### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have lost two straight and eight of the last 12 to fall a season high 17 games under .500...those are the A's most games under .500 since they finished the 1997 season 32 games under (.65-97)...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 28-33 over that span...are 59-76 (.437) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 125 days (since May 3) and 131 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...the A's finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

**DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION:** The A's are a season high tying 21 games out of first place in the American League West and have a magic number of eight for elimination from the division race...trail Boston by a season high tying 19½ games in the Wild Card and the magic number for elimination from the playoffs is nine...the last time the A's were more than 20 games out of a playoff spot was the end of the 1997 season when they finished 25 games back in the AL West...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 14-25 (.359) against American League West teams, which is the third worst record against divisional foes in the AL...the only times in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .400 in division games is 1997 (11-25, .306) and 1979 (25-53, .321)...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 19-38 (.333) record against Western division teams and 40-38 (.513) against teams from the Central and East.

**THE THREE SPOT:** A's number three hitters are 3 for 23 (.130) on the homestand and are batting .214 (114 for 533) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos...the four players with the most starts in the three spot are Jack Cust (33 starts, .156 average), Jason Giambi (29, .210), Scott Hairston (26, .252) and Kurt Suzuki (20, .193, 16 for 83).

**STARTING PITCHING:** The A's have started a rookie pitcher 97 times this year, which is an Oakland record, breaking the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 71 of the last 88 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...A's starting pitchers are 4-7 with a 3.92 ERA (48 er in 110.1 ip) over the last 19 games...are 38-55 with a 4.81 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (754.2) and wins in the American League and the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997.

**OFFENSE:** The A's rank fourth in the American League and fifth in the majors with 106 stolen bases...this marks just the second time in the last 14 years Oakland has reached the century plateau in stolen bases...the last time was in 1998 when they had 131...are batting .271 (459 for 1696) since the All-Star Break after hitting .246 before the break...have a .255 average for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...rank last in the AL in home runs (113), extra base hits (366) and slugging percentage (.386), have the third fewest runs scored (603) and triples (14) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.322)...have 437 walks and are on pace for 524 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's had their five-game errorless streak snapped last night and now have 82 errors for the season...are on pace to commit 98 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 14-21 (.400) in one-run games, which is tied for the second worst record in one-run games in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980...are 3-9 (.250) in extra inning games, which is tied with Pittsburgh (2-6) for the worst record in the majors...the nine extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...trailed 4-0 entering the bottom of the third Monday night but came back to win...it was the fifth time this year the A's overcame a deficit of four or more runs to win...had only one such win last year.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-3 on this seven-game homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (0-2)...went 4-5 on the last homestand and are 32-36 (.471) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 27-40 (.403) on the road for the season...with one more road loss, the A's will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's finished have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months, the first time they have done that since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 809 games, an average of 50.6 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

### A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have lost the season series for the second time in the last three years as they trail 3-11 with five games remaining...have a six-game losing streak against the Mariners, equaling the second longest in Oakland history (Sept. 12, 2007-April 17, 2008)...it is one short of the record of seven (Sept. 26, 2008-May 1, 2009)...the A's have now lost 14 of the last 17 games to Seattle...are 2-6 in Oakland this year and 1-5 in Seattle...the six losses in Oakland are the A's second most to Seattle in the Coliseum (went 1-8 in 2007)...are 18-34 (.346) against Seattle since 2007, which is the worst mark by an American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 268-198 (.575) against Seattle, which is the best record by an AL team against the Mariners...are 149-86 in Oakland and 119-112 in Seattle.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Bailey** was named American League Rookie of the Month for August after converting all seven of his save opportunities and allowing no runs in 11 outings and 11.0 innings...he has 21 saves for the season, which is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 23 set by Huston Street in 2005...leads Major League rookies and is tied for ninth among all AL pitchers in saves...has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities, which is also two short of the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street in 2005...has not allowed a run in his last 11 games and 12.0 innings.

**Rajai Davis** is batting .325 (51 for 157) with a ML leading 19 stolen bases since the All-Star Break.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On **September 5, 1951** Ferris Fain goes 5 for 5 in the second game of a doubleheader against Washington...on **September 5, 1973** Catfish Hunter improves his record to 18-3 as the A's defeat the California Angels 11-6...it is Hunter's club record 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive win...he finishes the season 21-5, an .808 winning percentage.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 26<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his career...this is his third professional season...the A's are 10-15 (.400) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings 14 times, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

**LAST 12 STARTS:** Is 4-3 with a 3.24 ERA (28 er in 77.2 ip), .225 (64 for 285) opponents batting average and five home runs over his last 12 starts after going 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs over his first 13 starts.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received run support of two runs or less in each of his last three starts and 13 of his 25 starts this year...his season run support of 4.36 (71 rs in 146.2 ip) is eighth lowest in the American League...is 0-9 in his 13 starts with run support of two runs or less and 7-1 with run support of three runs or more.

**MORE LEADERS:** Ranks eighth in the American League in grounded into double plays (19) and tied for eighth in losses (10) and unearned runs (10).

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Leads Major League rookies with 119 strikeouts, which is the third best rookie total in Oakland history...is tied for second among American League rookies in starts (25), ranks third in innings pitched(146.2) and tied for eighth in wins (7)...has one of four shutouts by an AL rookie this year and one of nine complete games.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 3-3 with a 3.54 ERA (27 er in 68.2 ip) in 12 starts on five or more days rest and 4-7 with a 5.19 ERA (45 er in 78.0 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest.

**21-YEAR OLDS WITH 25 OR MORE STARTS:** Is making his 26<sup>th</sup> start of the season, which is tied for fourth in Oakland history and fifth in Athletics history by a player under the age of 22...fellow 21-year old Trevor Cahill has made 28 starts...this is the first time in the history of the Athletics franchise the A's have had two pitchers under the age of 22 make at least 25 starts in the same season...the last Major League team to do it is the 1980 Chicago White Sox and the only other American League team to do it is the 1912 St. Louis Browns...according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the seventh ML team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 25 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

**21-YEAR OLDS WITH 7 OR MORE WINS:** Has seven wins, which is the fifth highest total in Oakland history by a pitcher under the age of 22...fellow 21-year old Trevor Cahill has eight wins giving the A's two 21-year olds with at least seven wins for the first time in Oakland history...that last time it happened in franchise history was in 1966 in Kansas City (Nash, 12 and Hunter, 9)...the last Major League team to have two pitchers under the age of 22 with at least seven wins is the 1986 Texas Rangers (Ed Correia, 12 and Mitch Williams, 8)

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .196 (9 for 46) average with runners in scoring position over his last 12 starts after opponents hit .386 (27 for 70) with RISP over his first 13 starts...has allowed a .310 average with RISP for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League...opponents are 5 for 10 (.500) with the bases loaded.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has yielded 13 of his 18 home runs on the road and nine with two outs...six have been hit by the opponents number seven hitter...allowed a three-run home run to Lowell in the first inning on July 29, snapping a six-start, 39.0-inning, 154-batters homerless streak.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Went 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA in six starts in the month of August after going 2-1 with a 1.87 ERA and .168 opponents batting average in five starts...led all American League pitchers in opponents batting average in July, ranked second in ERA (Washburn, SEA 1.44) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (33)...had an ERA of 5.00 or more in each of the first three months.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Los Angeles last Sunday...walked the leadoff batter but then retired 10 in a row before Hunter singled with one out in the fourth...had a 1-0 lead entering the bottom of the fifth but allowed a RBI double by Figgins and a three-run home run by Hunter.

**ANDERSON vs. SEATTLE:** Is 1-1 with a 3.32 ERA (19.0 ip, 19 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career starts...took the loss in his first appearance, his Major League debut on April 10 in a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland...allowed five runs in 6.0 innings and all five runs came in the second inning when he allowed five straight hits...then picked up the win in a 6-1 A's victory on May 25 in Oakland...allowed his only run on a solo home run to Johjima in the second...then had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning loss at Seattle on August 25...allowed just one run on a Branyan home run in the second and left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead...Wuertz allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save and a Breslow allowed a walk-off home run to Langerhans for the loss.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Gio Gonzalez (4-5, 6.07 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 16<sup>th</sup> appearance and 13<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 0-3 with a 7.29 ERA and .281 opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his previous four starts...now has a 6.07 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest among American League pitchers with at least 70.0 innings pitched...has struck out 81 batters in 72.2 innings, an average of 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings...that is the third highest ratio in the AL among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-5 A's win over Kansas City last Monday (5.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 8 so)...is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA in four career appearances, two starts, against Seattle...including 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA in two games, one start, this year.

 The A's bullpen leads the American League in fewest home runs (38) and is tied for the lead in strikeouts (398)...the Oakland record for strikeouts by the bullpen is 417 set last year...the pen also ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (451.1) and fourth in ERA (3.77)...is tied for the AL lead in first batter strikeouts (87) and has issued the third fewest first batter walks (24)...has allowed 73 of 192 (38.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has a 2.87 ERA (73 er in 228.2 ip), 11 home runs allowed and 64 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.69 ERA (116 er in 222.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 99 walks issued on the road...had a 2.81 ERA in the month of August after posting a 4.09 ERA in July, a 3.52 ERA in June, a 5.29 ERA in May and a 2.62 ERA in April...has a 4.72 ERA (7 er in 13.1 ip) over the first four games of September.
