ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 7-10 since the All-Star Break and have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...are 44-59 (.427) for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in the majors...it equals the fifth worst record after 103 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1997 club started the season 41-62...are a season high 18½ games out of first place in the AL West...have spent each of the last 91 days (since May 3) and 97 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...this season will mark the fifth in Oakland history in which the A's spent at least 100 days all alone in last place...the last time was in 1998 when they had 106 days and the other seasons are 1997, 1993 and 1979...the A's have finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-10 with a 6.09 ERA (86 er in 127.0 ip) in 23 games since July 6...that includes 3-1 with a 1.87 ERA (7 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts by Brett Anderson and 3-9 with a 7.62 ERA (79 er in 93.1 ip) by everyone else...are 29-43 with a 4.83 ERA for the season...the ERA is third highest in the American League and the wins are third fewest...have 570.2 innings pitched, which is second fewest in Major Leagues...the A's are one of seven ML teams with just one complete game...70 of the A's 103 games have been started by a rookie, which is third most in Oakland history (93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher in 43 of the last 55 games...have started a rookie in four consecutive games nine times this year and today is game two of another scheduled four game stretch...the average age of the five pitchers currently in the A's starting rotation is 22.4 years.

MORE PITCHING: Since Brett Anderson tossed his two-hit shutout at Boston on July 6, the A's pitching staff has compiled a 5.43 ERA (117 er in 194.0 ip)...that has lifted the season ERA to 4.49, which is the highest it has been since June 1 (4.57)...A's pitchers have allowed 103 home runs this year, which is tied for third fewest in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .305 (146 for 479) over the last 13 games with 36 doubles and 87 runs scored (6.7 per game)...that has boosted the season batting average eight points to .253...that is the highest it has been outside the first eight games of the season, but it is the second lowest batting average in the American League...rank last in the AL in home runs (81), slugging (.380) and extra base hits (278), second to last in triples (10) and have the third fewest runs (463).

ON THE BASES: The A's have 41 stolen bases in the last 40 games and 73 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...that is the A's second highest stolen base total over the last 11 years (had 88 last year)...have four players (Cabrera, Davis, Holliday, Kennedy) with at least 10 steals for the first time since 1993 (Lance Blankenship, Mike Bordick, Scott Hemond, Rickey Henderson, Ruben Sierra)...the A's have allowed just 58 stolen bases, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game homestand against Toronto (1-1) and Texas (four games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand and have lost 13 of the last 21 games in Oakland...are 23-26 (.469) at home for the season and are one of just three American League teams with a losing record at home...went 3-5 on the last road trip to New York (1-3) and Boston (2-2) and are 21-33 (.389) on the road for the season, which is the third worst mark in the AL.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's went 12-14 in the month of July and have finished with a losing record in each of the first four months of the season for the first time since 1993 (had a losing record in each of the first five months that year)...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the seven consecutive months without a winning record is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...had 10 straight months at .500 or less from August, 1996 to May, 1998 and eight straight from August, 1978 to September, 1979.

IN JULY: The A's batted .296 in the month of July, which was the second best batting average in the majors (LAA, .316) and the second best single month batting average in Oakland history (.305 in August, 1995)...it is the first time the A's hit over .252 in a month over the last two years...led the majors with 31 stolen bases, the A's most in a month since they had 39 in May, 1992...the last time the A's led the majors outright in steals in a month was July of 1989 when they had 34...tied with Toronto for the ML lead in doubles (63), which equaled the second best one month double total in Oakland history (67 in September, 2004)...ranked third in the American League in runs (138)...the pitching staff compiled a 5.17 ERA, which was third highest in the AL.

28 CONSECUTIVE DAYS: The A's are 7-10 in this stretch where they are scheduled to play 28 consecutive days without a day off from July 16 to August 12...that would be the most consecutive days without a day off in the history of the Athletics franchise...the existing high is 27 (twice, last in 1976)...were originally scheduled to have last Thursday off, but made up the April 20 rainout at New York that day...will make up the April 9 postponement against Los Angeles on another originally scheduled off day on August 27, meaning the A's are scheduled to have just two days off over a 53 day span from July 16 through September 6...have just five days off after the All-Star Break.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 14-22 (.389) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the American League (Kansas City, 14-23)...have a 14-30 (.318) record against Western division teams and are 30-29 (.508) against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions...are 10-16 in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the AL...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year...used it an Oakland record 25 times last year, breaking the previous mark of 22 (2007 and 1992)...have now used the DL 61 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 14 players on the DL have combined to miss 580 games, an average of 41.4 games per stint...last year they combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL...have had at least five players on the DL every day since April 29 and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...the A's have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The A's have lost the season series for the second consecutive year as they trail 3-5 entering the final meeting today...have lost three of five in Oakland and two of three in Toronto...are batting .207 (55 for 266) against the Blue Jays...the A's lowest single season average against Toronto is .212 in 1998 and 2002...have lost 11 of their last 14 games against the Blue Jays...were 4-6 against Toronto last year...all-time, the A's are 190-162 against the Blue Jays...that includes 92-84 in Oakland 98-76 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his last nine save opportunities and leads Major League rookies with 14 saves...he ranks second among all ML relievers with 69 strikeouts.

Rajai Davis has 14 RBI since the All-Star Break, which is tied for second most in the American League...he is hitting .324 (34 for 105) over his last 41 games after hitting .146 over his first 26 games.

Mark Ellis is tied for the American League lead in doubles (7) since the All-Star Break and is tied for second in runs scored (14).

Adam Kennedy extended his hitting streak to a season high eight games last night (14 for 41, .341)...he ranks third in the American League in batting with runners in scoring position (.394).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On **August 2, 1924** Joe Hauser becomes the second American Leaguer to hit three home runs in a game...he also adds a double for a then-record 14 total bases...on **August 2, 1933** Mickey Cochrane hits for the cycle for the second time in his career but the A's lose to New York, 16-3...on **August 2, 1972** Jim Hunter pitches a five-hit shutout as the A's defeat Kansas City 5-0...it follows a three-hit shutout by Ken Holtzman, which followed a two-hit shutout by Vida Blue.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season and his career...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 2 and made his Major League debut that night in Chicago...the A's are 3-8 (.273) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his 11 starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

LAST THREE STARTS: Has allowed at least six runs in each of his last three starts and is 0-2 with a 10.80 ERA (16 er in 13.1 ip) over that span...is the first A's pitcher to allow at least six runs in three consecutive appearances since Gil Heredia (April 15-26, 2001)...only two pitchers in Oakland history have done it in four consecutive games: Dave Stewart (June 10-25, 1991) and Bill Krueger (May 26-June 14, 1985).

SEVEN-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-7 with a 6.65 ERA (35 er in 47.1 ip) and .340 (67 for 197) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA and a .170 opponents batting average over the first two starts of his career...the seven-game losing streak is the longest by an Athletic since Dallas Braden had an eight-game losing streak from April 29 to September 23, 2007...it equals the second longest losing streak in the American League this year and is the second longest active streak (Berken, BAL 8)...had a no decision in his last start, snapping a streak of six consecutive starts with a losing streak...that is the longest such streak by an Athletic since Tom Candiotti also lost six straight from May 26 to June 23.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 0-4 with an 8.51 ERA (23 er in 24.1 ip), .400 (44 for 110) opponents batting average and five home runs in five starts in July after going 2-3 with a 2.95 ERA, .231 opponents batting average and one home run in six starts in June.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of three runs or less in each of his last 10 starts and his season run support of 2.95 (20 rs in 61.0 ip) is second lowest among Major League starting pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched (Zito, SF 2.74)...is 0-6 in seven starts with run support of two runs or less and 2-1 with support of three runs or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Five of his six home runs have come on the road, five have been hit by left-handed hitters and four are solo shots...opponents are batting .350 (21 for 60) when leading off an inning...they are 3 for 25 (.120) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .432 (19 for 44) batting average against the opponents number eight and nine hitters and .280 (56 for 200) against everyone else...has allowed a .213 (7 for 33) opponents batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game and .322 (68 for 211) after that.

A 22-YEAR OLD AND TWO 21-YEAR OLDS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season today...is 22 years old and Anderson and Cahill are both 21, giving the A's three pitchers under the age of 23 with at least 10 starts for the second time in Oakland history...the other time was in 1978 (Keough 32, Johnson 30, Wirth 14)...since 1996, the only Major League team to have three pitchers under the age of 23 make at least 10 starts is the 2006 Marlins (Scott Olsen 31, Josh Johnson 24, Anibal Sanchez 17)...the last American League team is the 1995 Twins (Brad Radke 28, Frank Rodriguez 16, Jose Parra 12)...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

2009 HIGHLIGHTS: He combined with Breslow and Ziegler on a five-hit shutout in his Major League debut, a 5-0 A's win at Chicago **June 2**...became the 40th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut and the 12th to win...is the fifth starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run in his debut...combined with Wuertz, Breslow and Bailey on a five-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Baltimore **June 7** in Oakland...of the 12 pitchers in Oakland history to start and win their ML debut, he is just the third to also win his second start...joins Bill Krueger, who won each of his first two career starts on April 10 and 16, 1983, and Dave Hamilton, who won each of his first four career starts from May 29 to June 17, 1972...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at San Francisco on **June 12**...retired each of the first 11 batters before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a Lincecum RBI single and a Rowand two-run single...that snapped his career opening scoreless streak at 17.2 innings...it was the longest career opening streak in Oakland history by a starter and it was second longest to Brad Ziegler's 39.0 inning streak last year...extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 3-1 loss to Colorado **June 28** in Oakland...struck out a career high eight batters in 5.0 innings...lost his sixth straight in the A's 11-6 loss to Los Angeles **July 18** in Oakland...tossed a career low 3.0 innings and allowed a career high eight runs on a career high tying 10 hits.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-8, 11-inning win at Boston last Tuesday...the A's scored twice in the second inning but he allowed five runs in the third inning on Youkilis two-run double, an Ortiz RBI groundout, a Bay RBI single and a Drew RBI double...also allowed a RBI double to Lowell in the sixth inning and was replaced by Springer to start the seventh with the A's trailing, 6-3.

MAZZARO vs. TORONTO: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 2-2 with a 2.38 ERA in 10 games, nine starts, with Triple-A Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion and led the PCL in hit batters (6)...allowed just two home runs in 56.2 innings... allowed a .205 opponents batting average, including .189 (18 for 95) by right-handed hitters and .218 (24 for 110) against left-handers...his opponents average dropped to .189 with runners in scoring position, including .120 with RISP and two outs...had no decisions, a 1.35 ERA and .188 opponents batting average over his first four starts...then lost each of his next two starts on April 30 and May 6, compiling an 11.00 ERA and .455 opponents batting average...finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign by going 2-0 with a 0.33 ERA and .099 opponents batting average over his final four games, three starts

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (6-8, 4.33 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 20th start of the season and his career...leads among American League rookies in strikeouts (85), is tied for second in starts (19), ranks fourth in innings pitched (108.0) and tied for sixth in wins (6)...went 2-1 with a 1.87 ERA and .168 opponents batting average in five starts in July...led all AL pitchers in opponents batting average, ranked second in ERA (Washburn, SEA 1.44) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (33)...had an ERA of 5.00 or more in each of the first three months of his career...is 3-1 with a 1.85 ERA and .173 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 1-3 with a 7.01 ERA and .346 opponents batting average over his previous five starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-6 A's win at Boston last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 8 so)...is 0-1 with a 7.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 11 h, 9 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against the Rangers, both in Texas.

Save/Save Opportunities: 24/32 (75.0%)

The A's bullpen has gone 3-2 with three saves in three chances with a 1.57 ERA (68.2 ip, 47 h, 13 r, 12 er, 21 bb, 72 so, 1 hr) and a .191 (47 for 246) opponents batting average over the last 19 home games...now has a 2.86 ERA (53 er in 166.2 ip), seven home runs allowed and 51 walks issued in Oakland this year compared to a 4.90 ERA (101 er in 185.1 ip), 23 home runs allowed and 95 walks issued on the road...leads all Major League bullpens with 322 strikeouts (Florida & San Diego, 320)...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in innings pitched (352.0)...is tied with the third best save percentage (75.0 %) in the AL (also, Boston)...has the second fewest save opportunities (32) in the AL (Toronto, 29)...has allowed 56 of 145 inherited runners to score (38.6%), which is the third highest percentage in the majors.

- Has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 17...leads Major League rookies in saves (14) and is the only one with more than two...in Oakland history, only Huston Street (23 in 2005) has more saves as a rookie...has recorded more than three outs in six of his saves.
- Has allowed one run in four of his last six outings (8.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 4.32 ERA) after a career best 15.1 inning scoreless streak.
- Has retired all 15 of his Toronto batters faced over his three appearances against the Blue Jays and has a win and two saves over that span (5.0 ip, 7 so)...struck out a career-high tying four batters on April 17 at Toronto (also, May 23 vs. Arizona).
- Ranks second among American League rookies in games pitched (46) and fifth in strikeouts (69).
- Ranks second among Major League relievers with 69 strikeouts (Broxton LAD, 74)...has struck out two or more batters in 26 of his 46 outings.
- Leads all AL relievers in innings pitched (61.0), is tied for fourth in blown saves (4), tied for seventh in opponents batting average (.183), ninth in ERA (2.21) and tied for 10th in wins (4).
- Has allowed only one run (12.1 ip) and has converted 7 of 8 save opportunities in 10 outings on no days rest.
- Has not yielded a home run in 119 at bats against right-handed hitters.
- Was the sixth Oakland rookie to be named to the American League All-Star team but did not pitch in the game.
- Spent the entire 2008 season at Double-A Midland...began the season in the starting rotation and went 1-8 with a 6.18 ERA and .258 opponents batting average in his 15 starts...then went 4-1 with a 0.92 ERA and .207 opponents average over his final 22 appearances, all in relief.
