A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's have won the season series as they lead 4-0 with two games remaining...won the first game in Baltimore last night after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland in June...have won nine straight games against the Orioles, which is an Oakland record for longest winning streak against Baltimore...it is the longest winning streak by the Athletics franchise since July 19-August 18, 1928 when the Philadelphia A's had a 10-game winning streak against the St. Louis Browns...have not lost to the Orioles since July 22, 2007...have not lost the season series to the Orioles since 1998 and are 64-27 (.703) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season...that is the best winning percentage the best winning percentage against the Orioles by any against the Orioles by any American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 231-233 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 114-123 in Oakland and 117-110 in Baltimore...including 50-36 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's 967-913 against Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The average temperature at first pitch for the first four games of the road trip has been 92.5 degrees.

Mark Ellis had a career high and tied an Oakland record with five hits last night...it was the 27th five-hit game in Oakland history...now has six consecutive hits...has hit safely in 13 of the last 14 games in which he has batted (23 for 58, .397).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On August 11, 1978 Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in the A's 2-0 victory...on August 11, 2003 Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games and nine of the last 14...have won each of the previous two series, the first time the A's have won back-to-back series since June 1-7 (Chicago and Baltimore)...need a win today or tomorrow to put together three straight series wins for the first time since April 18-27, 2008 (Kansas City, Minnesota and Seattle)...are now 13-13 since the All-Star Break...have not won or lost more than three in a row since June 29 and are 19-19 over that span...are 50-62 (.446) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...the A's face each of the other last place teams in the AL on this trip (Kansas City and Baltimore)...are 33-31 (.516) against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions and are 17-31 (.354) against Western division teams...have spent each of the last 100 days (since May 3) and 106 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the days in last place equal the fourth highest single season total in Oakland history (1998)...the only season the A's have spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153), 1979 (147) and 1993 (120)...the A's have finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

ERRORLESS STREAK: The A's have gone a season high six consecutive games without an error...the longest errorless streak last year was eight games from June 15-24...have made 69 errors for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...are on pace for 100 errors...have committed fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in each of the last seven games (13 stolen bases total), which is the longest streak by an A's team July 17-24, 1992 when they stole at least one base in eight consecutive contests...now have 86 steals for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...had 88 stolen bases all last year and that was the A's highest season total since 1998 when they had 131...have four players (Cabrera, Davis, Holliday, Kennedy) with at least 10 steals for the first time since 1993.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Baltimore (1-0) and have not finished with a winning record on a road trip of more than one series since June 13-19 of last year (4-2 vs. San Francisco and Arizona)...are 24-34 (.404) on the road for the season...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (1-2) and Texas (3-1)...it was just the second time this year the A's finished with a winning record on a homestand with more than one series...the other time was June 5-11 against Baltimore (3-0) and Minnesota (2-2) when they went 5-2...are 26-28 (.481) at home for the season and are one of just three American League teams with a losing record at home.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's are batting .284 (260 for 916) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best average in the American League...lead the majors in doubles (64) and stolen bases (32) since the break...rank second in the AL in runs (154) and extra base hits (90) and fourth in on-base percentage (.346)...before the break, the A's ranked last in the AL in batting (.246) and extra base hits (22), had the second lowest on-base percentage (.316) and the third fewest doubles (142) and runs (361).

ROOKIES ON THE MOUND: Today marks the 11th consecutive game the A's have started a rookie, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous high was five twice)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak since the 1997 St. Louis Cardinals started a rookie in each of their last 19 games that season (Manny Aybar, Rigo Beltran, Matt Morris, Sean Lowe, Mike Busby and Brady Raggio)...79 of the A's 112 games have been started by a rookie, which is third most in Oakland history (93 in 1983, 82 in 1978)...have started a rookie pitcher in 52 of the last 64 games...have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-6 with a 6.34 ERA (69 er in 98.0 ip) in 17 games since July 25...that includes 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA (4 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts by Gio Gonzalez and 4-6 with a 7.98 ERA (65 er in 73.1 ip) by everyone else...are 33-46 with a 4.89 ERA for the season...the ERA is fourth highest in the American League and the wins are tied for third fewest...have 622.0 innings pitched, which is second fewest ahead of Baltimore (601.2)...the A's are one of seven Major League teams with just one complete game.

28 CONSECUTIVE DAYS: Today is day 27 of a scheduled 28 day stretch where the A's will not have a day off...are 13-13 during the stretch that began the day after the All-Star Break and concludes tomorrow...this is the eighth time in the history of the franchise the A's have played more than 20 consecutive days without a day off...the existing record for most consecutive days without a day off is 27 from May 30-June 25, 1961 and June 15-July 11, 1976...were originally scheduled to have July 23 off, but made up the April 20 rainout at New York that day...will make up the April 9 postponement against Los Angeles on another originally scheduled off day on August 27, meaning the A's are scheduled to have just two days off over a 53 day span from July 16 through September 6...have just five days off after the All-Star Break.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .255, which is the highest the average has been outside the first eight games of the season...however, it is second lowest in the American League...rank last in the AL in slugging (.386) and extra base hits (310), are second to last in home runs (93) and triples (11) and rank fourth in fewest runs scored (515) and lowest on-base percentage (.323).

9,999 DOUBLES: The A's had four doubles last night break bringing the all-time Oakland total to 9,999 since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968...over that span, the only other teams that were in existence in 1968 and have not reached 10,000 doubles are the Angels (9,970) and Dodgers (9,460)...the first double in Oakland history was hit by Sal Bando on April 13, 1968 at Washington.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 15 times this year...used it an Oakland record 25 times last year, breaking the previous mark of 22 (2007 and 1992)...have now used the DL 62 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 15 players on the DL have combined to miss 649 games, an average of 43.3 games per stint...last year they combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL...have had at least five players on the DL every day since April 29 and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...the A's have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season and his career...the A's are 10-13 (.435) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in 11 of his 23 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

RECENTLY: Has lost each of his last three starts (16.1 ip, 26 h, 17 r, 17 er, 8 bb, 13 so, 5 hr, 9.37 ERA), matching the longest losing streak of his career (third time)...is now 1-6 with an 8.19 ERA (37 er in 40.2 ip) and .333 (56 for 168) opponents batting average over his last eight starts (since June 27)...was 5-5 with a 3.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in home runs (25), tied for second in losses (11), tied for fourth in runs (79) and tied for fifth in walks (55)...is averaging 4.56 strikeouts per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL...his strikeout to walk ratio of 1.16 is second lowest in the majors (Suppan, MIL 1.13).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Has set an Oakland rookie record with 25 home runs, topping the previous mark of 24 set by John Wasdin in 1996...leads Major League rookies in games started (23) and innings pitched (126.1)...is tied for eighth among AL rookies in wins (6) and ranks ninth in strikeouts (62).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-7 with a 4.68 ERA (43 er in 82.2 ip) in 14 starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 5.98 ERA (29 er in 43.2 ip) in nine starts on the road...has 25 walks and 46 strikeouts in Oakland and 30 walks and 18 strikeouts on the road.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or less in 11 of his 23 starts and is 0-7 in those starts...however, has four games with run support of

nine or more and he has been the starting pitcher in five of the 10 games this year in which the A's have scored at least nine runs in the whole game...has the fifth highest run support in the American League (6.27, 88 rs in 126.1 ip).

20 STARTS BY TWO 21-YEAR OLDS: Is making his 24th start of the season today and fellow 21-year old Brett Anderson has made 21 starts...this is the first time in the history of the Athletics franchise the A's have had two pitchers under the age of 22 make at least 20 starts in the same season...the last Major League team to do it is the 1980 Chicago White Sox (Britt Burns, 32 and Rich Dotson 32)...according to baseballreference.com, the A's are just the 10th team in American League history and the 17th ML team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 20 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed seven runs in the first inning this year and has a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) and .200 (16 for 80) opponents batting average in the inning...has a 5.57 ERA (64 er in 103.1 ip) and .296 (122 for 412) opponents average after that.

2009 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster at the age of 21 years, 36 days and was the sixth youngest player on an O.D. roster in Oakland history...made his Major League debut in the A's second game of the season and had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win at Los Angeles on **April 7**...according to baseball-reference.com, he is just the 16th pitcher since 1954 to make his Major League debut with a start in one of the first two games of the season (all 16 started game two)...at the age of 21 years, 37 days, he was the seventh youngest pitcher to debut with a start in Oakland history...no-hit Seattle over the first 6.1 innings on April 12 before Beltre singled with one out in the seventh...became the first Oakland rookie to take a no-hitter into the seventh inning since Mike Warren tossed his no-hitter on September 29, 1983...recorded his first Major League win in the A's 9-4 victory over Texas on *May 7* in Oakland...at the age of 21 years, 67 days he is the fifth youngest pitcher in Oakland history to record his first ML win...had his winning streak snapped at a career high three games on *June* 27 against Colorado when he allowed seven runs in 3.2 innings...yielded a career high four home runs...it was the 27th time in Oakland history a pitcher allowed at least four home runs in a game, the first time since Barry Zito on August 9, 2006 against Texas...then allowed a career high eight runs in 3.2 innings in his next start, a 15-3 loss at Cleveland on July 3...is the first starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs while pitching fewer than 4.0 innings in back-to-back starts.

LAST START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 6-4 loss to Texas last Thursday in Oakland...struck out a career high six...the A's scored twice in the first, but he allowed solo home run to Blalock in the second and Young in the third to tie the game...also allowed a Young RBI single in the fifth and a Byrd sacrifice fly in the sixth and was charged with one of the Rangers two runs in the seventh.

CAHILL vs. BALTIMORE: Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 9-4 win in Oakland on June 6...shutout the Orioles on four hits and no walks over the first six innings and allowed just two runners into scoring position...had a 9-0 lead entering the seventh inning and allowed back-to-back singles to Scott and Huff to start the inning...was relieved by Ziegler who allowed both of the runs to score.
