A FIGHT TO THE FINISH

The Tigers enter the final 41 games of the season battling for a Central Division title. The club plays 20 games on the road and 21 games at Comerica Park, including the final seven games of the season against American League Central Division opponents.

- 13 home games against teams from the American League Central Division.
- Eight home games against teams from the American League East Division.
- 12 road games against teams from the American League Central Division.
- Five road games against teams from the American League West Division.
- Three road games against teams from the American League East Division.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers defeated the Oakland Athletics 3-2 last night at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum, the club's sixth win in the last eight games. Edwin Jackson (10-5) limited the Athletics to two runs on six hits, while striking out five in six innings to earn the victory. Fernando Rodney tossed a scoreless ninth for the save. Ryan Raburn belted two home runs, while Clete Thomas collected an RBI. The club continues a six-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game series at Oakland and completes the trip with a three-game set against the Angels beginning Monday.

RABURN'S BEEN RAKING: Ryan Raburn belted two home runs last night against the Athletics, marking his second career game with multiple home runs. He is hitting .372 (16x43) with four home runs and seven RBI over his last 19 games dating back to July 29.

LOVING THE LONGBALL: The Tigers belted two home runs last night against the Athletics and have now hit a home run in 10 consecutive games, hitting 14 home runs during the streak. The 10-game home run streak is the club's second longball streak of 10-or-more games this season after hitting a home run in 12 consecutive games from June 16-28. It marks the first time the club has recorded two home run streaks of 10-or-more games in a single season since 2007, when the club posted two 10-game streaks.

POLANCO PACKS A PUNCH AGAINST A'S: Placido Polanco is tops among all major league players with a .376 batting average (62x165) in 40 career games against the Oakland Athletics. Polanco was selected the Most Valuable Player of the 2006 American League Championship Series after batting .529 (9x17) in four games versus Oakland.

CABRERA CRANKING IT UP AFTER THE BREAK: Miguel Cabrera has hit safely in seven of his last eight games and is hitting .369 (48x130) with nine doubles, six home runs and 22 RBI in 33 games since the all-star break. Cabrera is second in the American League with a .442 on-base percentage since the all-star break and fourth with a .369 batting average.

RACKING UP THE STRIKEOUTS: Four Tigers pitchers combined to fan nine batters last night against the Athletics and Tigers pitchers have now combined to fan 7.15 batters per nine innings this season. It marks the highest single-season strikeout per nine innings total by club pitchers in franchise history. The 1968 Tigers are the next closest club with 6.74 strikeouts per nine innings.

THE LINE ON LYON: Brandon Lyon has not allowed a run over his last 15 appearances, tossing 17.0 scoreless innings. Over his last 29 appearances, he is 5-1 with a 0.72 ERA (37.1IP/3ER) and 32 strikeouts. Lyon has limited opponents to a .167 batting average (21x126) over the 29-outing stretch. He is tied for second among all American League relievers with six wins.

CABRERA CLOSING IN ON 200 HOME RUNS: Miguel Cabrera enters tonight's game against the Athletics one home run shy of 200 in his major league career. Cabrera would become the fifth player from Venezuela to belt 200 career home runs, joining Tony Armas (251), Bobby Abreu (252), Magglio Ordonez (275) and Andres Galarraga (399).

WINNING OVER THE WEST: The Tigers have compiled a 20-11 record this season against clubs from the American League's West Division. The Tigers are second among all American League clubs with a .645 winning percentage over west division clubs this season.

BONDERMAN, ROBERTSON AND WILLIS ON INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Righthanded pitcher Jeremy Bonderman and lefthanded pitcher Nate Robertson both joined Triple A Toledo for injury rehabilitation assignments on August 4. Lefthanded pitcher Dontrelle Willis joined Toledo for an injury rehab assignment beginning Wednesday night.

- Bonderman tossed two scoreless innings of relief for Toledo Thursday night at Columbus, striking out two and retiring all six batters he faced. He has allowed seven runs on 14 hits in nine innings of work in seven outings during his current injury rehabilitation assignment with Toledo. Bonderman will continue to work in relief for the Mud Hens.
- Robertson started for the Mud Hens Thursday night at Columbus, earning the victory after allowing one run on five hits and striking out four in five innings of work. He has compiled a 1-1 record and 2.92 ERA (12.1IP/4ER) in four starts with Toledo. Robertson will continue to work as a starter for the Mud Hens.
- Willis started for the Mud Hens Wednesday night against Columbus, allowing one run on one hit, while walking one and striking out one in 1.1 innings of work.

ARMANDO'S ANTIDOTE: In his second season with the Tigers, Galarraga is making his 24th start of the 2009 season this evening against the Athletics.

ROUGH ON THE RIGHTIES: During his major league career, Galarraga has limited righthanded batters to a .208 batting average (115x553). Lefties are hitting .284 (185x651) versus Galarraga.

BACK ON TRACK AGAINST RIGHTIES: Over his last seven starts, Galarraga has held righthanded batters to a .191 batting average (17x89).

LOOKING TO LIMIT THE LONGBALL: Galarraga enters his start this evening against the Athletics having allowed 21 home runs this season, tied for fifth-most in the American League.

WINNING OVER THE WEST: Galarraga enters his start tonight against the Athletics with a 5-2 record during his career against opponents from the American League West Division. He has posted a 4.27 ERA (78.0IP/37ER) in 15 outings (13 starts) against the division during his career. He has limited opposing batters from the American League West to a .207 batting average (25x121) this season.

GET ME THROUGH THE FIRST: This season, opponents are hitting .333 (30x90) with five doubles, three triples and six home runs in the first inning of games against Galarraga. In all other innings this season, Galarraga's opposition is batting .269 (110x409) with 21 doubles, four triples and 15 home runs.

RECORD AT OAKLAND-ALAMEDA COUNTY COLISEUM: Galarraga is making his fourth career appearance and second start at Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum this evening. He has posted a 3.48 ERA (10.1IP/4ER) in his previous three outings.

ONE-HIT WONDER FOR A THIRD TIME: Galarraga limited Seattle to one hit over 7.1 innings of work in his start on July 22. It marked the third time in his career he has held the opposition to one hit while working at least six innings. He previously did so twice in 2008, on April 16 at Cleveland and May 17 at Arizona.

WINNING IN SPITE OF WALKS: Galarraga earned the victory in his outing at Oakland on June 30, in spite of issuing a season-high six walks in the outing. He is the first Tigers pitcher to issue six walks in a game and earn the victory since Jeremy Bonderman also walked six batters in a 3-2 victory over the Athletics at Comerica Park on August 7, 2003.

SNAPPING A SKID: Galarraga earned the victory in his start on June 25 against the Cubs after losing each of his previous seven decisions. The seven-game losing streak marked a career-long streak.

SNAPPING ANOTHER SKID: Galarraga did not allow a home run in his outing on June 30 at Oakland, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive outings in which he allowed a home run. The streak was the longest in the major leagues this season and he allowed 15 home runs during the streak after allowing just one home run in his first four starts of the season.

ROOKIE LEADER: Galarraga topped all American League rookie pitchers with 13 wins and 126 strikeouts for the Tigers during the 2008 season, while he finished third with a 3.73 ERA.

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC PARTICIPANT: Galarraga started two games for Venezuela during the World Baseball Classic this spring. In his two starts, he finished 1-0 with a 4.91 ERA (7.1IP/4ER) and six strikeouts.

OPENING DAY FIRST: Galarraga made the Tigers Opening Day roster, marking the first time he has been on an Opening Day roster at the major league level.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Galarraga was acquired by the Tigers from the Texas Rangers in a two-player deal on February 4, 2008. He originally signed with the Montreal Expos as a non-drafted free agent on October 31, 1998.
