OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-59) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (40-67)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing five in a row...went 10-8 over the first 18 games this year, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 20-21 since then...are 47-59 (.443) overall, which is the second worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 22½ games...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have started August trailing by 22½ or more games (1979)...it is just the third time they have been that far back before the end of August (1977 and 1979)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 67 days in fifth place this year.

LOSING MONTHS: The A's finished July with a 12-14 record, which marks their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

A's IN JULY: The A's led the majors with 112 walks in July, but had the third lowest batting average (.231)...it was the fourth lowest July batting average in Oakland history...struck out 229 times, which was third most in the American League...it also set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of July...have also set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...tied for fourth in the AL in fewest runs scored (108)...the pitching staff compiled a 3.88 ERA after seeing the ERA increase over the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...the bullpen had three saves, which tied for second fewest in the AL and matched the fewest in July in Oakland history (fifth time, last: 2008).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-10 (.286) in interleague play, which is tied for the fourth worst mark in the majors...it is currently the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13, .278 in 2009)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record against the National League for the second consecutive season and seventh time in 21 seasons...have three games remaining with the Giants and will conclude interleague play at Philadelphia, Sept. 15-17...have a 6.16 ERA (86 er in 125.2 ip), which is the highest in the majors (BAL, 5.90)...it is currently the highest in Oakland history (5.77 in 1998)...the offense has drawn 64 walks, which is tied for third most in the majors (NYY 73, CHC 71)...are 202-176 (.534) all-time in interleague play, which is seventh best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this five-game homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-0) and have won nine of the last 12 home games...are 31-24 (.564) at home compared to 16-35 (.314) on the road and the home winning percentage is .250 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-36/.308)...this homestand starts a stretch of 19 consecutive games in California (14 of 19 in Oakland)...begin a five-game road trip to San Francisco (two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) tomorrow...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have now lost seven of their last eight road games...are 10-5-2 in home series compared to 2-13-1 in road series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 87 errors, which have led to a ML leading 61 unearned runs...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 79 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (CHC, 82) and surpasses the A's season total from each of the last two years...outfielders have four assists in the last 10 games but just 15 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .308 (45-for-146) with 22 runs scored over the first four games of the homestand (5.5 runs per game) but are hitting .238 for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (SD, .236)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (990), the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.313) and are tied for the fourth fewest runs scored (455)...have the third most extra base hits (346) and are tied for the third most doubles (191).

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed at least four runs in all four games on the homestand while tossing five innings or fewer three times...

are 1-1 with an 8.68 ERA (18 er in 18.2 ip) over that span...starters are 33-42 with a 4.55 ERA (298 er in 589.2 ip) for the season...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but have the third fewest home runs allowed (77)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has compiled a 3.66 ERA (62 er in 152.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...for the season, lead the AL lead in wild pitches (58) and are tied for third in hit batters (40).

(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE: The A's are one of four American League teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year (Graveman at CWS) and their streak of 146 consecutive games without a complete game is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 235 and ATL, 196)...it is also third longest in Athletics history (151 from 7/9/08-7/5/09, 148 from 8/8/15-7/22/16).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors with a franchise record seven walk-off home runs...have nine walk-off wins overall, which ties the Dodgers for the most in the majors and is two more than the A's season total from last year...are fourth in the American League in walk-off losses (6)...are tied for second in the majors with seven wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 8) and tied for fifth with four wins when trailing after eight innings...however, have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most...are 4-5 in extra inning games and 13-15 in one-run games...are tied for third in the AL in extra inning losses and tied for fourth in one-run losses.

THIS AND THAT: Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win Saturday night to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...he is one of nine active managers with at least 1,000 wins...the A's have scored first in seven of the last 11 games but have lost five of those seven games...now have 29 losses in games in which they led at some point, which is second most in the AL (TB, 33)...have a run differential of -86, which is second lowest in the AL (TB, -86)...are 11-13 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-12.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the DL (Fowler, Graveman, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl) after having at least seven players on the DL every day from May 24 to July 29...Graveman and Wahl are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl)...have had at least five players on the DL all year.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's won the first meeting of 2017 last night after winning the season series last year 3-1...split two games in Oakland and swept a two-game series in San Francisco...have won 14 of the last 19 games in Oakland but have lost 16 of the last 21 in San Francisco...in the previous 20 years of interleague play, the A's have won seven season series, split nine and lost four...are 58-53 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 34-22 in Oakland and 24-31 in San Francisco...are 20-28 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has hit all 22 of his home runs as a first baseman, which are the most by an A's first baseman since Jason Giambi hit 32 of his 38 home runs in 2001 as a first baseman...**Rajai Davis** is batting .395 (15-for-38) since the All-Star Break after hitting .210 before the break...has 135 career steals as an Athletic, which is tied with Jose Canseco for seventh on the Oakland career stolen base list...**Jed Lowrie** has tied and Oakland record with nine interleague doubles (Damon, 2001).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1976** the A's steal a club record 12 bases in an 8-7, 12 inning loss in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota...in that game, Craig Kusick's eighth inning homer off Vida Blue snaps Blue's club record string of 140.2 innings without a home run...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits his 100th career home run off Melido Perez in the A's 10-2 win at Chicago...in **1999** Miguel Tejada, Eric Chavez, Jason Giambi and John Jaha all homer in the fourth inning of the A's 10-6 win over Tampa Bay...the four home runs in an inning ties the Oakland record...in **2009** Rickey Henderson become the fifth player in Athletics history to have his uniform retired when the A's retire #24.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-5, 3.82 ERA)

LAST 12 STARTS: Is 7-2 with a 3.23 ERA (30 er in 83.2 ip) over his last 13 starts dating back to May 20...was 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA over his first six starts...has walked 21 batters in 83.2 innings over his last 13 starts (2.26 per nine innings) after issuing 17 free passes in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings) over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks ninth in the American League in opponents batting average (.238) and slugging percentage (.387) and 10th in opponents OPS (.696)...is also tied for third in pickoffs (3), ranks seventh in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.88) and tied for 10th in most hit batters (6).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .186 (16-for-86) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .251 (85-for-338) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has a .524 OPS against lefties, .740 against righties...his career splits are a .183 (34-for-186) batting average against lefties, .258 (202-for-783) against righties.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has no decisions and a 4.15 ERA (13.0 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in two interleague starts...is now 1-2 with a 3.69 ERA (13 er in 31.2 ip) in five career starts against the National League.

INTERDIVISION PLAY: Is 6-0 with a 3.18 ERA (23 er in 65.0 ip) in 10 starts against interdivision opponents compared to 2-5 with a 4.69 ERA (25 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West teams...now has an eight-game winning streak against non-AL West teams dating back to last year and has a 2.75 ERA (24 er in 78.2 ip) in 12 starts total over that span...his last loss to a non-divisional foe was on Aug. 7, 2016 against Chicago (AL).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-1 with a 3.64 ERA (22 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 3.99 ERA (26 er in 58.2 ip) in 10 starts on the road...is now 9-4 with a 3.27 ERA (50 er in 137.2 ip) in 23 career games in the Coliseum compared to 6-10 with a 4.50 ERA (60 er in 120.0 ip) in 21 starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .130 (29-for-223) opponents batting average with two strikes, which is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...had the third lowest batting average against the opponents number three hitter (.163) and the sixth lowest against the six (.191) and seven hitters (.167)...the two hitter is batting .391, which is second highest...opponents are 15-for-50 (.300) with runners in scoring position over his last eight starts after hitting .146 over his first 11.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 runs in the second inning for a 7.11 ERA (15 er in 19.0 ip) and 15 in the sixth inning for an 8.56 ERA (13 er in 13.2 ip)...has a 2.24 ERA (20 er in 80.1 ip) in all other innings...the 15 runs in the sixth inning are the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Dickey, ATL 17).

CAREER HIGHS: Picked up his eighth win of the season July 16, which surpasses his season total of seven from his rookie campaign last year...has walked 38, which is one more than last year...has a 3.82 ERA this year after posting a mark of 3.86 last year...has lowed his opponents OPS from .713 last year to .696 this year.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings his second start of the season April 9 at Texas...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...however, took the loss in an 8-1 decision...tossed 5.0 hitless innings in his next start April 15 against Houston but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...left with a 5-2 lead but ended up with a no decision as the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss in a 10-6 loss...it was the first of three times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (July 22 at NYM, July 27 at Toronto)...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings April 21 against Seattle to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history and was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...left his start on April 26 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...was 1-2 with

a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches)...was reinstated May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings that day in a 6-5 loss to Seattle...defeated Boston May 20 to start a career-high five-game winning that spanned five starts through June 10...compiled a 1.97 ERA and .193 opponents batting average during the streak and issued just seven walks in 32.0 innings (1.97 walks per nine innings)...finished the month of May with a 3-1 record, a 2.63 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four starts...the three wins were his most ever in a month...allowed six hits June 10 in the second game of a doubleheader at Tampa Bay...that snapped a streak of 16 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more from Aug. 23, 2016 to June 5, 2017...that tied for the third longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913...it is the longest by an American League pitcher...tossed a career-high 115 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-3 win over Cleveland July 16

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss at Toronto last Thursday...it was his second consecutive start in which the bullpen blew the save...Oakland scored three times in the first inning but he allowed a solo home run to Donaldson in the bottom of the first...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Morales in the fifth and a RBI single to Smoak in the sixth to tie the game...the A's scored once in the eighth to take a 4-3 lead but Treinen allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (2-6, 5.74 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season and his career...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss to Minnesota last Friday here in Oakland (3.2 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...the three walks were a season high as he issued two walks or fewer in each of his first eight starts...has never faced the Giants in his career...is 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA in two interleague starts...is 1-for-2 with a strikeout and two sacrifice hits in four plate appearances...those are the only plate appearances of his career...went 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts with Nashville...that included 0-2 with a 4.71 ERA over his first six starts and 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA over his final five...ranked sixth in the PCL in ERA and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his promotion...surrendered just four home runs in 60.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings.
