### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-70) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (76-47)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 20, 2017 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight and four of the last five games to fall to a season-low 17 games under .500...are 53-70 (.431) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League...it is tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 123 games and matches their record from each of the previous two seasons...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 85 days in fifth.

**DOUBLE PLAYS:** The A's grounded into an Oakland record-tying five double plays last night...it was the ninth time and the first time since May 12, 2006 at New York (AL)...Houston turned a total of six double plays, tying the Oakland record for most double plays by an opponent (May 14, 1971 at Kansas City)...the A's turned three double plays and now have 124 for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...the nine double plays turned by both clubs ties the Oakland record set in the May 14, 1971 game against the Royals.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 99 errors, which marks the 10th consecutive season they have made 97 or more errors...have made at least 100 errors in five of the previous eight seasons...also lead the majors with 73 unearned runs...rank second in the American League in most stolen bases allowed (91), tied for second in most passed balls (13) and tied for fourth in fewest outfield assists (18).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored one run on 11 hits over the first two games of this series but are batting .266 (195-for-732) with 105 runs scored (5.0 per game) and 84 extra base hits (4.0 per game)...54 doubles, 2 triples, 28 home runs) over the last 210 games...are hitting .240 for the season, which is second lowest in the majors (SD, .234)...have the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.313)...however, rank third in the American League in extra base hits (410) and doubles (230).

**HOME RUNS:** Matt Joyce hit the A's 169th home run of the season Friday night, which ranks sixth in the American League and matches the A's season total from last year...it is tied for the 16th highest single season total in Athletics history...home runs have accounted for 259 of the A's 538 runs (48.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have won just four games when going homerless, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (NYY, 3)

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's have 1142 strikeouts, which is second most in the American League (TB, 1207) and seventh most in Athletics history (6th is 1145 in 2016, 5th is 1159 in 2000)...have 60 games with 10 or more strikeouts, which is an Athletics record (previous: 59 in 2012).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-9 with a 6.88 ERA (79 er in 103.1 ip) and .330 (144-for-437) opponents batting average over the last 22 games and 36-50 with a 4.79 ERA (359 er in 674.1 ip) for the season...have the second most losses in the American League (CWS, 56), but have allowed 93 home runs, which is tied for third fewest.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.64 ERA (94 er in 150.0 ip) in August, which is fourth highest in the American League...now have a 4.74 ERA for the season, which is also fourth highest in the AL...rank second in the AL in most doubles (233) and fourth in extra base hits (407)...have 66 wild pitches, which is the most in the majors and sixth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 70 in 2016, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...have allowed five grand slams, which is tied for the most in the AL (BAL, LAA).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 17-32 (.347) against the American League West compared to 36-38 (.486) against everyone else...have the worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 19-31/.380)...are batting .223 (361-for-1616) and are averaging 3.86 runs per game against the AL West (189 runs in 49 games) compared to .251 and 4.72 runs against all other teams.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have a 23-23 (.500) record during day games compared to 30-47 (.390) at night...are batting .268 (429-for-1602) and are averaging 5.11 runs per game during the day (235 runs in 46 games), .223 (563-for-2524) and 3.94 runs per game at night (303 runs in 77 games)...the night batting average is the lowest in the majors (PHI, .243) while the day batting average is sixth best.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on this six-game road trip to Houston (0-2) and Baltimore (three games)...are 19-39 (.328) on the road com-

pared to 34-31 (.523) in Oakland...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 20-46/.303)...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's play 12 of 15 games on the road after playing 19 consecutive games in California (including 14 in Oakland)...went 3-2 on the last road trip to San Francisco (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Seattle (0-2), Baltimore (2-2) and Kansas City (1-2)...are 12-18 over the last 30 home games after going 22-13 over the first 35...are 10-7-4 in home series compared to 3-14-2 in road series.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are tied with Kansas City for the Major League lead with nine wins when trailing after seven innings but are tied with Texas and Toronto for the American League lead with five losses when leading after eight innings...are tied with the Dodgers for the most walk-off wins in the majors (9) but have the fourth most walk-off losses in the AL (6)...have set an Athletics franchise record and lead the majors with seven walk-off home runs.

**THIS AND THAT:** Oakland has gone an Athletics record 163 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the A's have a run differential of -107, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 5 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...are 12-15 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 19-15...finished July with a 12-14 record, which marked their Oakland record ninth consecutive month with a losing record...broke the previous mark of eight from Aug. 1978-Sept. 1979...are currently 6-11 in August.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl), which matches the season low (March 30-April 1, May 20-23 and Aug. 3-present)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...the last time Oakland had fewer than five players on the DL was Aug. 31, 2015 when they had four...Oakland has used the disabled list a total of 22 times this year, which marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...the Oakland record is 27 set last year...currently have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 2-12 with five games remaining...the A's most losses ever against Houston came last year when they went 6-13...are 0-6 in Oakland this year and 2-6 in Houston...have lost 19 of their last 21 games to the Astros...have dropped 16 of the last 20 games at Minute Maid Park and have lost 10 in a row in the Coliseum...the Coliseum losing streak is the A's second longest against any team (13, Baltimore, July 8, 1976-April 27, 1979)...are 17-35 (.327) against the Astros over the last three years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...have 15 blown saves in their last 57 games against the Astros (dating back to Aug. 26, 2014)...the all-time series is now even at 48-48...the A's are 25-22 in Oakland and 23-26 in Houston.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads Major League rookies in extra base hits since the All-Star Break (22) and is tied for the lead in doubles (12)...leads American League rookies in home runs (9) and RBI (21) and is tied for the lead in runs (19)...**Khris Davis** is tied for third in the AL in RBI (86), tied for fourth in home runs (33), tied for fifth in extra base hits (56) and tied for ninth in games played (120)...**Rajai Davis** is tied for the ML lead in stolen bases in August (7) and leads the AL in stolen bases since the All-Star Break (11)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the AL in doubles (38).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1959** Bob Cerv hits three home runs in Kansas City's 11-10 loss to Boston...in **1963** the A's sweep a doubleheader from Washington...Moe Drabowsky tosses a one-hit shutout in a 9-0 win in Game 1 and Jerry Lumpe hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the 14<sup>th</sup> inning of Game 2, a 7-5 victory...in **1987** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record with three doubles, but the A's lose 7-6 to Toronto.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## TEAM

17-20, 4.65 ERA (213 er in 412.0 ip)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 23-for-43 (53.5%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 4-of-12 (33.3%) save opportunities over the last 30 games...is 23-for-43 (53.5%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the third fewest saves and is tied for third in blown saves (20).
- Has a 3.86 ERA (50 er in 116.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.27).
- Ranks second in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (154), has the third highest opponents slugging percentage (.431) and the fourth most home runs (60).
- Ranks fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.223) and slugging percentage (.364) against first batters faced...is tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (10).

## 64 RHP MICHAEL BRADY

**Last Outing:** 8/12 vs. Baltimore (ND, 5.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 5 so)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/2  
**First Hitters:** 5-9

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 11 for his third stint with the A's this year and has pitched once since his return.
- Tossed 5.1 innings Aug. 12 against Baltimore after pitching 6.0 innings of relief in his previous outing with the A's on Aug. 1...is the second Oakland reliever over the last 30 years with two outings greater than 5.0 innings in the same season (Brad Rigby, 1999).
- Has made four of his nine career appearances against Houston (7.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr, 4.91 ERA).
- Made one start with Nashville following his last option and had a no decision at Tacoma on Aug. 8 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so)...his complete 2017 minor league stats:

**Last Year:** Spent most of the year at Double-A Harrisburg but also made one start with Triple-A Syracuse in August...combined to go 3-6 with a 2.89 ERA in 18 games (12 starts) overall...issued just 13 walks in 81.0 innings (1.44 per nine innings).

## 46 RHP SANTIAGO CASILLA

**Saves/Opportunities:** 16-23  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/2  
**First Hitters:** 9-44, 4 bb

- Gave up three runs Tuesday night after not allowing a run over his previous eight outings (7.1 ip, 4 h, 3 bb, 10 so).
- Was charged with his seventh blown save Tuesday, which is tied for the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...it is two short of his career high of nine from last year...has the lowest save percentage in the AL (69.6%) and is tied for 10th in saves (16).
- Is tied for fourth among AL relievers in losses (5), tied for fifth in stolen bases (8) and ranks seventh in first batter strikeouts (18).
- Has not allowed a run in eight appearances on no days rest (8.0 ip).
- Has a loss and two saves in four games against Houston (4.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so, 6.75 ERA)...has a 2.20 ERA (4 er in 16.1 ip) in 17 career appearances against the Astros...has not allowed a run in nine career appearances at Minute Maid Park (9.1 ip, 9 h, 2 bb, 3 so).

**Last Year:** Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.

## 67 RHP SIMON CASTRO

**Last Outing:** 8/16 vs. Kansas City (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)  
**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1  
**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 5/0  
**First Hitters:** 2-12, hbp

- Has not allowed an earned run in nine of his last 11 appearances (3 er in 15.1 ip, 1.76 ERA) after allowing one run in each of his first two outings.
- Struck out a batter in his last appearance to snap a streak of five consecutive games with at least one inning pitched and no strikeouts...that matched the longest single season streak in Oakland history (ninth time...last: Jerry Blevins, May 19-30, 2013).
- Has a 1.69 ERA (2 er in 10.2 ip) in eight games at home compared to a 4.26 ERA (3 er in 6.1 ip) in five games on the road.
- Has never faced the Astros in his career.
- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville on July 16 after going 3-5 with four saves, a 3.32 ERA and .176 opponents batting average in 33 relief appearances with the Sounds.

**Last Year:** Spent the entire season at Triple-A Albuquerque in the Colorado organization and was 0-5 with 10 saves and a 3.38 ERA in 50 appearances, all in relief...the saves were the first of his career.

- Has not allowed a run in 18 of his last 21 games...however, has allowed three runs in each of the three games with a run and has a 5.79 ERA (9 er in 14.0 ip) and .309 (17-for-55) opponents batting average over that stretch dating back to July 4...logged a 2.22 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 33 contests.

- Has the fourth most inherited runners in the American League (44) and is tied for eighth in games pitched (54).
- Has not allowed an earned run in 12 games on no days rest (9.1 ip, 1 r).
- Has faced the Astros four times this season (3.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 2.45 ERA)
- Is 2-0 with a 2.36 ERA (7 er in 26.2 ip) in 31 games at home, 0-2 with a 5.17 ERA (9 er in 15.2 ip) in 23 games on the road.

**Last Year:** Was 3-1 with a 4.53 ERA and .216 opponents batting average in 35 games over five stints with the A's...had no decisions, a 1.08 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in 20 relief appearances for Triple-A Nashville.

- Has allowed a run in three of his last four appearances (4.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 6.75 ERA) after allowing no runs in his first eight games after being reinstated from the 10-day DL July 27 (5.1 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 4 so).
- Has an 11.05 ERA (9 er in 7.1 ip) in nine outings on no days rest, a 2.65 ERA (5 er in 17.0 ip) in his other 21 appearances.
- Is tied for second among AL relievers in unearned runs (6).
- Has face Houston five times this year (4.2 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1.93 ERA) and has a 1.13 ERA (2 er in 16.0 ip) in 14 career appearances against the Astros...has a 1.04 ERA (1 er in 8.2 ip) in eight career outings at Minute Maid Park.
- Was on the DL from May 20 to July 26 and missed 59 games with a strained right knee.

**Last Year:** Compiled a 2.42 ERA and .186 opponents batting average in 70 relief appearances...led AL rookies and tied for ninth among all AL pitchers in games pitched...fell one short of the Oakland rookie record for games pitched.

- Was acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers Tuesday for international slot money and has retired nine of the 10 batters he has faced in two appearances with the A's.
- Opponents are batting .071 (2-for-28) with runners in scoring position.
- Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings Friday night in his first appearance against Houston this year and has a 1.69 ERA (1 er in 5.1 ip) in six career appearances against the Astros.
- Was on the Dodgers Opening Day roster and was 0-1 with a 4.66 ERA in 26 relief appearances when he was placed on the DL June 23 with thoracic inflammation...had a five-game rehab assignment (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 1.50 ERA) from July 29 to Aug. 12 and was reinstated a week ago today.

**Last Year:** Appeared in 37 games with the Dodgers, going 5-4 with a 5.53 ERA (25 ER/ 40.2 IP), before being placed on the DL on July 20, where he remained for the duration of the season with a strained left oblique.

- Has a 7.94 ERA (20 er in 22.2 ip) over his last 29 games after posting a 3.04 ERA over his first 24 contests through June 7.
- Ranks second among American League relievers in runs allowed (33), tied for third in stolen bases (9) and has the sixth highest ERA (5.29).
- Has an 11.74 ERA (20 er in 15.1 ip) and .370 (27-for-73) opponents average in 19 games on the road compared to a 2.38 ERA (9 er in 34.0 ip) and .189 (24-for-127) opponents batting average in 34 games at home.
- Has a 17.18 ERA (3.2 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 3 so) in six games against Houston this year and a 6.86 ERA (15 er in 19.2 ip) in 15 career appearances against the Astros...has a 9.00 ERA (11 er in 11.0 ip) in eight games at Minute Maid Park.

**Last Year:** Compiled a 3.76 ERA and .270 opponents batting average in 53 relief appearances in his first season with the A's...had an 8.27 ERA in 11 games before going on the disabled list in early May, a 2.23 ERA in 42 games following his return.

- Has a 2.65 ERA (5 er in 17.0 ip) in 16 appearances since he was acquired from Washington July 16 in the Sean Doolittle/Ryan Madson trade...had a 5.73 ERA in 37 games with the Nationals.
- However, has allowed 6-of-9 (66.7%) inherited runners to score with the A's and 51.9% for the season, which is third highest in the majors.
- Ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents grounded into double plays (11) and tied for sixth in most hits allowed (61).
- Has never faced Houston in his career.
- Allowed two home runs in an outing for the first time in his career Tuesday against Kansas City...it was his 200th career appearance.

**Last Year:** Appeared in a career-high 78 games with Washington and was 4-1 with a save and a 2.28 ERA...ranked eighth among National League relievers in ERA...led Major League relievers with 17 opponents grounded into double plays.

- Is batting .286 (16-for-56) in August after hitting .193 in July...is tied for second in the AL in doubles in August (8).
- Has 35 hits, 24 of which are for extra bases (14 doubles, one triple, nine home runs).
- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 15 and has started each of the A's 45 games at third base while on the active roster...was on the 10-day disabled list from June 19 to July 2 with left knee cellulitis.
- Hit .257 with 16 home runs and 30 RBI in 49 games with Nashville... was tied for third in the Pacific Coast League and tied for fifth in all of the minor league in home runs at the time of his June 15 promotion

**Last Year:** Began the season at Double-A Midland and was moved up to Triple-A Nashville May 21...combined for a .285 batting average, 12 home runs and 87 RBI in 132 games overall...ranked second in the A's farm system in hits (155).

## 2 KHRIS DAVIS

**Last Homestand:** 8-33, 8 r, 2b, 3b, 4 hr, 11 rbi, 5 bb, 10 so, hbp

- Is 0-for-12 with eight strikeouts over his last three games, including his seventh career four-strikeout game on Wednesday against Kansas City...now has 162 strikeouts for the season, which ranks third in the American League and seventh most in Athletics history (6th is Cust with 164 in 2007).
- Is tied for third in the AL in RBI (86), tied for fourth in home runs (33), tied for fifth in extra base hits (56) and tied for ninth in games played (120).
- Is 10-for-45 (.222) with nine runs, one double, one triple, five home runs and 13 RBI over his last 12 games.
- Is batting .275 (14-for-51) with 11 runs, four doubles, seven home runs and 13 RBI in 14 games against Houston...the home runs are the most ever by an Athletic against the Astros
- Has 499 career hits and needs two more for 500 career.
- Leads the AL and is tied for second in the majors in go-ahead home runs (16)...the go-ahead home runs are the most by an Athletic since Frank Thomas had 19 in 2006...ranks third in the AL in go-ahead RBI (25).
- Is batting .204 (55-for-270) at night, which is second lowest in the AL (Gallo, TEX .198).
- Has 33 home runs this year after hitting 42 last year...is the first A's player with back-to-back 30-homer seasons since Miguel Tejada (2000-02) and Eric Chavez (2001-02).
- Has a career-high 57 walks...his home runs (33), RBI (86), runs (72) and strikeouts (162) are the second highest of his career to last year (42 HR, 102 RBI, 72 R, 166 SO).

- Is tied for the Major League lead with seven stolen bases in August (Hamilton, CIN)...ranks third in the AL with 26 stolen bases overall.

- Is batting .196 (44-for-225) at night, .298 (39-for-131) during the day.
- Led off the game with a home run Tuesday night for the fourth time this year and the eighth time in his career...his four leadoff home runs are tied for the seventh best single season total in Oakland history but they are tied for the fifth best career total...has hit 12 of his 18 home runs when batting first in the order.
- Added a three-run double in the eighth inning Tuesday for his 14th career game of four or more RBI.
- The three-run double Tuesday came off Minor and he now has five RBI off left-handed pitchers over his last five games after tallying no RBI off southpaws over his first 102 contests.
- Homered off Bleier a week ago today for his first home run off a lefty since June 4, 2016 against Los Angeles (AL), a three-run shot off Greg Mahle...that was also his last RBI against a lefty prior to Sunday.
