### 3 FOR THE MONEY

The Mariners collected three home runs last night, the 7th time this season Seattle has had a 3-homer game...Seattle is 6-1 when it collects a trio of homers, but 0-2 when it hits 4 long balls.

### CALIFORNIA LOVE

Mariners are 27-14 against teams from the Golden State, including 13-6 in California...Mariners have a winning record against all teams (Angels, 9-7; A's, 10-3; Dodgers, 2-1; Padres, 4-2; Giants, 2-1).

### THE TRIFECTA

With a winning August (15-14), the Mariners have strung together 3 straight winning months (June: 15-10, July: 14-13)...first time since a four-month stretch Sept. 2002-June 2003.

### STEADY PROGRESS

Jose Lopez has already set a career high with 20 home runs, upping his home run total in each of the last 4 seasons...he is currently on pace for a career-high 97 RBI this season... Lopez has 5 HR in his last 15 G.

### SURPASSING 2008

Seattle is 71-64, surpassing their win total from 2008 (61-101)...will need to win 10 of its final 27 games to secure a .500 record.

### CY LIKE

Mariners starter Felix Hernandez ranks 2nd in the AL in ERA (2.65), T3rd in wins (14) and 4th in strikeouts (185)... Hernandez has already set a career-high in strikeouts and matched his career-high in wins (14-7 in 2007).

### RUBBER GAMES & SERIES

Seattle is 25-16-2 in series this season, including winning 18 of last 26...14-5 in "rubber games" to decide a 3-game series, including winning 13 of last 16...have come back to win series after dropping first game 9 times.

### IRON MAN

Ichiro returned to the lineup Tuesday (and got 2 hits) after missing 8 games with a strained left calf (8/24-31)... Ichiro has missed 16 games this season (also spent 8 days on DL to open season) after missing only 16 total from 2001-08...he has played in 1,399 games since his debut in 2001 (most in MLB), missing only 32 out of a possible 1,431 games.

### CHASING TY COBB

Ichiro is on pace to record 227 hits, which would extend his streak of consecutive 200-hit seasons to an all-time record 9 straight...if he reaches 200 hits (11 hits short) he will tie the AL record for most 200-hit seasons in a career held by Ty Cobb...the all-time record is 10 by Pete Rose.

### WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Won 13 of last 16 one-run games, including 9 straight June 19-July 29...overall, are 29-16 in 1-run games, including 19-5 at home...also 14-15 in 2-run games...Seattle leads the Majors with 29 one-run victories (LAD is 2nd with 25)...Mariners club record for one-run wins is 31 set in '82... MLB record is 40 (BAL, '70 & '74).

### IMPROVEMENT SINCE '08

After going 61-101 (.377) in 2008 the Mariners are 71-64 (.526) this season, the biggest improvement from '08 in MLB...through 133 games last season, Seattle was 51-83.

### TONIGHT'S TILT

...the Mariners continue this 3-team, 10-game roadtrip with the second (1-0) of four at the Oakland A's...this trip also includes three games in Anaheim and three in Texas...Seattle just complete a 7-3 homestand, including a 3-game sweep of the A's...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on FSN in HD, and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

### ODDS AND ENDS

...have won 3 straight, 5 of 7 and 8 of last 11...are 11-7 over last 18 games...also 23-11 over last 34 and 27-22 over last 49 games...won 14 of last 22 home games and are 39-30 overall at Safeco Field...trailed at some point in 33 of 71 victories (46%)...also had a lead in 33 of 64 defeats...league-best 29-16 in 1-run & 14-15 in 2-run games.

- Mariners have used 44 players in '09: 24 position & 20 pitchers...6 players have made their ML debuts.
- Ichiro is 2nd in AL in batting average (.360), and leads MLB in hits (189) and multi-hit games (62).
- The Mariners lead AL with 51 sac bunts...Franklin Gutierrez is tied for T1st in AL with 11 sac bunts.
- Seattle has batted around 5 times this season (last: 8/16 vs. NYY, 7th inning).
- Mark Lowe is just 5th pitcher in club history (7th time) with 20+ holds in a season (is 3rd in AL w/24).
- Jose Lopez leads the team with 80 RBI, 2nd-most among AL 2B (A. Hill, TOR, 88).
- Russell Branyan is just the 11th Mariner in club history to record 30 homers in a season.
- Mariners minor league affiliates have a combined 465-413 (.530) record, 5th-best in the Majors...the AZL Mariners won the Arizona League Championship for the 2nd time in 3 seasons (also in 2007).

### SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS

...tonight is the 14th (10-3) of 19 games (10 in Oakland, 9 in Seattle) between the A's and Mariners in 2009...Mariners have a 5-game winning streak against the A's... Seattle swept @OAK April 10-12, took 2 of 3 May 1-3 in Seattle, dropped 2 of 3 May 25-27 @OAK and swept Aug. 24-26 in SEA...have won 13 of last 16 against Oakland (dating back to 9/26/08)... since the start of the 2007 season, Mariners have won 33 of 51 vs. the A's...Seattle lost last year's series (10-9), and was 3-6 in Oakland...Seattle trails the all-time series 197-268, and is 85-149 in Oakland...Seattle has had in winning record in Oakland just twice since 1999: 5-4 in '02 & 8-1 in '07.

### 8 WOULD BE GREAT

...a win tonight would give the Mariners a mark of 72-64, a season-high eight games over .500...have not been eight over since finishing the 2007 season 88-74.

### IF IT WORKS, DON'T CHANGE IT

...the Mariners have won their last 3 games, and David Aardsma and Mark Lowe have figured prominently...Lowe has a pair of holds (1.2 IP, 1 R) and Aardsma has three saves (3.0 IP, 1 H, 3 K).

### IF THEY SEEM LIKE CLOSE GAMES

...it's only because they are...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Seattle leads the American League (and is tied with San Francisco for the ML lead) with 26 games in which 1 or 0 total runs have been scored by the end of the fifth...that is, at the end of 5.0 it's either 0-0, 1-0 or 0-1.

### HE'S QUALITY

...David Aardsma recorded his Major League leading 16th "quality save" Tue vs. the Angels (Brian Fuentes-LAA is 2nd with 15)...the Elias Sports Bureau defines a quality save in which the pitcher entered with the tying run in scoring position or protected a one-run lead for at least one inning.

### COUNTDOWN TO 200 & 2,000

...Ichiro enters today's game 11 hits short of 200 for the season and 6 hits short of 2,000 for his MLB career...if he reaches 200 hits (on pace for 227), it will be his 9th consecutive 200-hit season, breaking the all-time record currently held by Willie Keeler (1894-1901)... he will likely reach 2,000 hits in the 2nd-fewest amount of games in ML history (among players who made their MLB debut in 1900 or later)...Al Simmons holds the current mark for fewest games to reach 2,000 career hits (1,390 G) and George Sisler is 2nd (1,414 G)...Ichiro has played in 1,399 games.

### AN ODD RECORD

...the Mariners beat the Angels Wednesday 3-0, extending their club-record with their 21st win of the season when scoring 3 or fewer runs...that mark leads the AL (DET is 2nd with 13) and ranks Tst in the Majors (STL - 21, SF - 20)...the previous club high was 19 wins in 1989... when the offense scores 3 or fewer runs, Mariners pitchers have stepped up to the challenge posting a 3.69 ERA (237 ER, 577.2 IP).

### PITCHING LEADERS

...the Mariners lead the American League with a 3.90 ERA (526 ER, 1213.0 IP)... Seattle last led AL in ERA in 2001 (3.54)...Seattle has already used 20 pitchers, including 12 starters, while compiling the league-leading mark...no team has used that many starters and pitchers and led the AL in ERA since Boston sent 24 pitchers (13 starters) to the mound in 2000...held opponents to one or fewer runs 24 times (3rd-most in the AL) and 2 or fewer runs 42 times (2nd-most in AL).

### SWEENEY ON FIRE

...Mike Sweeney has recorded a hit in 9 of his last 11 games, including 6 multi-hit games...over the 11-game stretch he is batting .421 (16x38) with 5 doubles and 8 RBI, raising his season batting average from .228 to .265.

### 30(PLUS) SOMETHING

...David Aardsma recorded his 34th save yesterday (T4th in AL); he's just the 6th pitcher in club history to record a season with 30 or more saves...he joins Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02), J.J. Putz (2006-07), Mike Schooler (1989-90), Eddie Guardado (2005) and Jose Mesa (1999)...he is just the 9th player in MLB history to record a 30-save season without a prior career save heading into the season (Koch, Sasaki, Gagne, Chacon, Turnbow, Papelbon, Ray, Wood).

### NO REST FOR THE WEARY

...today is game #31 (17-13) in a stretch of 33 games in 34 days, Aug. 4-Sept. 6, for the Mariners...the club spent the one off day flying from Seattle to Detroit...it's also game #18 (10-7) in a stretch of 20 games in 20 days, Aug. 18-Sept. 6.

### DID YOU KNOW?

...that the Mariners are having their best season ever vs. the Athletics?...Seattle is 10-3 vs. the A's this season, a .769 winning percentage...here's a look at Seattle's best winning percentage vs. the A's all-time:  
2009: 10-3, .769...2007: 14-5, .737...2003: 12-7, .632...1987: 8-5, .615...1997 & 1998: 7-5, .583.

**ABOUT ROWLAND-SMITH...**

- 26-year-old left-hander makes his 10th start of the season (3rd vs. OAK)...22nd career Major League start.
- Has made 61 of 82 career ML appearances as a reliever.
- Made Major League debut June 22, 2007 vs. Cincinnati in relief...Ken Griffey Jr. was first ML strikeout.
- Spent entire career in Mariners organization...selected by Minnesota in the 2004 Rule 5 Draft, but was returned to Seattle during spring training.
- Born in Sydney, Australia and resides during the off-season in Newcastle, Australia and Seattle...signed as a non-drafted free agent Nov. 19, 2000 by Mariners scout Barry Holland.
- Rode his mountain bike to Safeco Field several times during the 2008 season when living on Mercer Island (7 miles).
- On provisional roster for Australia for 2009 World Baseball Classic, but declined to play in order to compete for spot in Seattle starting rotation ...also on the provisional roster in 2006.
- Pitched for Australia in the 2004 Summer Olympics and won a silver medal...went 2-0 with a 1.23 ERA in 4 games.
- Only player ML history with a hyphenated last name.
- Can be followed on Twitter (@hyphen18).
- Is 2-1-0, 4.17 ERA (19 ER, 41.0 IP) in 14 G/15 GS career in September.
- Is 1-2-1, 2.67 ERA (18 ER, 60.2 IP) in 24 G/6 GS career vs. AL West.

**LAST START**...recorded a tough-luck loss in his last start Aug. 30 vs. Kansas City...opposed Royals ace Zack Greinke, who threw a CG 1-hitter...set career-highs in innings (8.0) and strikeouts (7)...allowed 5 hits and 3 runs in 8.0 innings pitched...threw 113 pitches/80 strikes.

**TOUGH LUCK IN RECENT STARTS**...is 0-1 with a 3.14 ERA (5 ER, 14.1 IP) over his last 2 starts...Mariners have given him only one run of support over his last 2 outings.

**TOUGH DRAW**...Rowland-Smith has squared off against some stiff competition in his starts this season...here are a few of the names he has matched up against: Roy Halladay (7/29), Scott Kazmir (8/9), Andy Pettitte (8/14), Jarrod Washburn (8/20), Brett Anderson (8/25) and Zack Greinke (8/30)...over his last 2 starts, opposing starters have allowed only 7 hits and one run in 16.0 innings.

**A GOOD START**...in 1st inning holding opponents to .212 (7x33) average and through first 6.0 innings, are hitting only .193 (34x176).

**WINNING STREAK**...had his 2-game winning streak snapped in his last start...streak tied his career-high (3rd time)...was 2-0 with a 4.21 ERA (17 ER, 36.1 IP) over 6 starts during winning streak (ND on 8/4 at KC, 8/14 vs. NYY, 8/20 at DET & 8/25 vs. OAK).

**NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN**...started April 10 in Oakland (Seattle's 5th game of season) but was forced out by elbow pain after 3.1 IP...placed on 15-day DL April 15, where he remained until June 23...DL stint included 5 rehab starts at AAA Tacoma, May 23-June 17...recalled from rehab assignment June 21, activated from 15-day DL and optioned back to Tacoma June 23...after option made 5 starts in Tacoma, posting a 4-0, 2.08 mark (30.1 IP, 7 ER), including 4-0, 1.69 mark in July.

**MR. CONSISTENT**...has lasted at least 6.0 innings in 14 of his last 17 starts...7.0 or more innings in 4 of 9 starts this season...over last 17 starts, is 5-4 with a 3.27 ERA (39 ER, 107.1 IP).

**QUALITY**...has recorded a quality start in 13 of 21 career starts...had streak of 8 consecutive quality starts snapped in season debut vs. the A's April 10...worked at least 6.0 innings and allowed 3-or-fewer earned runs in 8 consecutive starts Aug. 21, 2008-end of season...during the streak was 3-2, 2.56 (15 ER, 52.2 IP)...the streak was the longest by a Mariner since Joel Pineiro (8 straight QS Aug. 7-Sept. 5, 2002).

**INDECISION**...has recorded 12 no-decisions in his 21 career starts, including 7 of his last 14 starts dating back to 2008 season...he left with a lead in 7 of last 10 no-decisions dating back to 2008.

**STARTER VS. RELIEVER**...is 5-4, 3.69 (52 ER, 126.2 IP) in 21 career starts...went 2-1 with 2 saves and a 3.30 ERA (17 ER, 46.1 IP) in 35 relief appearances in 2008...in his career as a reliever, is 3-1 with 2 saves and a 3.60 ERA (34 ER, 85.0 IP).

23-year-old left-hander, turns 24 on Sept. 13, is scheduled to make his 7th start as a Mariner tomorrow vs. Oakland...Seattle is 4-2 in his starts...is 3-2, 5.73 (21 ER, 33.0 IP) in 6 starts with SEA...suffered L#4 (#2 with SEA) in his last start 8/31 vs. LAA (5.0,10,7,7,0,3,2 HR)...won his Mariners debut 8/5 @KC...ND 8/10 vs. CWS in Safeco Field debut (5.1,3,4,4,6,5)...acquired (w/ LHP Mauricio Robles) from the Detroit Tigers in exchange for LHP Jarrod Washburn on July 31...was 1-2, 3.38 (29.1 IP, 11 ER) in 7 G, 5 GS w/DET...in 13 starts with AAA Toledo, posted a 4-4 record with a 2.98 ERA (27 ER, 81.2 IP)...vs. OAK -- 1-0, 3.12 (3 ER, 8.2 IP) in 3 career outings vs. OAK (1 GS)...made MLB debut vs. the A's on 5/15/09...Career -- originally selected by the Tigers in the 8th round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft.

Martinez and Sorrento were also 1B.

**.300 EVERY YEAR...**the Mariners will finish the season with a .300 hitter for the 21st consecutive season (Ichiro is currently batting .360)...the Mariners have had at least one .300 hitter in each season dating back to 1989...the streak is the longest current in the Majors (BOS/COL is 2nd with 17).

**A NEW DAY, A NEW LINEUP...**the Mariners have kept things interesting this season, using 117 batting lineups and 87 different defensive alignments (not counting pitcher) 135 games of the season.

**DOUBLE DIGITS...****Ken Griffey Jr.** is T3rd on the team with 14 home runs and ranks 5th all-time with 625 home runs...he has now collected double-digits in homers in 20 seasons (1989-2001, 2003-current)...only 4 players in MLB history have more than 20 double-digit HR seasons: Hank Aaron (23), Carl Yastrzemski (22), Barry Bonds (21) and Stan Musial (21).

**3 OR LESS...**the Mariners set a club record allowing 3 or fewer runs in 9 consecutive games, June 1-11...went 6-3 with a 1.78 ERA (16 ER, 81.0 IP)...the old record was 7 consecutive games (6x, last: June 11-18, 2005)...also tied a record allowing 2 or fewer runs in 6 consecutive games (June 1-7)... joins St. Louis as only other team in the Majors this season to string together 9 such games and becomes first AL team to accomplish this since Minnesota in 2008.

**THE ROSTER...**the Mariners activated 3B **Adrian Beltre** from the 15-day DL, and recalled 1B **Mike Carp** and LHP **Jason Vargas** from AAA Tacoma Sept. 1...the Mariners now have 28 players on the active Major League roster.

**FOOL ME ONCE...**Ichiro has not gone hitless in consecutive games since Aug. 13-15, 2008...that's a **streak of 160 consecutive games without going hitless in back-to-back games...**the streak is the longest in the Majors since Stan Musial (174 games) in 1943-44 and the longest AL streak since Doc Cramer (191 games) in 1934-35...thanks to SABR's Trent McCotter & Elias for the research help.

**THOU SHALT NOT STEAL...**Seattle leads the AL in caught stealing percentage by its catchers...Mariners backstops have thrown out 35 of 96 opposing runners (36.5%), tops in the American League...adding in the pitchers caught stealing (1-3-6), and Seattle has nabbed 40 of 101, 40%.

**FIELDING FUNDAMENTALS...**the Mariners played a season-high 10-consecutive error-free games August 24-Sept. 2...Seattle ranked 3rd in the AL with a .990 fielding percentage in August, compared to an overall .982 season mark (12th in AL).

**DOUBLE YOUR FUN...**the Mariners have turned 7 double plays over the last 6 games (including 3 Tuesday), after going 6 consecutive games without a DP (8/23-28).
