#### A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series 2-0 as they swept a two-game set in Oakland in May...lost the season series last year 3-6 and lost all three games in Kansas City...have not won here since May 10, 2007...have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and are 9-12 against the Royals since 2007...are 281-234 all-time against Kansas City...that includes 156-103 in Oakland and 125-131 in Kansas City.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities and leads Major League rookies with 15 saves...he ranks second among all ML relievers with 71 strikeouts.

Rajai Davis is batting .347 (17 for 49) with 11 runs, six doubles, two triples, 17 RBI and seven stolen bases in 17 games since the All-Star Break...is tied for second in the AL in steals since the break and tied for eighth in RBI.

Mark Ellis is batting .282 (22 for 78) with 16 runs scored and eight doubles since the All-Star Break...is tied for fifth in the American League in runs and doubles since the break.

Tommy Everidge has reached base safely via hit or walk in all 10 games since he was selected from Sacramento July 28...that equals the fourth longest reaching base streak to start a career in Oakland history.

**Adam Kennedy** ranks third in the American League in batting with RISP (.403).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On August 7, 1968 Joe Keough homers in his first major league at bat off New York's Lindy McDaniel at Yankee Stadium...on August 7, 1971 Vida Blue becomes Oakland's first 20-game winner when he shuts out the White Sox 1-0 on a five hitter at the Coliseum...he would go on to win 24 games and won the American League MVP and Cy Young awards.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their three-game winning streak snapped yesterday and are now 6-4 over the last 10 games...have not won or lost more than three in a row since June 29 and are 16-18 over that span...are 10-12 since the All-Star Break...are 47-61 (.435) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...the A's will face two of the three teams with a worse record on this trip (Kansas City and Baltimore)...have spent each of the last 96 days (since May 3) and 102 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...this season is the fifth in Oakland history in which the A's spent at least 100 days all alone in last place...the last time was in 1998 when they had 106 days and the other seasons are 1997, 1993 and 1979...the A's have finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a six-game road trip tonight against Kansas City (three games) and Baltimore (three games)...went 3-5 on the last road trip to New York (1-3) and Boston (2-2) and are 21-33 (.389) on the road for the season, which is the third worst mark in the American League...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (1-2) and Texas (3-1)...it was just the second time this year the A's finished with a winning record on a homestand with more than one series...the other time was June 5-11 against Baltimore (3-0) and Minnesota (2-2) when they went 5-2...are 26-28 (.481) at home for the season and are one of just three AL teams with a losing record at home.

**28 CONSECUTIVE DAYS:** Today is day 23 of a scheduled 28 day stretch where the A's will not have a day off...are 10-12 during the stretch that began the day after the All-Star Break and runs through next Wednesday...this is the eighth time in the history of the franchise the A's have played more than 20 consecutive days without a day off...the existing record for most consecutive days without a day off is 27 from May 30-June 25, 1961 and June 15-July 11, 1976...were originally scheduled to have July 23 off, but made up the April 20 rainout at New York that day...will make up the April 9 postponement against Los Angeles on another originally scheduled off day on August 27, meaning the A's are scheduled to have just two days off over a 53 day span from July 16 through September 6...have just five days off after the All-Star Break.

ROOKIES ON THE MOUND: Today marks the seventh consecutive game the A's have started a rookie, which is the longest streak in Oakland history...the previous high was five twice...are scheduled to start a rookie in each of the next two games...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have a rookie starting pitcher for nine straight games was the 1997 St. Louis Cardinals who started a rookie in each of their last 19 games that season (Manny Aybar, Rigo Beltran, Matt Morris, Sean Lowe, Mike Busby and Brady Raggio)...75 of the A's 108 games have been started by a rookie, which is third most in Oakland history (93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...have started a rookie pitcher in 48 of the last 60 games...have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 7-12 with a 5.95 ERA (104 er in 157.1 ip) in 28 games since July 6...that includes 3-1 with a 1.96 ERA (9 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts by Brett Anderson and 4-11 with a 7.37 ERA (95 er in 116.0 ip) by everyone else...are 30-45 with a 4.85 ERA for the season...the ERA is third highest in the American League and the wins are tied for second fewest...have 601.0 innings pitched, which is second fewest in Major Leagues...the A's are one of seven ML teams with just one complete game.

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank last in the American League with 86 home runs (Kansas City is second to last, 90), a .381 slugging percentage (Kansas City is second to last, .394) and 294 extra base hits...are second to last with a .2522 batting average (Kansas City, .2515) and 11 triples and have the third fewest runs scored with 485 (Kansas City is tied for last, 425)...are batting .286 (183 for 639) over the last 18 games with 46 doubles and 109 runs scored (6.1 runs per game)...hit a season high tying four home runs Wednesday night (May 23 vs. Arizona, July 20 vs. Minnesota) and three of the home runs gave the A's the lead...seven of the A's last 10 home runs have given Oakland the lead.

**DOUBLES:** The A's had three doubles yesterday and now have 55 since the All-Star Break, which are the most in the majors (Cubs, 45)...there have been 9,990 doubles in Oakland history, leaving the A's 10 short of the 10,000 plateau...the first double in Oakland history was hit by Sal Bando on April 13, 1968 at Washington...double number 2,000 came here in Kansas City on September 14, 1977 by Rob Picciolo in the first game of a doubleheader...number 4,000 came against the Royals in Oakland on June 24, 1987 by Mike Davis.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have a Major League leading 25 stolen bases since the All-Star Break (Angels, 22)...have 47 stolen bases in the last 45 games and 79 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...that is the A's second highest stolen base total over the last 11 years (had 88 last year)...have four players (Cabrera, Davis, Holliday, Kennedy) with at least 10 steals for the first time since 1993.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 30-30 (.500) record against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions and are 17-31 (.354) against Western division teams...are 11-16 in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the AL...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19)...went 12-14 in the month of July and have finished with a losing record in each of the first four months of the season for the first time since 1993 (had a losing record in each of the first five months that year)...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the seven consecutive months without a winning record is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...had 10 straight months at .500 or less from August, 1996 to May, 1998 and eight straight from August, 1978 to September, 1979.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 14 times this year...used it an Oakland record 25 times last year, breaking the previous mark of 22 (2007 and 1992)...have now used the DL 61 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 14 players on the DL have combined to miss 615 games, an average of 43.9 games per stint...last year they combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL...have had at least five players on the DL every day since April 29 and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...the A's have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his career...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 2 and made his Major League debut that night in Chicago...the A's are 3-9 (.250) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has allowed at least six runs in each of his last four starts and is 0-3 with an 11.29 ERA (23 er in 18.1 ip) and .420 (37 for 88) opponents batting average over that span...only two

other pitchers in Oakland history have allowed at least six runs in four consecutive games: Dave Stewart (June 10-25, 1991) and Bill Krueger (May 26-June 14, 1985)...has allowed 27 runs in his last four starts and 20 of those have come in four innings (5 in the 1<sup>st</sup> on August 2, 5 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> on July 28, 4 in the 4<sup>th</sup> on July 23 and 6 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> on July 18).

**EIGHT-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-8 with a 7.22 ERA (42 er in 52.1 ip) and .347 (77 for 222) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA and a .170 opponents batting average over the first two starts of his career...the eight-game losing streak is the longest by an Athletic since Dallas Braden also had an eight-game losing streak from April 29 to September 23, 2007...it is the second longest losing streak in the American League this year (Berken, BAL 9...also active)...the last A's pitcher to lose more than eight in a row is Bob Welch, who had a nine-game losing streak from September 5, 1993 to May 11, 1994...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, over the last 56 seasons (since 1954), the only other pitcher to lose his next eight decisions after being credited with a win in each of his first two (or more) appearances in the big leagues was the Mets' Mike Pelfrey (2006-07)...had a no decision on July 28, snapping a streak of six consecutive *starts* with a losing streak...that is the longest such streak by an Athletic since Tom Candiotti also lost six straight from May 26 to June 23.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .359 (23 for 64) when leading off an inning and .545 (6 for 11) with a walk with the bases loaded...they are 3 for 29 (.103) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .440 (22 for 50) batting average against the opponents number eight and nine hitters and .288 (63 for 219) against everyone else.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-5 with a 6.58 ERA (29 er n 39.2 ip) in seven starts on four days rest and 1-3 with a 4.44 ERA (13 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of three runs or less in each of his last 11 starts and his season run support of 3.00 (22 rs in 66.0 ip) is second lowest among Major League starting pitchers with at least 60 innings pitched (Berken, BAL 2.97)...is 0-7 in eight starts with run support of two runs or less and 2-1 with support of three runs or more.

A 22-YEAR OLD AND TWO 21-YEAR OLDS: Is scheduled to make his 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season today...is 22 years old and Anderson and Cahill are both 21, giving the A's three pitchers under the age of 23 with at least 10 starts for the second time in Oakland history...the other time was in 1978 (Keough 32, Johnson 30, Wirth 14)...since 1996, the only Major League team to have three pitchers under the age of 23 make at least 10 starts is the 2006 Marlins (Scott Olsen 31, Josh Johnson 24, Anibal Sanchez 17)...the last American League team is the 1995 Twins (Brad Radke 28, Frank Rodriguez 16, Jose Parra 12)...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

**2009 HIGHLIGHTS:** He combined with Breslow and Ziegler on a five-hit shutout in his Major League debut, a 5-0 A's win at Chicago *June* **2**...became the 40<sup>th</sup> pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut and the 12<sup>th</sup> to win...is the fifth starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run in his debut...combined with Wuertz, Breslow and Bailey on a five-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Baltimore *June* **7** in Oakland...of the 12 pitchers in Oakland history to start and win their ML debut, he is just the third to also win his second start...joins Bill Krueger, who won each of his first two career starts on April 10 and 16, 1983, and Dave Hamilton, who won each of his first four career starts from May 29 to June 17, 1972...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss at San Francisco on *June* 12...retired each of the first 11 batters before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a Lincecum RBI single and a Rowand two-run single...that snapped his career opening scoreless streak at 17.2 innings...it was the longest career opening streak in Oakland history by a starter and it was second longest to Brad Ziegler's 39.0 inning streak last year.

**LAST START:** He lost his eighth consecutive decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Toronto last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a career high tying 10 hits in 5.0 innings...allowed five runs in the first inning on a two-run home run by Hill and a three-run double by Rios...each of the first six batters reached base before he retired the next three...also allowed a RBI single to Lind in the second and a Barajas solo home run in the fifth.

MAZZARO vs. KANSAS CITY: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 2-2 with a 2.38 ERA in 10 games, nine starts, with Triple-A Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion and led the PCL in hit batters (6)...allowed just two home runs in 56.2 innings... allowed a .205 opponents batting average, including .189 (18 for 95) by right-handed hitters and .218 (24 for 110) against left-handers...his opponents average dropped to .189 with runners in scoring position, including .120 with RISP and two outs...had no decisions, a 1.35 ERA and .188 opponents batting average over his first four starts...then lost each of his next two starts on April 30 and May 6,

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Brett Anderson (6-8, 4.20 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 21<sup>st</sup> start of the season and his career...is 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 1-3 with a 7.01 ERA and .346 opponents batting average over his previous five starts...leads American League rookies in strikeouts (93), is tied for second in starts (20), ranks third in innings pitched (115.2) and tied for seventh in wins (6)...received no run support in his last start for the sixth time this year...has received run support of one run or less in 10 of his 20 starts this year and is 0-7 in those starts...his season run support of 4.28 is eighth lowest in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, 3-2 A's win over Texas last Monday in Oakland (7.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...has never faced Kansas City in his career.

The A's bullpen allowed two runs in 21.0 innings on the last homestand (0.86 ERA) after allowing 19 runs in 23.1 innings on the last road trip (17 er, 6.56 ERA)...now has a 2.73 ERA (55 er in 181.1 ip), seven home runs allowed and 53 walks issued in Oakland this year compared to a 4.90 ERA (101 er in 185.1 ip), 23 home runs allowed and 95 walks issued on the road...ranks second among Major League bullpens with 336 strikeouts (San Diego, 338)...ranks second in the American League in innings pitched (366.2) and fewest save opportunities (34), third in save percentage (73.5%) tied for third in fewest home runs (30) and fourth in ERA (3.83) and opponents batting average (.242)...has allowed 57 of 151 (37.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL .have issued 21 first batter walks, which is second fewest in the Al

- Has recorded the save in each of his last five outings and has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 17...leads Major League rookies and ranks 10th among all American Leaguers in saves (15)...has recorded more than three outs in six of his saves.
  - MOST SAVES, OAKLAND ROOKIE Ranks second among Major League relievers with 71 strikeouts (Broxton LAD, 74)...has struck out two or more 23 Huston Street, 2005 Andrew Bailey, 2009 Rollie Fingers, 1969 batters in 27 of his 47 outings. 15
- Ranks second among AL rookies in games pitched (47) and fifth in strikeouts (71).
- Ranks third among AL relievers in innings pitched (62.0), tied for fourth in blown saves (4), seventh in opponents batting average (.181) and ninth in ERA (2.18).
- Faced the Royals once this year on May 13 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so, 1 hr).
- Has allowed only one run (12.1 ip, 0.73 ERA) and has converted 7 of 8 save opportunities in 10 outings on no days rest.
- Has not yielded a home run in 121 at bats against right-handed hitters.
- Was the sixth Oakland rookie to be named to the American League All-Star team but did not pitch in the game.
- Spent the entire 2008 season at Double-A Midland...began the season in the starting rotation and went 1-8 with a 6.18 ERA and .258 opponents batting average in his 15 starts...then went 4-1 with a 0.92 ERA and .207 opponents average over his final 22 appearances, all in relief.
