OAKLAND ATHLETICS (68-83) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (62-89)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight, four of the last five, and 10 of the last 13...are 16-13 over the last 29 games and 68-83 (.450) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season but have tied their win total from 2015 (68-94) and are just one short of their total from last year (69-93)...this marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons, the first time since 2007-09...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 117 days in fifth overall...should the A's remain in last the rest of the way, they will spend 129 days in sole possession of last, which would be fifth most in Oakland history and the most since 2015 (142).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-3 on their penultimate road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (2-0)...clinched a winning road trip for just the second time this season (Aug. 2-6 at SF/LAA, 3-2) and have won back-to-back road series for the first time since last Sept. 12-18 (KC/TEX)...are 26-50 (.342) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the majors...the 50 road losses are the A's most since 2011 (also 50) and are tied for sixth most in Oakland history (58 in 1979, 52 in 1977, 51 in 1993, 1997 and 1978)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the season's final homestand begins Friday against Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Houston (4-0) and have a 42-33 (.560) record in Oakland...the home winning percentage is .218 better than the road, which is currently the second largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...are 12-8-4 in home series compared to 5-18-2 in road series (includes current series win at Detroit).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (118) and unearned runs (82)...rank tied for third in the American League in double plays (154), and third in passed balls (16) and stolen bases allowed (108)...are fourth in fewest outfield assists (20).

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out a franchise record 1413 times...that ranks second in the American League (TB, 1457) and third in the majors (MIL, 1471)...it is eighth most in AL history (7th is MIN with 1426 in 2016)...rank third in the AL in doubles (285) and extra base hits (521), and fourth in walks (541) and home runs (221)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are seventh most (6th is 527 in 1932, 5th is 540 in 2004)...have 52 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is the most in the majors (MIN, 51)...home runs have accounted for 342 of the A's 697 runs (49.1%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996,

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.76 ERA, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.69 was in 1998 (4.81)...are second in the majors with an Athletics franchise record 81 wild pitches...have allowed 512 extra base hits, which is third most in the AL and is fifth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998, 518 in 1999)...have 1123 strikeouts, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL but eighth most in Athletics history (7th in 1124 in 2009, 6th is 1136 in 2012)...have allowed 197 home runs, which is seventh most in the AL but tied for second most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed just seven earned runs in the last five games (24.1 ip, 2.59 ERA) but are 14-16 with a 5.80 ERA (159 er in 246.2 ip) and .307 (307-for-1001) opponents batting average over the last 49 contests...are 46-57 with a 4.83 ERA (439 er in 817.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (629) and fourth in most losses and fewest home runs (120)...Daniel Mengden snapped the Athletics franchise record streak of 186 consecutive games without a complete game on Friday...it was the A's first complete game since Aug. 19, 2016 at Chicago-AL (Graveman)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

SEPTEMBER BATTING: The A's are batting .276 (175-for-633) in the month of September...are leading the American League in home runs (34), are tied for first in walks (76), are second in extra base hits (76), slugging percentage (.510) and on-base percentage (.359), and are third in runs

(110)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 179 strikeouts...have set franchise records for most strikeouts in the month of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year...the record for September is 276 in 2012

TRAGIC NUMBER: The A's can be officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 152 today with a loss and a Minnesota win...were eliminated from the playoffs in game 147 last year and 149 in 2015...were officially eliminated from the American League West in game 137 on Sept. 4, which was the third earliest elimination by game in Oakland history (game 135 on Aug. 30, 1979; game 136 on Sept. 6, 1977).

ROOKIES: The trio of Matt Olson (23), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (13) have combined for 51 home runs in just 210 combined games, which is the third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 1987 - in 398 games; 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 1977 - in 409 games)...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...rookies have combined for 20 home runs and 53 RBI over the last 15 games...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...had seven rookies in the starting lineup once (Sept. 9 vs. HOU, G#2), six (including the starting pitcher) five times and at least one every day dating back to May 31.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have employed 53 players for the season, which is second most in Oakland history (54 in 2007) and third most in Athletics history (56 in 1915)...have used 28 pitchers, which is second most in Athletics history to the franchise record of 30 in 2015...have employed 75 different players over the last two years, 23 of which have made their Major League debuts

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 31-27 (.534) during day games compared to 37-56 (.398) at night...are 26-40 (.394) against the American League West compared to 42-43 (.494) against everyone else...are averaging 3 hours, 10 minutes and 19 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have won the season series (up 4-1)...have won two straight in Detroit after winning two of three in Oakland in May...lost the season series last year, 3-4...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Detroit...over the past 11 years, the A's are 5-4-2 in season series, including this year's win...are now 44-39 against the Tigers dating back to the start of the 2007 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-247 against the Tigers...that includes 142-111 in Oakland, 112-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 36-28 (.563) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (LAA, 40-32/.556)...all-time, the A's are 924-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson has homered 15 times in his last 21 games, which are the most ever in Oakland history over a 21-game span...also are the most in MLB history by a rookie over a 21-game span (source: Elias)...has 12 home runs this month, which are the most in MLB history by a rookie in September...are also tied for the second most home runs in September by any player in franchise history (Giambi, 13, 2000)...his 23 home runs are tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a rookie...has homered in five straight games, which is a new Oakland rookie record...the franchise record for home runs in consecutive games is six, set by Frank Thomas in 2006 (Sept. 5-11)...has homered in each of the A's last eight series...each of his last six hits and eight of his last nine have been home runs...since Aug. 27 (21 games), he is 24-for-78 (.308) with a double, 15 home runs, 26 RBI, and a 1.297 OPS...has 23 home runs through 66 career games, which is the most in franchise history (McGwire, 22; Canseco, 16)...**Jed Lowrie** hit his 47th double of the season last night, which ties the Oakland A's record for doubles in a season (Giambi, 2001)...the franchise record is 53 (Al Simmons, 1926).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** the A's clinch their first American League Pennant...in **1975** Vida Blue wins 20 games for the third time in his career as he pitches eight innings in the A's 16-4 win at Kansas City...he would go on to win each of his final two starts to finish at 22-11.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-1, 4.30 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 5 and is 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA (2 er in 15.0 ip) and .143 (7-for-49) opponents batting average in two starts since his return...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...began the season on the 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner...started a rehab assignment with Nashville on May 8 and made three starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed hitters to a .194 (7-for-36) batting average...opponents are 5-for-24 (.208) with no walks when leading off an inning...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number one hitter in batting order (0-for-12)...has retired the side in order in the first inning in each of his four starts...has allowed a .206 (13-for-63) batting average with the bases empty compared to .333 (7-for-21) with runners on base.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season today, his fourth in a day game...is 0-1 in three starts during the day this year and 0-7 in eight starts in his career.

LOSSES: Is 2-10 in 18 career starts...the 10 losses are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first 18 career games...Mike Morgan has the most as he was 2-13 in 16 career games with the A's.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland on May 29...allowed three home runs, which marks the first time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in a start...yielded a leadoff home run to Jackson in the third inning and then surrendered four runs in the fourth inning on back-to-back homers by Santana and Encarnacion, a RBI singles by Gomes and a Jackson sacrifice fly.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-4 win over Washington on June 3...Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the first but he allowed a Drew sacrifice fly in the second...the A's built a 6-1 lead before he allowed a three-run home run to Lind in the third...had a 7-4 lead when he was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-4 win over Houston in the second game of the doubleheader on Sept. 9 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first five innings but Peacock shutout the A's on three hits over the first five innings...Mengden allowed three runs in the sixth on a two-run home run by Altuve and a RBI single by Reddick but Oakland tied the game in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Moll to start the seventh.

LAST START: He tossed his first career complete game, a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Philadelphia last Friday...did not walk a batter to become the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout and not walk a batter...struck out seven while tossing a career-high 118 pitches...those were the most pitches by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray had 119 on May 3, 2015 at Texas...Crawford had both of the Phillies hits...had a one-out single in the third and a leadoff single in the sixth...retired each of the final 11 batters he faced.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in nine starts with Nashville...missed two months of the season while he was on the disabled list from June 9 to Aug. 13 with a strained right oblique...was sent to the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League Aug. 4 for a two-start rehab assignment and did not allow a run in 5.0 innings (1 h, 3 bb, 9 so)...combined with both clubs for a 2-4 record, a 3.69 ERA and .237 opponents batting average...the batting average broke down to .190 (15-for-79) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (26-for-94) against right-handers...surrendered four of his five home runs to

righties...yielded a .217 average with runners in scoring position...tossed more than five innings in just two of his starts.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: His first three starts with the Sounds were on a rehab assignment from Oakland and he went 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA and .220 opponents batting average...tossed 3.2 innings in each of his first two starts but then struck out a season-high seven while allowing just one run in 6.0 innings in a 13-3 win at Fresno May 18...was reinstated from the Oakland disabled list and optioned to Nashville May 20...combined with Chris Smith on a three-hit shutout in Nashville's 10-0 win over Omaha May 23...tossed a season-high seven innings and allowed all three of the hits...was promoted to Oakland May 29...was optioned back to Nashville June 3 but did not pitch before going on the disabled list June 9 with a strained right oblique...made two rehab starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings Aug. 4 against the Dodgers and 3.0 scoreless and hitless innings Aug. 9 at the Cubs...was reinstated Aug. 14 and went 0-3 with a 6.09 ERA over his final five starts with the Sounds...walked a season-high four batters in back-to-back starts on Aug. 19 against Iowa and Aug. 24 against Round Rock...matched his season high with seven strikeouts in just 4.0 innings on the 24th...yielded a season-high four runs on a season-high eight hits in 5.0 innings in a 9-3 loss to Omaha on Aug. 29.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in his third professional season after beginning the year with no experience above Single-A...went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts with Double-A Midland, 8-2 with a 1.67 ERA in 13 starts with Triple-A Nashville and 2-9 with a 6.50 ERA in 14 starts over two stints with Oakland...his ERA with the A's was second highest in the majors among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched (Blair, ATL 7.59)...his .182 winning percentage was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more decisions (Morgan, PHI .154) and sixth lowest in Oakland history...tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (72.0) and strikeouts (71)...allowed a .284 opponents batting average, which included a .283 (39-for-138) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .286 (44-for-154) against right-handers.

2016 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Midland and Nashville...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for second in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...his opponents batting average included a .190 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 against right-handers...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position.

- Has a 4.35 ERA (104 er in 215.0 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.65 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.40).
- Has allowed 77 home runs, which is third most in the AL and the most homers an Oakland bullpen has ever allowed...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is first in the AL in most extra base hits allowed (198), is second in highest opponents slugging percentage (.434), is tied for third in most losses (26) and is tied for fourth in fewest wins (22).
