### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-73) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (67-65)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 29, 2017 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night...are now 5-3 over the last eight games and 23-25 over the last 28...are 58-73 (.443) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the seventh worst record in Oakland history after 131 games and is one game better than each of the previous two seasons (57-74)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 94 days in fifth overall...swept a three-game series from Texas last weekend for just their fourth series sweep of the season (previous: July 14-16 vs. CLE).

**LOSING MONTHS:** With the loss last night, the A's fell to 11-14 (.440) in the month of August with two games remaining...have clinched a losing record for the 10th consecutive month, which is an on-going Oakland record and the longest streak by an A's team since the Kansas City A's had 21 consecutive months with a losing record from June, 1963 to Aug. 1966 (all consecutive month records exclude October)...it is the longest active streak in the majors and the A's are one five teams without a winning record in a month this year (DET, NYM, CIN, SF)...have not posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016.

**HOME AND AWAY:** This three-game series with Los Angeles marks the fourth series in a stretch where the A's play five consecutive series in five different cities...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Houston (1-2) and Baltimore (1-2), 3-0 on the last homestand against Texas and are 0-1 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-1) and Seattle (three games)...are 21-42 (.333) on the road compared to 37-31 (.544) at home...have the worst road record in the American League and third worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the only time in Oakland history the A's have finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...are 11-7-4 in home series compared to 3-15-2 in road series.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 3-1 in this stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West teams that runs through Sept. 10...however, are 21-33 (.389) against the AL West for the season compared to 37-40 (.481) against everyone else...have the second worst intradivision record in the majors (SF, 20-34/.370)...are batting .226 (402-for-1776) and are averaging 3.93 runs per game against the AL West (212 runs in 54 games) compared to .253 and 4.74 runs against all other teams.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 104 errors, which marks the sixth time in the last nine seasons they have made 100 or more errors...also lead the majors with 76 unearned runs...lead the American League in passed balls (16), rank second in most stolen bases allowed (93), tied for third in fewest outfield assists (18) and fourth in most double plays (134).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .267 (270-for-1010) with 144 runs scored (4.97 per game) and 113 extra base hits (3.90 per game)...69 doubles, 2 triples, 42 home runs over the last 29 games...have doubled in each of those games, which is their longest streak of consecutive games with a double since a 37-game streak from June 10-July 22, 2005...have 245 doubles for the season, which ranks third in the American League...also rank third in extra base hits (439)...however, have the second lowest batting average (.242)...went 0-for-9 with runners in scoring position last night and are hitting .171 (14-for-82) with RISP over the last 11 games...home runs have accounted for 277 of the A's 577 runs (48.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's struck out 14 times yesterday, which was their 11th game this year with 14 or more strikeouts...rank second in the American League with 1216 strikeouts for the season (TB, 1272)...it marks the third time in Athletics history the A's have struck out at least 1200 times in a season (1387 in 2012, 1226 in 2008).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 3-1 with a 2.94 ERA (11 er in 33.2 ip) over the last six games after going 5-10 with a 6.69 ERA over their previous 23 contests...have walked just four batters over the last six games (1.07 per nine innings)...rank second in the American League in fewest home runs (98) and most losses (52) and fourth in fewest strikeouts (558)...are one of four AL teams without a complete game and have gone

an Athletics record 171 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics have never gone an entire season without a complete game.

**PITCHING:** Daniel Gossett's first inning wild pitch yesterday was Oakland's 73rd of the season, which breaks the Athletics franchise record of 72 set in 1979...it is also the most in the majors...A's pitchers have compiled a 3.48 ERA (34 er in 88.0 ip) over the last 10 games.

**ROOKIES:** The A's have two rookies with 10 home runs (Pinder 12, Chapman 10) for the eighth time in Oakland history and the first time since 2012 (Carter and Cespedes)...Matt Olson has nine home runs and the only time in Oakland history the A's had three players with 10 or more home runs was 1977 (Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13)...the A's had six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup Sunday for the fourth time this year...did that three times in 2016...have had at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have employed 17 rookies for the season (8 batters, 9 pitchers).

**IN AUGUST:** The A's leads the majors with 53 doubles in August and are tied for second with 93 extra base hits (BAL, 105)...rank fourth in the American League with a .456 slugging percentage...over the last 12 years, the only time the A's have slugged over .455 in a month was Sept. 2013 (.487)...have struck out 226 times, which is nine short of the Athletics franchise record for the month of August (235 in 2012)...have already set franchise records this year for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285) and July (229)...the pitching staff ranks second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (161) and highest opponents batting average (.284), third in highest slugging percentage (.472) and fourth in highest ERA (4.95).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have a 26-24 (.520) record during day games compared to 32-49 (.395) at night...are batting .272 (476-for-1752) and are averaging 5.22 runs per game during the day (261 runs in 50 games), .223 (591-for-2652) and 3.90 runs per game at night (316 runs in 81 games)...the day batting average is fourth best in the majors while the night batting average is the lowest (PIT, .241).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Fowler, Phegley, Smolinski, Triggs, Wahl)...Phegley and Smolinski are currently on rehab assignments...Oakland has used the disabled list 23 times this year and those players have combined to miss 932 games...set an Oakland record by using the DL 27 times last year and missed 1810 games...this marks the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have three players on the 60-day DL (Smolinski, Triggs and Wahl).

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's trail in the season series as they are 6-8 against the Angels...are 4-3 in Oakland and 2-5 in Anaheim...have lost eight of the last 10 games at Angel Stadium and 24 of the last 35...have won six of the last nine games in the Coliseum...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 30-41 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 427-362 against the Angels...that includes 222-170 in Oakland and 205-192 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 476-439 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads Major League rookies in doubles (14) and extra base hits (25) since the All-Star Break...leads American League rookies in home runs (10) since the break...**Khris Davis** is tied for second in the AL in home runs (36), ranks fourth in RBI (91) and tied for fourth extra base hits (60)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the majors in doubles (40).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1937** the A's score 12 runs in the first inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago...Bob Johnson drives in six runs in the first inning...in **1989** the A's score 10 times in the fifth inning of a 19-5 win at New York...Jose Canseco has two hits in the inning, including a three run homer, and is 4 for 5 with four runs, a pair of homers and five RBI in the game...in **1998** the A's set an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 11-6 win at Cleveland...Ben Grieve ties the Oakland individual record with three doubles and Scott Spiezio adds two.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Smith (0-3, 5.56 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and eighth start of the season... all of his appearances have come at night...the starts are the first of his career...went 0-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .211 opponents batting average over his first three starts but is 0-2 with a 7.30 ERA (20 er in 24.2 ip) and .280 (28-for-100) opponents batting average in five games (four starts) since then...his only career win came in his second career outing over nine years ago on June 24, 2008 with Boston against Arizona (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed at least one home run in seven of his eight games, including a career-high four on Aug. 10 against Baltimore...has allowed 11 home runs in 43.2 innings, an average of 2.27 per nine innings...has allowed 43 hits, 23 of which are for extra bases (11 doubles, one triple).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued 11 of his 15 walks to left-handed hitters but has surrendered 10 of his 11 home runs to right-handers... has a .924 OPS against righties, .694 against lefties...has allowed a .308 (12-for-39) batting average with runners in scoring position but opponents are 3-for-16 (.188) with RISP and two outs...has a .290 (18-for-62) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .258 (17-for-66) the second time and .186 (8-for-43) the third time...has held the two, three and fourth hitter in the batting order to a combined .200 (12-for-60) batting average...opponents are 14-for-41 (.341) with four walks, four doubles, a triple and four home runs when leading off an inning (.400 on-base percentage, .780 slugging percentage).

**SUPPORT:** Has received three runs of support or fewer in six of his seven starts (16 rs in 39.2 ip, 3.63 RSA)...his overall run support average is 3.50 (17 rs in 43.2 ip)...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his seven starts (July 18, Aug. 15).

**CAREER HIGHS:** Has pitched parts of five seasons in the majors over the last 10 years...his seven starts and three losses are the first of his career and he also has career highs in hits (43), runs (29) and earned runs (27)... has matched his high in home runs (11) and his 43.2 innings pitched are 2.1 innings shy of his best of 46.0 in 2009.

**AGE AT FIRST START:** His first start on July 8 at Seattle came at the age of 36 years and 90 days, making him the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to make his first Major League start...the previous oldest was Joe Pate at the age of 33 years, 334 days on May 6, 1926 against St. Louis (ND, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the fourth ML pitcher over the last 55 years to make his first ML start at age 36 or greater...joins Jason Lane (SD, July 28, 2014 at 37 years, 218 days), Troy Percival (STL, Sept. 30, 2007 at 38 years, 52 days) and Danny Boone (BAL, Sept. 30, 1990 at 36 years, 259 days).

**2017 APPEARANCES:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle **July 8**...left after six innings with the score tied 3-3...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Tampa Bay **July 18** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs (one earned)...left with a 3-2 lead but Casilla allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss at Toronto **July 24**...allowed a solo home run to Martin in the first and two more runs in the fourth on RBI singles by Carrera and Goins...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Minnesota on **July 29** in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven hits...pitched in relief in the A's 11-2 loss at San Francisco **Aug. 3**...tossed the final four innings and allowed four runs, all in the fifth...blanked the Giants on two hits and a walk over the final three innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Baltimore in Oakland on **Aug. 10**...allowed a career-high five runs on a career-high tying seven hits, including a career-high four home runs...had a no decision in the A's 10-8 win over Kansas City **Aug. 15** in Oakland...retired 15 of the final 16 batters he faced and left after 5.1 innings with a 4-3 lead but the bullpen allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save (Casilla).

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Baltimore Aug. 21...allowed a career-high tying five runs in 4.1 innings, which was his shortest outing as a starter...Oakland scored a run in the second but he gave that run back in the bottom of the second on a Trumbo sacrifice fly... then surrendered a lead off home run to Jones in the fourth and a three-run home run to Schoop in the fifth.

**SMITH vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.1 ip, 2 h, 4 bb, 5 so) in two career appearances, both in relief at Anaheim...faced the Angels once last year on Sept. 28 in the A's 8-6 loss (2.1 ip, 1 h, 4 bb, 3 so)...his other outing came on June 14, 2010 while pitching for Milwaukee...pitched the ninth inning of the Brewers 12-2 win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so).

**2017 WITH NASHVILLE:** Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...surrendered just five home runs in 74.0 innings, an average of 0.61 per nine innings...went 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA and .301 opponents average over his first 10 games... his opponents batting average included a .245 (34-for-139) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .284 (42-for-148) against right-handers... issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...yielded a .290 batting average and .355 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...was 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA in six games on the road, 1-3 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games in Nashville...did not allow a run in the third inning (12.0 ip)...tossed 6.0 innings or fewer in each of his 15 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 10 times...his first relief appearance came on May 18 at Fresno following rehab appearances by Daniel Mengden and John Axford...surrendered his first home run that day, snapping a season-opening seven-game, 38.1-inning, 166-batters faced homerless streak...also pitched in relief of Mengden in his next outing on May 23 against Omaha...moved back into the starting rotation May 28...had his only winning streak when he tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in back-to-back starts on June 2 at Iowa and June 7 at Omaha...that was part of a 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2-13... combined with Sean Doolittle, Tucker Healy and Simon Castro on a no-hitter on the 7th...tossed six of the innings and walked two while striking out four in the 4-0 win...earned Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of June 5-11 for his efforts.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Kendall Graveman (4-4, 4.24 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Aug. 3 and is 2-2 with a 4.93 ERA and .336 opponents batting average in five starts since his return...has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last three starts and is 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA over that span... is 3-2 with a 2.89 ERA in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with an 8.35 ERA in four starts against everyone else...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 2-0 with a 2.78 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-4 with a 5.36 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win over Texas last Friday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so)...is 2-2 with a 3.19 ERA (53.2 ip, 55 h, 20 r, 19 er, 10 bb, 37 so, 6 hr) in nine career starts against Los Angeles...is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (19.0 ip, 19 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 27-for-47 (57.4%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 7-of-15 (46.7%) save opportunities over the last 38 games...is 27-for-47 (57.4%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the American League...has the fourth fewest saves and the fifth most blown saves (20) in the AL.
