3 FOR THE MONEY

e Mariners collected three home runs Thursday, the 7th time this season Seattle has had a 3-homer game...Seat-tle is 6-1 when it collects a trio of homers, but 0-2 when it hits 4 long balls.

CALIFORNIA LOVE

ariners are 28-14 against teams from the Golden State, including 14-6 in California...Mariners have a winning record against all teams (Angels, 9-7; **A's, 11-3**; Dodgers, 2-1; Padres, 4-2; Giants, 2-1).

ith a winning August (15-14), the Mariners have strung together 3 straight winning months (June: 15-10, July: 14-13)...first time since a fourmonth stretch Sept. 2002-June 2003.

STEADY PROGRESS

Jose Lopez has already set a career high with 21 home runs, upping his home run total in each of the last 4 seasons...he is currently on pace for a career-high 96 RBI this season... Lopez has 6 HR in his last 16 G.

SURPASSING 2008

Seattle is 72-64, surpassing their win total from '08 (61-101)...will need to win 9 of final 26 games to secure .500 record.

<u>CY LIKE</u> Mariners starter Felix Hernandez ranks 2nd in the AL in ERA (2.65), T4th in wins (14) and 4th in strikeouts (185)... Hernandez has already set a careerhigh in strikeouts and matched his career-high in wins (14-7 in 2007).

RUBBER GAMES & SERIES

attle is 25-16-2 in series this season, including winning 18 of last 26...14-5 in "rubber games" to decide a 3-game series, including winning 13 of last 16...have come back to win sees after dropping first game 9 times.

IRON MAN

niro returned to the lineup Tuesday
(and got 2 hits) after missing 8 games Ichiro returne with a strained left calf (8/24-31)... Ichiro has missed 16 games this season (also spent 8 days on DL to open season) after missing only 16 total from 2001-08...he has played in 1,400 games since his debut in 2001 (most in MLB), missing only 32 out of a possible 1,432 games.

CHASING TY COBB
Ichiro is on pace to record 227 hits,
which would extend his streak of consecutive 200-hit seasons to an alltime record 9 straight...if he reaches 200 hits (9 hits short) he will tie the AL record for most 200-hit seasons in a career held by Ty Cobb...the all-time record is 10 by Pete Rose.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

on 13 of last 16 one-run games, including 9 straight June 19-July 29... overall, are 29-16 in 1-run games, including 19-5 at home...also 14-15 in 2-run games...Seattle leads the Majors with 29 one-run victories (LAD is 2nd with 25)...**Mariners club record** for one-run wins is 31 set in '82 ... MLB record is 40 (BAL, '70 & '74).

IMPROVEMENT SINCE '08 ter going 61-101 (.377) in 2008 the Mariners are 72-64 (.529) this season, the biggest improvement from '08 in MLB...through 136 games last season, Seattle was 53-83.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue this 3-team, 10-game roadtrip with the third (2-0) of four at the Oakland A's...this trip also includes three games in Anaheim and three in Texas...Seattle just complete a 7-3 homestand, including a 3-game sweep of the A's...tonight's game will be televised in the Northwest on FSN in HD, and broadcast on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...have won 4 straight, 6 of 8 and 9 of last 12...are 12-7 over last 19 games...also 24-11 over last 35 and 28-22 over last 50 games...won 14 of last 22 home games and are 39-30 overall at Safeco Field...trailed at some point in 33 of 72 victories (46%)...also had a lead in 33 of 64 defeats...league-best 29-16 in 1-run & 14-15 in 2-run games.

- Mariners have used 44 players in '09: 24 position & 20 pitchers...6 players have made their ML debuts.
- Ichiro is 2nd in AL in batting average (.360), and leads MLB in hits (191) and multi-hit games (63).
- The Mariners lead AL with 51 sac bunts...Franklin Gutierrez is tied for T1st in AL with 11 sac bunts.
- Seattle has batted around 5 times this season (last: 8/16 vs. NYY, 7th inning).
- Mark Lowe is just 5th pitcher in club history (7th time) with 20+ holds in a season (is 3rd in AL w/24).
- Jose Lopez leads the team with 81 RBI, 2nd-most among AL 2B (A. Hill, TOR, 91).
- Russell Branyan is just the 11th Mariner in club history to record 30 homers in a season.
- Mariners minor league affiliates have a combined 469-414 (.534) record, 5th-best in the Majors...the AZL Mariners won the Arizona League Championship for the 2nd time in 3 seasons (also in 2007).

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is the 15th (11-3) of 19 games (10 in Oakland, 9 in Seattle) between the A's and Mariners in 2009... Mariners have a 6-game winning streak against the A's... Mariners are 5-1 vs. A's in Seattle, 6-2 here in Oakland...have won 14 of last 17 against Oakland (dating back to 9/26/08)...since the start of the 2007 season, Mariners have won 34 of 52 vs. the A's...Seattle lost last year's series (10-9), and was 3-6 in Oakland...Seattle trails the all-time series 198-268, and is 86-149 in Oakland (.366)...Seattle has clinched a winning record in Oakland this season & has now had in winning record @Oakland 3 times since 1999: also 5-4 in '02 & 8-1 in '07.

COUNTDOWN TO 2,000 & 200 ... Ichiro enters tonight's game 4 hits short of 2,000 for his MLB career and 9 hits short of 200 for the season...he will likely reach 2,000 hits in the 2nd-fewest amount of games in ML history (among players who made their MLB debut in 1900 or later): Al Simmons holds the current mark for fewest games to reach 2,000 career hits (1,390 G) and George Sisler is 2nd (1,414 G)...Ichiro has played in 1,400 games...if he reaches 200 hits (on pace for 228), it will be his 9th consecutive 200-hit season, breaking the all-time record currently held by Willie Keeler (1894-1901).

AN "A" FOR THE EFFORT...Seattle is 11-3 vs. the A's this season, a .786 winning percentage; that's its best season ever vs. the A's.....here's a look at Seattle's best winning percentage vs. the A's all-time: **2009**: 11-3, .786...2007: 14-5, .737...2003: 12-7, .632...1987: 8-5, .615...1997 &1998: 7-5, .583.

9 WOULD BE FINE...Mariners are a season-high 8 games over .500 for the first time...have not been 9 games over since finishing the 2007 season 88-74.

FOUR SCORE...the Mariners have posted 4-run innings in each of the first two games of this series (the second inning last night and the first inning Thursday)...Mariners had had an inning as big as four runs just once (Aug. 29) in the previous 12 games.

IF IT WORKS, DON'T CHANGE IT ... the Mariners have won their last 4 games, and David Aardsma and Mark Lowe have figured prominently...Lowe has a pair of holds and a save (2.2 IP, 1 R) and Aardsma has three saves (3.0 IP, 1 H, 3 K).

ON THE ROAD...the Mariners are 33-34 on the road this season...since falling to 8-9 on the road on May 9, Seattle has only returned to .500 in away games three times: at 9-9, 26-26 and 29-29...have not been above .500 on the road since being 8-7 on May 7.

HE'S QUALITY...David Aardsma recorded his Major League leading 16th "quality save" Tue vs. the Angels (Brian Fuentes-LAA is tied with 16)...the Elias Sports Bureau defines a quality save in which the pitcher entered with the tying run in scoring position or protected a one-run lead for at least one inning.

PITCHING LEADERS...the Mariners lead the American League with a 3.90 ERA (529 ER, 1222.0 IP) .Seattle starters are 1st in the AL at 3.99 (354 ER/798.1 IP) and the 'pen is 3rd at 3.72 (175 ER/423.2 IP)...Seattle last led AL in ERA in 2001 (3.54)...Seattle has already used 20 pitchers, including 12 starters, while compiling the league-leading mark...no team has used that many starters & pitchers and led the AL in ERA since Boston sent 24 pitchers (13 starters) to the mound in 2000...held opponents to 1 or fewer runs 24 times (3rd-most in AL) and 2 or fewer runs 42 times (2nd-most in AL).

SWEENEY ON FIRE...Mike Sweeney has recorded a hit in 10 of his last 12 games, including 6 multihit games...over the 12-game stretch he is batting .395 (17x43) with 5 doubles and 8 RBI, raising his season batting average from .228 to .264.

30(PLUS) SOMETHING...David Aardsma recorded his 34th save Thursday (T4th in AL); he's just the 6th pitcher in club history to record a season with 30 or more saves...he joins Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02), J.J. Putz (2006-07), Mike Schooler (1989-90), Eddie Guardado (2005) and Jose Mesa (1999)...he is just the 9th player in MLB history to record a 30-save season without a prior career save heading into the season (Koch, Sasaki, Gagne, Chacon, Turnbow, Papelbon, Ray, Wood).

NO REST FOR THE WEARY...tonight is game #32 (18-13) in a stretch of 33 games in 34 days, Aug. 4-Sept. 6, for the Mariners...the club spent the one off day flying from Seattle to Detroit...it's also game #19 (11-7) in a stretch of 20 games in 20 days, Aug. 18-Sept. 6.

DID YOU KNOW?...that David Aardsma has collected a save in his last 5 appearances?...since Aug. 26 he is 0-0-5 in 5 games with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 4 H, 6 K)...it is the 2nd-longest consecutive games with a save streak of the year for DA; he collected saves in 7 straight appearances June 6-24.

ABOUT FRENCH...

- 23-year-old left-hander makes his 7th start with Seattle and 12th overall this season (and career).
- Is 3-2, 5.73 (21 ER, 33.0 IP) in his 6 starts with the Mariners...went 1-2, 3.38 (11 ER, 29.1 IP) in 7 G/5 GS with the Detroit Tigers.
- Traded to Seattle with minor league LHP Mauricio Robles on July 31, 2009 in exchange for LHP Jarrod Washburn.
- Made Major League debut in 9th inning May 15, 2009 in a relief appearance vs. the Oakland A's (1.0,0,0,0,0,1).
- Spent entire career prior to trade in Tigers organization... originally selected by Detroit in 8th rd. of 2004 June Draft.
- Born in Salina, KS and currently resides in Littleton, CO...attended Heritage High School...signed an NLI to play college baseball at UNLV.
- Participated in the inaugural AFLAC All-American High School Baseball Classic in 2003 (as 1B).

LAST START...allowed a career-high 10 hits and 7 runs Aug. 31 vs. LAA... allowed 4 runs in the 3rd and 3 runs in the 5th...allowed 2R HR to V. Guerrero in the 3rd, 3R HR to Juan Rivera in the 5th...has allowed 4 HR in last 2 games, 1 in previous 3.

THEY CALL IT A WINNING STREAK ... won consecutive starts for the first time in his career 8/21-26...over his 3 starts (Aug. 15-26) was 2-1 with a 3.06 ERA (6 ER, 17.2 IP).

MARINERS DEBUT ... earned the win in his Mariners debut Aug. 5 at Kansas City...allowed 9 hits and 4 runs in 5.0 IP in Mariners 11-6 win over KC...struck out 2. walked one and allowed 2 home runs.

SEEING BLUE ... French has recorded both of his Major League wins against the Royals: July 8 with the Tigers (6.1,6,1,1,1,2,HR) and Aug. 5 with the Mariners (5.0,9,4,4,1,2,2 HR)...he is the first starter since Mo Sanford (1991-93) to record each of his first two career victories against the same team, while pitching for different teams

THE TRADE ... acquired along w/ minor league LHP Mauricio Robles, in exchange for LHP Jarrod Washburn July 31...added to roster Aug. 1st.

FIRST WIN ... earned his first Major League win on July 8 vs. Kansas City... limited the Royals to one run over 6.1 innings in 3-1 victory...out-dueled Royals ace Zack Greinke to earn the win.

WITH THE TIGERS ... went 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA (11 ER, 29.1 IP) in 7 G/5 GS with the Tigers...as a starter, went 1-2, 3.76 (11 ER, 26.1 IP)...made 2 relief appearances in his first stint with Detroit (0-0, 0.00)

WITH THE MUD HENS ... opened the season with the Tigers AAA affiliate,

the Toledo Mud Hens...went 4-4 with a 2.98 ERA (27 ER, 81.2 IP) in 13 starts...recorded 8 quality starts at AAA, including his final 3 prior to recall by Tigers on June 29.

IL PITCHER OF THE WEEK...named International League Pitcher of the Week June 15-21...posted a 1.13 ERA (2 ER, 16.0 IP), 18 K's in 2 starts. PITCHER OF THE MONTH...Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Month for June; 1-1 w/ 1.98 ERA (8 ER, 36.1 IP)...35 K's in 7 GS w/ Toledo.

- Walked career-high 6 batters 8/10 vs. CWS...walked 14 batters in 33.0 IP with Seattle, after walking only 11 in 29.1 IP with Detroit.
- Allowed only 2 runs in the first inning in 11 starts...holding opponents to .174 avg (8x46) in the opening frame.
- MLB opponents are batting .297 (76x256), including .277 (23x83) vs. left-handers and .306 (53x173) vs. right-handers.

WAK OFF WINS ... the Mariners have recorded 11 walk-off wins, 2nd-most in the Majors behind the Yankees…one off club record for walk-off wins in a season (12, 1986)…**Ryan Langerhans** hit 2 walkoff home runs in August (8/7 vs. TB, 8/25 vs. OAK), becoming the 12th Mariner to record multi-walkoff homers in the same season...6 different players have recorded a walk-off hit this season (Lopez - 3, Langerhans - 2, Gutierrez, Beltre, Ichiro, Griffey).

EVERYDAY ICHIRO...Ichiro has recorded a hit in 108 of the 120 (90%) games he's played this season...if he keeps up his current pace (and plays every game), he'd play 146 games and be on pace to get a hit in 131 of those games...Ichiro tied the AL record with a hit in 135 games during his rookie season in 2001: Most Games, One or More Hits in a Season: NL-135, Rogers Hornsby, St. Louis, in 154 G, 1922 & Chuck Klein, Philadelphia, in 156 G 1930...AL-135, Wade Boggs, Boston, in 161 G, 1985; Derek Jeter, New York, in 158 G, 1999; Ichiro, Seattle, in 157 G, 2001.

YOU'VE BEEN ONE UPPED!...Seattle is 29-16 in one run games this season, accounting for 40% of the total wins (29 of 72)...the American League record for most 1-run victories in a season is 40, held by the 1974 (40-21) and 1970 (40-15) versions of the Baltimore Orioles...Mariners club record for 1-run victories is 31 set by the 1982 team.

SCORELESS FOR 14.0 INNINGS...the Mariners set club record for most scoreless innings in a single game (14.0) in a 1-0 victory over the White Sox on Aug. 12...the previous record was 10.0 innings in a 2-0 win at KC (7/18/01)...it was the first 1-0 extra inning win and 2nd extra inning shutout (2-0 at KC, 7/18/01) in club history...it was just the 2nd time since 2004 that a team has held its opponent scoreless in a game of at least 14.0 innings...Ken Griffey Jr. provided the heroics with a walk-off single, his 9th career game-ending hit.

30 FOR BRANYAN...Russell Branyan ranks T3rd in the American League with 31 home runs... he is just the 11th Mariner in club history to hit 30 or more homers in a season...it's now been done 23 times, by 11 guys: Ken Griffey Jr. (6x), Alex Rodriguez (4x), Jay Buhner (3x), Bret Boone (2x), Richie Sexson (2x), Edgar Martinez, Raul Ibañez, Gorman Thomas, Tino Martinez, Paul Sorrento and Branyan...on the list, Sexson, T. Martinez and Sorrento were also 1B.

.300 EVERY YEAR ... the Mariners will finish the season with a .300 hitter for the 21st consecutive season (Ichiro is currently batting .360)...the Mariners have had at least one .300 hitter in each season dating back to 1989...the streak is the longest current in the Majors (BOS/COL is 2nd with 17).

A NEW DAY, A NEW LINEUP...the Mariners have kept things interesting this season, using 118 batting lineups and 87 different defensive alignments (not counting pitcher) 136 games of the season.

DOUBLE DIGITS...Ken Griffey Jr. is T3rd on the team with 14 home runs and ranks 5th all-time with 625 home runs...he has now collected double-digits in homers in 20 seasons (1989-2001, 2003-current)...only 4 players in MLB history have more than 20 double-digit HR seasons: Hank Aaron (23), Carl Yastrzemski (22), Barry Bonds (21) and Stan Musial (21).

3 OR LESS...the Mariners set a club record allowing 3 or fewer runs in 9 consecutive games, June 1-11...went 6-3 with a 1.78 ERA (16 ER, 81.0 IP)...the old record was 7 consecutive games (6x, last: June 11-18, 2005)...also tied a record allowing 2 or fewer runs in 6 consecutive games (June 1-7)... joins St. Louis as only other team in the Majors this season to string together 9 such games and becomes first AL team to accomplish this since Minnesota in 2008.

THE ROSTER...the Mariners activated 3B Adrian Beltre from the 15-day DL, and recalled 1B Mike Carp and LHP Jason Vargas from AAA Tacoma Sept. 1...the Mariners now have 28 players on the active Major League roster.

FOOL ME ONCE...Ichiro has not gone hitless in consecutive games since Aug. 13-15, 2008...that's a streak of 161 consecutive games without going hitless in back-to-back games...the streak is the longest in the Majors since Stan Musial (174 games) in 1943-44 and the longest AL streak since Doc Cramer (191 games) in 1934-35...thanks to SABR's Trent McCotter & Elias for the research help.

THOU SHALT NOT STEAL...Seattle leads the AL in caught stealing percentage by its catchers...Mariners backstops have thrown out 35 of 96 opposing runners (36.5%), tops in the American League...adding in the pitchers caught stealing (1-3-6), and Seattle has nabbed 40 of 101, 40%.

FIELDING FUNDAMENTALS...the Mariners played a season-high 10-consecutive error-free games August 24-Sept. 2... Seattle ranked 3rd in the AL with a .990 fielding percentage in August, compared to an overall .982 season mark (12th in AL).

DOUBLE YOUR FUN... the Mariners have turned 7 double plays over the last 7 games (including 3 Tuesday), after going 6 consecutive games without a DP (8/23-28).

IF THEY SEEM LIKE CLOSE GAMES...it's only because they are...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Seattle leads the American League (and is tied with San Francisco for the ML lead) with 26 games in which 1 or 0 total runs have been scored by the end of the fifth...that is, at the end of 5.0 it's either 0-0, 1-0 or 0-1.

AN ODD RECORD...the Mariners beat the Angels Wednesday 3-0, extending their club-record with their 21st win of the season when scoring 3 or fewer runs...that mark leads the AL (DET is 2nd with 13) and ranks T1st in the Majors (STL - 21, SF - 21)...the previous club high was 19 wins in 1989... when the offense scores 3 or fewer runs, Mariners pitchers have stepped up to the challenge posting a 3.69 ERA (237 ER, 577.2 IP).
