CHICAGO WHITE SOX (60-57) at OAKLAND A'S (51-65) LHP John Danks (10-8, 4.04) vs. RHP Trevor Cahill (6-12, 5.06) Game #118/Road #58 • Sunday, August 16, 2009

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox, defending American League Central champions, have won three of their last four games as they conclude a six-game, seven-day trip today in Oakland ... left-hander John Danks, who is 6-4 with a 3.18 ERA (26 ER/73.2 IP) in his last 11 starts, takes the mound for the White Sox.
- The White Sox improved to 3-2 on the trip yesterday with an 8-1 victory ... Gavin Floyd earned the win, allowing one run over 7.0 IP with eight strikeouts, and Jim Thome hit his 563rd career home run to tie Reggie Jackson for 12th place all-time.
- The Sox posted an 8-7 victory in 10 innings on Friday as Alexei Ramirez hit his second-game winning homer in the last three games, a solo shot off Craig Breslow leading off the 10th ... Oakland erased a 6-0 deficit to take a 7-6 lead before Chicago rallied to win ... the Sox bullpen threw 5.2 scoreless IP.
- The Sox opened the trip by losing two of three games to Seattle, including a 1-0, 14-inning setback on Wednesday ... Ken Griffey Jr. hit a game-winning single with two outs in the 14th ... Mark Buehrle threw 8.0 scoreless IP in a no decision.
- Ramirez hit a game-winning, three-run homer in the ninth inning off David Aardsma on Tuesday to give the Sox a 3-1 victory ... John Danks allowed one run over 8.0 IP with eight strikeouts, and the Sox improved to 1-49 when trailing after eight innings.
- The Sox lost the opener on the trip, 6-4, as Seattle scored three runs in the sixth inning to erase a 4-3 deficit.
- Following today's game, the Sox return home for six games in seven days vs. Kansas City (8/17-19) and Baltimore (8/21-23).
- The White Sox went 6-4 on their last homestand vs. the Yankees (3-1), Angels (2-1) and Cleveland (1-2) ... the Sox lost each finale against the Yankees and Angels in bids for sweeps.
- The Sox have used 89 different lineups this season.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The White Sox have won the first two games of this series to even the season matchup at three games apiece ... the A's won three of four games in Chicago on 6/1-4, including the last three by a 17-3 margin with two shutouts.
- The Sox are batting .245 (48-196) with a 3.76 ERA (23 ER/55.0 IP) and have been outscored by Oakland, 27-25.
- The White Sox went 5-4 in 2008 for their first series win since 1999 (1-7-1) ... Chicago took two of three games on 8/15-17 for its first season series win at Oakland Coliseum since 8/28-30/00.
- The Sox trail all-time, 256-276 ... they are 43-49 at U.S. Cellular Field and 141-157 in Oakland ... since the start of the 2001 season, Oakland is 49-26 overall and 28-10 at home.

SWEPT AWAY

- The White Sox are looking to record their third three-game sweep of 2009 and first in Oakland since 5/16-18/97 ... the Sox swept three-game sets earlier this season at Kansas City on 5/29-31 and at Cleveland on 6/29-7/1.
- The White Sox have won four straight games at Oakland Coliseum (combined 31-10 margin) for the first time since a five-game winning streak from 8/1/96-8/5/97.

THOME TIES REGGIE

- Jim Thome hit his 563rd career home run yesterday to tie Reggie Jackson for 12th place on the all-time list ... Rafael Palmeiro ranks 11th with 569 homers.

READY FREDDY

- The White Sox announced that RHP Freddy Garcia will start on Tuesday vs. Kansas City ... Garcia, 33, is 118-77 with a 4.07 ERA (777 ER/1,716.2 IP) lifetime, including a 40-21 record with a 4.24 ERA (258 ER/547.1 IP) in 82 starts with the Sox from 2004-06.
- Garcia is 0-1 with a 1.80 ERA (4 ER/20.0 IP) and 19 strikeouts in four minor-league starts after signing with the Sox as a free agent on 6/8 ... his last major-league start came on 9/29/08 at Chicago when he allowed two runs on two hits over 5.0 IP.

FLOYD SINCE MAY 22

- Gavin Floyd is 8-3 with a 2.46 ERA (31 ER/113.1 IP) and 99 strikeouts in his last 16 starts dating back to 5/22 ... during that stretch Floyd has made 13 quality starts and allowed just 84 hits (.205 average) while lowering his season ERA from 7.71 to 3.94 ... Floyd since 5/22:

BULLPEN RELIEF

- The White Sox bullpen has thrown 7.2 scoreless IP in this series and owns a 2.06 ERA (15 ER/65.2 IP) over its last 22 games, lowering its season ERA from 4.15 to 3.74.

AT THE GATE

- As of this morning, the lower level for tomorrow's game vs. Kansas City is sold out, and only a few tickets remain the upper boxes ... a few thousand upper reserve are left.
- The upper level for Tuesday vs. Kansas City is sold out, but lower level tickets still are available.

BAT IT LIKE BECKHAM

- Gordon Beckham is attempting to become the 10th White Sox Player to earn American League Rookie of the Year honors but first since Ozzie Guillen in 1985.
- Beckham, the AL Rookie of the Month for July, is hitting .362 (42-116) with 15 doubles, three home runs and 24 RBI in his last 31 games and .351 (59-168) with 18 doubles, five homers and 35 RBI in his last 45.
- Beckham, who has played in just 63 games since his promotion on 6/4, leads AL rookies in average (.305), RBI (43), on-base (.378) and slugging percentage (.478), doubles (21) and extra-base hits (27).
- After a 2-28 start, he is batting .338 (67-198) ... Beckham also is hitting .373 (41-110) on the road, .382 (21-55) with runners in scoring position and .480 (12-25) with RISP and two outs.

PACK YOUR BAGS

- The White Sox are in the middle of a stretch from 8/10-9/3 where they play 17 of 23 games on the road (3-2 so far) ... the Sox also are on the road for 11 games at Boston (four), New York and Minnesota (three each) and the Cubs (one) from 8/24-9/3.

HOLDING ON

- The White Sox blew a 6-0 lead on Friday before rallying to win ... the six-run lead is the largest surrendered by the Sox since 4/7/06 at Kansas City when they also built a 6-0 cushion before losing, 11-7.

PEAVY UPDATE

- Jake Peavy, who has been on the disabled list since 6/13 with a strained tendon in his right ankle, threw 3.0 scoreless IP on Thursday vs. Pawtucket in his first rehabilitation start ... he allowed just one hit and one walk and struck out five.
- Peavy, who was acquired from San Diego on 7/31, is scheduled to make his next start for Charlotte on Tuesday.

CLEAN IT UP

- The White Sox rank last in the American League with a .979 fielding percentage ... the Sox have allowed 56 unearned runs, second-most in the AL behind Kansas City (57).

ON DECK: KANSAS CITY ROYALS

- The White Sox open a six-game, seven-day homestand tomorrow vs. Kansas City ... left-hander Mark Buehrle starts the opener for the Sox.
- The season series is even at six games apiece, with the Sox going 1-2 at home and 5-4 in Kansas City ... the Royals won four of the first five games and the last two, while the White Sox won five in a row from 5/29-7/2, including a three-game sweep at Kauffman Stadium on 5/29-31.

DANKS AT A GLANCE

- Is making his 22nd start of 2009 and 11th on the road ... missed his start on 7/22 with a blister and circulatory problems with his left index finger and has gone 2-2 with a 4.28 ERA (13 ER/27.1 IP) in four starts since his return to the rotation.
- Has not won back-to-back starts since 5/20 and 5/25.
- Is 4-1 with a 2.91 ERA (15 ER/46.1 IP) with one home run allowed in his last seven road starts.
- Has made 12 quality starts ... the Sox are 12-10 in his outings ... has 14 career pickoffs (six in 2009).
- Had his season-best 19.1 IP scoreless streak end after allowing four runs in the first inning of his last start on 7/10 at Minnesota.
- Tossed at least 7.0 IP in a career-best five straight outings from 6/10-7/3.
- Went 12-9 with a 3.32 ERA (72 ER/195.0 IP) and 159 strikeouts in his second major-league season in 2008 ... his 3.32 ERA was 2.18 lower than his 2007 total (5.50), the second biggest improvement in baseball.
- Earned the win in the one-game playoff vs. Minnesota on 9/30/08 at U.S. Cellular Field ... started and picked up the victory in Game 3 of the ALDS vs. Tampa Bay, striking out seven (3 ER/6.2 IP).
- Was traded by Texas to the White Sox on 12/23/06 with pitchers Nick Masset and Jacob Rasner in exchange for pitcher Brandon McCarthy and outfielder David Paisano.
- Chosen by the Rangers in the first round (ninth overall) of the June 2003 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START

- Matched his career high with 8.0 IP (third time) in a victory on 8/11 at Seattle ... allowed one run on seven hits ... walked one and struck out eight.
- The road win was his first since 7/3 at Kansas City.
- Departed with a 3-1 lead after throwing 99 pitches.

SELECT SOUTHPAWS

- Has gone 22-17 with a 3.61 ERA (132 ER/328.2 IP) in 55 starts since the start of 2008 ... the 3.61 ERA is the fourth-lowest among all American League left-handers during that span.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE LEFTY

- Has limited the opposition to a .247 (126-510) average in 2009, the third-lowest among all American League left-handers ... only Detroit's Jarrod Washburn (.229) and the Yankees' CC Sabathia (.235) are lower.

CALIFORNIA LOVE

- Is 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (7 ER/30.1 IP) in five starts in California over his career.
- Has gone 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (3 ER/12.1 IP) at Angel Stadium, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/6.0 IP) at Dodger Stadium, 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (1 ER/6.0 IP) at the Coliseum and 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER/6.0 IP) and AT&T Park.

LEADING OFF AN INNING

- Opponents are hitting .344 (43-125) with four home runs, 15 walks and a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning ... the .344 average is the highest to start an inning in the American League, while the .418 on-base percentage is second to Toronto's Ricky Romero (.429)

WIN OR GO HOME

- Earned the win in the one-game playoff vs. Minnesota on 9/30/08 at U.S. Cellular Field ... matched his career high with two hits allowed and 8.0 scoreless IP ... the Sox won, 1-0, on Jim Thome's home run and clinched the American League Central Division.
- Started and picked up the victory in Game 3 of the ALDS vs. Tampa Bay (Sox trailed in series, 2-0), striking out seven (3 ER/6.2 IP) ... limited the Rays to one run on five hits in the first six innings before surrendering a two-run homer to B.J. Upton in the seventh.

IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR

- Brother, Jordan, is an outfielder with Class AA Birmingham in the White Sox organization and was named to the Southern League All-Star Team ... he was selected by Chicago out of the University of Texas in the 19th round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft (did not sign) and the seventh round in 2008 (signed on 8/14/08).
- Sister, Emily, is a senior at Round Rock (Tex.) High School and has accepted a volleyball scholarship to The Ohio State University in the fall.
- Father, John, was a four-year basketball letterman with Texas (1977-80) ... played on the NIT Championship team in 1978 and appeared in the 1979 NCAA Tournament as a No. 4 seed (lost to Oklahoma).

2008 HIGHLIGHTS

- Went 12-9 with a 3.32 ERA (72 ER/195.0 IP) and 159 strikeouts in his second major-league season ... his 3.32 ERA was 2.18 lower than his 2007 total (5.50), the second biggest improvement in baseball.
- Along with Mark Buehrle, became just the 13th set of White Sox left-handers since 1958 to each accumulate 10 wins in a season and second since 200 (Jim Parque and Mike Sirotko).
- Ranked among American League leaders in ERA (5th), starts (T5th, 33), baserunners per 9.0 IP (9th, 11.22), opponents average (10th, .246) and hits per 9.0 IP (10th, 8.40).
- Earned the win in the one-game playoff vs. Minnesota on 9/30/08 at U.S. Cellular Field ... started and picked up the victory in Game 3 of the ALDS vs. Tampa Bay, striking out seven (3 ER/6.2 IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Made his major-league debut opposite Johan Santana on 4/8/07 at U.S. Cellular Field (L, 3 ER/6.0 IP) ... picked up his first win on 5/9/07 at Minnesota (1 ER/6.2 IP)
- Entered the 2008 season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 1 Prospect and having the Best Curveball in the Texas organization ... also rated as the No. 2 Prospect in 2005-06 and No. 7 in 2007.
- Appeared in MLB's All-Star Futures Game in 2004 at Minute Maid Park (W, 0 ER/1.0 IP).

VS. OAKLAND

- Is making his fifth career start against the A's and first of 2009 ... was 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP) in 2008 and is 4-0 with a 1.38 ERA (4 ER/26.0 IP) lifetime.
- Has allowed two earned runs or less in all four starts.
- Won his only start in Oakland on 8/16/08 (1 ER 6.0 IP).
