A's vs. ROYALS

The A's have won the season series as they lead 5-1 with two games remaining...have won all three games in Oakland and won two of three in Kansas City...the A's lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons but won it in each of the seven years before that (2000-06)...are 57-31 (.648) against Kansas City since 2000...all-time, the A's are 285-235 against the Royals...that includes 157-103 in Oakland and 127-132 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey has 21 saves, which is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 23 set by Huston Street in 2005...leads Major League rookies and ranks eighth among all AL pitchers in saves...has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities, which is also two short of the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street in 2005.

Rajai Davis stole his 30th base of the season last night to become the 16th player (39th time) in Oakland history to steal 30 bases...is the first to do it since Rickey Henderson had 66 in 1998.

Mark Ellis is batting .314 (49 for 156) since the All-Star Break and has 15 doubles, which is tied for third in the American League.

Michael Wuertz ranks second among ML relievers with 84 strikeouts (Broxton, LAD 93).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On **September 1, 1906** Jack Coombs and Boston's Joe Harris go the distance in a 24 inning, 4-1 A's victory that lasts four hours and 47 minutes...Coombs strikes out 18 and allows 14 hits...on **September 1, 1974** Sal Bando hits a two-run homer in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit...it is his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...on **September 1, 2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run homer run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Minnesota 7-5 to set a franchise record with their 18th consecutive win...the streak would reach an American League record 20 before coming to an end. ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last five games and are 5-5 over the last 10 games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 27-30 over that span...are 58-73 (.443) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 121 days (since May 3) and 127 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...the A's finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

COMEBACKS AND CLOSE CALLS: The A's trailed 4-0 entering the bottom of the third last night but came back to win...it was the fifth time this year the A's overcame a deficit of four or more runs to win, which matches the second highest total in the majors this year (LAA, 9)...had only one such win last year...are 14-20 (.412) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in one-run games in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980...are 3-9 (.250) in extra inning games, which is tied with Pittsburgh (2-6) for the worst record in the majors...the nine extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's finished the month of August with a 14-15 record and have finished with a losing record in each month this year...this marks the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

STARTING PITCHING: The A's have started a rookie pitcher 95 times this year, which is an Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club (Codiroli 31, Conroy 18, Krueger 16, Heimueller 14, Warren 9, Callahan 2, Young 2, Smith 1)...have started a rookie pitcher in 69 of the last 84 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...A's starting pitchers are 12-17 with a 5.51 ERA (157 er in 256.1 ip) and .291 (296 for 1016) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break after going 25-36 with a 4.39 ERA and .273 opponents average before the break...are 37-53 with a 4.78 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (732.0) and wins in the American League and are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997.

ON THE BASES: The A's rank fourth in the American League and fifth in the majors with 103 stolen bases...this marks just the second time in the last 14 years Oakland has reached the century plateau...the last time was in 1998 when they had 131...Rajai Davis leads the A's with 30 steals and Adam Kennedy has 18...the last time the A's had two players steal 20 or more bases in one season was in 1995 when Stan Javier had 36 steals and Rickey Henderson had 32...the A's stole 30 bases in August, which was second most in the majors to Texas (32)...led the majors with 31 stolen bases in July, the A's most in a month since they had 39 in May, 1992...it marked the first time the A's led the majors outright in steals in a month since July of 1989 when they had 34...have 63 stolen bases in 67 road games and 40 stolen bases in 64 home games.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 53 runs over the last 16 games, an average of 3.3 runs per game...have scored three runs or less 12 times over that span and have 583 runs scored for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank last in the AL in home runs (109), extra base hits (358) and slugging percentage (.386), second to last in batting (.255), have the third fewest triples (14) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.321)...A's number three hitters are batting a combined .216 (111 for 514), which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos.

SINCE THE BREAK: The A's are 21-24 since the All-Star Break...are batting .273 (427 for 1563) since the break, which is fifth best in the American League...were batting .246 before the break, which was the lowest mark in the AL...are second in the AL in stolen bases (49) since the break, third in doubles (93) and fourth in runs scored (222)...had the third fewest doubles (142) and runs (361) in the AL before the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last seven games and have 81 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...are on pace to commit 100 errors...have committed fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game homestand against Kansas City (1-0) and Seattle (four games)...went 4-5 on the last homestand and are 31-33 (.484) at home for the season and are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 27-40 (.403) on the road for the season...with one more road loss, the A's will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year...used it an Oakland record 25 times last year, breaking the previous mark of 22 (2007 and 1992)...have now used the DL 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players on the DL have combined to miss 784 games, an average of 49.0 games per stint...last year they combined to miss 877 games, an average of 35.1 games per stint...currently have seven players on the DL (Braden, Chavez, Crosby, Devine, Duchscherer, Giese, Outman)...have had at least five players on the DL every day since April 29 and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season (Devine, Giese and Outman had Tommy John surgery, and Chavez had season ending back surgery and Duchscherer was diagnosed with clinical depression)...the A's have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 22^{nd} appearance and third start of the season...it will be the 38^{th} start of his career...the A's lost each of his two starting assignments earlier this year and his teams are 12-25 (.324) when he starts in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was selected by Oakland on May 19 and went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts before he was moved to the bullpen...his last 19 appearances have been in relief and he has no decisions and a 5.20 ERA (21 er in 36.1 ip)...is now 8-20 with a 5.81 ERA (122 er in 189.0 ip) in 37 career starts and 6-2 with a 5.96 ERA (76 er in 115.0 ip) in 64 career relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-0 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) and .227 (20 for 88) opponents batting average in 13 games in Oakland and 0-1 with a 7.06 ERA (17 er in 21.2 ip) and .326 (30 for 92) average in eight games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .198 (17 for 86) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters and .351 (33 for 94) against left-handers...has 8 walks and 20 strikeouts against righties and 14 walks and 9 strikeouts against lefties...has yielded a .333 (28 for 84) average against the one through four hitters and .229 (22 for 96)

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run over his first 20 games and 45.1 innings...then allowed a home run to the first batter he faced in his last outing on August 15 against Chicago (Thome)...has allowed just one home run in 46.1 innings this year.

MORE RELIEF: Tossed at least 1.0 inning in each of his 19 relief appearances including 2.0 or more 11 times...his longest outing was 3.2 innings on August 8 at Kansas City...allowed 2 of 9 (22.2%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced hit .211 (4 for 19)...allowed just two runs over his first four relief appearances (7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA) but then allowed nine runs in 9.2 innings over his next five outings (8.38 ERA)...posted a 3.00 ERA (5 er in 15.0 ip) over an eight-game stretch from July 3 to August 2 before allowing five runs over his final two outings (4.2 ip, 9.64 ERA).

BRIEFLY: Was signed by the A's as a free agent to a minor league contract on February 9 and went 1-2 with a 10.93 ERA in six games, three starts, this spring...began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 3-2 with a 5.22 ERA in seven games, all starts, when he was selected by Oakland on May 19.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the second game of the doubleheader on May 29 at Texas...the A's scored a run in the top of the first but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the first on RBI doubles by Hamilton and Blalock and a two-run single by Teagarden...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Young in the fourth inning.

LAST APPEARANCE: Has not pitched since August 15 against Chicago when he tossed the ninth inning of the A's 8-1 loss...will be pitching on 16 days rest today and has tossed just 1.0 inning over the previous 23 days...allowed a leadoff home run to Thome on the 15th and yielded two hits and a walk while striking out two in his 1.0 inning pitched.

LAST WIN: Has not won a game since April 24, 2008 at Los Angeles (NL) while pitching for Arizona...allowed three runs on seven hits in 5.1 innings in a 6-4 Diamondbacks victory...is 0-3 with a 5.88 ERA (49 er in 75.0 ip) in 34 games, including four starts, since then.

GONZALEZ vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 0-0 with a 15.00 ERA (6.0 ip, 15 h, 10 h, 10 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, all in relief...faced the Royals once this year on August 8 at Kansas City, a 12-6 A's loss (3.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 so)...relieved Mortensen in the fifth inning with the A's trailing 6-3 and allowed two inherited runners to score...then allowed a RBI double to Butler in the sixth and three more runs in the eighth inning...his other two outings came in Phoenix while pitching for Arizona...including June 10, 2005 when he allowed four runs on two hits and two walks while retiring just one batter.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a ERA in seven starts with 5.22 Sacramento...allowed a .300 opponents batting average, including .323 (21 for 65) against left-handed hitters and .284 (27 for 95) against right-handers...allowed four home runs, but just one over his last five starts and 27.2 innings...was 2-1 with a 3.47 ERA in four starts at home and 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA in three starts on the road...tossed six or more innings in two of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer three times and walked two batters or fewer four

times...the River Cats were 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments.

TWO AT A TIME: Went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA over his first two starts, allowing nine runs on 15 hits in 12.0 innings...then put together back-to-back wins on April 22 at Portland and April 27 against Los Angeles...allowed just three runs on eight hits in 12.0 innings (2.25 ERA) over that two start stretch...had a loss and a no decision over his next two starts, allowing 10 runs on 18 hits in 9.0 innings (10.00 ERA)...then picked up the win in final Triple-A start on May 16 against Round Rock, allowing just one run in 5.2 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (7-12, 4.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 28th start of the season and his career...is 1-1 with a 2.33 ERA and .219 opponents batting average over his last four starts...however, is 2-7 with a 5.85 ERA and .292 opponents batting average over his last 12 starts after going 5-5 with a 3.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts...has set an Oakland rookie record with 25 home runs, topping the previous mark of 24 set by John Wasdin in 1996...his 12 losses are tied for fourth most by a rookie in Oakland history...has received run support of two runs or less in each of his last four starts and 15 of his 27 starts this year...is 1-8 with run support of two runs or less...combined with Wuertz and Bailey on a three-hit shutout in his last start, a 2-0 win at Los Angeles last Thursday (7.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 2 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Kansas City, a 12-3 A's win in Oakland on May 12 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so).

40 RHP ANDREW BAILEY Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/8

Did not allow a run and converted all seven of his save opportunities in 11 games and 11.0 innings in August...now has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak over his last 11 outings dating back to July 31 (4 h, 8 so)...his longest scoreless streak this year was 15.1 innings from June 14-July 17.

Save/Opportunities: 21-25
