A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series, 3-1...have split the first two games in Kansas City after sweeping a two-game set in Oakland in May...have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and are 10-13 against the Royals since 2007...are 282-235 all-time against Kansas City...that includes 156-103 in Oakland and 126-132 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities and leads Major League rookies with 15 saves...he ranks second among all ML relievers with 71 strikeouts.

Rajai Davis is batting .351 (20 for 57) with 12 runs, six doubles, two triples, 19 RBI and seven stolen bases in 19 games since the All-Star Break...ranks third in the American League in steals since the break and tied for sixth in RBI...needs two more steals to become the first Athletic with back-to-back 20 steal seasons since 1994-95 when Rickey Henderson and Stan Javier did it.

Mark Ellis is batting .291 (25 for 86) with 18 runs scored and eight doubles since the All-Star Break...is tied for third in the AL in runs since the break and tied for seventh in doubles.

Tommy Everidge has reached base safely via hit or walk in all 12 games since he was selected from Sacramento July 28...that is the third longest reaching base streak to start a career in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On **August 9, 1968** Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...on **August 9, 2002** the A's win the longest game by time in Oakland history as they defeat New York 3-2 in 16 innings in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 7-5 over the last 12 games and are 11-13 since the All-Star Break...have not won or lost more than three in a row since June 29 and are 17-19 over that span...are 48-62 (.436) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...the A's will face each of the other last place teams in the AL on this trip (Kansas City and Baltimore)...have spent each of the last 98 days (since May 3) and 104 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...this season is the fifth in Oakland history in which the A's spent at least 100 days all alone in last place...the last time was in 1998 when they had 106 days and the other seasons are 1997, 1993 and 1979...the A's have finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

ROOKIES ON THE MOUND: Today marks the ninth consecutive game the A's have started a rookie, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous high was five twice)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak since the 1997 St. Louis Cardinals started a rookie in each of their last 19 games (Manny Aybar, Rigo Beltran, Matt Morris, Sean Lowe, Mike Busby and Brady Raggio)...77 of the A's 110 games have been started by a rookie, which is third most in Oakland history (93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...have started a rookie pitcher in 50 of the last 62 games...have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-13 with a 6.22 ERA (115 er in 166.1 ip) in 30 games since July 6...that includes 3-1 with a 1.96 ERA (9 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts by Brett Anderson and 5-12 with a 7.63 ERA (106 er in 125.0 ip) by everyone else...are 31-46 with a 4.94 ERA for the season...the ERA is third highest in the American League and the wins are tied for second fewest...have 610.0 innings pitched, which is second fewest in the Major Leagues...the A's are one of seven ML teams with just one complete game.

28 CONSECUTIVE DAYS: Today is day 25 of a scheduled 28 day stretch where the A's will not have a day off...are 11-13 during the stretch that began the day after the All-Star Break and runs through Wednesday...this is the eighth time in the history of the franchise the A's have played more than 20 consecutive days without a day off...the existing record for most consecutive days without a day off is 27 from May 30-June 25, 1961 and June 15-July 11, 1976...were originally scheduled to have July 23 off, but made up the April 20 rainout at New York that day...will make up the April 9 postponement against Los Angeles on another originally scheduled off day on August 27, meaning the A's are scheduled to have just two days off over a 53 day span from July 16 through September 6...have just five days off after the All-Star Break.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this six-game road trip against Kansas City (1-1) and Baltimore (three games)...went 3-5 on the last road trip and are 22-34 (.393) on the road for the season, which is the third worst mark in the American League...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (1-2) and Texas (3-1)...it was just the second time this year the A's finished with a winning record on a homestand with more than one series...the other time was June 5-11 against Baltimore (3-0) and Minnesota (2-2) when they went 5-2...are 26-28 (.481) at home for the season and are one of just three AL teams with a losing record at home.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the American League with 89 home runs (Kansas City is second to last, 92), a .253 batting average (Kansas City is second to last, .255) a .383 slugging percentage (Kansas City is second to last, .399) and 301 extra base hits...are second to last with 11 triples and have the third fewest runs scored with 500 (Kansas City is second to last, 441)...are batting .288 (205 for 711) over the last 20 games with 50 doubles and 124 runs scored (6.2 runs per game)...hit a season high tying four home runs Wednesday night (May 23 vs. Arizona, July 20 vs. Minnesota) and three of the home runs gave the A's the lead...seven of the A's last 13 home runs have given Oakland the lead.

DOUBLES: The A's had one double yesterday and now have 59 since the All-Star Break, which are the most in the majors (Cubs, 49)...there have been 9,994 doubles in Oakland history, leaving the A's six short of the 10,000 plateau...the first double in Oakland history was hit by Sal Bando on April 13, 1968 at Washington...double number 2,000 came here in Kansas City on September 14, 1977 by Rob Picciolo in the first game of a doubleheader...number 4,000 came against the Royals in Oakland on June 24, 1987 by Mike Davis.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in a season high five consecutive games and now have a Major League leading 27 stolen bases since the All-Star Break (Texas and Los Angeles-AL, 22)...have 49 stolen bases in the last 47 games and 81 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...that is the A's second highest stolen base total over the last 11 years (had 88 last year)...have four players (Cabrera, Davis, Holliday, Kennedy) with at least 10 steals for the first time since 1993.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's have a 31-31 (.500) record against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions and are 17-31 (.354) against Western division teams...are 11-16 in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19)...are 15-23 (.385) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 15-26)...went 12-14 in the month of July and have finished with a losing record in each of the first four months of the season for the first time since 1993 (had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the seven consecutive months without a winning record is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...had 10 straight months at .500 or less from August, 1996 to May, 1998 and eight straight from August, 1978 to September, 1979.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 15 times this year...used it an Oakland record 25 times last year, breaking the previous mark of 22 (2007 and 1992)...have now used the DL 62 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 15 players on the DL have combined to miss 635 games, an average of 42.3 games per stint...last year they combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL...have had at least five players on the DL every day since April 29 and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...the A's have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season and his career...this is his third professional season...the A's are 9-11 (.450) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings 10 times, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times.

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA (46.2 ip, 30 h, 10 r, 10 er, 16 bb, 48 so) and .182 (30 for 165) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 1-3 with a 7.01 ERA and .346 opponents batting average over his previous five starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in unearned runs (10), tied for seventh in grounded into double plays (15) and tied for 10th in losses (8)...he leads AL rookies in strikeouts (93), is tied for second in starts (20), tied for fourth in innings pitched (115.2) and tied for seventh in wins (6)...has one of three

RUN SUPPORT: Received no run support in his last start for the sixth time this year...has received run support of one run or less in 10 of his 20 starts this year and is 0-7 in those starts...is 6-1 in 10 starts with run support of two runs or more...his season run support of 4.28 (55 rs in 115.2 ip) is seventh lowest in the American League

20 STARTS BY TWO 21-YEAR OLDS: Is making his 21st start of the season today and fellow 21-year old Trevor Cahill has made 23 starts...this is the first time in the history of the Athletics franchise the A's have had two pitchers under the age of 22 make at least 20 starts in the same season...the last Major League team to do it is the 1980 Chicago White Sox (Britt Burns, 32 and Rich Dotson 32)...according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the 10th team in American League history and the 17th ML team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 20 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .235 (27 for 115) when leading off an inning...has allowed a .148 (4 for 27) opponents average with runners in scoring position over his last seven starts, but they are batting .320 (31 for 97) for the season, which is fourth highest in the AL...opponents are 5 for 10 (.500) with the bases loaded.

IN JULY: Went 2-1 with a 1.87 ERA and .168 opponents batting average in five starts in July...led all American League pitchers in opponents batting average in July, ranked second in ERA (Washburn, SEA 1.44) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (33)...had an ERA of 5.00 or more in each of the first three months of his career.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed a three-run home run to Lowell in the first inning on July 29, snapping a sixstart, 39.0-inning, 154-batters homerless streak...has yielded one home run over his last eight starts and 51.2 innings after allowing 13 home runs over his first 12 starts and 63.0 innings...has allowed 11 of his 14 home runs on the road and six have been hit by the opponents number seven hitter.

SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED: Allowed a RBI single to Jeter in the third inning on July 24 at New York to snap his scoreless streak at a career high 23.0 innings...that is the fourth longest scoreless streak in Oakland history by a rookie and the longest by a rookie starter since Barry Zito had a 23.2 inning streak in 2000.

2009 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 5-4 A's loss to Seattle on *April* **10**...became the 39th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his debut and at the age of 21 years, 68 days, eight youngest to start ... allowed five runs in 6.0 innings and all five runs came in the second inning... left his start on April 28 at Texas and May 4 against Los Angeles in the fifth inning with a blister on his finger and went 10 days without pitching...extended his career opening losing streak to four games in the A's 14-1 loss at Detroit on May 15... allowed a career high nine runs in a career low 3.1 innings but only three of the runs were earned...that gave him a career-opening stretch of six consecutive starts in team losses...the only longer such streak in Oakland history was by Mike Morgan who went 0-9 over his first nine career starts from June 11, 1978 to July 24, 1979...then picked up his first Major League win in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay on May 20...at the age of 21 years, 108 days, he became the sixth youngest pitcher in Oakland history to record his first ML win...combined with Wuertz and Casilla on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win at Chicago June 4...tossed 7.0 innings, allowed three of the hits and allowed only one base runner as far as third base...tossed a complete game two-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Boston on July 6...walked two and struck out a career high nine...allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...at the age of 21 years, 155 days he is the fifth youngest pitcher in Oakland history to toss a shutout...left his start on July 12 at Tampa Bay after 4.0 innings with lower back stiffness...retired each of the first 20 batters he faced on July 19 against Los Angeles before Abreu singled with two outs in the seventh inning to break up the perfect game...he is the second A's pitcher to take a no-hitter into the seventh inning this year (Cahill, April 12 vs. Seattle) and the second A's rookie to take a perfect game into the seventh inning (Mike Norris, June 28, 1976)...ended up with a no decision in the A's 1-0, 10 inning loss.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Texas last Monday in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings before loading the bases with no outs in the fifth...Saltalamacchia grounded into a double play to drive in a run and he struck out Andrus to get out of the inning...also allowed a RBI single to Byrd in the eighth inning but five Rangers pitchers shutout the A's on two hits over the first eight innings...was relieved by Wuertz after 7.2 innings and Oakland scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

ANDERSON vs. KANSAS CITY: Is making his first career appearance.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (3-2, 6.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th appearance and eighth start of the season... is 3-0 with a 5.72 ERA over his last six games, five starts...it is the first winning streak of his career...11 of the 18 runs he has allowed during the streak came in one game on July 20 against Minnesota, but he ended up with a no decision when the A's overcame a club record 10-run deficit...is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .154 opponents batting average over his last three starts...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento for the third time on June 24 and is 3-2 with a 6.08 ERA in eight games, seven starts, since his return...combined with Ziegler, Wuertz and Breslow on a five-hit shutout in his last start, a 6-0 A's win over Texas last Tuesday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 3 h, 3 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Orioles in his career...was 4-1 with a 2.51 ERA in 12 games, all starts, at Triple-A Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion.

Has recorded the save in each of his last five outings and has converted each of his last 10 save opportunities dating back to June 17...leads Major League rookies and is tied for 10th among all American Leaguers in saves (15)...has recorded more than three outs in six of his saves.

Ranks second among Major League relievers with 71 strikeouts (Broxton LAD, 76)...has struck out two or more batters in 27 of his 47 outings.

Ranks second among AL rookies in games pitched (47) and fifth in strikeouts (71).

- Ranks third among AL relievers in innings pitched (62.0), tied for fourth in blown saves (4), sixth in opponents batting average (.181) and ninth in ERA (2.18).
- Faced the Royals once this year on May 13 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so, 1 hr). Has allowed only one run (12.1 ip, 0.73 ERA) and has converted 7 of 8 save opportunities in 10 outings on no days rest.
