OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-86) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (77-83)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won nine of the last 12 and 16 of the last 22 games...went 35-48 over the first 83 games through July 3 but are 39-38 since then...are 74-86 (.463) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League and 10th worst in the majors...the A's are in last place in the AL West and trail fourth place Texas by three games with two games remaining, which guarantees a last place finish in the West for the third consecutive season...is the first time they have ever finished last in the West three straight years...before divisional play, the A's had three or more consecutive last place finishes in the AL twice (7, 1915-21; 4, 1940-43)...have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season, which marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have finished under .500 in at least three straight seasons (last: 2007-09)...however, have topped their record from each of the previous two seasons (69-93 last year, 68-94 in 2015)...have been in sole possession of last place in the AL West every day dating back to May 30 and have spent 127 days in fifth overall.

A's IN SEPTEMBER: The A's have clinched a winning record in September as they are 16-11 with one game remaining...that snaps an Oakland record streak of 10 consecutive months with a losing record...this is the first time the A's have posted a winning record in a month since going 13-12 in April of 2016...the 16 wins are the A's most in a month since they went 17-9 in June of 2014...have hit 44 home runs, which is tied for third in the American League...it is second most Athletics history in the month of September and is three short of the record of 47 in 2000...have 100 extra base hits, which ranks fourth in the AL and is a new Athletics record for September (was 99 in 2013)...have struck out 242 times, which is fifth most in the AL and second most in Athletics history to the record of 276 in 2012...also rank third in the AL in walks (95), fourth in slugging percentage (.471) and fifth in on-base percentage (.336).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have split the first two games of their final road trip of the season...last night's loss snapped a season-high five-game road winning streak...went 6-3 on the last road trip to Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0)...have won back-to-back road series for the first time since Sept. 12-18 of last year (KC/TEX)...are 28-51 (.354) on the road and finished 46-35 (.568) at home...have the second worst road record in the American League (CWS, 27-52)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the fourth consecutive season and ninth time in the last 11 years...the 51 road losses are the A's most since 1997 (also 51) and are tied for third most in Oakland history (58 in 1979, 52 in 1977, 51 in 1993, 1997 and 1978)...the home winning percentage is .214 better than the road, which is currently the second largest differential in Oakland history (.223 in 2003, .210 in 1999, .199 in 1986)...went 4-2 on the final homestand against Texas (3-0) and Seattle (1-2) and finished with a winning record at home for the first time since 2014 (48-33)...went 13-9-4 in home series and are 5-18-2 in road series.

MORE ON THE ROAD: The A's have hit 102 home runs on the road, which is tied for seventh most in Oakland history (130 in 1996, 123 in 1999, 113 in 2000, 111 in 1987, 103 in 2012, 103 in 2013, 102 in 2016)...hitters have set an Athletics record for strikeouts on the road (757)...are hitting .236 (638-for-2702), which is second lowest in the American League (TEX, .224) and currently third lowest in Oakland history (.230 in 1968, .234 in 2014, .239 in 2011)...have scored 313 runs, which is the second fewest in the AL (DET, 315 in 79 games)...are averaging 3.96 runs per game on the road...have averaged under 4.00 runs per game on the road seven times in Oakland history but just twice over the last 38 years (3.81 in 2010, 3.83 in 2011)...the pitching staff has set an Athletics record for home runs allowed on the road (109).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their season-high errorless streak snapped at nine games Thursday night...the streak tied for fifth longest in Oakland history...now have a Major League leading 120 errors, which is six more than any other team (CWS, 114)...have led the majors in errors three times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 2015)...also have a Major League leading 83 unearned runs, which are the A's most since 2000 (also 83)...last had more in 1999 when they had 96...are tied for second in the American League in fewest outfield assists (21), rank third in stolen bases allowed (109), tied for third in passed balls (16) and fourth in double plays (162).

OFFENSE: The A's have set a franchise record for strikeouts in a season (1476) and have 545 extra base hits, which is 10 short of the record of 555 set in 2001...the strikeouts are third most in the American League this year but are fourth most in AL history (1535 by HOU in 2013, 1514 by TB

in 2017, 1482 by TB in 2016)...have homered in a season-high 16 consecutive games, which is tied for the sixth longest such streak in Oakland history...now have 231 home runs, which is fourth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999)...rank third in the AL in extra base hits and doubles (299) and fifth in home runs, walks (560) and slugging percentage (.435)...have been hit by the fewest pitches (42), rank third in fewest stolen bases (57) and fourth in fewest triples (15)...have 62 home runs dating back to Aug. 21, which is second most in the majors (CLE, 63)...home runs have accounted for 358 of the A's 730 runs (49.0%)...the Oakland record for highest percentage of runs scoring on home runs is 46.3% in 1996.

PITCHING: The A's have set an Athletics record for wild pitches (83)...have set an Oakland record with 208 home runs, which is 12 short of the Athletics record of 220 by the Kansas City A's in 1964...have 1187 strikeouts, which is third most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1188 in 2016)...have allowed 531 extra base hits, which is third most in Oakland history (581 in 1997, 556 in 1996)...have a 4.67 ERA and have not finished the season with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...the 83 wild pitches are second most in the majors (HOU, 85).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of the last 14 games and are 7-3 with a 3.09 ERA (26 er in 75.2 ip) over that span...overall, rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (667), tied for third in fewest complete games (1) and fourth in most losses (60)...the Athletics record for fewest complete games in a season is one in 2012.

THIS AND THAT: The trio of Matt Olson (24), Chad Pinder (15) and Matt Chapman (14) have combined for 53 home runs in just 228 games, which is third most in Oakland history by a rookie trio (69 by McGwire/Steinbach/Polonia in 398 games in 1987, 56 by Gross/Page/Armas in 409 games in 1977)...the A's are 34-27 (.557) during day games compared to 40-59 (.404) at night...are 24-25 (.490) against playoff teams, 50-61 (.450) against all other teams...are 31-43 (.419) against the American League West, 43-43 (.500) against all other teams...are 35-36 (.493) since the All-Star Break after going 39-50 (.438) before the break...are averaging 3 hours, 8 minutes and 55 seconds per game...the Oakland record for longest average time of game is 3:08:28 in 2000.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the season series as they lead 10-7 with two games remaining...had their seven-game winning streak against Texas snapped last night, which was their longest against the Rangers since July 17-Sept. 10, 2005 when they also won seven straight...the Oakland record for longest winning streak against Texas is nine (July 28, 2002-April 9, 2003 and June 26, 2003-April 6, 2004)...are 2-6 in Texas but went 8-1 in Oakland, tying the Oakland record for home wins against the Rangers (8-2 in 2002, 8-1 in 2003)...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against Texas...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 48-45 against the Rangers over the last five seasons...are 351-360 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 186-170 in Oakland and 165-190 in Texas...are 98-102 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 448-442 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the second player in Athletics history with back-to-back 40-homer seasons...the other is Jimmie Foxx, who did it three straight seasons from 1932-34...**Jed Lowrie** has set the Oakland record for doubles in a season with 48 (previous: Jason Giambi, 47 in 2001).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-4 A's win at Seattle against the Pilots...he was 5 for 5 against Seattle earlier in the same season on July 17...in **1987** Dave Stewart becomes the A's first 20-game winner in seven years when he picks up the decision in the A's 4-3 victory over Cleveland...in **1995** Dennis Eckersley becomes the ninth major leaguer to pitch 900 games in his career when he tossed one inning at California...in **2000** the A's set Oakland records with 23 runs scored and a 21-run margin of victory in a 23-2 win over Texas...Adam Piatt has four hits and Miguel Tejada has five RBI...in **2014** Brandon Moss hits two home runs and sets an Athletics postseason record with five RBI in a 9-8, 12-inning loss to Kansas City in the American League Wild Card game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (4-10, 5.82 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-10 with a 5.82 ERA in 17 starts over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...was first selected from Triple-A Nashville June 14 and went 3-6 with a 5.17 ERA and .281 opponents average in 10 starts before he was optioned to Nashville Aug. 3...was recalled Aug. 23 and is 1-4 with a 6.81 ERA (27 er in 35.2 ip) and .331 (49-for-148) opponents batting average in seven starts since his return.

LOSSES: Has 10 losses over the first 17 starts of his career...is one of three pitchers in Oakland history to lose at least 10 games over his first 17 career appearances (Morgan 13, Mengden 10).

THE LONG BALL: Allowed a career-high four home runs in his last start and has surrendered 20 home runs in 89.2 innings for the season...based on a minimum of 81.0 innings pitched, his average of 2.01 home runs per nine innings is second highest in Athletics history (2.22, Gil Heredia in 2001)...his 20 home runs are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over the first 17 games of his career (Blake Stein, 21).

BASES ON BALLS: Walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five starts and walked just three batters in 26.0 innings total over that span (1.04 per nine innings)...has walked two batters or more in nine of his 12 starts since then and has issued 27 free passes in 63.2 innings over that stretch (3.82 per nine innings).

IN SEPTEMBER: Is 1-3 with a 7.50 ERA (20 er in 24.0 ip) and .320 (32-for-100) opponents batting average in five starts in September...the ERA is fourth highest in the American League this month among pitchers with at least 20 innings...has allowed eight home runs, which is third most in the AL.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.59 ERA (3 er in 17.0 ip) in the first inning, a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in the second innings and a 4.76 ERA (9 er in 17.0 ip) in the third inning for a combined 3.35 ERA...has a 9.08 ERA (39 er in 38.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...has a .229 (44-for-192) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a .379 (67-for-177) average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .301 opponents batting average, which is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with at least 81 innings pitched...the average breaks down to .295 (62-for-210) against right-handed hitters and .308 (49-for-159) against left-handers...has surrendered 15 of his 20 home runs to righties...has a .211 (30-for-142) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .357 (81-for-227) after that...has held the opponents clean-up hitter to a .182 (8-for-44) batting average...however, the nine hitter is batting .400 (12-for-30)...opponents are batting .356 (32-for-90) with a .408 on-base percentage (8 walks) and .544 slugging percentage (five doubles, four home runs) when leading off an inning

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 3-6 with a 5.61 ERA (37 er in 59.1 ip) in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts before the break...is tied for eighth in the American League in post-break losses.

THIS AND THAT: Has made 11 of his 17 starts this year on the road...10 have come during day games...is tied for 10th in the American League in wild pitches (9)...has received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 17 starts and is 0-9 in those starts...is 4-1 in seven starts more than one run of support...tossed 3.0 innings or more and walked one batter or fewer in each of his first five career games...is the only Athletics pitcher since 1913 and the 11th Major Leaguer to begin his career with five consecutive games of one walk or fewer and 3.0 innings pitched or more.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, an 11-6 A's loss at Miami on June 14...became the 50th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut...allowed a career-high seven runs in a career-low 3.1 innings, which were the most runs allowed in Oakland history by a pitcher in his ML debut...they were the most A's by any A's pitcher since Glenn Cox allowed seven runs in 1.1 innings for the Kansas City A's on Sept. 20, 1955 against Detroit...lost his second start, a 4-1 decision against Houston on June 19, to become the third Oakland pitcher over the last 20 years to take the loss in each of the first two games of his career (Daniel Mengden, June 11-16, 2016; Brett Anderson, April 10-15, 2009)...allowed two unearned runs in 6.0 innings in his third start on June 24 at Chicago (AL) for his first Major League win...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win over Chicago (AL) in Oakland on July 4...allowed a career-high nine hits...left with a 6-5 lead but Casilla allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay July 17...equaled his career-high by allowing nine hits in a 6-3 loss to Minnesota July 28...matched his career-high with 7.0 innings pitched in a 6-1 win at San Francisco Aug. 2...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits and tossed a career-high 103 pitches in a 3-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL)

Aug. 28...walked a career-high five batters in a 10-2 loss at Seattle Sept. 3...struck out a career-high seven batters in an 11-1 win over Houston in the first game of the doubleheader Sept. 9 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying nine hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision at Detroit Sept. 19.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high four home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings...all of the runs came on home runs as he yielded a three-run home run to Zunino in the second, solo home runs to Haniger in the third and Alonso in the fourth, and a two-run home run to Haniger in the fifth.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-4 with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts...that included 3-3 with a 3.41 ERA in 11 starts to open the season and 1-1 with a 4.60 ERA in three starts following his Aug. 3 option from Oakland...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...five of the six were solo shots...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .506 (33-for-132) against left-handers...went 2-2 with a 2.25 ERA in six starts at home, 2-2 with a 4.67 ERA in eight starts on the road...yielded five of his six home runs on the road...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts...the Sounds were 7-7 (.500) in his starting assignments...ranked sixth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.41) and opponents batting average (.231) at the time of his first promotion on June 14...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 22-28...won each of his two starts that week and did not allow a run or walk a batter (14.0 ip, 6 h, 14 so)...tossed 8.0 innings at Sacramento May 22 and 6.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 27...the 8.0 innings against the River Cats were a season-high and his eight strikeouts against the Sky Sox matched his high...it was part of a 15.0-inning scoreless streak from May 22 to June 5...went 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

RHP Daniel Mengden (2-2, 3.75 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 5 and is 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .194 opponents batting average in four starts since returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when Triple-A Nashville's season concluded...his 1.93 ERA in September is sixth lowest in the American League...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...is 4-11 in 20 career starts...the 11 losses are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over his first 20 career games...Mike Morgan has the most as he was 2-13 in 16 career games with the A's...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss to Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...is 0-1 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Texas, both last year...went 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with Nashville.

- The A's bullpen has converted just 15-of-28 (53.5%) save opportunities over the last 68 games...is 34-for-59 (57.6%) for the season, which is tied for second lowest percentage in the majors...tied for second in blown saves in the American League (25) and has the fourth fewest saves.
- Has a 4.04 ERA (112 er in 249.2 ip) since the All-Star Break after posting a 4.97 ERA before the break...has a 4.54 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the AL...
- Has allowed 80 home runs, which is fifth most in the AL and the most homers an Oakland bullpen has ever allowed...the Athletics record is 92 by the 1964 Kansas City A's.
- Is second the AL in most extra base hits allowed (204), is fourth in highest opponents slugging percentage (.429), is tied for fourth in most losses (26) and tied for fourth in fewest wins (23).
- Ranks first in the AL in fewest inherited runners (207).
- Has allowed 54 stolen bases, which is tied for most in the majors.
