### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-62) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (57-56)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Won two of three at Los Angeles (AL) over the weekend and have won six of the last nine games after losing five in a row...are 50-62 (.446) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...went 10-8 over the first 18 games, 17-30 over the next 47 games from April 23 to June 14 and are 23-24 since then...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 21½ games...have been in sole possession of last place in the West every day dating back to May 30...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 74 days in fifth.

**OFFENSE:** The A's scored a season-high 11 runs Sunday at Los Angeles (AL) to snap a streak of 125 consecutive games with 10 runs or fewer...that was the A's longest such streak since a 134-game streak from Aug. 25, 1981 to July 25, 1982...added a season-high 18 hits Sunday, which were the A's most in a game since Sept. 15, 2015 at Chicago-AL (19)...are now batting .289 (95-for-329) with 53 runs scored over the last nine games (5.9 runs per game)...are batting .240 for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...had 10 extra base hits on Sunday (seven doubles, three home runs), which are the A's most in a game since Sept. 11, 2013 vs. Minnesota (11)...have 370 extra base hits for the season, which ranks third in the AL...also rank third in doubles (208) and fourth in walks (397) but have the second most strikeouts (1041).

**(DON'T) GO THE DISTANCE:** Sunday's game at Los Angeles (AL) was the A's 152nd consecutive game without a complete game...that breaks the franchise record of 151 from July 9, 2008 to July 5, 2009...have not tossed a complete game since Aug. 19 of last year (Graveman at CWS)...the streak is the third longest active streak in the majors (TB, 241 and ATL, 202).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed four runs or more in eight of the last 10 games and have tossed fewer than four innings five times over that stretch...are 3-3 with a 7.09 ERA (36 er in 45.2 ip) and .338 (67-for-198) opponents batting average over that span and 35-44 with a 4.61 ERA (316 er in 616.2 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 51) but have surrendered the fewest home runs (81).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 10 or more runs three times over the first six games of August for a 5.71 ERA (33 er in 52.0 ip)...have a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...lead the AL in wild pitches (62) and have allowed the second most doubles (211).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 92 errors, which is five short of their season total of 97 from last year...the errors have led to a ML leading 68 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2011 (82)...have allowed 82 stolen bases, which is second most in the American League (CWS, 86)...outfielders have 15 assists, which is second fewest in the AL (NYY, 12).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This two-game series with Seattle concludes a brief five-game stretch against American League West competition...are 17-28 (.378) against the AL West compared to 33-34 (.493) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-31/.380)...are batting .225 (335-for-1487) and are averaging 3.98 runs per game against the AL West (179 runs in 45 games) compared to .249 and 4.63 runs against all other teams.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a season-long tying nine-game homestand against Seattle (two games), Baltimore (four games) and Kansas City (three games) tonight...are 31-25 (.554) at home compared to 19-37 (.339) on the road...have the fifth best home record in the American League but the second worst road record...the home winning percentage is .215 better than the road...the biggest differential in Oakland history is .223 in 2003 (.704 at home, .481 on the road)...this homestand concludes a 19-game stretch from July 28 to Aug. 16 where the A's played every game in California...the only road games came on the last road trip in which the A's went 3-2 against San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-2 on the last homestand against Minnesota (2-1) and San Francisco (1-1) and have won nine of the last 13 home games...are 10-5-3 in home series compared to 3-13-2 in road series.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have compiled a 22-21 (.512) record during day games compared to 28-41 (.406) at night...are batting .269 (402-for-1497) and are averaging 5.05 runs per game during the day (217 runs in 43

games), .220 (498-for-2259) and 3.94 runs per games at night (272 runs in 69 games)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (TEX, .244) while the day batting average is fifth best...according to Stats, Inc., the last time a team hit under .223 in night games was in 1972 (Rangers, .213; Mets, .221).

**WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's overcame a five-run deficit to win Sunday for the second time in the last eight games...won for the eighth time when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with San Francisco and Kansas City for the most in the majors...are tied for fifth in the majors with four wins when trailing after eight innings but have five losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the American League (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record with seven walk-off home runs...are 4-5 in extra inning games and the losses are tied for third in the AL.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's win on Sunday took 4 hours and 12 minutes, which was the fourth longest nine-inning game in Oakland history...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 45 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have a run differential of -90, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors (SD -133, SF -109)...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are 11-14 in re-play challenges while opposing managers are 19-13...home runs have accounted for 233 of the A's 489 runs this year (47.6%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...have set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229)

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1 and May 20-23)...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's lead the season series, 6-5...are 3-4 in Seattle and 3-1 in Oakland...have lost each of the previous four season series, which marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 36-51 (.414) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season...that is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 11-18/.379)...all-time, the A's are 340-275 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 156-151 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-87 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** is 8-for-20 (.400) in August...is tied for the American League lead in walks in August (6) and is tied for second in runs (7) and doubles (4)...**Khris Davis** ranks fifth in the AL in home runs (29), tied for sixth in RBI (75), tied for eighth in extra base hits (50) and tied for ninth in games played (109)...**Rajai Davis** is hitting .346 (18-for-52) since the All-Star Break after batting .210 before the break...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .328 (13-for-40) with eight walks (.438 on-base percentage) and just one strikeout in 48 plate appearances over his last 10 games...**Chad Pinder** had his first career four-hit game Sunday at Los Angeles (AL) and is now 9-for-18 (.500) with six runs scored in six games since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 31.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** Dave Kingman's eighth inning homer in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota gives him homers in five consecutive games, an Oakland A's record at the time...in **2004** the A's defeat Minnesota 6-5 in 18 innings in the longest A's game since 1972...Oakland scores three times in the top of the 18<sup>th</sup> on RBI singles by Jermaine Dye, Erubiel Durazo and Damian Miller before the Twins score twice in the bottom of the 18<sup>th</sup>...in **2006** Nick Swisher hits his 24<sup>th</sup> home run of the season in the A's 7-6 win over Texas, setting an all-time Athletics record for home runs by a switch hitter.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-3, 4.96 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Thursday and started and lost that night at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb)... was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the DL the first time April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder... did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...went 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts before returning to the DL with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)... was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts (10.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 4 hr).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.20 ERA (20 er in 25.0 ip) in five starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 8-10 with a 3.54 ERA (68 er in 172.2 ip) in 28 starts in Oakland compared to 10-13 with a 4.85 ERA (96 er in 178.0 ip) in 32 starts on the road.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-1 with a 2.87 ERA (12 er in 37.2 ip) in six starts against American League West competition compared to 0-2 with an 11.91 ERA (15 er in 11.1 ip) in three starts against everyone else.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 1-3 with a 6.83 ERA (22 er in 29.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed 12 of his 27 runs in the first inning for a 12.00 ERA (12 er in 9.0 ip)...has a 3.38 ERA (15 er in 40.0 ip) for the second inning on...opponents are hitting .390 (16-for-41) in the first inning, .252 (38-for-151) in the second inning or later...last year he allowed just six runs in the first inning in 31 starts (1.74 ERA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked two batters or fewer in seven of his nine starts...has issued 10 of his 15 walks this year and 69 of his 100 walks in his career to left-handed hitters...has surrendered five of his seven home runs to left-handed hitters...five have come with runners on base... has a .354 (17-for-48) opponents batting average against hitters leading off an inning...the opponents number six hitter is 1-for-21 (.045) but the three hitter is 11-for-22 (.500).

**THIS AND THAT:** Has made eight of his nine starts at night...went 0-1 with a 5.48 ERA in four starts in May after going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader.

**REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made his first rehab start July 19 at Iowa and had a no decision in the Sounds 11-8 win in 11 innings (2.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 2 hb)...started and lost at New Orleans in an 8-0 loss on July 24 (3.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hb)...his final start came last Saturday at Nashville against Salt Lake, a no decision in a 2-1 Sounds win (4.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hb, 1 hr).

**2017 START-BY-START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day **April 3** in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)... won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas **April 8**...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings and Napoli broke up the no-hitter with a two out homer in the bottom of the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on **April 14** in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 27**...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota **May 3**...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed a two-run single to Vargas in the first inning but the A's got one of those runs back in the third...then surrendered a three-run home run to Vargas in the bottom of the third...Oakland scored twice in the fourth to cut the lead to 5-3 but he allowed a leadoff triple to Buxton in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks who allowed the inherited runner to score...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) **May 8** in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow...shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the game and won it on a Lowrie walk-off home run in the 11th...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas **May 14**...allowed two runs in the first inning on an Andrus RBI single and a Lucroy grounded into double play...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next five innings and had a 4-2 lead when

DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save and a RBI single to Mazara for the loss...had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win over Boston **May 19** in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Moreland in the fourth inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...retired the side in order in the first inning but that was his only 1-2-3 inning.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco last Thursday...allowed seven runs on eight hits in 2.0 innings...yielded four runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Posey and Crawford and a RBI double by Parker...surrendered three more runs in the second on a Jones RBI single and a Belt two-run home run...was relieved by Castro to start the third with the A's trailing 7-0.

## GRAVEMAN vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-3

with a 4.82 ERA (37.1 ip, 50 h, 20 r, 20 er, 9 bb, 22 so, 2 hr) in eight career appearances, including six starts...is 0-0 with a 2.70 ERA (3 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts at Safeco Field and 1-3 with a 5.93 ERA (18 er in 27.1 ip) in six games, four starts, in his home ballpark...is 1-3 with a 4.98 ERA (19 er in 34.1 ip) in his six starting assignments...has not faced the Mariners this year...went 0-3 with a 6.26 ERA (27.1 ip, 43 h, 19 r, 19 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 2 hr) in five starts last year...the ERA was second highest in Oakland history against the Mariners by a pitcher with 20 or more innings pitched (Jesse Chavez, 8.41 in 2015)...his first loss came in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on May 2...had a 1-0 lead when allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an lanetta RBI single...then had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...left trailing 2-1 but the A's scored four times in the sixth to get him off the hook...took the loss in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on Aug. 13... had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fourth... allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Smith RBI single and a Cano two-run homer...then took the loss in a 14-3 decision in Oakland Sept. 10... allowed a career-high tying eight runs on a career-high 12 hits...yielded two runs in the first inning and four more runs in the third, including a two-run double by Cruz...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss at Seattle Sept. 29...allowed a RBI single to Martin in the fourth inning and the A's scored once in the sixth to tie the game...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the bottom of the sixth.

**2016 RECAP:** Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Jharel Cotton (5-8, 5.48 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 0-0 with an 8.31 ERA and .343 opponents batting average in two starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4...is 4-2 with a 3.88 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in eight starts during the day compared to 1-6 with a 7.38 ERA and .341 opponents batting average in eight starts at night... had a no decision in his last start, an 8-6 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (10.1 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Seattle...including a win in his only start this year on April 22 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so).
