### A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have lost the season series for the second time in the last three years as they trail 3-10 with six games remaining...are 2-5 in Oakland and 1-5 in Seattle...have a five-game losing streak against the Mariners and have also lost 13 of the last 16...are 18-33 (..353) against Seattle since 2007, which is the worst mark by an American League team over that span...alltime, the A's are 268-197 ( against Seattle, which is the best record by an AL team against the Mariners...are 149-85 in Oakland and 119-112 in Seattle.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey was named AL Rookie of the Month for August after converting all seven of his save opportunities and allowing no innings...he has 21 saves for the season, which is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 23 set by Huston Street in 2005...leads ML rookies and is tied for ninth among all AL pitchers in saves...has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities, which is also two short of the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street in 2005...has not allowed a run in his last 11 games and 12.0 innings.

**Rajai Davis** is batting .333 (51 for 153) with a ML leading 19 stolen bases since the All-Star Break.

**Cliff Pennington** has a 35-game errorless streak dating back to last year, which is tied for the fifth longest errorless streak by a shortstop in Oakland history.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On September 4, 1973 the A's defeat the California Angels 4-3 as Ken Holtzman wins his 20th game en route to a 21-13 season...on September 4, 2000 Mike Stanley is a perfect 5 for 5 with five RBI in the A's 10-0 win over Toronto...on September 4, 2002 the A's blow an 11-0 lead against Kansas City but Scott Hatteberg hits a pinch-hit "walk-off" home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 12-11 win, the A's American League record breaking 20<sup>th</sup> consecutive win.

#### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 4-4 over the last eight games and 6-7 over the last 13 games...are a season high tying 16 games under .500 for the seventh time this year...have not been more than 16 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 28-32 over that span...are 59-75 (.440) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 124 days (since May 3) and 130 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...the A's finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 14-24 (.368) against American League West teams, which is the third worst record against divisional foes in the AL...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 19-37 (.339) record against Western division teams and 40-38 (.513) against teams from the Central and East.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's won two of three from Kansas City to start this homestand after winning two of three from Detroit to finish the last homestand...this is just the third time this year the A's have won back-to-back home series, the first time since May 25-June 8 (Seattle and Baltimore)...have not won more than two straight home series since May 18-June 7, 2007 when they won four straight...are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (0-1)...went 4-5 on the last homestand and are 32-35 (.478) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 27-40 (.403) on the road for the season...with one more road loss, the A's will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season.

**STARTING PITCHING:** The A's have started a rookie pitcher 96 times this year, which is an Oakland record, breaking the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 70 of the last 87 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...A's starting pitchers are 4-6 with a 3.83 ERA (44 er in 103.1 ip) over the last 18 games...are 38-54 with a 4.80 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (747.2) and wins in the American League and are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's rank fourth in the American League and fifth in the majors with 106 stolen bases...this marks just the second time in the last 14 years Oakland has reached the century plateau...the last time was in 1998 when they had 131...Rajai Davis leads the A's with 30 steals and Adam Kennedy has 18...the last time the A's had two players steal 20 or more bases in one season was in 1995 when Stan Javier had 36 steals and Rickey Henderson had 32.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored 25 runs in the first four games of the homestand after scoring 20 runs in seven games total on the last road trip...have 600 runs for the season, which is third fewest in the American League...rank last in the AL in home runs (112), extra base hits (363) and slugging percentage (.386), second to last in batting (.255), have the third fewest triples (14) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.323)...have 436 walks and are on pace for 527 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508

**THE THREE SPOT:** A's number three hitters are batting a combined .216 (114 for 529), which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos...the four players with the most starts in the three spot are Jack Cust (33 starts, .156 average), Jason Giambi (29, .210), Scott Hairston (26, .252) and Kurt Suzuki (19, .203, 16 for 79).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone five consecutive games without an error and have 81 for the season...are on pace to commit 98 errors...have committed fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 14-21 (.400) in one-run games, which is tied for the second worst record in one-run games in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980...are 3-9 (.250) in extra inning games, which is tied with Pittsburgh (2-6) for the worst record in the majors...the nine extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...trailed 4-0 entering the bottom of the third Monday night but came back to win...it was the fifth time this year the A's overcame a deficit of four or more runs to win...had only one such win last year.

**SINCE THE BREAK:** The A's are 22-26 since the All-Star Break...are batting .273 (454 for 1664) since the break, which is sixth best in the American League...hit .246 before the break, which was the lowest mark in the AL...lead the AL in stolen bases since the break (52) and are fourth in doubles (95) and runs scored (239)...had the third fewest doubles (142) and runs (361) in the AL before the break.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's finished the month of August with a 14-15 record and have finished with a losing record in each month this year...this marks the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 803 games, an average of 50.2 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

MORTENSEN'S 2009 APPEARANCES

Memphis before earning a promotion to St.

Louis on June 29...pitched just once and was optioned back to Memphis on July 1 before being dealt to Oakland in the Matt Holliday trade July 24...was assigned to Sacramento and had no decisions and a 1.64 ERA in two starts before he was brought up to Oakland August 8...started and lost that day at Kansas City and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day

TRADE: Was acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals in the Matt Holliday trade...was sent to Oakland along with Brett Wallace and Shane Peterson on July 24 and was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento...was originally selected by St. Louis as a supplemental pick following the first round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft (36<sup>th</sup> selection overall)...was rated as the Cardinals sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2008 season after being rated number seven after the 2007 season.

WITH ST. LOUIS: Began the season at Triple-A Memphis in the Cardinals organization, but was promoted to St. Louis on June 29...pitched the final three innings of St. Louis' 10-0 loss to San Francisco that day...allowed six runs, two earned, on five hits and a walk while striking out two, and was optioned back to Memphis on July 1 after appearing in just one game (6.00 ERA).

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-6 loss at Kansas City on August 8...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a DeJesus RBI double and a Butler sacrifice fly...then allowed four runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Jacobs, a solo home run by Olivo and a DeJesus sacrifice fly...put the first two runners on base in the fifth inning and was relieved by Edgar Gonzalez, who allowed both runs to score.

MORTENSEN vs. SEATTLE: Is making his first career appearance.

IN THE MINORS: Was 7-6 with a 4.37 ERA in 17 starts with Memphis before he was dealt to the A's organization on July 24...had no decisions and a 1.64 ERA in two starts with Sacramento before his promotion to Oakland on August 8 and then went 2-2 with a 5.91 ERA in four starts following his option...was 2-2 with a 4.45 ERA in six starts overall with the River Cats and combined for a 9-8 mark and a 4.39 ERA in 23 minor league starts overall...his teams were 12-11 (.522) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 23 starts, including one nine-inning complete game on June 7 against New Orleans...allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .271 opponents batting average, which included a .273 (75 for 275) mark against righthanded hitters and .270 (68 for 252) against left-handers...held the opposition to a .221 (30 for 136) average with runners in scoring position, including .190 (11 for 58) with RISP and two outs...allowed just 13 home runs in 137.1 innings, an average of 0.85 per nine innings.

2009 MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed just one earned run in each of his first five starts at Memphis, going 2-1 with a 1.44 ERA...then lost each of his next two

starts, allowing six runs in 6.0 innings on May 10 at Iowa and 7 runs in 5.0 innings on May 15 against Las Vegas...followed that with a season best four-game winning streak from May 22-June 7...compiled a 2.39 ERA during the winning streak...capped the streak on June 7 against New Orleans when he tossed a complete game six-hitter in the Redbirds 12-1 win...did not walk a batter and struck out a season high eight...allowed a season high nine runs in 3.1 innings in a loss on June 18 at Iowa...was 7-4 with a 4.24 ERA in 14 starts when he was promoted to St. Louis on June 29...went 0-2 with a 4.95 ERA in three starts following his option on July 1 and before his trade to the A's organization...allowed just one run in each of his first two starts with the River Cats but had a no decision in each outing...allowed nine hits and walked seven in 11.0 innings...tossed 7.0 innings in two of his four outings following his option, picking up the win each of those games.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in the River Cats 9-5 win over Fresno last Saturday...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed a season high tying 11 hits...allowed a two-run single to Matt Downs in the top of the first but Sacramento scored twice in the bottom of the first and seven more in the second...allowed two more runs in the third, including a Kevin Frandsen RBI single, and an unearned run in the seventh.

#### **ORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**

LHP Brett Anderson (7-10, 4.42 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 26<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his career...is 4-3 with a 3.24 ERA, .225 opponents batting average and five home runs over his last 12 starts after going 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs over his first 13 starts...has received run support of two runs or less in each of his last three starts and 13 of his 25 starts this year...his season run support of 4.36 is eighth lowest in the American League...leads Major League rookies with 119 strikeouts, which is the third best rookie total in Oakland history...is tied for second among AL rookies in innings pitched (146.2), tied for second in starts (25) and tied for eighth in wins (7)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-1 A's loss at Los Angeles last Sunday (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.32 ERA (19.0 ip, 19 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against Seattle

 first batter strikeouts (86) and has issued the third fewest first batter walks (24)...has allowed 73 of 192 (38.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has a 2.82 ERA (71 er in 226.2 ip), 10 home runs allowed and 64 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.69 ERA (116 er in 222.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 99 walks issued on the road...had a 2.81 ERA in the month of August after posting a 4.09 ERA in July, a 3.52 ERA in June, a 5.29 ERA in May and a 2.62 ERA in April...has a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) over the first three games of September

- Was named the American League Rookie of the Month for the month of August in which he went 2-0, did not allow a run and converted all seven of his save opportunities in 11 games and 11.0 innings...allowed just four hits, did not walk a batter and struck out seven...held the opposition to a .111 (4 for 36) batting average.
- Has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak over his last 11 outings dating back to July 31 (4 h, 8 so)...his longest scoreless streak this year was 15.1 innings from June 14-July 17.
- Has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities dating back to June 17 and is 2-2 with a 1.16 ERA (31.0 ip, 19 h, 4 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 28 so, 1 hr) over that span...the 16 consecutive saves are two short of the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Huston Street in 2005.
- Has 21 saves for the season, which is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 23 set by Huston Street in 2005...leads Major League rookies and is tied for ninth among all AL pitchers in saves...has recorded more than three outs in six of his saves. Ranks second among AL relievers in strikeouts (76) and opponents batting average (.173), third in innings pitched (72.0) and ERA (1.88), tied for
- fourth in wins (6) and 10<sup>th</sup> in batting average against first batters faced (.151).
- Ranks second among AL rookies in games pitched (57) and ninth in strikeouts (76).
- Is 1-0 with one save in one opportunity and a 1.42 ERA (1 er in 6.1 ip) over five appearances against the Mariners.
- Has not yielded a home run in 135 at bats against right-handed hitters.
- Has allowed just one run (14.1 ip, 0.63 ERA) and has converted 9 of 10 save opportunities in 12 outings on no days rest.
- Was the sixth Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team but did not pitch in the game...was the only rookie named to either All-Star team this year.
- Spent the entire 2008 season at Double-A Midland...began the season in the starting rotation and went 1-8 with a 6.18 ERA and .258 opponents batting average in his 15 starts...then went 4-1 with a 0.92 ERA and .207 opponents average over his final 22 appearances, all in relief.
