A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-5...have won two of three in Oakland but have lost four of six in Texas...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons against the Rangers and are 29-37 against Texas since 2006...the A's are 270-281 against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 143-130 in Oakland and 127-151 in Texas...have an all-time record of 367-363 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his last nine save opportunities and leads Major League rookies with 14 saves...he ranks second among all ML relievers with 69 strikeouts.

Rajai Davis had the fourth gameending triple in Oakland history last night and it was the first pinch hit game-ending triple...he now has 16 RBI since the All-Star Break, which is tied for third in the American League...has a career high tying eight-game hitting streak (11 for 26, .423) and is now batting .336 (37 for 110) over his last 43 games after hitting .146 over his first 26 games.

Nomar Garciaparra is a .389 (100 for 257) career hitter against Texas, the second best mark ever against the Rangers.

Adam Kennedy ranks third in the American League in batting with RISP (.394) and 10^{th} in batting vs. right-handed pichers (.326).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On August 4, 1910 Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...on August 4, 1992 Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...on August 4, 2002 Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 8-11 since the All-Star Break and have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...are 45-60 (.429) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it equals the sixth worst record after 104 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1997 club was 42-63...have spent each of the last 93 days (since May 3) and 99 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...this season is the fifth in Oakland history in which the A's spent at least 100 days all alone in last place...the last time was in 1998 when they had 106 days and the other seasons are 1997, 1993 and 1979...the A's have finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

COMEBACKS: The A's trailed 2-0 entering the bottom of the ninth last night but came back to win 3-2...it was the first time since August 21, 1985 against Detroit that the A's won a nine-inning game in which they were scoreless heading into the bottom of the ninth inning and trailed by at least two runs...it was just the third time this year the A's won a game when scoring fewer than four runs...it was the A's third "walk-off" win of the season...the A's are now 17-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 11-16 in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the AL...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 10-17 (.370) against American League West teams, which is the third worst record against divisional foes in the AL...including interleague play, the A's have a 15-30 (.333) record against Western division teams and are 30-30 (.500) against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-11 with a 6.12 ERA (95 er in 139.2 ip) in 25 games since July 6...that includes 3-1 with a 1.96 ERA (9 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts by Brett Anderson and 3-10 with a 7.87 ERA (86 er in 98.1 ip) by everyone else...are 29-44 with a 4.86 ERA for the season...the ERA is fourth highest in the American League and the wins are tied for second fewest...have 583.1 innings pitched, which is second fewest in Major Leagues...the A's are one of seven ML teams with just one complete game...72 of the A's 105 games have been started by a rookie, which is third most in Oakland history (93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher in 45 of the last 57 games...with the start by Gio Gonzalez today, the A's have now started a rookie in four consecutive games 10 times this year...the average age of the five pitchers currently in the A's starting rotation is 22.4 years.

MORE PITCHING: Since Brett Anderson tossed his two-hit shutout at Boston on July 6, the A's pitching staff has compiled a 5.35 ERA (126 er in 212.0 ip)...that has lifted the season ERA to 4.49, which ranks ninth in the American League.

DOUBLES: The A's did not have a double last night, ending their streak of 11 consecutive games with two or more doubles (33 doubles total)...have 48 doubles since the All-Star Break, which are the most in the majors by eight (Cubs, 40)...there have been 9,983 doubles in Oakland history, leaving the A's 17 short of the 10,000 plateau...the first double in Oakland history was hit by Sal Bando on April 13, 1968 at Washington.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .294 (160 for 544) over the last 15 games with 39 doubles and 92 runs scored (6.1 per game)...that has boosted the season batting average seven points to .252, but that is the second lowest batting average in the American League...have gone homerless in each of the last five games, which is the second longest homerless streak this year...had a six-game streak from April 14 to 21...rank last in the AL in home runs (81), slugging (.379) and extra base hits (282), second to last in triples (11) and have the third fewest runs (468).

ON THE BASES: The A's have gone four consecutive games without a stolen base for the first time since June 11-16 when they had a five-game streak...have 41 stolen bases in the last 42 games and 73 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...that is the A's second highest stolen base total over the last 11 years (had 88 last year).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Toronto (1-2) and Texas (1-0)...went 3-4 on the last homestand and have lost 14 of the last 23 games in Oakland...are 24-27 (.471) at home for the season and are one of just three American League teams with a losing record at home...went 3-5 on the last road trip to New York (1-3) and Boston (2-2) and are 21-33 (.389) on the road for the season, which is the third worst mark in the AL...leave following the game on Thursday for a six-game road trip to Kansas City (three games) and Baltimore (three games).

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's went 12-14 in the month of July and have finished with a losing record in each of the first four months of the season for the first time since 1993...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the seven consecutive months without a winning record is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...had 10 straight months at .500 or less from August, 1996 to May, 1998 and eight straight from August, 1978 to September, 1979.

IN JULY: The A's batted .296 in the month of July, which was the second best batting average in the majors (LAA, .316) and the second best single month batting average in Oakland history (.305 in August, 1995)...it is the first time the A's hit over .252 in a month over the last two years...led the majors with 31 stolen bases, the A's most in a month since they had 39 in May, 1992...the last time the A's led the majors outright in steals in a month was July of 1989 when they had 34...tied with Toronto for the ML lead in doubles (63), which equaled the second best one month double total in Oakland history (67 in September, 2004).

28 CONSECUTIVE DAYS: The A's are 8-11 in this stretch where they are scheduled to play 28 consecutive days without a day off from July 16 to August 12...that would be the most consecutive days without a day off in the history of the Athletics franchise...the existing high is 27 (twice, last in 1976)...were originally scheduled to have July 23 off, but made up the April 20 rainout at New York that day...will make up the April 9 postponement against Los Angeles on another originally scheduled off day on August 27, meaning the A's are scheduled to have just two days off over a 53 day span from July 16 through September 6.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year after setting an Oakland record with 25 last year...have now used the DL 61 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 14 players on the DL have combined to miss 594 games, an average of 42.4 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th appearance and seventh start of the season...it will be the 14th start of his career...the A's are 3-3 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in two of his six starts, allowed two runs or fewer twice and walked two or fewer three times.

TWO-GAME WINNING STREAK: Won each of his two decisions in July for the first winning streak of his career...however, was 2-0 with a 7.48 ERA (21.2 ip, 24 h, 18 r, 18 er, 13 bb, 25 so, 5 hr) in five games, four starts.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento for the third time on June 24 and is 2-2 with a 7.42 ERA (25 er in 30.1 ip) in seven games, six starts, since his return...began the season at Sacramento and was 1-0 with a 2.12 ERA in four starts when the A's called for the first time on May 2...pitched 5.0 innings of relief on May 3 in the A's 8-7, 15-inning loss at Seattle (5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so) and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day...made two more starts with Sacramento, going 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA, before returning to Oakland on May 18...pitched 3.2 innings of relief that day at Tampa Bay (6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so) and was optioned to Sacramento the next day...was 3-0 with a 1.23 ERA in six starts with the River Cats during his third stint.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-2 with a 7.36 ERA (24 er in 29.1 ip) in his six starts this year and 0-0 with a 7.45 ERA (8 er in 9.2 ip) in three relief appearances...last year, he went 1-4 with a 9.32 ERA in seven starts and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in three relief appearances...his career numbers are now 3-6 with an 8.32 ERA (53 er in 57.1 ip) in 13 starts and 0-0 with a 4.60 ERA (8 er in 15.2 ip) in six relief appearances...has an overall career ERA of 7.52.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .323 opponents batting average, which includes a .474 (18 for 38) mark against left-handed hitters and .276 (34 for 123) against right-handers...has allowed a .250 (12 for 48) opponents batting average over his first 30 pitches in a game and .354 (40 for 113) after that

THE LONG BALL: Allowed a career high four home runs on July 20 against Minnesota, the second time this year an A's pitcher allowed four home runs in a game (Cahill, June 27 vs. Colorado)...it was the 28th game of four or more home runs allowed in Oakland history...has allowed seven home runs in 39.0 innings this year (1.62 per nine innings) and 16 in 73.0 career innings (1.97 per nine innings).

23-YEAR OLD: Is 23 years old, making him the fourth youngest pitcher in the A's starting rotation behind Trevor Cahill (21), Brett Anderson (21) and Vin Mazzaro (22)...is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season today and the A's have four starting pitchers under the age of 24 with more than five starts for the first time in Oakland history...the last Major League team to do that is the 2006 Florida Marlins (Nolasco, Olsen, Johnson, Sanchez) and the last American League team is the 2003 Detroit Tigers (Roney, Ledezma, Bonderman, Cornejo)...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

2009 IN RELIEF: Tossed 108 pitches in his first appearance on May 3 at Seattle, the most by an Oakland reliever since pitch count data is first available in 1988...then tossed 91 pitches in his second outing on May 18 at Tampa Bay, also a relief appearance...also pitched an inning of relief on July 10 at Tampa Bay as the A's did not need a fifth starter with a day off and the All-Star Break.

2009 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to San Francisco on *June 24* in Oakland...allowed a career high 10 hits in 3.2 innings...also took the loss in his second start, a 5-3 A's loss to Detroit on *June 30* in Oakland...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-2 win at Cleveland on *July 5*...had a no decision in the 14-13 win over Minnesota on *July 20* in Oakland...allowed a career high 11 runs on a career high 10 hits in just 2.2 innings...is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to allow 11 or more runs in a game, the first to do it in less than 3.0 innings...is the third pitcher to allow at least 11 earned runs...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is just the second starting pitcher since 1900 to avoid a loss in a game in which he pitched fewer than three innings and gave up at least 11 runs...the other was the Rangers' Scott Feldman last year on August 12 at Boston (2.2 ip, 12 r)...all 11 runs scored on home runs with two outs...left trailing 11-2 and the Twins built a 12-2 lead before the A's came back with three in the third, two in the fourth and seven in the seventh...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-4 win at New York *July 25*...allowed just one run on two hits in a career high 6.2 innings...blanked the Yankees on one hit and one walk over the first five innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-5 loss at Boston last Thursday...struck out a career high tying eight batters in 5.1 innings...allowed just one run over the first five innings, a RBI single by Varitek in the second inning...the A's scored four times in the sixth inning to give him a 4-1 lead and he allowed a RBI double to Lowell in the sixth...was relieved by Springer, who allowed Lowell to score...was the pitcher of record before the pen allowed three runs in the seventh inning and two more in the eighth for the loss.

GONZALEZ vs. TEXAS: Has not allowed a run in two career appearances, both in relief last year...tossed 2.0 innings on September 12 in Oakland and retired all six batters that he faced and then pitched a 1-2-3 eighth inning on September 23 at Texas.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 2.51 ERA in 12 games, all starts, at Triple-A Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion...had the lowest opponents batting average (.194) and ranked second in strikeouts (71)...the batting average included a .188 (28 for 149) mark against right-handed hitters and .209 (14 for 67) against left-handers...allowed all five of his home runs to righties...his opponents batting average dropped to .160 (8 for 50) with runners in scoring position...the River Cats were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more inninas in five of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

LHP Dallas Braden (8-9, 3.89 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season...is tied for fourth in the American League in games started (22) and tied for sixth in losses (9)...has allowed just nine home runs in 136.2 innings, an average of 0.59 per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL...is 1-2 with a 7.40 ERA and .324 opponents batting average in four starts since the All-Star Break...has received run support of one run or less in 10 of his 22 starts and his season run support of 3.95 is fifth lowest in the AL...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-5 win over Toronto last Friday (6.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...is 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA in eight career appearances, five starts, against Texas...including 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (11.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 bb, 12 so) in two starts this year.

- Has allowed one run in four of his last six outings (8.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 4.32 ERA) after a career best 15.1 inning scoreless streak.
- Is 1-0 with two blown saves and a 2.45 ERA (2 er in 7.1 ip) over six appearances against the Rangers.
- Has allowed only one run (12.1 ip) and has converted 7 of 8 save opportunities in 10 outings on no days rest.
- Has not yielded a home run in 119 at bats against right-handed hitters.
- Ranks second among American League rookies in games pitched (46) and fifth in strikeouts (69).
- Ranks second among Major League relievers with 69 strikeouts (Broxton LAD, 74)...has struck out two or more batters in 26 of his 46 outings. Ranks second among all AL relievers in innings pitched (61.0), is tied for fourth in blown saves (4), ranks eighth in opponents batting average (.183), ninth in ERA (2.21) and tied for 10th in wins (4).
- Was the sixth Oakland rookie to be named to the American League All-Star team but did not pitch in the game.
