A's vs. YANKEES

The A's have lost the season series as they trail 5-1 with three games remaining...this is the first meeting in Oakland this year as the A's lost five of six in New York...the A's have now lost the season series in each of the last two years and four of the last six...have lost 10 of the last 12 games to New York and are 16-29 against the Yankees since 2004...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 216-244 against the Yankees...that includes 118-108 in Oakland and 98-136 in New York...all-time, the A's are 757-1110 against the Yankees.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Ellis was named American League Player of the Week today and is the first Athletic to receive the honor since Jack Cust won it the week ending May 5, 2008...Ellis hit .571 with three doubles, a home run and 11 RBI in six games...the week began with a five-hit game a week ago today at Baltimore and was capped with a walk-off home run yesterday...he is batting .431 (22 for 51) with a ML leading 19 RBI in August...he is tied for third in the AL in RBI since the break (24) and tied for fourth in doubles (11).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On **August 17, 1934** Ed Coleman hits three consecutive home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago, a 9-8, 10 inning A's win...on **August 17, 1980** Brian Kingman tosses the A's Oakland record ninth consecutive complete game in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle...the A's pitching staff set an Oakland record with 94 complete games for the season...on **August 17, 1987** Reggie Jackson hits the 563rd and final home run of his career against his teammates from the previous season, the California Angels...on **August 17, 1990** Bob Welch wins his 20th game of the season en route to a club record 27 wins...the wins are the most by an American League pitcher since Denny McClain's 31 in 1968...Welch wins the AL Cy Young Award.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Chicago to start the homestand, snapping the A's three-series winning streak...it was the first time the A's won three consecutive series since April 18-27, 2008 (Kansas City, Minnesota and Seattle)...are 8-5 over the last 13 games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 21-22 over that span...are 52-65 (.440) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 106 days (since May 3) and 112 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153), 1979 (147) and 1993 (120)...the A's finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

ROOKIES ON THE MOUND: The start by Brett Tomko today will end an Oakland record streak of 15 consecutive games started by a rookie...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the longest such streak since the 1997 St. Louis Cardinals started a rookie in each of their last 19 games that season (Manny Aybar, Rigo Beltran, Matt Morris, Sean Lowe, Mike Busby and Brady Raggio)...the last non-rookie to start a game was Dallas Braden on July 31...have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...have started a rookie pitcher in 58 of the last 70 games and 84 of 117 games for the season...that is the second highest total in Oakland history to the record of 93 set in 1983.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's are 15-16 since the All-Star Break...are batting .285 (312 for 1093), which is the second best average in the American League, but have a 5.17 ERA (159 er in 277.0 ip), which is fourth highest...lead the majors in doubles (77) and stolen bases (37)...rank second in the AL in runs (173) and extra base hits (109)...before the break, the A's ranked last in the AL in batting (.246) and extra base hits (220), had the second lowest on-base percentage (.316) and the third fewest doubles (142) and runs (361).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen 91 bases, which is fifth most in the American League and the most by an A's team since the 1998 club had 131...have stolen at least one base in 11 of the last 12 games (18 stolen bases total), including a streak of 10 in a row that ended on Saturday...that was the longest by an Oakland team since August 5-14, 1988 when they also had a steal in 10 consecutive contests...have four players (Cabrera, Davis, Holliday, Kennedy) with at least 10 steals for the first time since 1993.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-12 with a 6.44 ERA (125 er in 174.2 ip) and .313 (222 for 710) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break after going 25-36 with a 4.39 ERA and .273 opponents average before the break...are 34-48 with a 4.94 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (650.1) and wins in the American League, the third highest opponents batting average (.284) and the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game.

OFFENSE: The A's rank last in the American League in slugging (.390), second to last in batting (.256), home runs (98), triples (12) and extra base hits (329), rank third in fewest runs scored (534) and fourth in most grounded into double plays (103) and lowest on-base percentage (.323).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last four games after going a season high seven consecutive games without an error...each of the three errors have been committed by an outfielder and A's outfielders have 15 errors for the season, which is tied with Detroit for second most in the American League (Baltimore, 16)...overall, the A's have 72 errors and are on pace for 100...have committed fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this nine-game homestand against Chicago (1-2), New York (three games) and Detroit (three games)...it equals the A's longest homestand of the season (third time)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (1-2) and Texas (3-1), just the second time this year the A's finished with a winning record on a homestand with more than one series (June 5-11, 5-2 vs. Baltimore and Minnesota)...are 27-30 (.473) at home for the season and are one of just three AL teams with a losing record at home...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Baltimore (2-1), their first winning road trip of more than one series since June 13-19 of last year (4-2 vs. San Francisco and Arizona)...are 25-35 (.417) on the road.

ONE-RUN AND EXTRA INNING GAMES: The A's fell to 3-8 (.273) in extra inning games with the loss Friday night and have the second worst record in extra inning games in the majors (Colorado, 1-4)...the 11 extra innings games are tied for second most in the American League (Toronto, 16)...the eight extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...are 12-18 (.400) in one-run games, which is tied with Toronto for the second worst record in the AL (Kansas City, 11-17)...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.

WINS AND LOSSES: The A's are 35-34 (.507) against teams from the Central and Eastern divisions and are 17-31 (.354) against Western division teams...faced a left-handed starter yesterday for the first time since August 4 and won...have won each of their last two starts against lefties and are 16-23 (.410) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander this year, which is the third worst record in the American League...have finished with a losing record in each of the first four months of the season for the first time since 1993 (had a losing record in each of the first five months that year)...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the seven consecutive months without a winning record is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...had 10 straight months at .500 or less from August, 1996 to May, 1998 and eight straight from August, 1978 to September, 1979.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 15 times this year...used it an Oakland record 25 times last year, breaking the previous mark of 22 (2007 and 1992)...have now used the DL 62 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 15 players on the DL have combined to miss 684 games, an average of 45.6 games per stint...last year they combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL...have had at least five players on the DL every day since April 29 and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...the A's have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento today and will be making his Oakland debut...it will be his 16th appearance and first start of the season...his first 15 appearances came in relief with New York...it will be the 261st start of his career.

BRIEFLY: Was signed by the Yankees to a minor league contract on February 20 and began the season at Triple-A Scranton-Wilkes Barre...went 1-0 with four saves and a 0.64 ERA in 10 relief appearances and was selected by New York on May 9...was 1-2 with a 5.23 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Yankees and was designated for assignment on July 21...was released on July 29 and signed a minor league contract with the A's organization on August 5...was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento and had no decisions and a 7.94 ERA in three games, two starts.

CAREER: The A's will be the ninth team he has pitched for in his 13 seasons in the majors...has also pitched for Cincinnati (1997-99), Seattle (2000-01), San Diego (2002, 07, 08), St. Louis (2003), San Francisco (2004-05), Los Angeles-NL (2006-07), Kansas City (2008) and New York-AL (2009).

13th STARTER: Will become the 13th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is tied with San Diego and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...it equals the A's season total from last year...at the age of 36 years, 131 days, he will be the oldest pitcher to start a game this year by nearly five years (Giese, 31 years, 352 days)...will be the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's since Tom Candiotti faced Tampa Bay on June 2, 1999 at 41 years, 275 days...this will be just the fifth game this year in which the A's starting pitcher has been at least 26 years of age...the average age of the 13 pitchers to start a game for the A's this year is 25.2 years...Tomko had 260 major league starts entering this season...the other 12 pitchers to start for the A's this year had a combined 132 starts entering the season (Eveland 35, E. Gonzalez 35, Braden 24, Gallagher 21, G. Gonzalez 7, Outman 4, Giese 3, Reineke 3, Anderson 0, Cahill 0, Mazzaro 0, Mortensen 0).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: All 15 of his appearances with the Yankees this year came in relief...stranded all six of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 3 for 15 (.200)...in his career, he is 88-91 with a 4.66 ERA (809 er in 1563.2 ip) in 260 career starts and 8-10 with a 4.95 ERA (109 er in 198.0 ip) in 123 relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .247 opponents batting average, including .152 (5 for 33) against left-handed hitters and .318 (14 for 44) against right-handers...has allowed five home runs in 20.2 innings and all have been hit by right-handed hitters...opponents are batting .192 (10 for 52) with the bases empty and .360 (9 for 25) with runners on base.

WITH NEW YORK: Tossed two or more innings in five of his 15 relief appearances and allowed at least one run in seven of his appearances...yielded just two runs over his first seven outings for a 2.16 ERA...then allowed seven runs over his next three outings (3.2 ip, 17.18 ERA), including four in 0.2 innings on June 12 at New York (NL) and three in 2.0 innings on June 21 at Florida...allowed two runs over his final four outings (6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA).

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher on May 26, 2008 at Toronto in Kansas City's 7-2 loss (6.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 6 er, 4 so, 2 hr)...allowed four runs in the second inning on an Overbay RBI single, a Wilkerson sacrifice fly and a Zaun two-run home run...also yielded a two-run double to Rios in the fifth and a solo home run by Scutaro in the sixth.

TOMKO vs. NEW YORK: Is 2-0 with a 9.00 ERA (14.0 ip, 26 h, 18 r, 14 er, 5 bb, 6 so, 7 hr) in five career appearances, all in relief...is 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in two appearances in his home ballparks and 1-0 with a 12.00 ERA (12 er in 9.0 ip) in three appearances at Old Yankee Stadium as a visiting player...his last appearance came on June 7, 2008 at New York while pitching for Kansas City (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 hr)...entered the game in the fifth inning with the Royals trailing 6-5 and allowed a two-run home run to Rodriguez in the seventh.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Combined for a 1-0 record and a 2.75 ERA (6 er in 19.2 ip) in 13 games, including two starts, with Scranton-Wilkes Barre and Sacramento...both of the starts came with the River Cats...converted all four of his save opportunities...allowed a .227 opponents batting average, including .261 (12 for 46) against right-handed hitters and .172 (5 for 29) against left-handers...opponents were 4 for 20 (.200) with runners in scoring position...did not allow a run in nine of his 10 outings with the SWB Yankees, including each of his first five (7.1 ip)...allowed one run in the 10th inning of a 17-14, 13-inning win at Rochester...did not allow a run over his final four outings and 4.2 innings before the Yankees called on May 9...tossed a scoreless inning of relief in his first outing with Sacramento on August 5 but his final two outings were starts...had no decisions and a 9.64 ERA in his two starts, tossing 1.2 innings on August 8 against Oklahoma City and August 12 against New Orleans as he built up his pitch count.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Vin Mazzaro (4-8, 5.54 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 15th start of the season and his career...that will give the A's three pitchers under the age of 23 with at least 15 starts for the first time in Oakland history...went 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA and a .170 opponents batting average over the first two starts of his career, 0-8 with a 7.22 ERA and .347 opponents batting average over his next 10 starts and is 2-0 with a 4.35 ERA and .348 opponents batting average over his last two starts...has run support of three runs or less in 11 of his 14 starts and has season run support of 3.89...has issued 22 of his 31 walks and allowed six of his nine home runs to left-handed hitters...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win at Baltimore last Wednesday (5.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against the Yankees, a 6-3 loss at New York on July 23 (4.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 7 so).

The A's bullpen has allowed two home runs over the last three home games after allowing just one over the previous 24 home games (83.1 ip)...leads American League bullpens in strikeouts (356), ranks second in innings pitched (397.1) and third in ERA (3.74) and save percentage (73.0%)...has allowed 64 of 168 (38.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has issued 21 first batter walks, which is second fewest in the AL...now has a 2.70 ERA (58 er in 193.1 ip), nine home runs allowed and 56 walks issued in Oakland this year compared to a 4.72 ERA (107 er in 204.0 ip), 24 home runs allowed and 97 walks issued on the road...has a 2.02 ERA (11 er in 49.0 ip) in the month of August after posting a 4.09 ERA in July, a 3.52 ERA in June, a 5.29 ERA in May and a 2.62 ERA in April.
