A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 4-5...have won two of three in Oakland but have lost four of six in Texas...have lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons against the Rangers and are 29-37 against Texas since 2006...the A's are 270-281 against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 143-130 in Oakland and 127-151 in Texas...have an all-time record of 367-363 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his last nine save opportunities and leads Major League rookies with 14 saves...he ranks second among all ML relievers with 69 strikeouts.

Rajai Davis had the fourth game-ending triple in Oakland history last night and it was the first pinch hit game-ending triple...he now has 16 RBI since the All-Star Break, which is tied for third in the American League...has a career high tying eight-game hitting streak (11 for 26, .423) and is now batting .336 (37 for 110) over his last 43 games after hitting .146 over his first 26 games.

Nomar Garciaparra is a .389 (100 for 257) career hitter against Texas, the second best mark ever against the Rangers.

Adam Kennedy ranks third in the American League in batting with RISP (.394) and 10th in batting vs. right-handed pitchers (.326).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On **August 4, 1910** Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...on **August 4, 1992** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...on **August 4, 2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 8-11 since the All-Star Break and have not won or lost more than two in a row over that span...are 45-60 (.429) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it equals the sixth worst record after 104 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1997 club was 42-63...have spent each of the last 93 days (since May 3) and 99 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...this season is the fifth in Oakland history in which the A's spent at least 100 days all alone in last place...the last time was in 1998 when they had 106 days and the other seasons are 1997, 1993 and 1979...the A's have finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

COMEBACKS: The A's trailed 2-0 entering the bottom of the ninth last night but came back to win 3-2...it was the first time since August 21, 1985 against Detroit that the A's won a nine-inning game in which they were scoreless heading into the bottom of the ninth inning and trailed by at least two runs...it was just the third time this year the A's won a game when scoring fewer than four runs...it was the A's third "walk-off" win of the season...the A's are now 17-18 in games decided in the seventh inning or later, including 8-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are 11-16 in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the AL...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 10-17 (.370) against American League West teams, which is the third worst record against divisional foes in the AL...including interleague play, the A's have a 15-30 (.333) record against Western division teams and are 30-30 (.500) against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-11 with a 6.12 ERA (95 er in 139.2 ip) in 25 games since July 6...that includes 3-1 with a 1.96 ERA (9 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts by Brett Anderson and 3-10 with a 7.87 ERA (86 er in 98.1 ip) by everyone else...are 29-44 with a 4.86 ERA for the season...the ERA is fourth highest in the American League and the wins are tied for second fewest...have 583.1 innings pitched, which is second fewest in Major Leagues...the A's are one of seven ML teams with just one complete game...72 of the A's 105 games have been started by a rookie, which is third most in Oakland history (93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher in 45 of the last 57 games...with the start by Gio Gonzalez today, the A's have now started a rookie in four consecutive games 10 times this year...the average age of the five pitchers currently in the A's starting rotation is 22.4 years.

MORE PITCHING: Since Brett Anderson tossed his two-hit shutout at Boston on July 6, the A's pitching staff has compiled a 5.35 ERA (126 er in 212.0 ip)...that has lifted the season ERA to 4.49, which ranks ninth in the American League.

DOUBLES: The A's did not have a double last night, ending their streak of 11 consecutive games with two or more doubles (33 doubles total)...have 48 doubles since the All-Star Break, which are the most in the majors by eight (Cubs, 40)...there have been 9,983 doubles in Oakland history, leaving the A's 17 short of the 10,000 plateau...the first double in Oakland history was hit by Sal Bando on April 13, 1968 at Washington.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .294 (160 for 544) over the last 15 games with 39 doubles and 92 runs scored (6.1 per game)...that has boosted the season batting average seven points to .252, but that is the second lowest batting average in the American League...have gone homerless in each of the last five games, which is the second longest homerless streak this year...had a six-game streak from April 14 to 21...rank last in the AL in home runs (81), slugging (.379) and extra base hits (282), second to last in triples (11) and have the third fewest runs (468).

ON THE BASES: The A's have gone four consecutive games without a stolen base for the first time since June 11-16 when they had a five-game streak...have 41 stolen bases in the last 42 games and 73 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...that is the A's second highest stolen base total over the last 11 years (had 88 last year).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Toronto (1-2) and Texas (1-0)...went 3-4 on the last homestand and have lost 14 of the last 23 games in Oakland...are 24-27 (.471) at home for the season and are one of just three American League teams with a losing record at home...went 3-5 on the last road trip to New York (1-3) and Boston (2-2) and are 21-33 (.389) on the road for the season, which is the third worst mark in the AL...leave following the game on Thursday for a six-game road trip to Kansas City (three games) and Baltimore (three games).

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's went 12-14 in the month of July and have finished with a losing record in each of the first four months of the season for the first time since 1993...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the seven consecutive months without a winning record is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...had 10 straight months at .500 or less from August, 1996 to May, 1998 and eight straight from August, 1978 to September, 1979.

IN JULY: The A's batted .296 in the month of July, which was the second best batting average in the majors (LAA, .316) and the second best single month batting average in Oakland history (.305 in August, 1995)...it is the first time the A's hit over .252 in a month over the last two years...led the majors with 31 stolen bases, the A's most in a month since they had 39 in May, 1992...the last time the A's led the majors outright in steals in a month was July of 1989 when they had 34...tied with Toronto for the ML lead in doubles (63), which equaled the second best one month double total in Oakland history (67 in September, 2004).

28 CONSECUTIVE DAYS: The A's are 8-11 in this stretch where they are scheduled to play 28 consecutive days without a day off from July 16 to August 12...that would be the most consecutive days without a day off in the history of the Athletics franchise...the existing high is 27 (twice, last in 1976)...were originally scheduled to have July 23 off, but made up the April 20 rainout at New York that day...will make up the April 9 postponement against Los Angeles on another originally scheduled off day on August 27, meaning the A's are scheduled to have just two days off over a 53 day span from July 16 through September 6.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year after setting an Oakland record with 25 last year...have now used the DL 61 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 14 players on the DL have combined to miss 594 games, an average of 42.4 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL and have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had one.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

16-16, 3.88 ERA (357.1 ip, 326 h, 164 r, 154 er, 147 bb, 325 so, 30 hr) Save/Save Opportunities: 24/32 (75.0%)

The A's bullpen has gone 4-2 with three saves in three chances with a 1.46 ERA (74.0 ip, 49 h, 13 r, 12 er, 22 bb, 75 so, 1 hr) and a .187 (49 for 262) opponents batting average over the last 21 home games (since June 11)...now has a 2.77 ERA (53 er in 172.0 ip), seven home runs allowed and 52 walks issued in Oakland this year compared to a 4.90 ERA (101 er in 185.1 ip), 23 home runs allowed and 95 walks issued on the road...ranks second in the majors and leads all American League bullpens with 325 strikeouts (San Diego, 328)...ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (357.1)...is tied with the third best save percentage (75.0 %) in the AL (also, Boston)...has the second fewest save opportunities (32) in the AL (Toronto, 29)...has allowed 56 of 146 inherited runners to score (38.4%), which is the third highest percentage in the AL.

- Has converted each of his last nine save opportunities dating back to June 17...leads Major League rookies in saves (14) and is the only one with more than two...in Oakland history, only Huston Street (23 in 2005) has more saves as a rookie...has recorded more than three outs in six of his saves.
- Has allowed one run in four of his last six outings (8.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 4.32 ERA) after a career best 15.1 inning scoreless streak.
- Is 1-0 with two blown saves and a 2.45 ERA (2 er in 7.1 ip) over six appearances against the Rangers.
- Has allowed only one run (12.1 ip) and has converted 7 of 8 save opportunities in 10 outings on no days rest.
- Has not yielded a home run in 119 at bats against right-handed hitters.
- Ranks second among American League rookies in games pitched (46) and fifth in strikeouts (69).
- Ranks second among Major League relievers with 69 strikeouts (Broxton LAD, 74)...has struck out two or more batters in 26 of his 46 outings.
- Ranks second among all AL relievers in innings pitched (61.0), is tied for fourth in blown saves (4), ranks eighth in opponents batting average (.183), ninth in ERA (2.21) and tied for 10th in wins (4).
- Was the sixth Oakland rookie to be named to the American League All-Star team but did not pitch in the game.
- Spent the entire 2008 season at Double-A Midland...began the season in the starting rotation and went 1-8 with a 6.18 ERA and .258 opponents batting average in his 15 starts...then went 4-1 with a 0.92 ERA and .207 opponents average over his final 22 appearances, all in relief.

- Leads the American League with a career-high 53 games pitched...is tied with the most losses (5) among AL relievers.
- Has allowed 9 of 37 (24.3%) of inherited runners to score, which is tied for the ninth lowest percentage in the AL.
- First batters faced are 7 for their last 19 (.368) with six walks and two home runs...has issued 11 first batter walks this year, which are the most in the AL...has allowed three home runs to first batters faced on the year which are tied for the second most in the AL.
- Opponents are 6 for 40 (.150) with runners in scoring position.
- Has not allowed a run over three career appearances against Texas (2.1 ip).
- Was claimed off waivers from Minnesota on May 20 and has not allowed a run in 28 of his 36 outings with the A's (11 er in 27.0 ip, 3.67 ERA)...was 1-2 with a 6.28 ERA in 17 appearances with the Twins (14.1 ip, 11 h, 11 r, 10 er, 11 bb, 11 so).
- Posted a combined 0-2 record and a 1.91 ERA for Cleveland and Minnesota last season and his ERA ranked second lowest among American League left-handed relievers with a minimum of 35.0 innings pitched...it was ninth-best in the AL for all pitchers with at least 40.0 ip.

- Tossed a career-high 2.2 innings Saturday against the Blue Jays (previous high: 2.1 ip, twice, last: May 17 at Detroit).
- Has a 7.39 ERA (23 er in 28.0 ip) in 27 games since being reinstated from the DL May 15...had a 1.59 ERA in nine games before going on DL.
- Has a 5.72 ERA for the season, which is third highest among American League relievers.
- Is 2-1 with a save, two blown saves and a 12.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 19 h, 18 r, 18 er, 12 bb, 10 so, 5 hr) over 16 career appearances against the Rangers...the 18 earned runs, five home runs and 12 walks are the most he has allowed against any team in his career.
- Has a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) in 16 outings on one day rest or less and a 8.53 ERA (18 er in 19.0 ip) in 20 outings on two days rest or more.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from April 29 to May 14 with a sprained right knee...made two rehab appearances before he was reinstated.
- Was 2-1 with two saves and a 3.93 ERA in a career high 51 appearances last year...had a 0.93 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in 21 games before he was placed on the 15-day DL on May 16...posted a 5.81 ERA and .353 opponents batting average over his final 30 games.

- Has a 3.00 ERA (5 er in 15.0 ip) over his last eight outings after posting a 5.74 ERA over his first 11 games this year.
- His next appearance will be the 100th of his career.
- Began the season by going 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in two starts but his last 17 outings have come in relief...has no decisions and a 4.55 ERA (16 er in 31.2 ip) in relief...is 8-20 with a 5.81 ERA in 37 career starts and 6-2 with a 5.79 ERA (71 er in 110.1 ip) in 62 career relief appearances.
- Has not allowed a home run in 41.2 innings, which are the second most innings pitched among American League pitchers with no home runs (Delcarmen BOS, 42.1)...his last home run allowed was on June 17, 2008 against Oakland (Suzuki).
- Has yielded a .187 (14 for 75) batting average against right-handed hitters and .313 (25 for 80) against left-handers.
- Made his first and only appearance against the Rangers in a start this year on May 29 at Texas (L, 5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 0 hr).
- Was signed by the A's as a free agent to a minor league contract on February 9 and went 1-2 with a 10.93 ERA in six games, three starts, this spring...began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 3-2 with a 5.22 ERA in seven starts when he was selected by Oakland on May 19.
- Was 1-2 with a 6.00 ERA in six starts with Arizona last year and 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA in 11 relief appearances.

- Has not allowed a run in 20 of his last 22 outings (20.1 ip, 19 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 24 so, 1.33 ERA) after allowing at least one run in six consecutive outings (11 er in 3.1 ip, 29.70 ERA).
- Has allowed a .263 (26 for 99) batting average against right-handed hitters and .343 (23 for 67) against left-handers...has 3 walks and 30 strikeouts against righties and 10 walks and 16 strikeouts against lefties.
- Has a 5.71 ERA (11 er in 17.1 ip) and .338 (26 for 77) opponents average with all five of his home runs allowed in 23 outings on the road compared to a 2.82 ERA (7 er in 22.1 ip) and .258 (23 for 89) opponents batting average in 23 appearances in Oakland.

- Earned his sixth win of the season last night which matches his career-high from 2005...is tied for the lead among AL relievers and tied for second among all Major League relievers in wins (6)...tied for fifth in AL in games pitched (49).
- Has allowed 5 of his 10 inherited runners to score over his last 20 appearances after allowing just 1 of 16 to score over his first 30 outings...has allowed 6 of 26 (23.1%) to score this season, which is the seventh lowest percentage in the AL.
- Has not allowed a run in 20 of his 21 outings at home and has a 0.39 ERA (1 er in 23.0 ip) and .120 (9 for 75) opponents batting average in Oakland...has a 6.04 ERA (19 er in 28.1 ip) and .284 (31 for 109) opponents average with four of his five home runs allowed on the road.

- Leads American League relievers and ranks second in the majors with 11 grounded into double plays (Affeldt, SF 14).
- Has allowed a .227 (22 for 97) average against right-handed hitters and .337 (28 for 83) against left-handers...has 6 walks and 22 strikeouts against righties and 12 walks and 11 strikeouts against lefties.
- Is one for two in save chances with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) over eight career appearances against Texas.
- Opponents are batting .255 (25 for 98) with the bases empty but are hitting .432 (19 for 44) with runners in scoring position.

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list a week ago today retroactive to July 27 with a strained left hamstring...this is his second career stint on the DL...is eligible to be reinstated on August 11.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento July 20 for his second stint with the A's this year and started five of the A's eight games at first base before going on the DL...was 3 for 17 (.176) with five runs scored, a double, a home run, two RBI and five walks.

- Had season-ending microdiscectomy surgery on his back June 23, performed by Dr. Robert Watkins in Los Angeles...it was his fifth surgery since September 5, 2007, the second on his back...has also had three shoulder surgeries.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list on May 1 retroactive to April 25 with a strained right forearm...had back spasms on May 10 and an MRI on May 11 revealed a bulging disk in his back...was transferred to the 60-day DL May 19...this is his sixth career stint on the DL, his fourth in the last three years...has appeared in just 121 games over the last three years (8 this year, 23 last year, 90 in 2007).

- Is batting .283 (15 for 53) over his last 20 games after hitting .138 over his previous 36 contests...hit .262 over his first 21 games.
- Is batting .271 (23 for 85) in Oakland compared to .180 (20 for 111) on the road.
- Is 5 for 7 (.714) over his last seven games in which he did not start and is 10 for 27 (.370) in non-starting assignments for the season.
- Three of his four home runs this year have either tied the game or put the A's ahead.
- Has made 51 starts at four different positions (25 at third base, 21 at first base, four at second base, one at shortstop).
- Has appeared in 47 games at first base, 32 at third base, five at second base, five at shortstop, one in right field and one at designated hitter...is the first Athletic to appear in at least five games at all four infield positions since Ernie Riles in 1991...had never played a position other than shortstop in his professional career prior to this season.
- Played in 145 games in 2008 after appearing in fewer than 100 games in each of the previous three seasons...batted .237, which was seventh lowest in the AL...had a .232 batting average in 334 games over the previous three seasons, which was sixth lowest in the majors.
