreless frames on March 9 at STL.

ABOUT LAST SEASON: made his Major League debut in 2016, appearing in a total of 3 games, including 1 start in September...debuted as a starter on 9/8 at CLE and was handed the loss after allowing 4 runs on 4 hits in 3.0 innings...has his most effective outing on 9/30 at LAA, tossing 3.0 scoreless in relief.

- went 5-4 with a 2.00 ERA (20ER/90IP), 19 walks and 106 strikeouts in 20 minor league outings (15 starts)...pitched in 14 games at Double A, 3 games at Triple A and 3 games in the Rookie Level Gulf Coast League on a minor league rehab assignment...was a Double A Texas League Midseason All-Star, as he put up a 5-2 record and a 1.83 ERA (13ER/64IP) with 72 strikeouts at the level.

LATIN CONNECTION: Paulino hails from Nizoa, Dominican Republic... he is the 3rd Dominican on the active roster, joining Michael Feliz and Francis Martes.

- prior to his season debut on 5/31 at MIN, the last Dominican to start a game for the Astros was Roberto Hernandez in 2015.
- also, prior to Paulino, the last time the Astros started a rookie pitcher from the Dominican was back in 2011, when both Aneury Rodriguez and Henry Sosa made starts for Houston.

QUICK RISER: advanced from extended Spring Training to the Major Leagues in 2 years from 2015-16...began the 2015 season at extended Spring Training and advanced 3 levels from Class A Short-Season Tri-City to to Class A Advanced Lancaster...advanced another 3 levels in 2016, beginning in Double A Corpus Christi and ending up in Houston.

WHAT A DEAL: was originally signed out the Dominican Republic by Detroit, and spent his first 3 seasons with the org. (2011-13)... acquired by Houston as a PTBNL in a trade that sent RHP Jose Veras to Detroit... missed the entire 2014 season while recovering from Tommy John surgery before debuting in an Astros minor league uniform in 2015.

- 1x5 with a run scored last night at OAK...had his 9-game hitting streak at Oakland Coliseum snapped on Monday with an O4...has gone hitless in only 6 of 42 career games in Oakland...is a career .344 (63x183) hitter with 10 doubles, 2 HR and an .833 OPS at Oakland Coliseum...leads MLB in road batting (.389, 49x126) after leading the the Majors in batting on the road in 2016 (.372).
- recorded multiple hits in 4 straight games from 6/14-18, his longest streak since a 5-game run in 2016...also doubled in 4 straight games, which tied his career-long streak.
- played his 900th career game Mon. becoming the 20th position player to play in 900 games with the Astros...only 31 players in MLB history recorded more hits within their first 900 games than Altuve (1,133)...his hit total was more than **Ted Williams** (1,117), **Albert Pujols** (1,114), **Lou Gehrig** (1,113) and **Pete Rose** (1,100) recorded within their first 900g in the Majors.
- ranks among the top AL players in hits (3rd, 88), OBP (3rd, .397), average (4th), doubles (T-4th, 20), runs (6th, 46), steals (T-7th, 12) and OPS (10th, .921).
- ranks 10th on the club's all-time hits list (1,135)...trails **Bill Doran** by 4 hits for 9th place (1,139)...his 211 career steals rank 6th in club history, trailing **Terry Puhl** by 6 for 5th place (217)...ranks T-13th in runs (496) with **Ken Caminiti**...is trailing **Doug Rader** (520) by 24 for 12th place...224 doubles rank 9th, 2 behind **Puhl** for 8th (226).

- has recorded an extra-base hit in 10 of his last 20 games (.538 SLG, 5 doubles, 6 HR, 17 RBI)...1,060 career extra-base hits rank 2nd all-time among switch hitters, behind **Eddie Murray** (1,099).
- has hit all 10 of his home runs and recorded 27 of his 31 RBI batting left-handed.
