THIS DATE IN YANKEES HISTORY

August 19, 1962: In a 21-7 rout at the Kansas City Athletics, Elston Howard hits two home runs and drives in a career-high eight runs. Mickey Mantle adds a grand slam, seven RBI and two stolen bases.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will play the finale a three-game series vs. the Oakland Athletics tonight at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum...are 4-2 on this season-long 11-day, 10-game road trip, winning three of four games at Seattle (Thursday-Sunday) and splitting the first two games of this series...trip concludes with three games in Boston this weekend...tonight concludes a stretch in which the Yankees played 33 games in 34 days from 7/17-8/19 (are 24-8 thus far)...are 17-10 against the AL West this season and 47-26 (.644) vs. all non-AL East competition...beginning Friday, the Yankees will play 23 of their final 41 games against teams currently leading their division, within 5.0 games of the division lead or within 5.0 games of the wild card lead...the Yankees are 25-13 in series finales in 2009.

OF LATE: The Yankees have won 13 of their last 16, 24 of their last 32 and 37 of their last 50G...are 60-28 in their last 88G, starting with a season-high nine-game winning streak from 5/13-21...have compiled four winning streaks of at least seven games this season and own two winning streaks of at least eight games in the same season for the first time since 2003...are a Major League-best 24-8 since the All-Star break, matching their best-ever mark to start the second half (also 1938, 1984 and 2007).

TO THE TOP: The Yankees own the best record in the Majors...are 30 games over .500 (one shy of their season high) and 7.0G ahead of Boston for first place in the AL East (0.5G behind their season-high division lead)...is the largest division lead in Baseball...have been in first place (shared or sole possession) for 43 days this season, including each of the last 30...surpassed the Red Sox for sole possession of first place in the division with 7/21 win vs. Baltimore...reached 60 wins in under 100 games for the first time since 2004...did not reach more than 17 games above .500 during 2008.

✎ According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, the Yankees have never blown a lead of *more than* 6.0 games...the largest division lead – at any point in the season – ever blown by the Yankees was a 6.0G lead in 1933 after 44 games...finished that campaign 91-59, in second place and 7.0G behind Washington.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Yankees returned to the win column with a 7-2 victory at Oakland...**LHP CC Sabathia** won his 14th game of the season, limiting the A's to 2ER on 5H over 8.0IP with 1BB and 7K...both runs scored on solo home runs...the Yankees scored five runs in the sixth inning, breaking a 2-2 tie...**SS Derek Jeter** (3-for-5) recorded his third straight three-hit game, driving in the go-ahead run in the sixth inning...**DH Hideki Matsui** (2-for-4) had 1RBI in his first game back after missing three games to recover from having his left knee drained.

LEADING OFF: Over his last nine games, **SS Derek Jeter** is batting .556 (20-for-36) with 8R, 3HR, 7RBI and seven multi-hit contests, including five three-hit games...are his most hits over any 36AB stretch since June/July 2003 (credit: *Elias*)...his .331 average (152-for-459) and .398 OBP as the No. 1 batter in the lineup each rank second among Major League leadoff men this season.

✎ Has collected three hits in each of his last three games, marking the fourth time in his career he has accomplished the feat (also 9/13-14/08, 5/26-28/04 and 6/3-5/00).

✎ Has reached 150 hits for the 14th consecutive season, surpassing Lou Gehrig (13 seasons from 1926-38) for the longest such streak in franchise history (credit: *Elias*)...is the longest such stretch among active players.

CC GOES BACK TO SCHOOL: This morning, **LHP CC Sabathia**, returned to his elementary school, Loma Vista, in Vallejo, Calif., to greet the students on their first day of school with new, fully-loaded backpacks...the Yankees pitcher personally handed out the backpacks – filled with an autographed photo, binders, lined paper, rulers, erasers, pencil sharpeners and crayons – in conjunction with his 'PitCCh In Foundation.'

SWISH! **OF/INF Nick Swisher** has reached base safely in each of his last 27 games...marks the second-longest such stretch of his career behind a span of 36 games from 4/7-5/19/06 (w/ Oakland) and is the longest stretch by a Yankee this season...is tied with the Dodgers' Rafael Furcal for the second-longest current stretch in the Majors behind Baltimore's Nick Markakis (37).

✎ Hit his 20th home run of the season in Sunday's loss at Seattle, marking the fifth straight season he has reached the plateau...was his 17th HR on the road this season, making him the first player in franchise history to hit at least 17 of his first 20HR on the road (credit: *Elias*).

HOMER HAPPY: The Yankees have homered in 94 of their 120 games this season (78.3%), including 55 of their 59 games at home...the Yankees' 182HR this season are most in the Majors...are on pace for a franchise-record 246HR...went homerless in Monday's loss at Oakland, snapping their season-high streak of 14 straight games with at least one homer...marked their longest such stretch since homering in 14 consecutive games from 9/18-10/1/05...have gone more than two straight games without a homer just once this season (three in-a-row, 6/20-23).

JETER LEADER: With 3H in Sunday's loss at Seattle, **SS Derek Jeter** became the all-time leader in hits as a shortstop (2,675), surpassing Luis Aparicio (2,673) – credit: *Elias*...all but 16 of Jeter's career hits have come while playing SS, collecting the others as a DH...surpassed Aparicio in his 2,085th career game at SS...according to *Elias*, only two others have played more games at shortstop while never playing any other fielding position – Aparicio (2,583) and Ozzie Smith (2,511).

SUMMER HEAT: With his win on Tuesday at Oakland, **LHP CC Sabathia** improved to 31-9 with a 3.16 ERA (339.0IP, 119ER) in the month of August, including a 19-2 combined mark with a Major League-best 2.14 ERA (202.0IP, 48ER) over the last five Augusts (2005-09)...his August-only win total and winning percentage (.904) since 2005 are both tops in the Majors...has now won 10 consecutive August starts, marking the longest current August winning streak in the Majors.

✎ Since 5/8, has gone 13-4 with a 3.22 ERA in 20 starts (139.2IP, 114H, 52R, 50ER, 33BB, 116K), leading the Majors in wins over the stretch...began the season 1-3 with a 4.85 ERA (39.0IP, 21ER) in his first six starts.

TANDEM BATTING: **1B Mark Teixeira** (30HR) and **OF/INF Nick Swisher** (20) are the fourth set of Yankees teammates over the last 50 years to each hit at least 20HR in their first full season in pinstripes...join Alex Rodriguez/Gary Sheffield (2004), Jason Giambi/Robin Ventura (2002) and Kevin Maas/Jesse Barfield (1990).

TEAM DIVERSITY: The Yankees have a Major League-most nine players with at least 10HR this season (Teixeira-30, Damon-22, Rodriguez-21, Swisher-20, Matsui-19, Cano-18, Posada-15, Jeter-15 and Cabrera-11)...marks their most players with double-digits in homers since 2005 (also nine)...have eight players with 15-or-more home runs, making them the first team to accomplish the feat since Cleveland and Texas both did so in 2005 (both had nine such players)...is the first Yankees club to do so since 2004 (eight - Clark, Jeter, Matsui, Posada, Rodriguez, Sheffield, Sierra, Williams)...have a Major League-most four players with at least 20HR, marking their most since 2006 (Giambi, Rodriguez, Damon and Posada).

✎ The Yankees are the only club in the Majors that has eight players with at least 50RBI (Cano, Damon, Jeter, Matsui, Posada, Rodriguez, Swisher, Teixeira)...Philadelphia has seven but no other team has more than five...Cabrera (46) is just shy of reaching the plateau...the Yankees have not had nine players, each with at least 50RBI, since 1998.

✎ The Yankees also have seven players with at least 50 runs scored (Cabrera, Cano, Damon, Jeter, Rodriguez, Swisher, Teixeira)...is tied with the Angels for most players with 50-or-more runs scored.

LEFT-LEANING: The Yankees are 27-14 (.659) vs. left-handed starters in 2009, the second-best mark in the Majors behind Los Angeles-AL (26-11, .703)...lead the Majors with a .294 (382-for-1,301) batting average vs. LHP this season with 80 doubles, 4 triples, 60HR and 159BB...**SS Derek Jeter** is tops in the AL among qualifiers in batting average vs. LHP (.429, 57-for-133)...among the AL's left-handed batters, **DH Hideki Matsui** has a league-most 10HR vs. left-handed pitchers.

ARMS RACE: Since the All-Star break, Yankees pitchers have gone a Major League-leading 24-8 (.750) with an AL-leading 3.56 ERA and a .246 opp. average and 269K...lead the Majors in strikeouts and rank fourth in ERA and opp. avg...posted a 4.54 ERA in the first half, ranking 11th out of 14 AL teams.

COMEBACK KIDS: The Yankees lead the Majors with 40 come-from-behind victories this season...own 20 wins in their last at-bat, ranking second in the Majors behind Los Angeles-NL (21)...the Yankees' 11 "walk-off" wins are tied for most in the Majors with the Dodgers (11) and are their most since 1988 (also 11)...have come back to win four games this season when trailing in the eighth inning (4-26 overall) after going 4-122 in such games from 2007-08 combined...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, **opposing relievers are 15-31 with a 5.60 ERA (384.0IP, 239ER) against the Yankees this season.**

✎ The Yankees are 62-1 this season when leading after eight innings and 139-1 over the last two years (2008-09)...the only loss occurred on 4/24/09 at Fenway Park (led 4-2 in eighth, lost 5-4).

A-CLUTCH: 3B Alex Rodriguez hit his 574th home run in 8/9 win vs. Boston, breaking a tie with Harmon Killebrew for sole possession of ninth place on Baseball's all-time list...the solo homer in the seventh broke a scoreless tie.

✎ Five of his home runs this season have given the Yankees the lead in the seventh inning or later, most in the Majors this season (credit: *Elias*)...was the 32nd such homer of his career, second only to Ken Griffey, Jr. (37) among active players in the category.

✎ Owns two "walk-off" home runs this season and six as a Yankee, marking the most "walk-off" HR by a Yankee since Graig Nettles had six from 1973-81.

✎ According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, 12 of his 21HR this season have either tied the game or given the Yankees the lead...of his 63RBI this season, 34 have either tied the game or given the Yankees the lead.

MO'ED DOWN: RHP Mariano Rivera is tied for the Major League lead (w/ Los Angeles-AL's Brian Fuentes) with 35 saves (in 36 chances) in 2009, pitching to a 0.96 ERA (37.1IP, 24H, 4ER) in save opportunities with 40K and 5BB...his current streak of 31 straight converted save chances is the longest such streak in the Majors since Brad Lidge converted 47 consecutive saves with Houston and Philadelphia from 9/25/07-4/13/09...also ties his personal best consecutive-save streak achieved in 2005...recorded a Major League-high 10 saves in July, tossing 11.2 scoreless IP in 12 relief appearances, allowing only 3H and 2BB with 9K...according to *Elias*, it marked just the second time in his career he earned at least 10 saves in a month without allowing a run (also August 1999).

✎ Has reached 35-save plateau for the 10th time in his career...only Trevor Hoffman (11) has more 35-save seasons all time.

✎ Has converted 104-of-108 save chances (96.3%) since blowing his first two chances in 2007, marking the best ratio in the Majors over the span (since 4/21/07) and the best mark since Eric Gagne saved 104-of-108 from 6/10/03-8/12/07 (credit: *Elias*).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees rank second in the AL with a .557 (34-27) road winning percentage in 2009, behind the Angels (36-23, .610)...are the only two AL teams with a road record above .500 in 2009...collected a season-high eight-game road winning streak from 6/24-7/9, marking their longest winning streak away from the Bronx since a nine-gamer from 4/20-5/8/98.

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will play the final game a three-game series at the Athletics tonight...are 6-2 vs. the A's this season, winning five of six at Yankee Stadium and splitting the first two games of this set...have won their most games against Oakland in a single season since 2005 (7-2)...were 5-1 vs. Oakland in 2008, winning the season series for the first time since 2005...have won 11 of the last 14 games vs. Oakland, including an eight-game winning streak from 6/12/08-7/24/09, their longest winning stretch since 1993-94...have secured the series win for the second straight year and sixth time this decade.

AT OAKLAND-ALEMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: The Yankees are making their only visit to Oakland this season, playing the last game of a three-game set...went 2-1 in their only visit to Oakland in 2008 from 6/10-12...was their seventh road season series win vs. Oakland since 1998...the Yankees are 12-8 (.600) at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum since the start of the 2004 season, the highest winning pct. by any AL team in Oakland over the span...had lost 11 of the previous 15 games there from 2001-03.

AT YANKEE STADIUM: The Yankees went 5-1 at home against the A's this season, including a win in the first-ever night game at Yankee Stadium on 4/21...won the home season series in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2004-05...have won eight of their last nine home games vs. the A's and are 18-9 vs. Oakland in the Bronx since the start of the 2004 season...had a seven-game home winning streak against Oakland from 7/18/08-7/24/09...the Yankees have gone 39-21 in 60 home games vs. the A's since the start of the 1997 season.

OVERALL TRENDS/FACTS: The Yankees will begin a three-game series vs. the Boston Red Sox on Friday at Fenway Park...swept a four-game series from the Red Sox 8/6-9 at Yankee Stadium, marking their first four-game sweep of Boston at home since 1985...prior to sweep, had lost nine straight games - including the first eight games this season - vs. Boston...was their longest skid vs. Boston to start a season since dropping their first 14 games in 1912...the nine-game slide vs. Boston was their longest since an all-time high 17-game winless streak vs. the Red Sox from 10/3/11-7/1/12 (credit: *Elias*)...have gone 23-25 against Boston since 2007.

AT FENWAY PARK: The Yankees will make their final trip to Boston for a three-game series beginning Friday...are 0-6 at Fenway Park in 2009 after suffering a three-game sweep from 4/25-27 and again from 6/9-11...have lost seven straight, eight of 10 and 15 of their last 24 at Boston, after winning seven straight games there from 5/23-8/21/06...their current seven-game slide is their longest losing streak at Fenway Park since losing the first seven games there in 1990.

UNSUPPORTING CAST: In his 19 prior starts this season (all with San Diego), the Padres averaged just 3.22 runs per 9.0IP with Gaudin on the mound, ranking him **151 of 157** Major League starters with 10-or-more starts this season.

RECOGNIZE: Earned NL "co-Player of the Week" honors (with Florida's Hanley Ramirez) for the period ending 6/28, going 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA (15.0IP, 20K).

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: Has played with six Major League teams in his career — Tampa Bay (2003-04), Toronto (2005), Oakland (2006-08), Chicago-NL (2008), San Diego (2009) and the Yankees (2009) — marking the most for any current Yankee on the active roster or disabled list.

AT THE READY: In 69 career starts, is 20-28 with a 4.85 ERA (378.2IP, 306K)...is 13-7 with a 4.02 ERA (179.0IP, 129K) in 138 career relief appearances.

AMERICAN WAY: Owns a career ERA vs. American League opposition (4.25) that is more than a full run better than his mark vs. NL clubs (5.34)...in his career, has held AL hitters to a .262 batting average and allowed a .292 average to NL hitters.

- Went to spring training with Chicago-NL before getting released on 4/5.

LHP Andy Pettitte, 37, will make his 25th start of the season on Friday against the Boston Red Sox at Fenway Park...will be his 368th start and 377th appearance as a Yankee...will be his 35th career appearance (33rd start) against the Red Sox...has pitched at least 5.0 innings in 22 of 24 starts this season...**last started** on 8/14 at Seattle, striking out 10 batters, his highest single-game total since fanning 10 on 8/21/06 w/ Houston at Cincinnati...was his most as a Yankee since 7/6/03 vs. Boston (10K)...recorded a no-decision, allowing 2ER in 6.0IP (6H, 1BB)...was signed to a one-year contract with the Yankees on 1/26/09.

IT'S NOT HOW YOU FINISH: According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Pettitte has made 99 consecutive career starts without a complete game, marking the longest such stretch in his career...is 41-29 with a 4.11 ERA (612.2IP, 280ER) over the span (since 8/21/06).

- Made his coaching debut in 2005 as the Yankees Bench Coach and Catching Instructor.

- Last appeared on Saturday at Seattle, starting and recording the win in a 5-2 Yankees victory (5.1IP, 7H, 2R, 1ER, 2BB, 3K)...marked his fewest runs allowed in an outing this season...was the latest into a season he recorded a win in his career (deepest win had been 7/29/07 w/ Florida at San Francisco)...has made six overall appearances with the Yankees this season (all starts), going 2-1 with a 6.04 ERA (28.1IP, 45H, 23R, 19ER, 8BB, 18K, 4HR).

- Became the 22nd pitcher in Major League history to appear in at least 900 games on Friday at Seattle.
- His current streak of 31 straight converted save chances is the longest active stretch in the Majors and equals his career high (also 31 straight in 2005)...is tied for the Major League lead with 35 saves this season.
- Has saved at least 35 games in a season 10 times in his career, ranking second all time to Trevor Hoffman's 11.
- Has converted 54 of his last 57 save chances on the road, after blowing his first two save opportunities on the road in 2007...has allowed just 5ER in 47G on the road over the last two seasons (2008-09), holding opponents to a .155 (28-for-181) batting average over the stretch.
- Owns **517** career saves, the most ever in AL history and second-most all-time behind Trevor Hoffman (580).
- Has reached the 30 save plateau for the 12th time in his career in 2009, including each of his last seven seasons...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Rivera is the fourth player in Major League history to register at least 30 saves in seven straight seasons, joining Hoffman (eight, 1995-2002), Robb Nen (1996-2002) and Troy Percival (1998-2004).
- Rivera in save opportunities in 2009: 36 games, 0-0, 35 saves, 0.96 ERA (37.1IP, 4ER), .176 opponent's batting average (24-for-136), 40K, 5BB...in tied games: 10 games, 1-2, 5.06 ERA (10.2IP, 6ER), .304 opponent's batting average (14-for-46), 12K, 2BB (credit: *Elias Sports Bureau*).
- Made his 50th appearance of the season—and second in as many games—in Saturday's win at Seattle, tossing a scoreless ninth (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 2K) for his 35th save...made his 900th Major League appearance—and 49th of the season—in Friday's win at Seattle, tossing a perfect ninth (1.0IP) for his 34th save...in 8/11 win vs. Toronto, allowed 2H and 1ER in 1.0IP for his 33rd save (2K, 1HR)...was his first run allowed since 6/12 vs. the Mets...in 8/4 win at Toronto, tossed a scoreless 1.1 innings (3H) to record his 31st save...was his 114th career save of at least four outs, most all-time.
