OAKLAND ATHLETICS (72-84) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (76-81)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high seven-game winning streak snapped last night...it was the A's longest winning streak over the last four years...are now 14-4 over the last 18 games...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 37-36 since then...are 72-84 (.462) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and 10th worst in the majors...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...however, have topped their record from each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 123 days in fifth overall.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's had their season-high eight-game home winning streak snapped last night...it was their longest home winning streak over the last four years...are 3-1 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (3-0) and Seattle (0-1) and have won 11 of the last 14 home games...are 45-34 (.570) at home compared to 27-50 (.351) on the road...have the fifth best home record in the American League but the second worst road record...the home winning percentage is .219 better than the road, which is currently the second largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999)...have clinched a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...leave following the game tomorrow for the final road trip of the season, a four-game series at Texas...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0) for their third winning road trip of the season (June 23-29, Aug. 2-6)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...are 13-8-4 in home series compared to 5-18-2 in road series.

MORE AT HOME: The A's have hit 126 home runs at home, which ties the Oakland record for home runs in the Coliseum (2000)...are slugging .470, which is on pace to break the Oakland record for highest home slugging percentage (.462 in 2002)...have already set Oakland records for extra base hits (301) and strikeouts (705) at home...have 163 doubles, which is second most to the record of 170 in 2005...have 408 runs scored, which ranks sixth (466 in 2000, 461 in 1999, 440 in 1996, 427 in 2002, 423 in 2001)...lead the American League in extra base hits, rank second in doubles and strikeouts, third in home runs and slugging and fourth in runs scored...the pitching staff has set an Oakland record for strikeouts at home (641)...has a 4.41 ERA, which will be third highest in Oakland history if it remains above 4.34 (5.57 in 1997, 5.12 in 1996)...have allowed 95 home runs, which is third most in Oakland history (102 in 1996, 96 in 1997).

A'S IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 14-9 in September and need one more win to clinch a winning record in a month for the first time since going 13-12 in April of 2016...the 14 wins are the A's most in a month since they went 15-12 in June of 2015...the streak of 10 consecutive losing months is an Oakland record...have hit 39 home runs, which ranks second in the American League and tied for fourth in Oakland history in the month of September (47 in 2000, 42 in 2012, 42 in 2013)...have struck out 214 times, which is fourth most in the AL and third most in Oakland history (276 in 2012, 223 in 1999)...have already set franchise records for most strikeouts in the months of April (221), May (255), June (285), July (229) and August (244) this year...also rank second in the AL in walks (88), third in extra base hits (87), slugging percentage (.477) and on-base percentage (.343) and fourth in runs (127).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high seven-game errorless streak...however, lead the majors with 118 errors for the season, which is six more than any other team (CWS, 112)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (82)...rank third in the American League in stolen bases allowed (108), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fourth in double plays (158) and fewest outfield assists (21).

OFFENSE: The A's have struck out a franchise record 1448 times, which is fifth most in American League history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1488 by TB in 2017, 1482 by TB in 2016, 1452 by HOU in 2016)...rank third in the AL in doubles (291) and extra base hits (532) this year and fifth in home runs (226), walks (553) and slugging percentage (.435)...the home runs are fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999) and the extra base hits are sixth most (555 in 2001, 547 in 1996, 543 in 2000, 542 in 1999, 540 in 2004)...have 57 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is tied with Cleveland for the most in the majors...home runs have

accounted for 350 of the A's 714 runs (49.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (41), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15).

PITCHING: The A's allowed four home runs last night to bring their season total to 203...this marks the second time in Oakland history the A's have allowed 200 home runs...are two short of the record of 205 set in 1996...have compiled a 2.83 ERA (28 er in 89.0 ip) over the last 10 games but have a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last time Oakland finished with an ERA above 4.58 was in 1999 (4.68)...rank second in the majors with an Athletics franchise record 83 wild pitches...have allowed 523 extra base hits, which is fourth most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996, 530 in 1998)...have 1160 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but tied for fifth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1188 in 2016, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015, 1160 in 2011).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in eight of the last 10 games...allowed six and seven runs in the other two contests and are 6-1 with a 2.56 ERA (15 er in 52.2 ip) over that span...overall, rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (652), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in fewest home runs (125)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

ROOKIES: The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (13) have combined for 52 home runs in just 224 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's had three rookies with 10 or more home runs (1977)...the A's have employed 20 rookies this year, which is the second highest total in Oakland history (21 in 2008).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-25 (.490) against teams that have either clinched a playoff spot (BOS, CLE, HOU, NYY, WASH) or currently have a playoff spot (MIN)...are 48-59 (.449) against all other teams...are 33-27 (.550) during day games compared to 39-57 (.406) at night...are 29-41 (.414) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...have 10 walk-off wins, including an Athletics record and Major League leading seven walk-off home runs...are averaging 3 hours, 9 minutes and 24 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000...have 33 players on the active roster.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost each of their last seven games to Seattle, which matches the longest losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (Sept. 26, 2008-May 1, 2009 and Aug. 13-Sept. 30, 2016)...have lost the season series for the fifth consecutive season as they trail 6-11 with two games remaining...prior to this streak, had never lost more than four straight season series to the Mariners...are 3-4 in Oakland and went 3-7 in Seattle...are 36-57 (.388) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...all-time, the A's are 340-281 against the Mariners...that includes 183-125 in Oakland, 156-154 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 80-90 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the second player in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...the other is Jimmie Foxx, who did it three straight seasons from 1932-34...**Jed Lowrie** has tied the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 47 (Jason Giambi, 2001).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1954** the Philadelphia Athletics play at New York in their last game ever and defeat the Yankees, 8-6...in **1971** Vida Blue strikes out four Milwaukee Brewers in his final start of the season to bring his season total to 301...he joins Rube Waddell as the only two Athletic pitchers to fan 300 in a single season...in **1974** Jim Hunter tosses a seven-hitter to defeat the Minnesota Twins 2-1...it is his 25th win and his fourth straight 20-win season...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits an inside the park home run in the A's 7-5 win over Seattle in the Coliseum to tie Carlton Fisk's record for most home runs by an American League catcher, a record Steinbach would later break...in **2002** the A's clinch their second AL West title in three years and win their 100th game of the season with a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle...Miguel Tejada collects his 200th hit of the season in that game to become the first Oakland player to reach the 200 plateau.

Saves/Opportunities: 33-for-56 (58.9%)

- The A's bullpen has converted just 14-of-25 (56.0%) save opportunities over the last 64 games...is 33-for-56 (58.9%) for the season, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the majors...is tied for the third most blown saves in the American League (23) and has the fourth fewest saves.
- Has a 4.05 ERA (107 er in 237.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.56 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL (DET, 5.66)...the last time the A's bullpen finished the season with an ERA above 4.62 was in 1997 (4.82).
- Has allowed 78 home runs, which is tied for third most in the AL and the most homers an Oakland bullpen has ever allowed...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is second the AL in most extra base hits allowed (201), is third in highest opponents slugging percentage (.429), is tied for fourth in most losses (26) and tied for third in fewest wins (22).
- Ranks first in the AL in fewest inherited runners (201).
- Has allowed 53 stolen bases, which is tied for the most in the majors.

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville on Sept. 5 for his second stint with the A's this year and has made four appearances, including two starts, since his return (12.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 1 hr, 1.42 ERA).
- Was on the Opening Day roster and made one start before moving to the bullpen...was 0-1 with a 16.71 ERA in three games when he was designated for assignment April 25 and outrighted to Nashville April 29.
- Has allowed at least one home run in eight of his 12 career appearances and has surrendered 13 home runs in 42.0 career innings (2.79 per nine innings)...the home runs are tied for second most by an A's pitcher over the first 12 games of his career (Straily, 14).
- Has faced the Mariners once this season (3.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 1 hr).
- Did not allow a run over his final five appearances with Nashville (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 so)...was on the Sounds disabled list from May 26 to July 28 with a strained right elbow and had a four-game rehab assignment with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...did not allow a home run in 39.0 minor league innings overall...his complete 2017 minor league stats:

Last Year: Made both his Triple-A and Major League debuts...combined for a 9-6 record and a 3.58 ERA in 25 starts with Midland and Nashville...went 1-3 with a 7.25 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's.

64 RHP MICHAEL BRADY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville on Aug. 25 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and has pitched five times since his return (7.0 ip, 9 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 10.29 ERA).
- Tossed 5.1 innings Aug. 12 after pitching 6.0 innings of relief on Aug. 1...is the second Oakland reliever over the last 30 years with two outings greater than 5.0 innings in the same season (Brad Rigby, 1999).
- Posted a 3.18 ERA in seven games during his first stint from June 17 to July 18...pitched just once during his second stay from July 31 to Aug. 1.
- Has faced the Mariners twice this season (4.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 so, 11.25 ERA).
- Did not pitch with Nashville following his last option Aug. 23...had a .220 opponents batting average overall, including .220 against right-handers and .224 against left-handers...his complete 2017 minor league stats:

- Is tied for eighth among AL relievers in losses (5), tied for 14th in first batter strikeouts (20) and tied for sixth in stolen bases against (10).
- Opponents are 9-for-57 (.158) with runners in scoring position.
- Has not allowed a run in 11 appearances on no days rest (11.0 ip).
- Has faced the Mariners seven times this season (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 1 hr, 4.50 ERA).

Last Year: Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.

- Has tossed fewer than one inning in 41 of his 70 appearances.

- Has an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) in 13 outings on no days rest, a 3.18 ERA (12 er in 31.0 ip) in his other 34 appearances.
- Is tied for fourth among American League relievers in unearned runs (6).
- First batters faced are 4-for-43 (.093) with a sacrifice fly, three walks (.149 on-base percentage) and 19 strikeouts.

- Has not allowed a run in his last 11 games for a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak...opponents are 6-for-41 (.145) over that stretch...logged a 5.63 ERA over his first nine games with the A's after being acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers Aug. 15 for international slot money.
- Opponents are batting .089 (4-for-45) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Mariners once this season (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so, 1 hr).
- Was on the Dodgers Opening Day roster and was 0-1 with a 4.66 ERA in 26 relief appearances when he was placed on the DL June 23 with thoracic inflammation...had a five-game rehab assignment (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 1.50 ERA) before he was reinstated Aug. 13.

Last Year: Appeared in 37 games with the Dodgers, going 5-4 with a 5.53 ERA (25 ER/ 40.2 IP), before being placed on the DL on July 20, where he remained for the duration of the season with a strained left oblique.

- Has a career high 68 games pitched and 76 strikeouts.
- Is tied for fourth among AL relievers in runs allowed (34), tied for first in stolen bases against (12) and is 11th in highest ERA (4.31).
- Has an 7.20 ERA (20 er in 25.0 ip) and .302 (32-for-106) opponents average in 29 games on the road compared to a 2.39 ERA (10 er in 37.2 ip) and .180 (25-for-139) opponents batting average in 39 games at home.
- Has faced the Mariners six times this season (3.2 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 2 hr, 14.73 ERA).

- Was acquired from Colorado for a player to be named later or cash on Aug. 16 and was assigned to Nashville.
- Was originally selected by the Rockies in the third round of the 2013 draft and is 9-10 with a 3.35 ERA in 151 appearances in five seasons in the minors.
- Has faced the Mariners four times this season (3.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 2.45 ERA).

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville July 8 and has made nine starts and three relief appearances since then.
- Is 0-4 with a 6.94 ERA in nine starts (the first starts of his career) and 0-0 with a 7.37 ERA (6 er in 7.1 ip) in three relief appearances.
- Has allowed 16 home runs in 54.0 innings, an average of 2.67 per nine innings...that is currently the highest in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings.
- Has faced the Mariners once this season (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 1 hr).
- Was 4-3 with a 3.16 ERA and .265 opponents batting average in 15 games, including 12 starts, with Nashville...ranked third in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his July 8 promotion.
