OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-57) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (47-54)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight, five of the last six and seven of the last nine games to fall a season-low-tying 13 games under (35-48 on July 3)...have the second worst record in the American League (CWS, 39-59)...Oakland now trails first place Houston by a season-high 23 games in the AL West...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 23 or more games before the end of July (1979) and just the third time they have been that far back before the end of August (1977 and 1979)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 62 days in fifth place this year...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 17-19 since then.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000: Bob Melvin recorded his 999th career win Sunday at New York (NL) and needs one more to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...there are eight active managers with at least 1,000 wins (Bochy, 1829; Baker, 1826; Scioscia, 1539; Showalter, 1477; Francona, 1435; Hurdle, 1093; Yost, 1059; Maddon, 1034).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a Major League leading 85 errors for the season, which have led to a ML leading 60 unearned runs...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 77 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 80) and two more than the A's season total from last year (75)...have the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (13).

OFFENSE: The A's have tallied 11 total hits in the first three games of this series after collecting at least nine hits in each of the previous four games...are now hitting .205 (150-for-730) over the last 23 games and .235 for the season, which is the lowest in the majors (SD, .236)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (952) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.309) but have the third most extra base hits (326)...have the lowest batting average in the majors among leadoff hitters (.199), two hitters (.192) and outfielders (.223)...are hitting .229 with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the majors to Toronto (.219)...have the third lowest mark in the majors with the bases loaded (.203).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.04 ERA (35 er in 103.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have the third lowest post-break ERA in the American League (NYY, 2.76; BOS, 2.96)...for the season, are tied for the AL lead in wild pitches (54) and are tied for second in hit batters (40).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-8 despite a 3.14 ERA (48 er in 137.2 ip) over the last 22 games...starters ERA since the All-Star break is 2.87 (24 er in 75.1 ip), which is the best in the AL...are 32-41 with a 4.42 ERA (277 er in 564.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but have the fewest home runs allowed (72)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year and their streak of 141 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 230 and ATL, 192)...it is also third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-5 on this seven-game road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-3) and have now lost six of their last seven road games...have scored first in five of six games on the trip but have lost four of those five games...including the current series, have fallen to 2-13-1 in road series this season...are 16-34 (.320) on the road compared to 28-23 (.549) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...return home following the game today for a five-game homestand against Minnesota (three games) and San Francisco (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Cleveland (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-2)...are 9-5-2 in home series.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have compiled a 20-20 (.500) record during day games compared to 24-37 (.393) at night...are batting .264 (361-for-1369) and are averaging 4.90 runs per game during the day (196 runs), .215 (427-for-1988) and 3.82 runs per games at night (233 runs)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors while the day batting average is sixth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have a run differential of -82, which is second worst in the American League to Toronto (-84)...all of their seven losses since the All-Star break have been by three runs or fewer and five of the seven have been one-run losses...however, are 32-30 (.516) overall in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 12-27 (.308) in games decided by four runs or more...the mark in games decided by four runs or more is the worst in the majors (SD, 13-28/.317).

A'S IN JULY: Oakland is 9-12 in the month of July with five games remaining...went 12-16 in June, which marked the A's eighth consecutive month with a losing record...that ties the Oakland record for consecutive months with a losing record (also Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...have a 3.59 ERA (74 er in 185.2 ip) this month, which is third lowest in the American League...the ERA increased each of the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...have issued 55 walks, which is the tied for second fewest in the AL...are batting .214 (143-for-669), which is the lowest in the majors...rank third in the AL in stolen bases (15) and are second in walks (85)...the steals are the A's most in one month since April of 2016 when they also had 15.

THIS AND THAT: Home runs have accounted for 210 of the A's 429 runs this year (49.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...the A's have used 84 different lineups over the first 88 games but have repeated a lineup three times in the last 13 games...are 10-12 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-11...are averaging 3 hours, 7 minutes and 29 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have faced a left-handed starting pitcher 23 times, which is third fewest in the American League (BOS and TEX, 22).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have seven players on the disabled list (Cotton, Graveman, Phegley, Pinder, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), but four of those players are currently on rehab assignments (all but Phegley, Smolinski and Triggs)...have had at least seven players on the DL every day since May 24 and have had at least five players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 21 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's have lost the season series as they are 2-4 with one game left...marks the second time in the last three years they've lost the season series (1-5 in 2015; 3-3 in 2016)...have lost the first three games in Toronto after winning two of three in Oakland...have been swept in a four-game series by Toronto just once all-time (Aug. 4-7, 2008 at Toronto)...have now lost 11 of the last 12 games at Rogers Centre but have won nine of the last 13 games in the Coliseum...are batting .170 (31-for-182) with 19 runs scored in the six games this year (3.2 runs per game)...the pitching staff has a 2.94 ERA (17 er in 52.0 ip)...are 217-194 all-time, including 109-97 in Oakland, 108-95 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 67-63 (.515) in Rogers Centre, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Boston, 127-101, .557).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have scored first in five of the six games on the current road trip, but are 1-4 in those five games...the A's are 5-7 since the break, with **all seven losses** coming by three runs or fewer...five of the seven have been one-run losses...the A's have been swept in a four-game series against Toronto just once all-time (Aug. 4-7, 2008 at Toronto).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1996** Geronimo Berroa and Matt Stairs homered in the A's 6-4 loss at Toronto...it is the 23rd consecutive game in which the A's hit a homer, a club record which ended the following day...in **2008** Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings to extend his career opening scoreless streak to a Major League record 27.0 innings, breaking the previous mark of 25 set by George McQuillan of the 1907 Philadelphia Phillies...the streak would reach 39.0 innings before he allowed his first run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-5, 3.82 ERA)

LAST 12 STARTS: Is 7-2 with a 3.17 ERA (27 er in 76.2 ip) over his last 12 starts dating back to May 20...was 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts...has walked 21 batters in 76.2 innings over his last 12 starts (2.47 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.373), sixth in opponents OPS (.685), and ninth in opponents batting average (.237)...is also tied for third in pickoffs (3), ranks fourth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.76) and tied for ninth in most hit batters (6).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .188 (16-for-85) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (78-for-312) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...his career splits are .184 (34-for-185) against lefties, .258 (195-for-757) against righties.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 4-0 with a 3.19 ERA (11 er in 31.0 ip) in five starts against American League East teams compared to 4-5 with a 4.08 ERA (34 er in 75.0 ip) in 13 starts against everyone else.

INTERDIVISION PLAY: Is 6-0 with a 3.10 ERA (20 er in 58.0 ip) in nine starts against interdivision opponents compared to 2-5 with a 4.69 ERA (25 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West teams...now has an eight-game winning streak against non-AL West teams dating back to last year and has a 2.64 ERA (21 er in 71.2 ip) in 11 starts total over that span...his last loss to a non-divisional foe was on Aug. 7, 2016 against Chicago (AL).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .130 (27-for-208) opponents batting average with two strikes, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...the opponents number three hitter is batting .152 (7-for-46), which is fourth lowest in the AL, the seven hitter is batting .154 (6-for-39), which is seventh lowest...the two hitter is batting .419 (18-for-43), which is the third highest in the majors...opponents are 13-for-44 (.295) with runners in scoring position over his last seven starts after hitting .146 over his first 11.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-1 with a 3.64 ERA (22 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 4.01 ERA (23 er in 51.2 ip) in nine starts on the road...is now 9-4 with a 3.27 ERA (50 er in 137.2 ip) in 23 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-10 with a 4.54 ERA (57 er in 113.0 ip) in 20 starts on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 runs in the second inning for a 7.50 ERA (15 er in 18.0 ip) and 14 in the sixth inning for an 8.53 ERA (12 er in 12.2 ip)...has a 2.14 ERA (18 er in 75.1 ip) in all other innings.

CAREER HIGHS: Picked up his eighth win of the season July 16, which surpasses his season total of seven from his rookie campaign last year...has walked 38, which is one more than last year...has a 3.82 ERA this year after posting a mark of 3.86 last year...has lowed his opponents OPS from .713 last year to .685 this year.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds

8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches)...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a career-high 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at New York (NL) last Saturday...shutout the Mets on five hits over the first five innings and had a 5-0 lead entering the sixth...allowed four runs on five hits in the sixth inning while recording just two outs...surrendered a two-run home run to Bruce, a RBI single to d'Arnaud and a RBI double to Conforto...left with a 5-4 lead but the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save and one in the ninth for the loss...it was the second time the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (April 15 vs. Houston).

win in Oakland on June 5...allowed a RBI double to Donaldson in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the second and two more in the fourth...also yielded a RBI double to Pillar in the fifth and was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 5-2...his other outing came in relief in the A's 5-3 loss on July 17, 2016 in Oakland and he had a no decision (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...allowed a two-run home run to Tulowitzki in the fourth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (2-5, 5.40 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season and his career...is 2-5 over his first eight starts and is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history with five or more losses over his first eight career games...has surrendered at least one home run in seven of his first eight starts and his 11 home runs are tied for third most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first eight career games...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's win at New York (NL) last Sunday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts with Nashville...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings.

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in seven of the last 14 games (12 er in 35.0 ip, 3.09 ERA) after allowing at least one run in each of the previous 12 contests...that tied the Oakland record for consecutive team games with a run allowed by a reliever.
- The pen now has a 4.84 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League (DET, 5.28).
- Has the fewest inherited runners in the AL (117), is tied for first in most stolen bases allowed (36), tied for second in fewest wins (12) and fourth in fewest walks (117).

- Made his 600th career appearance on July 8 at Seattle to become one of 11 active pitchers with 600 games pitched.

- Is third among American League relievers in lowest save percentage (72.7%), tied for third in stolen bases allowed (8), tied for first in blown saves (6) and tied for ninth in saves (16).
