### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-61) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (54-55)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 4, 2017 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Split a pair of two-game series with San Francisco to start the week...have won four of the last six games after losing five in a row...are 48-61 (.440) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...this is the third consecutive season the A's have been 48-61 after 109 games...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 21-23 since then...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 21½ games...have been in sole possession of last place in the West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent a total of 70 days in fifth place this year.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This three-game series with the Angels marks the A's first games against American League West competition since splitting a four-game series at Seattle in the final series before the All-Star Break...are 15-27 (.357) against the AL West compared to 33-34 (.493) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 17-30/.362)...are batting .220 (302-for-1373) and are averaging 3.74 runs per game against the AL West (157 runs in 42 games) compared to .249 and 4.63 runs against all other teams.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just one error in the last six games but it led to four unearned runs...for the season, Oakland leads the majors in errors (88) and unearned runs (65)...last year, the A's committed 97 errors but had just 43 unearned runs...have allowed 79 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 82)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .288 (62-for-215) with 31 runs scored over the last six games (5.2 runs per game) but are hitting .238 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .234)...the only time in Oakland history the A's hit under .238 is in 1982 (.236)...have the second most strikeouts in the AL (1011) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.313)...have the third most extra base hits (354).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in six of the last seven games and have tossed fewer than four innings four times over that stretch...are 2-3 with an 8.22 ERA (21 er in 30.2 ip) and .360 (49-for-136) opponents batting average over the last seven games and 34-44 with a 4.61 ERA (308 er in 601.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the AL (CWS, 51) but are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (79).

**(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE:** The A's are one of four American League teams without a complete game...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year (Graveman at CWS) and their streak of 149 consecutive games without a complete game is two short of the Athletics record of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 238 and ATL, 199).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.04 ERA (80 er in 178.1 ip) since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.78 ERA before the break...have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...are tied for the league lead in wild pitches (60) and have allowed the second most doubles (203).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this five-game road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...are 17-36 (.321) on the road compared to 31-25 (.554) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 16-39/.291)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...the home winning percentage is .233 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...this road trip marks the A's only five road games over a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16...all 19 games are in California...went 1-6 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-2) and Toronto (0-4) and have lost eight of their last 10 road games...return home following the game Sunday for a season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (two games), Baltimore (four games) and Kansas City (three games)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1) and have won nine of the last 13 home games...are 10-5-3 in home series compared to 2-13-2 in road series.

**WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the American League (6)...have set an Athletics

franchise record with seven walk-off home runs...are tied for second in the majors with seven wins when trailing after seven innings (KC, 8) and tied for fifth with four wins when trailing after eight innings...however, have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most...are 4-5 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for third in the AL.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have a run differential of -94, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors (SD -133, SF -109)...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are 11-13 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...home runs have accounted for 224 of the A's 467 runs this year (48.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...Bob Melvin recorded his 1000th career win last Saturday to become the 64th manager in Major League history with 1,000 wins...is one of nine active managers with at least 1,000 wins.

**LOSING MONTHS:** The A's finished July with a 12-14 record, which marks their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...it is the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

**A's IN JULY:** The A's led the majors with 112 walks in July, but had the third lowest batting average (.231)...it was the fourth lowest July batting average in Oakland history...struck out 229 times, which was third most in the American League...it also set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of July...have also set franchise records for strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255) and June (285) this year...the pitching staff compiled a 3.88 ERA after seeing the ERA increase over the first three months of the season (4.14 in April, 4.70 in May, 5.57 in June)...the bullpen had three saves, which tied for second fewest in the AL and matched the fewest in July in Oakland history (fifth time, last: 2008).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...Wahl is currently on a rehab assignment...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's trail in the season series as they are 4-6...this is their first meeting with the Angels since May 10 as Oakland played 10 of its 34 games against Los Angeles...are 4-3 in Oakland and 0-3 in Anaheim...have a six-game losing streak at Angel Stadium, which is tied for the A's second longest losing streak in this ballpark in Oakland history...dropped eight straight from May 14, 2010 to April 26, 2011...the Kansas City A's had a nine-game losing streak here from May 22 to Sept. 17, 1967...have also lost nine of the last 10 games and 22 of the last 31 at Angel Stadium...have won six of the last nine games in the Coliseum...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 28-39 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 425-360 against the Angels...that includes 222-170 in Oakland and 203-190 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 474-437 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Daniel Coulombe** has not allowed a run in his last 11 appearances (7.0 ip)...**Ryon Healy** hit his 20th home run of the season Wednesday night, giving the A's three players with 20 or more home runs for just the third time over the last 11 years (4 in 2013, 3 in 2012)...**Jed Lowrie** has struck out just once in 59 plate appearances over his last 15 games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1910** Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...in **1992** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jhareel Cotton (5-8, 5.49 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Sunday and had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 12-inning win that day against Minnesota (3.2 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 5 so, 2 hr)...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** Was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville and was a combined 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (9.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) and .188 (6-for-32) opponents batting average...originally developed a blister during his start on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and missed a turn in the rotation before making his next start July 3, also against the White Sox.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks third among American League rookies in strikeouts (72), innings pitched (80.1) and games started (15) and tied for third in wins (5)...is tied for second among all AL pitchers in balks (2) and tied for fifth in unearned runs (8)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-4 with a 3.26 ERA (14 er in 38.2 ip), .229 (32-for-140) opponents batting average and five home runs allowed in seven starts on the road compared to 2-4 with a 7.56 ERA (35 er in 41.2 ip), .297 (49-for-165) opponents average and 10 home runs in eight starts in Oakland...has the highest home ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 40.0 innings pitched at home.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-2 with a 3.34 ERA (13 er in 35.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 1-6 with a 7.15 ERA (36 er in 45.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 1-6 with a 7.68 ERA (29 er in 34.0 ip) and .343 (49-for-143) opponents batting average in seven starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 3.88 ERA (20 er in 46.1 ip) and .198 (32-for-162) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day...has the third highest night ERA in the American League among pitchers with at least 30.0 innings pitched at night...is tied for fifth in the AL in day wins...his one win at night came on June 23 at Chicago (AL) and it was the first night win of his career...is now 1-6 with a 6.12 ERA (34 er in 50.0 ip) in 10 career starts at night, 6-2 with a 3.32 ERA (22 er in 59.2 ip) in 10 starts during the day.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .338 (26-for-77) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...10 of the 15 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots as have 13 of his 19 career home runs...nine of his 15 home runs have been allowed the first time through the lineup...seven have come in the second inning, which is tied for the most in the majors...opponents are hitting .305 (32-for-105) with nine of his 15 home runs with two outs.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has walked 37 batters in 80.1 innings this year (4.15 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has allowed 14 home runs in his last 10 starts (53.1 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has received 10 runs of support in his eight losses (40.1 ip, 2.23 RSA) and 19 runs of support in his five wins (30.1 ip, 5.64 RSA).

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5...yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.1 innings in a 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...also yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...allowed a career-high seven runs in a 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9...that began a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts through June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 12-inning win over Minnesota last Sunday in Oakland...walked a career-high five batters in a career-low 3.2 innings...yielded three runs in the first inning on a lead-off home run by Dozier and a two-run home run by Escobar...also allowed a Mauer sacrifice fly in the third and walked Grossman with the bases loaded in the fourth...was relieved by Castro following the walk with the A's trailing 5-0, but Oakland scored six unanswered runs for the win.

**COTTON vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 1-2 with a 7.47 ERA (15.2 ip, 18 h, 13 r, 13 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 4 hr) in three career starts, all in Oakland...is 0-2 with an 11.57 ERA (9.1 ip, 16 h, 12 r, 12 er, 3 bb, 11 so) in two starts this year...was charged with the first loss of his

career in the A's 5-0 loss in Oakland on April 5...retired the first four batters before allowing three runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Simmons and a two-run single by Espinosa...also allowed RBI singles to Trout and Pujols in the fifth...lost again May 9 in a 7-3 decision in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the first and the A's scored twice in the bottom of the first to take a 2-1 lead...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Revere and a three-run home run to Escobar in the second...yielded two more runs in the fourth inning on a Pennington RBI single and a Escobar RBI ground out...his lone win came in his Major League debut last year, a 4-1 A's victory on Sept. 7 in Oakland.

**2017 WITH NASHVILLE:** Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Paul Blackburn (2-1, 3.05 ERA):** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 1 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...has tossed more than five innings in each of his six career starts...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss more than five innings in each of his first six career games (Adams, Griffin, Krueger)...opponents are 4-for-25 (.160) with runners in scoring position...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-5 A's victory over San Francisco last Monday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Angels in his career...was 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his July 1 promotion to Oakland...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 21-for-38 (55.3%)

- The A's bullpen has five blown saves in the last 16 games but has a 3.80 ERA (24 er in 55.1 ip) over that span...has issued 27 walks in 55.1 innings and surrendered nine home runs.
- Has converted 21-of-38 (55.3%) save opportunities, which is the fourth-lowest percentage in the American League...the saves are third fewest.
- Has the third highest ERA in the AL.
- Has allowed 34-of-129 (26.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...has the fewest inherited runners.
