A FIGHT TO THE FINISH

The Tigers enter the final 42 games of the season battling for a Central Division title. The club plays 21 games on the road and 21 games at Comerica Park, including the final seven games of the season against American League Central Division opponents.

- 13 home games against teams from the American League Central Division.
- Eight home games against teams from the American League East Division.
- 12 road games against teams from the American League Central Division.
- Six road games against teams from the American League West Division.
- Three road games against teams from the American League East Division.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers defeated the Seattle Mariners 7-6 yesterday afternoon at Comerica Park, the club's fifth win in the last seven games. Bobby Seay (4-2) tossed a scoreless inning of relief to pick up the victory. Clete Thomas delivered a walk-off single to score Miguel Cabrera in the ninth inning. Thomas finished with two hits, while Ryan Raburn finished with three hits, including a solo home run. Miguel Cabrera added two doubles, while both Alex Avila and Brandon Inge each collected two RBI. The club begins a six-game road trip this evening with the first game of a three-game series at Oakland and completes the trip with a three-game set against the Angels beginning Monday.

POLANCO PACKS A PUNCH AGAINST A'S: Placido Polanco is tops among all major league players with a .379 batting average (61x161) in 39 career games against the Oakland Athletics. Polanco was selected the Most Valuable Player of the 2006 American League Championship Series after batting .529 (9x17) in four games versus Oakland.

CABRERA CRANKING IT UP AFTER THE BREAK: Miguel Cabrera has hit safely in six of his last seven games and is hitting .370 (47x127) with nine doubles, six home runs and 22 RBI in 32 games since the all-star break. Cabrera is third in the American League with a .441 on-base percentage since the all-star break and is fourth with a .370 batting average.

WINNING WAYS WHEN HANGING 10: The Tigers collected 10 hits yesterday as the club posted a 7-6 win over the Mariners. Detroit is 36-6 this season when posting 10-or-more hits, including a 25-2 mark when doing so at Comerica Park.

AVILA AMONG AUGUST ROOKIE LEADERS: Alex Avila collected two RBI yesterday against the Mariners and is batting .435 (10x23) with four doubles, three home runs and nine RBI this month. He is tied for the lead among American League rookies with the three home runs in August, while he is tied for second with seven extra-base hits and third with nine RBI.

RACKING UP THE STRIKEOUTS: Two Tigers pitchers combined to fan six batters yesterday against the Mariners and Tigers pitchers have now combined to fan 7.14 batters per nine innings this season. It marks the highest single-season strikeout per nine innings total by club pitchers in franchise history. The 1968 Tigers are the next closest club with 6.74 strikeouts per nine innings.

GUILLEN GETTING IT GOING: Carlos Guillen has hit safely in 16 of his 24 games with an at-bat since returning from the disabled list on July 24. He is batting .289 (26x90) with two doubles, a triple, five home runs and 15 RBI during that stretch.

THE LINE ON LYON: Brandon Lyon has not allowed a run over his last 14 appearances, tossing 15.2 scoreless innings. Over his last 28 appearances, he is 5-1 with a 0.75 ERA (36.0IP/3ER) and 31 strikeouts. Lyon has limited opponents to a .165 batting average (20x121) over the 28-outing stretch. He is tied for second among all American League relievers with six wins.

CABRERA CLOSING IN ON 200 HOME RUNS: Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game against the Athletics one home run shy of 200 in his major league career. Cabrera would become the fifth player from Venezuela to belt 200 career home runs, joining Tony Armas (251), Bobby Abreu (252), Magglio Ordonez (275) and Andres Galarraga (399).

STOPPING THE RUNNING GAME: Tigers catchers have combined to throw out 35.2 percent of runners attempting to steal (31x88) this season, second-best in the American League. Gerald Laird is tops among all league catchers by throwing out 41.9 percent of runners attempting to steal (26x62).

BONDERMAN, ROBERTSON AND WILLIS ON INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Righthanded pitcher Jeremy Bonderman and lefthanded pitcher Nate Robertson both joined Triple A Toledo for injury rehabilitation assignments on August 4. Lefthanded pitcher Dontrelle Willis joined Toledo for an injury rehab assignment beginning Wednesday night.

- Bonderman tossed two scoreless innings of relief for Toledo last night at Columbus, striking out two and retiring all six batters he faced. He has allowed seven runs on 14 hits in nine innings of work in seven outings during his current injury rehabilitation assignment with Toledo. Bonderman will continue to work in relief for the Mud Hens.
- Robertson started for the Mud Hens last night at Columbus, earning the victory after allowing one run on five hits and striking out four in five innings of work. He has compiled a 1-1 record and 2.92 ERA (12.1IP/4ER) in four starts with Toledo. Robertson will continue to work as a starter for the Mud Hens.
- Willis started for the Mud Hens Wednesday night against Columbus, allowing one run on one hit, while walking one and striking out one in 1.1 innings of work.

TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - EDWIN JACKSON

'09 Season (Detroit): 9-5, 2.85 ERA, 24 G, 24 GS, 1 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 157.2 IP, 136 H, 57 R, 50 ER, 51 BB, 123 SO.
'08 Season (Tampa Bay): 14-11, 4.42 ERA, 32 G, 31 GS, 0 CG, 0 SHO, 0 SV, 183.1 IP, 199 H, 91 R, 90 ER, 77 BB, 108 SO.

E.J.'S EDICT: In his first season with the Tigers, Jackson will make his 25th start of the season this evening against the Athletics.

HE'S AN ALL-STAR: Jackson was selected to the American League's all-star squad and he was one of the club's four representatives for the All-Star Game in St. Louis, tossing a scoreless inning of relief. It marked his first selection to the all-star team.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Jackson enters his start this evening against the Athletics second among American League pitchers with a .231 batting average against, while he is fourth with a 2.85 ERA and 7.76 hits per nine innings and eighth with 10.96 baserunners per nine innings.

WINS HAVE BEEN ELUSIVE: Jackson enters tonight's start at Oakland with nine wins this season. He has earned three wins over his last 12 starts dating back to June 11, a stretch in which he has compiled a 3.63 ERA (74.1IP/30ER). Jackson posted six victories over a 10-start stretch April 18-June 6.

RISP MANAGEMENT: Opponents are hitting .174 (21x121) with runners in scoring position against Jackson this season. His .174 batting average against with runners in scoring position is second-lowest among all American League pitchers.

AT HIS BEST AGAINST THE WEST: Jackson has posted an 8-6 record and 3.25 ERA (113.2IP/41ER) with 83 strikeouts in 20 career appearances against teams from the American League West division. Jackson is tied for second among all pitchers with four victories against the American League West this season.

RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: Jackson is making his first career start at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this evening.

ROAD WARRIOR: Jackson is 3-4 with a 2.79 ERA (80.2IP/25ER) in 13 starts on the road in 2009. He is third among all American League pitchers with a 2.79 ERA on the road this season.

TRYING TO LIMIT THE LONGBALL: Jackson has surrendered at least one home run in each of his last eight starts, a total of 12 home runs allowed. He allowed seven home runs in his first 16 starts of the season.

LOOKING FOR A LITTLE SUPPORT: Jackson has received 3.82 runs per nine innings of run support this season, fourth-lowest in the American League.

QUALITY STARTS: Jackson registered a quality start in seven straight starts June 17-July 25, the longest such streak of his career. The seven straight quality stretch surpasses a stretch in which he registered a quality start in six straight starts May 9-June 6 this season for the Tigers. Prior to this season, Jackson's previous longest streak was five straight quality starts with Tampa Bay July 31-August 22, 2007. He is tied for third in the American League with 18 quality starts.

LOWEST ERA PRIOR TO THE BREAK SINCE 1976: Jackson compiled a 2.52 ERA prior to the all-star break for the Tigers. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 2.52 ERA prior to the all-star break is the lowest ERA by a Tigers pitcher prior to the break since Mark Fidrych posted a 1.78 ERA in the first half of the 1976 season.

JACKSON PART OF HISTORY AT THE ALL-STAR GAME: Jackson worked a perfect inning of relief for the American League during the All-Star Game on July 14 in St. Louis. Jackson was one of six relievers for the American League that worked a perfect inning and according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it was the first time in All-Star Game history that a league had more than four pitchers throw at least one inning and not allow a baserunner during their stint on the mound.

MATCHING A CAREER HIGH IN STRIKEOUTS: Jackson equaled a career high with nine strikeouts in his start on July 4 at Minnesota, marking the third time in his career he has fanned nine batters in an outing. He accomplished the feat twice in 2007 with Tampa Bay, doing so on May 12 at Toronto and May 28 versus Detroit.

YOU COMPLETE ME: Jackson tossed his second career complete game on June 6 versus the Angels at Comerica Park. He went the distance in a four-hit shutout against the Texas Rangers on August 11, 2007 for his first career complete game while with Tampa Bay.

WHAT A FINISH: Jackson went the distance on June 6 against the Angels in a 2-1 win for his second career complete game. Jackson struck out the side in the ninth inning to close out the win and according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first major league pitcher to go the distance in a one-run win and strike out the side in the ninth inning since Milwaukee's CC Sabathia did so on July 13, 2008 against Cincinnati. Prior to Sabathia, no major league pitcher had accomplished the feat since 1998, when Curt Schilling did so for Philadelphia.

GERMAN BORN: Jackson is just the second pitcher in Tigers history to be born in Germany. He joins Bun Troy, who started one game for the Tigers during the 1912 season.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Jackson was acquired by the Tigers in a two-player deal with the Tampa Bay Rays on December 11, 2008. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad in 2009. Jackson was originally selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the sixth round of the June 2001 draft.
