### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (63-81) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (82-62)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 13, 2017 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Snapped their season-high tying five-game winning streak last night to fall to 63-81...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the third consecutive season...it would mark the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons, the first time since 2007-09...have a .438 winning percentage, which is third lowest in the American League and tied for sixth lowest in the majors...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 110 days in fifth overall...should the A's remain in last the rest of the way, they will spend 129 days in sole possession of last, which would be fifth most in Oakland history and the most since 2015 (142).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's extended their road losing streak to eight games last night, which matches their second longest road losing streak over the last 12 years (had a nine-game road losing streak last year from May 24-June 11)...are now 21-48 (.304) on the road compared to 42-33 (.560) at home...the home winning percentage is .256 better than the road, which is currently the largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003) and the largest by an A's team since 1949 (.298)...have the worst road record in the majors and have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the 48 road losses are the most by a A's team since 2011 when they went 31-50...the only time in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .350 on the road was in 1979 (23-58, .284)...are 0-1 on their penultimate road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Boston (0-1), Philadelphia (three games) and Detroit (three games)...it matches their longest road trip of the season (April 25-May 4)...went 0-6 on the last trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-3), which marked the 11th winless road trip of six or more games in Oakland history (last: 0-7, Aug. 11-17, 2015)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (4-0) and have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 3-17-2 in road series.

**MORE HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are batting .227 (63-for-277) with 14 doubles, 10 home runs and 29 runs scored (3.6 runs per game) during their eight-game road losing streak...have a 7.45 ERA (56 er in 67.2 ip and .327 (92-for-281) opponents batting average...are hitting .335 with 23 doubles, 3 triples, 21 home runs and 76 runs scored over the last nine home games (8.4 runs per game) and are 7-2 in those games...have a 4.18 ERA and .244 opponents batting average.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's lead the majors in errors (113) and unearned runs (80)...rank second in the American League in passed balls (16), third in most stolen bases allowed (103) and double plays (148) and tied for third in fewest outfield assists (20).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .282 (190-for-673) with 40 doubles, 3 triples, 37 home runs and 114 runs scored over the last 19 games (6.0 runs per game)...rank third in the American League in doubles (272) and extra base hits (494)...however, have the second most strikeouts (1341) and fourth lowest batting average (.247)...the strikeouts are second most in Athletics history to the record of 1387 set in 2012.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit 39 home runs in the last 20 games and have 208 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...it is the fourth highest total in Athletics history and is the most since 2000 (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999)...A's players have 18 individual multi-homer games, which is second most in Oakland history (20 in 1996)...home runs have accounted for 319 of the A's 658 runs (48.5%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff has allowed 26 home runs in the last 13 games and has a 6.28 ERA (80 er in 114.2 ip) over that span...have surrendered 190 home runs for the season, which is third most in Oakland history and the most since 1997 (197)...the record is 205 in 1996...rank second in the American League in most wild pitches (77) and fourth in highest ERA (4.81) and fewest strikeouts (1075)...the wild pitches are an Athletics franchise record.

**STARTING PITCHING:** Sean Manaea allowed seven runs last night, which marks the third time in the last eight games the A's starter has allowed seven runs...starters have allowed one run or fewer three times over that

span...starters are now 11-15 with a 6.20 ERA (146 er in 212.0 ip) and .317 (276-for-872) opponents batting average over the last 42 contests dating back to July 28...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (607) and fourth in highest ERA (4.90), most losses (56) and fewest home runs (116)...are one of four teams without a complete game (ATL, CWS, TB) and have gone an Athletics record 184 consecutive games since their last complete game on Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...entering this season, 13 teams in Major League history have gone an entire season without a complete game...the Athletics have never done it.

**ROOKIES:** A's rookies are batting a combined .333 (44-for-132) with 34 runs scored, seven doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 33 RBI and 18 walks over the last eight games...the A's have used 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...eight of the rookies have made their Major League debuts...had seven rookies in the starting lineup in the second game of the doubleheader Saturday...have had exactly six rookies (including the starting pitcher) in the starting lineup four times and at least one rookie in the lineup every day dating back to May 31...have three rookies (Chapman, Olson, Pinder) with 10 or more home runs for the second time in Oakland history (1977: Gross 22, Page 21, Armas 13).

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have employed 53 players for the season, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 30-26 (.536) during day games compared to 33-55 (.375) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 37-41 (.474) against everyone else...have a run differential of -102, which is third lowest in the AL...were outscored by 108 runs last year, which was the A's worst mark since 1997 (-182)...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 3 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

**A's vs. RED SOX:** The A's lead the season series 3-2...lost the first game in Boston last night after winning three of four in Oakland in May...now have a seven-game losing streak at Fenway Park, which is their longest since an eight-game losing streak from May 19, 1996-July 22, 1997...have been outscored 66-24 during the current streak and have allowed 51 runs in the last four games at Fenway...lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and are 5-12 against Boston over the last three years...that includes 5-5 in the Coliseum and 0-7 at Fenway...are 239-293 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 145-121 in Oakland, 93-171 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 881-1074 against the Red Sox.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads Major League rookies in doubles (16) and extra base hits (30) since the All-Star Break...**Khris Davis** needs one more home run to join Jimmie Foxx (1932-34) as the only players in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...**Jed Lowrie** ranks third in Oakland history and tied for ninth in Athletics history with 44 doubles...the Oakland record for doubles in a season is 47 by Jason Giambi in 2001...**Matt Olson** has six home runs in his last nine games and nine in his last 14...has 13 home runs since the break, which is tied for second most among Major League rookies (Hoskins, PHI 16).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1953** Bob Trice becomes the first African-American to appear in a major league game for the Athletics...in **1970** Bert Campaneris singles in the first game of a double-header at Kansas City for the 1000<sup>th</sup> hit of his major league career...in **1971** Rick Monday's 11<sup>th</sup> inning RBI single scores Catfish Hunter to give the A's a 2-1 win at Kansas City...Hunter pitches 10 innings, allowing a run on four hits, to become the A's second 20-game winner...in **2010** Bobby Cramer defeats the Kansas City Royals 5-3 in his Major League debut at the age of 30 to become the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to start and win in his debut.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (7-10, 5.82 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 30 and is 2-2 with a 7.02 ERA (33 er in 42.1 ip) and .291 (50-for-172) opponents batting average in eight starts since his return...has the fifth highest post All-Star Break ERA in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...was on the A's Opening Day roster and was 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...was recalled on May 27 and went 2-4 with a 4.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in seven starts before going on the DL July 4 with a right thumb blister.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed 27 home runs, which ties the Oakland rookie record set by Trevor Cahill in 2009...yielded three home runs in his last start after allowing three in his start before that...is the first A's pitcher to allow three home runs in back-to-back games since Cory Lidle in 2001 (June 21 and 29)...has allowed at least one home run in each of his last six starts and has surrendered 12 home runs in 33.2 innings total over that stretch (3.21 per nine innings)...has allowed an average of 2.04 home runs per nine innings for the season...the only pitcher in Athletics history to average two or more home runs per nine innings in a season with 100 or more innings pitched is Gil Heredia (2.22 in 2001)...14 of his home runs have come with two outs, which is second most in the American League (Zimmerman, DET 16)...13 have come over the first two innings, including seven in the second inning, which is tied for third most in the AL...his 27 home runs are the most by any A's pitcher since A.J. Griffin surrendered 36 in 2013.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (7) and ranks second in strikeouts (96), innings pitched (119.0) and games started (22)...this marks the third consecutive season and sixth time in the last seven years the A's had at least one rookie with 20 or more starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for second in the American League in balks (2), tied for fifth in unearned runs (11) and tied for seventh in wild pitches (9)...opponents have been caught stealing six times with him on the mound, which is tied for fifth most in the AL...has a 5.82 ERA, which is fourth highest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched.

**TWO-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Has allowed 11 runs in his last two starts but has a no decision in each outing...is now 2-0 with a 5.82 ERA (14 er in 21.2 ip) over his last four starts...it marks the third time in his career he has won back-to-back decisions...has never won three straight.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-6 with a 7.52 ERA (54 er in 64.2 ip) and 18 home runs allowed in 12 starts in Oakland compared to 4-4 with a 3.81 ERA (23 er in 54.1 ip) and nine home runs allowed in 10 starts on the road...is tied for the Major League lead in home runs allowed at home and is two short of the Oakland record of 20 set by Trevor Cahill in 2009...based on a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he has the highest home ERA in the majors (Kennedy, KC 6.82) and in Oakland history (Mark Redman, 7.46 in 2004).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 1-7 with an 8.00 ERA (48 er in 54.0 ip) and .341 (78-for-229) opponents batting average in 11 starts at night compared to 6-3 with a 4.02 ERA (29 er in 65.0 ip) and .205 (48-for-234) opponents batting average in 11 starts during the day...has the second highest night ERA in the majors among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched at night (Pivetta, PHI 8.19)...using the same minimum, it is third highest in Oakland history (Blake Stein, 9.00 in 1998; Dave Stewart, 8.15 in 1995)...is tied for second in the AL in day wins...is tied for the Major League lead in home runs allowed during the day (15)...is now 1-7 with a 6.81 ERA (53 er in 70.0 ip) in 14 career starts at night, 8-3 with a 3.56 ERA (31 er in 78.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-4 with a 4.67 ERA (27 er in 52.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 3-6 with a 6.72 ERA (50 er in 67.0 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

**2017 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was charged with the first loss of his career in his first start of the season, a 5-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5...yielded five runs on eight hits in 4.1 innings...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...struck out a career-high nine batters in an 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...had a career-high four-game losing streak that spanned five starts from May 9 to June 13...had a 6.59 ERA during the streak...tossed a career-high 107 pitches at New York (AL) May 27...picked up the win in consecutive starts on June 18 against New York (AL) and June 23 at Chicago (AL)...it was the first time in his career he won back-to-back starts and the second time he had a two-game winning streak (Sept. 7-25, 2016)...left the start against the White Sox with a blister after tossing 66 pitches...missed just one turn in the rotation before starting against the White Sox again on July 3...was placed on the 10-day disabled list July 6 retroactive to July 4 with a right thumb blister...made

two rehab appearances (one start) with Triple-A Nashville before he was reinstated July 30...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings in an 8-3 win over Texas on Aug. 27.

**LAST START:** He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 win over Houston last Friday...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 5.0 innings and also surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...allowed a two-run home run to Altuve in the first but the A's tied the game with two in the second...then allowed a Reddick RBI double and a Gurriel two-run home run in the third and a Reddick two-run home run in the fifth...left after five innings trailing 7-3 and the A's scored four in the seventh and two in the ninth for the win.

**2017 WITH NASHVILLE:** Went 3-0 with a 2.95 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four games, including three starts, with Triple-A Nashville...walked just four batters in 21.1 innings (1.69 per nine innings) while striking out 28 (11.81 per nine innings)...surrendered three home runs...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts following his May 11 option...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win May 21 at Sacramento start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland May 27 but returned to Nashville July 19 on a rehab assignment...his first outing came in relief July 19 at Iowa in a game started by a rehabbing Kendall Graveman...entered the game to start the fourth inning and tossed 3.1 innings (4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...then started on July 25 against Las Vegas and was the winning pitcher in a 10-4 victory (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 9 so).

**2016 RECAP:** Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHERS

**RHP Daniel Gossett (4-8, 5021 ERA):** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with a 4.64 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in four starts since his return...was first selected from Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents average in 10 starts in his Major League debut before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season today, his 10th in a day game...is 3-4 with a 6.09 ERA in eight starts during the day compared to 1-4 with a 3.48 ERA in five starts at night...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-1 A's win over Houston in the first game of the doubleheader last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Red Sox in his career...was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with Nashville.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 28-for-51 (54.9%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 8-of-19 (42.1%) save opportunities over the last 51 games...is 28-for-51 (54.9%) for the season, which is the second lowest percentage in the majors (TEX, 54.5%)...is tied for the third most blown saves in the American League (23) and has the third fewest saves.
- Has a 4.21 ERA (91 er in 194.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.67 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.26).
