### CALIFORNIA LOVE

Mariners are 26-14 against teams from the Golden State, including 12-6 in California...Mariners have a winning record against all teams (Angels, 9-7; A's, 9-3; Dodgers, 2-1; Padres, 4-2; Giants, 2-1).

### THE TRIFECTA

With a winning August (15-14), the Mariners have strung together 3 straight winning months (June: 15-10, July: 14-13)...first time since a four-month stretch Sept. 2002-June 2003.

### STEADY PROGRESS

Jose Lopez has already set a career high with 20 home runs, upping his home run total in each of the last 4 seasons...he is currently on pace for a career-high 97 RBI this season... Lopez has 5 HR in his last 14 G.

### SURPASSING 2008

Seattle is 70-64, surpassing their win total from 2008 (61-101)...will need to win 11 of its final 28 games to secure a .500 record.

### CY LIKE

Mariners starter Felix Hernandez ranks 2nd in the AL in ERA (2.65), T3rd in wins (14) and 4th in strikeouts (185)... Hernandez has already set a career-high in strikeouts and matched his career-high in wins (14-7 in 2007).

### RUBBER GAMES & SERIES

Seattle is 25-16-2 in series this season, including winning 18 of last 26...**14-5 in "rubber games" to decide a 3-game series, including winning 13 of last 16**...have come back to win series after dropping first game 9 times.

### IRON MAN

Ichiro returned to the lineup Tuesday (and got 2 hits) after missing 8 games with a strained left calf (8/24-31)... Ichiro has missed 16 games this season (also spent 8 days on DL to open season) after missing only 16 total from 2001-08...he has played in 1,398 games since his debut in 2001 (most in MLB), missing only 32 out of a possible 1,430 games.

### CHASING TY COBB

Ichiro is on pace to record 227 hits, which would extend his streak of consecutive 200-hit seasons to an all-time record 9 straight...if he reaches 200 hits (12 hits short) he will tie the AL record for most 200-hit seasons in a career held by Ty Cobb...the all-time record is 10 by Pete Rose.

### WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Won 13 of last 16 one-run games, including 9 straight June 19-July 29...overall, are 29-16 in 1-run games, including 19-5 at home...**also 14-15 in 2-run games**...Seattle leads the Majors with 29 one-run victories (LAD is 2nd with 25)...**Mariners club record for one-run wins is 31 set in '82 ... MLB record is 40 (BAL, '70 & '74).**

### IMPROVEMENT SINCE '08

After going 61-101 (.377) in 2008 the Mariners are 70-64 (.522) this season, the biggest improvement from '08 in MLB...through 133 games last season, Seattle was 50-83.

### TONIGHT'S TILT

...the Mariners begin a 3-team, 10-game roadtrip with the first of four at the Oakland A's...this trip also includes three games in Anaheim and three in Texas...Seattle just complete a 7-3 homestand, including a 3-game sweep of the A's...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on FSN in HD, and broadcast on 770 AM, 100.7 FM & the Mariners Radio Network.

### ODDS AND ENDS

...have won 2 straight, 4 of 6 and 7 of last 10...are 10-7 over last 17 games...also 22-11 over last 33 and 26-22 over last 48 games...won 14 of last 22 home games and are 39-30 overall at Safeco Field...trailed at some point in 33 of 70 victories (47%)...also had a lead in 33 of 64 defeats...league-best 29-16 in 1-run & 14-15 in 2-run games.

- Mariners have used 44 players in '09: 24 position & 20 pitchers...6 players have made their ML debuts.
- Ichiro is 2nd in AL in batting average (.361), and leads MLB in hits (188) and multi-hit games (62).
- The Mariners lead AL with 49 sac bunts...Franklin Gutierrez is tied for T1st in AL with 10 sac bunts.
- Seattle has batted around 5 times this season (last: 8/16 vs. NYY, 7th inning).
- Mark Lowe is just 5th pitcher in club history (7th time) with 20+ holds in a season (is T3rd in AL w/23).
- Jose Lopez leads the team with 80 RBI, 2nd-most among AL 2B (A. Hill, TOR, 88).
- Russell Branyan is just the 11th Mariner in club history to record 30 homers in a season.
- Mariners minor league affiliates have a combined 464-409 (.532) record, 5th-best in the Majors...the AZL Mariners won the Arizona League Championship for the 2nd time in 3 seasons (also in 2007).

### SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS

...tonight is the 13th (9-3) of 19 games (10 in Oakland, 9 in Seattle) between the A's and Mariners in 2009...Seattle swept @OAK April 10-12, took 2 of 3 May 1-3 in Seattle, dropped 2 of 3 May 25-27 @OAK and swept Aug. 24-26 in SEA...have won 12 of last 15 against Oakland (dating back to 9/26/08)...since the start of the 2007 season, Mariners have won 32 of 50 vs. the A's...Seattle lost last year's series (10-9), and was 3-6 in Oakland...Seattle trails the all-time series 196-268, and is 84-149 in Oakland...Seattle has had in winning record in Oakland just twice since 1999: 5-4 in 2002 and 8-1 in 2007.

### 7-UP

...a win tonight would give the Mariners a mark of 71-64, matching their season-high at seven games over .500 (also: 51-44) for just the second time this season.

### HE'S QUALITY

...David Aardsma recorded his Major League leading 16th "quality save" Tue vs. the Angels (Brian Fuentes-LAA is 2nd with 15)...the Elias Sports Bureau defines a quality save in which the pitcher entered with the tying run in scoring position or protected a one-run lead for at least one inning.

### COUNTDOWN TO 200 & 2,000

...Ichiro enters today's game 12 hits short of 200 for the season and 7 hits short of 2,000 for his MLB career...if he reaches 200 hits (on pace for 227), it will be his 9th consecutive 200-hit season, breaking the all-time record currently held by Willie Keeler (1894-1901)...he will likely reach 2,000 hits in the 2nd-fewest amount of games in ML history (among players who made their MLB debut in 1900 or later)...Al Simmons holds the current mark for fewest games to reach 2,000 career hits (1,390 G) and George Sisler is 2nd (1,414 G)...Ichiro has played in 1,398 games.

### AN ODD RECORD

...the Mariners beat the Angels yesterday 3-0, extending their club-record with their 21st win of the season when scoring 3 or fewer runs...that mark leads the AL (DET is 2nd with 13) and ranks Tst in the Majors (STL - 21, SF - 20)...the previous club high was 19 wins in 1989...when the offense scores 3 or fewer runs, Mariners pitchers have stepped up to the challenge posting a 3.69 ERA (237 ER, 577.2 IP).

### PITCHING LEADERS

...the Mariners lead the American League with a 3.91 ERA (523 ER, 1204.0 IP)...Seattle last led AL in ERA in 2001 (3.54)...Seattle has already used 20 pitchers, including 12 starters, while compiling the league-leading mark...no team has used that many starters and pitchers and led the AL in ERA since Boston sent 24 pitchers (13 starters) to the mound in 2000...held opponents to one or fewer runs 24 times (3rd-most in the AL) and 2 or fewer runs 42 times (2nd-most in AL).

### SWEENEY ON FIRE

...Mike Sweeney has recorded a hit in 9 of his last 11 games, including 6 multi-hit games...over the 11-game stretch he is batting .421 (16x38) with 5 doubles and 8 RBI, raising his season batting average from .228 to .265.

### 30(PLUS) SOMETHING

...David Aardsma recorded his 33rd save yesterday (T4th in AL); he's just the 6th pitcher in club history to record a season with 30 or more saves...he joins Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02), J.J. Putz (2006-07), Mike Schooler (1989-90), Eddie Guardado (2005) and Jose Mesa (1999)...he is just the 9th player in MLB history to record a 30-save season without a prior career save heading into the season (Koch, Sasaki, Gagne, Chacon, Turnbow, Papelbon, Ray, Wood).

### NO REST FOR THE WEARY

...today is game #30 (16-13) in a stretch of 33 games in 34 days, Aug. 4-Sept. 6, for the Mariners...the club spent the one off day flying from Seattle to Detroit...it's also game #17 (9-7) in a stretch of 20 games in 20 days, Aug. 18-Sept. 6.

### FOOL ME ONCE

...Ichiro has not gone hitless in consecutive games since Aug. 13-15, 2008...that's a streak of 159 consecutive games without going hitless in back-to-back games...the streak is the longest in the Majors since Stan Musial (174 games) in 1943-44 and the longest AL streak since Doc Cramer (191 games) in 1934-35...thanks to SABR's Trent McCotter & Elias for the research help.

### FIELDING FUNDAMENTALS

...the Mariners have played error-free in each of their last 10 games setting a season-high for consecutive errorless games...Seattle ranked 3rd in the AL with a .990 fielding percentage in August, compared to an overall .982 season mark (12th in AL)...the Mariners have also turned 6 double plays over the last 5 games (including 3 Tuesday), after going 6 consecutive games without a DP (8/23-28).

### DID YOU KNOW?

...that Seattle leads the AL in caught stealing percentage by its catchers?...Mariners backstops have thrown out the last two runners attempting to steal, and have now caught 35 of 94 opposing runners (37.2%), tops in the AL...adding in the pitchers CS, and Seattle has nabbed 40 of 99, 40%.

**ABOUT SNELL...**

- 27-year-old right-hander makes his 7th start with Seattle...is his 22nd 2009 start overall and the 135th appearance, 123rd start of his ML career.
- Traded to Seattle with Jack Wilson on July 29, 2009.
- Made Major League debut Aug. 20, 2004 with Pittsburgh at St. Louis...surrendered one hit (a solo home run to John Mabry), 3 walks and 2 strikeouts in 2.0 innings.
- Spent entire career prior to trade in Pirates organization ...selected by Pittsburgh in the 26th round of the 2000 June Draft.
- Recorded first victory Sept. 19, 2005, against Roger Clemens and the Houston Astros...allowed only three singles in 8.0 innings of work.
- Pitched Puerto Rico in the 2009 World Baseball Classic...his stepfather has Puerto Rican ancestry.
- On January 28, 2007, the Delaware Sportswriters and Broadcasters Association honored Snell as the "John J. Brady Athlete of the Year", an award given annually to the best athlete from Delaware.
- Born in Dover, DE, and currently resides in Bradenton, FL.
- Is 6-7, 3.65 ERA (47 ER, 116.0 IP) in 20 G/20 GS career in Sept.
- Making his 5th career start vs. an AL West opponent...is 2-1, 2.67 ERA (8 ER, 27.0 IP).
- Is 36-47, 4.81 ERA (373 ER, 698.0 IP) in 122 career starts....0-0, 3.60 (25.0 IP, 10 ER) in 12 relief appearances.

**LAST START...**recorded his 3rd win as a Mariners in Seattle's 8-4 victory over Kansas City on Aug. 29...allowed 2 run on 3 hits, while walking 2 and striking out 2 in 5.0 innings of work...left after 5.0 innings because of swelling in his right forearm after taking a line drive (Maier) off the arm in the 5th...finished the frame, and his day was done after just 68 pitches...allowed 2-run HR (J. Buck) in the 3rd inning.

**THE FIRST WIN IS ALWAYS THE TOUGHEST...**recorded first win as a Mariners in 3-1 victory on Aug. 19 at Detroit...allowed only 1 run on 4 hits, while walking 3 and striking out 2...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings before allowing a solo home run to Carlos Guillen in the 6th inning...it was his first win since June 17 at MIN (w/PIT).

**STREAKING...**over his last 3 starts, Snell is 3-0 with a 2.16 ERA (4 ER, 16.2 IP)...has held opponents (Tigers, A's, Royals) to a .186 (11x59) batting average...has surrendered just 4 runs to lower his ERA with Seattle to a 5.10. first time to win 3 consecutive starts since winning 5 in a row May 20-June 10, 2006 (w/PIT).

**MARINERS DEBUT...**made first career start with Seattle, earning a ND in Mariners 4-2 loss at Texas on Aug. 2...allowed 2 runs on 3 hits, while walking 3 and striking out 4 in 6.0 innings of work.

**MOVING MAN...**in a 5-week span, was: **Optioned** (June 25) to AAA by Pittsburgh...**Traded** (July 29) by Pittsburgh to Seattle...**Optioned** (July 29) to AAA by Seattle...**Recalled** (July 31) to Seattle...that's Pittsburgh to Indianapolis to Tacoma to Seattle if you are scoring at home.

**NICE FIRST IMPRESSION...**struck out 17 batters, including 13 straight, in his first AAA start for Indianapolis (vs. Toledo) after being optioned by the Pirates...walked just 1 batter...finished with a no-decision despite allowing just 1, unearned run in 7.0 innings.

**2009 HIGHLIGHTS...**

- Snapped 10-G personal winless streak with W#2 6/17 at MIN; 1st win since 4/18.
- Limited to 2.0 IP (3 ER) in game that was delayed by rain 5/16 vs. COL.

**TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP RYAN ROWLAND-SMITH (2-2, 3.95)**

26-year-old left-hander makes his 10th start of the 2009 season in tomorrow at Oakland...recorded loss in a pitching duel with Z. Greinke in last start on 8/30 vs. the Royals (8.0,5,3,3,1,7); set a career-high tossing 8.0 innings...tossed 6.0 no-hit innings to begin GS on July 29, a 3-2 win over Roy Halladay & Toronto (7.0,3,2,2,0,4,HR)...has limited opponents to a .220 (40x205) average, including a .193 (11x57) clip vs. lefties...has worked into the 7th inning in 6 of 9 starts with 5 quality starts...with AAA Tacoma was 5-3, 4.31 ERA in 10 starts...in last 4 AAA starts went 4-0, with 1.69 ERA (5 ER, 26.2 IP) with 23 K, 2 BB...**Career** -- is 5-4, 3.69 (52 ER, 126.2 IP) in 21 career starts and is 3-1 with 2 saves and a 3.60 ERA (34 ER, 85.0 IP) in 61 relief appearances...**vs. OAK** -- Making his 5th career start in his 10th appearance vs. the Athletics...is 1-1 with a 3.03 ERA (10 ER, 29.2 IP) in 9 career appearances (4 GS) in his career vs. the A's...recorded ND in last start on Aug. 25 vs. OAK (6.1,9,2,2,0,1)...started April 10 but was forced out by elbow pain after 3.1 IP...went 1-1, 3.94 (7 ER, 16.0 IP) in 4 G/2 GS in 2008...in 4 starts, is 1-1 with a 2.31 ERA (6 ER, 23.1 IP) and 3 quality starts...

**WAK OFF WINS**...the Mariners have recorded 11 walk-off wins, 2nd-most in the Majors behind the Yankees...one off club record for walk-off wins in a season (12, 1986)...**Ryan Langerhans** hit 2 walk-off home runs in August (8/7 vs. TB, 8/25 vs. OAK), becoming the 12th Mariner to record multi-walk-off homers in the same season...6 different players have recorded a walk-off hit this season (Lopez - 3, Langerhans - 2, Gutierrez, Beltre, Ichiro, Griffey).

**EVERYDAY ICHIRO**...Ichiro has recorded a hit in 106 of the 118 (90%) games he's played this season...if he keeps up his current pace (and plays every game), he'd play 146 games and be on pace to get a hit in 131 of those games...Ichiro tied the AL record with a hit in 135 games during his rookie season in 2001:

**Most Games, One or More Hits in a Season:** NL-135, **Rogers Hornsby**, St. Louis, in 154 G, 1922 & **Chuck Klein**, Philadelphia, in 156 G 1930...AL-135, **Wade Boggs**, Boston, in 161 G, 1985; **Derek Jeter**, New York, in 158 G, 1999; **Ichiro**, Seattle, in 157 G, 2001.

**YOU'VE BEEN ONE UPPE!**...Seattle is 29-16 in one run games this season, accounting for 41% of the total wins (29 of 70)...the American League record for most 1-run victories in a season is 40, held by the 1974 (40-21) and 1970 (40-15) versions of the Baltimore Orioles...Mariners club record for 1-run victories is 31 set by the 1982 team.

**SCORELESS FOR 14.0 INNINGS**...the Mariners set club record for most scoreless innings in a single game (14.0) in a 1-0 victory over the White Sox on Aug. 12...the previous record was 10.0 innings in a 2-0 win at KC (7/18/01)...it was the first 1-0 extra inning win and 2nd extra inning shutout (2-0 at KC, 7/18/01) in club history...it was just the 2nd time since 2004 that a team has held its opponent scoreless in a game of at least 14.0 innings...**Ken Griffey Jr.** provided the heroics with a walk-off single, his 9th career game-ending hit.

**30 FOR BRANYAN**...**Russell Brayan** ranks T3rd in the American League with 31 home runs... becomes just the 11th Mariner in club history to hit 30 or more homers in a season...it's now been done 23 times, by 11 guys: Ken Griffey Jr. (6x), Alex Rodriguez (4x), Jay Buhner (3x), Bret Boone (2x), Richie Sexson (2x), Edgar Martinez, Raul Ibanez, Gorman Thomas, Tino Martinez, Paul Sorrento and Brayan...on the list, Sexson, T. Martinez and Sorrento were also 1B.

**.300 EVERY YEAR**...the Mariners will finish the season with a .300 hitter for the 21st consecutive season (Ichiro is currently batting .361)...the Mariners have had at least one .300 hitter in each season dating back to 1989...the streak is the longest current in the Majors (BOS/COL is 2nd with 17).

**A NEW DAY, A NEW LINEUP**...the Mariners have kept things interesting this season, using 116 batting lineups and 86 different defensive alignments (not counting pitcher) 134 games of the season.

**DOUBLE DIGITS**...**Ken Griffey Jr.** is T3rd on the team with 14 home runs and ranks 5th all-time with 625 home runs...he has now collected double-digits in homers in 20 seasons (1989-2001, 2003-current)...only 4 players in MLB history have more than 20 double-digit HR seasons: Hank Aaron (23), Carl Yastrzemski (22), Barry Bonds (21) and Stan Musial (21).

**3 OR LESS**...the Mariners set a club record allowing 3 or fewer runs in 9 consecutive games, June 1-11...went 6-3 with a 1.78 ERA (16 ER, 81.0 IP)...the old record was 7 consecutive games (6x, last: June 11-18, 2005)...also tied a record allowing 2 or fewer runs in 6 consecutive games (June 1-7)... joins St. Louis as only other team in the Majors this season to string together 9 such games and becomes first AL team to accomplish this since Minnesota in 2008.

**THE ROSTER**...the Mariners activated 3B **Adrian Beltre** from the 15-day DL, and recalled 1B **Mike Carp** and LHP **Jason Vargas** from AAA Tacoma Sept. 1...the Mariners now have 28 players on the active Major League roster.
