A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's lead the season series, 3-2...lost the first game in Oakland last night after winning three of four at Chicago in June...lost the season series last year 4-5, marking the first time the A's have lost the season series to Chicago since 2000...are 49-25 (.662) against the White Sox since 2001, which is the best record by any American League team...are 28-9 (.757) against the White Sox in Oakland since 2001...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-255 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 145-124 in Oakland and 131-131 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 953-1010 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities...he leads Major League rookies and ranks 10th among all American Leaguers with 17 saves...ranks second among ML relievers in strikeouts (73).

Rajai Davis has hit safely in a career high nine consecutive games (13 for 38, .342) and 17 of his last 18 (24 for 67, .358).

Mark Ellis leads the American League with 16 RBI in the month of August...has hit safely in 15 of his last 17 games (26 for 66, .394) with 14 runs scored.

Edgar Gonzalez has not allowed a home run in 45.1 innings, which are the second most innings pitched among Major League pitchers with no home runs.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On August 15, 1907 Chief Bender wins his 11th consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 win over Cleveland...on August 15, 1976 Joe Rudi collects his 1000th hit as an Oakland Athletic in the A's 8-7 win against Boston...on August 15, 1980 Rick Langford pitches a six-hitter as the A's defeat Seattle 11-3...it is his club record ninth consecutive complete game victory...the win comes in the midst of a club record 22 consecutive complete games.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven of the last 11 games and 10 of the last 17 and are 14-15 since the All-Star Break...lost the first game of this series last night but have won each of the previous three series...that is the first time the A's have won three consecutive series since April 18-27, 2008 (Kansas City, Minnesota and Seattle)...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 20-21 over that span...are 51-64 (.443) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 104 days (since May 3) and 110 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153), 1979 (147) and 1993 (120)...the A's finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen at least one base in each of the last 10 games (17 steals total), which is the longest streak by an Oakland team since August 5-14, 1988 when they also had a steal in 10 consecutive contests...have not stolen a base in more than 10 consecutive games since June 26-July 7, 1986 when they did it in 11 straight...now have 90 steals for the season, which is fifth most in the American League and the most by an A's team since the 1998 club had 131...have four players (Cabrera, Davis, Holliday, Kennedy) with at least 10 steals for the first time since 1993.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 3-8 (.273) in extra inning games with the loss last night and have the second worst record in extra inning games in the majors (Colorado, 1-4)...the 11 extra innings games are tied for second most in the American League (Toronto, 16)...the eight extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...fell to 11-18 (.379) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 10-17)...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's are batting .284 (291 for 1024) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best average in the American League...lead the majors in doubles (71) and stolen bases (36) since the break...rank second in the AL in runs (169) and extra base hits (102)...before the break, the A's ranked last in the AL in batting (.246) and extra base hits (22), had the second lowest on-base percentage (.316) and the third fewest doubles (142) and runs (361).

ROOKIES ON THE MOUND: Gio Gonzalez is scheduled to make the 83rd start by an A's rookie pitcher, which is the second highest total in Oakland history...the record is 93 set in 1983...today marks the 14th consecutive game the A's have started a rookie, which is the longest streak in Oakland history (previous high was five twice)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak since the 1997 St. Louis Cardinals started a rookie in each of their last 19 games that season (Manny Aybar, Rigo Beltran, Matt Morris, Sean Lowe, Mike Busby and Brady Raggio)...the A's have started a rookie pitcher in 56 of the last 68 games...the last non-rookie to start a game was Dallas Braden on July 31...have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-7 with a 6.32 ERA (81 er in 115.1 ip) in 20 games since July 25...that includes 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA (4 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts by Gio Gonzalez and 5-7 with a 7.64 ERA (77 er in 90.2 ip) by everyone else...are 34-47 with a 4.93 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched in the American League (639.1), the third fewest wins and the third highest ERA and opponents batting average (.283)...are the only AL team with just one complete game.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the American League in slugging (.389), are second to last in batting (.256), home runs (97), triples (12) and extra base hits (322) and rank fourth in fewest runs scored (530) and lowest on-base percentage (.323).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Rajai Davis' sixth inning error on Wednesday snapped the A's errorless streak at a season high seven games...it was the A's 70th error of the season, which is tied for fifth most in the American League...are on pace for 99 errors...have committed fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this nine-game homestand against Chicago (0-1), New York (three games) and Detroit (three games)...it equals the A's longest homestand of the season (third time)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (1-2) and Texas (3-1), just the second time this year the A's finished with a winning record on a homestand with more than one series (June 5-11, 5-2 vs. Baltimore and Minnesota)...are 26-29 (.473) at home for the season and are one of just three AL teams with a losing record at home...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Baltimore (2-1), their first winning road trip of more than one series since June 13-19 of last year (4-2 vs. San Francisco and Arizona)...are 25-35 (.417) on the road.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 34-33 (.507) against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions and are 17-31 (.354) against Western division teams...have finished with a losing record in each of the first four months of the season for the first time since 1993 (had a losing record in each of the first five months that year)...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the seven consecutive months without a winning record is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...had 10 straight months at .500 or less from August, 1996 to May, 1998 and eight straight from August, 1978 to September, 1979.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 15 times this year...used it an Oakland record 25 times last year, breaking the previous mark of 22 (2007 and 1992)...have now used the DL 62 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 15 players on the DL have combined to miss 670 games, an average of 44.7 games per stint...last year they combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL...have had at least five players on the DL every day since April 29 and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...the A's have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th appearance and ninth start of the season...it will be the 16th start of his career...the A's are 5-3 (.625) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in four of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two or fewer four times.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 5.72 ERA (34.1 ip, 34 h, 18 r, 18 er, 17 bb, 37 so, 5 hr) over his last seven games, six starts...it is the first winning streak of his career...has allowed three runs or less in five of the starts during the streak as 11 of the 18 runs he has allowed came in one game on July 20 against Minnesota...ended up with a no decision in that game after the A's overcame a club record 10-run deficit.

SOME LIKE IT HOT: The average temperature over his last four starts is 80.0 degrees (81 at New York, 79 at Boston, 67 vs. Texas, 93 at Baltimore) and he is 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA (4 er in 24.2 ip) and .189 (17 for 90) opponents batting average over that span...for the season, he is 4-0 with a 2.25 ERA (6 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts where game time temperature is 72 and above and 0-2 with a 14.29 ERA (18 er in 11.1 ip) in three starts with a temperature of 62 or less...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (6.2 ip) in one start with the temp in between

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA (18 er in 18.0 ip) and .380 (30 for 79) opponents batting average in four starts in Oakland compared to 3-0 with a 3.74 ERA (14 er in 33.2 ip) and .246 (32 for 130) opponents average in seven games, four starts on the road...has allowed six of his seven home runs in Oakland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .297 opponents batting average, which includes a .385 (20 for 52) mark against left-handed hitters and .268 (42 for 157) against right-handers...has allowed a .238 (15 for 63) opponents batting average over his first 30 pitches in a game and .322 (47 for 146) after that

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento for the third time on June 24 and is 4-2 with a 5.23 ERA (25 er in 43.0 ip) in nine games, eight starts, since his return...his first stint was from May 2 to 4 and he pitched 5.0 innings of relief on May 3 in the A's 8-7, 15-inning loss at Seattle (5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...his second stint was from May 18 to 19 and he pitched 3.2 innings of relief on the 18th at Tampa Bay (6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

23-YEAR OLD: Is 23 years old, making him the fourth youngest pitcher in the A's starting rotation behind Trevor Cahill (21), Brett Anderson (21) and Vin Mazzaro (22)...is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season today and the A's have four starting pitchers under the age of 24 with more than five starts for the first time in Oakland history...the last Major League team to do that is the 2006 Florida Marlins (Nolasco, Olsen, Johnson, Sanchez) and the last American League team is the 2003 Detroit Tigers (Roney, Ledezma, Bonderman, Corneio)...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

2009 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 108 pitches in his first appearance on *May 3* at Seattle, the most by an Oakland reliever since pitch count data is first available in 1988...then tossed 91 pitches in his second outing on *May 18* at Tampa Bay, also a relief appearance...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 5-2 win at Cleveland on *July 5*...had a no decision in the 14-13 win over Minnesota on *July 20* in Oakland...allowed a career high 11 runs on a career high tying 10 hits in just 2.2 innings...is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to allow 11 or more runs in a game, the first to do it in less than 3.0 innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is just the second starting pitcher since 1900 to avoid a loss in a game in which he pitched fewer than three innings and gave up at least 11 runs...the other was the Rangers' Scott Feldman last year on August 12 at Boston (2.2 ip, 12 r)...all 11 runs scored on home runs with two outs...allowed a career high four home runs...it was the 28th game of four or more home runs allowed in Oakland history, the second this year (Cahill, June 27 vs. Colorado)...left trailing 11-2 and the Twins built a 12-2 lead before the A's came back with three in the third, two in the fourth and seven in the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 8-5 loss at Boston *July 30*...struck out a career high tying eight batters in 5.1 innings...left with a four run lead, but the pen blew the save...combined with Ziegler, Wuertz and Breslow on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Texas *August 4* in Oakland...tossed a career high tying 6.2 innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win at Baltimore last Monday...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extended his scoreless streak to a career high 12.2 innings...scattered seven hits and walked just one...the biggest threat came in the seventh inning when Mora singled and Wieters doubled to start the inning...the game was delayed by rain for 52 minutes and when it resumed he was relieved by Breslow who retired the next three batters to end the inning.

GONZALEZ vs. CHICAGO: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 13-1 loss in Oakland on August 17, 2008...allowed three runs in the second inning on a wild pitch and a two-run home run by Uribe and then yielded three more runs in the third on a two-run home run by Quentin and a solo home run by Dye...the White Sox scored two more runs in the fourth on a two-run single by Quentin.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 2.51 ERA in 12 games, all starts, at Triple-Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion...had the lowest opponents batting average (.194) and ranked second in strikeouts (71)...the batting average included a .188 mark against right-handed .209 and hitters against handers...allowed all five of his home runs to righties...his opponents batting average dropped to .160 with runners in scoring position...the River Cats were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in five of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

RHP Trevor Cahill (6-12, 5.06 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season and his career...has lost each of his last four starts (7.71 ERA), which is the longest losing streak of his career...is now 1-7 with a 7.55 ERA and .328 opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 5-5 with a 3.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts...has set an Oakland rookie record with 25 home runs and his 12 losses are tied for fourth most...ranks second in the American League in home runs allowed (25)...19 of his 25 home runs have been hit by left-handed hitters, an Oakland record tying 19 have come at home and 19 have been solo shots...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's loss at Baltimore last Tuesday (7.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the White Sox, a 6-2 A's loss at Chicago on June 1 (5.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

The A's bullpen leads the American League in strikeouts (349), ranks second in innings pitched (390.1), third in ERA (3.76) and fourth in save percentage (73.0%)...has allowed 62 of 164 (37.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has issued 21 first batter walks, which is second fewest in the AL...the pen allowed six runs in 18.2 innings on the last road trip (2.89 ERA)...yielded two runs in 21.0 innings on the previous homestand (0.86 ERA)...now has a 2.70 ERA (56 er in 186.1 ip), eight home runs allowed and 54 walks issued in Oakland this year compared to a 4.72 ERA (107 er in 204.0 ip), 24 home runs allowed and 97 walks issued on the road.

Ranks second among Major League relievers with 73 strikeouts (Broxton LAD, 76)...has struck out two or more
