A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have lost the season series for the second time in the last three years as they trail 4-11 with four games remaining...snapped their six-game losing streak against the Mariners last year...the A's have had three losing streaks of six or more games to Seattle and all have come in the last three years...have now lost 14 of the last 18 games to Seattle...are 3-6 in Oakland this year and 1-5 in Seattle...the six losses in Oakland are the A's second most to Seattle in the Coliseum (went 1-8 in 2007)...are 19-34 (.358) against Seattle since 2007, which is the worst mark by an American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 269-198 (.576) against Seattle, which is the best record by an AL team against the Mariners...are 150-86 in Oakland and 119-112 in Seattle.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey was named American League Rookie of the Month for August after converting all seven of his save opportunities and allowing no runs in 11 outings and 11.0 innings...he has 22 saves for the season, which is one short of the Oakland rookie record of 23 set by Huston Street in 2005...leads Major League rookies and is tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in saves...has converted each of his last 17 save opportunities, which is also one short of the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street in 2005.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On September 6, 1913 Eddie Collins steals home twice in the same against Boston to tie a major league record...on September 6, 1943 Carl Scheib becomes the youngest player to appear in an American League game at the age of 16 years, 248 days...on September 6, 1976 the A's steal seven bases in a 2-1, 11 inning win at California to run the season total to an American League record 297...Oakland would go on to steal 341 bases to best the AL record of 291 established by Washington in 1913.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 5-5 over the last 10 games and 9-11 over the last 20 games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 29-33 over that span...are 60-76 (.441) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 126 days (since May 3) and 132 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...the A's finished the season in last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION: The A's are a season high tying 21 games out of first place in the American League West and have a "tragic" number of seven for elimination from the division race...trail Boston by 18½ games in the Wild Card and the "tragic" number for elimination from the playoffs is nine...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 15-25 (.375) against American League West teams, which is the third worst record against divisional foes in the AL...the only times in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .400 in division games is 1997 (11-25, .306) and 1979 (25-53, .321)...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 20-38 (.345) record against Western division teams and 40-38 (.513) against teams from the Central and East.

THE THREE SPOT: A's number three hitters are 4 for 26 (.154) on the homestand and are batting .215 (115 for 536) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos...the four players with the most starts in the three spot are Jack Cust (33 starts, .156 average), Jason Giambi (29, .210), Scott Hairston (26, .252) and Kurt Suzuki (21, .198, 17 for 86).

STARTING PITCHING: The A's have started a rookie pitcher 98 times this year, which is an Oakland record, breaking the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 72 of the last 89 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...A's starting pitchers are 5-7 with a 3.98 ERA (51 er in 115.1 ip) over the last 20 games...are 39-55 with a 4.81 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (759.2) and wins in the American League and the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League and tied for fourth in the majors with 107 stolen bases...this marks just the second time in the last 14 years Oakland has reached the century plateau in stolen bases...the last time was in 1998 when they had 131...are batting .273 (472 for 1729) since the All-Star Break after hitting .246 before the break...have a .256 average for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...rank last in the AL in home runs (114), extra base hits (373) and slugging percentage (.388), have the third fewest runs scored (612) and triples (14) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.323)...have 441 walks and are on pace for 525 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in their last six games and have 82 errors for the season...are on pace to commit 98 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's trailed 3-0 entering the bottom of the third last night but came back to win...it was the 12th time this year the A's overcame a deficit of three or more runs to win...had just eight such wins last year...are 14-21 (.400) in one-run games, which is tied for the second worst record in one-run games in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980...are 3-9 (.250) in extra inning games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-7) for the worst record in the majors...the nine extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this seven-game homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (1-2)...went 4-5 on the last homestand and are 33-36 (.478) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Seattle (0-3) and Los Angeles (2-2) and are 27-40 (.403) on the road for the season...with one more road loss, the A's will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season...leave tomorrow for an eight-game, nine-day road trip to Chicago (two games), Minnesota (three games) and Texas (three games).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's finished have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months this year, the first time they have done that since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...in the majors, only Baltimore and Washington have finished with a losing record in all five months this year...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 815 games, an average of 50.9 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

NZALEZI GAREER LUGUG

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 16th appearance and 13th start of the season...it will be the 20th start of his career...the A's are 6-6 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in four of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two or fewer four times.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 7.29 ERA (21.0 ip, 23 h, 18 r, 17 er, 17 bb, 26 so, 5 hr) and .281 (23 for 82) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 3-0 with a 1.46 ERA and .189 opponents batting average over his previous four starts...now has a 6.07 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest among American League pitchers with at least 70.0 innings pitched.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 81 batters in 72.2 innings, an average of 10.03

strikeouts per nine innings...that is the fourth highest ratio in the American League among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched...his 81 strikeouts rank tied for sixth among AL rookies.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts in the month of August...it was the first time in his career he had an ERA under 7.00 in a month...this year, he had a 7.27 ERA in May, 7.27 in June and 7.48 in July...last year, he had a 7.25 ERA in August and 8.49 in September.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-4 with an 8.21 ERA (31 er in 34.0 ip) and .326 (46 for 141) opponents batting average in seven starts in Oakland compared to 3-1 with a 4.19 ERA (18 er in 38.2 ip) and .260 (39 for 150) opponents average in eight games, five starts on the road...has allowed 10 of his 12 home runs in Oakland.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-4 with a 7.05 ERA (35 er in 44.2 ip) and .326 (61 for 187) opponents batting average in 10 games, eight starts, at night compared to 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (14 er in 28.0 ip) and .231 (24 for 104) opponents batting average in five games, four starts, during the day...has allowed 10 of his 12 home runs at night.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .292 opponents batting average, which includes a .361 (26 for 72) mark against left-handed hitters and .269 (59 for 212) against right-handers...has yielded five of his 12 home runs to lefties and has a .694 opponents slugging percentage against lefties and .434 against righties.

SOME LIKE IT HOT: Is 4-2 with a 3.38 ERA (13 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts where game time temperature is 72 and above and 0-2 with a 12.42 ERA (23 er in 16.2 ip) in four starts with a temperature of 62 or less...is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (5 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts with the temp in between.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his four-game winning streak snapped August 15 against Chicago...it was the first winning streak of his career...compiled a 5.72 ERA during the streak, which spanned seven games, including six starts...11 of the 18 runs he allowed during the streak came in one game on July 20 against Minnesota...he ended up with a no decision in that game after the A's overcame a club record 10-run deficit to win...his ERA minus the one start against the Twins is 4.88 (38 er in 70.0 ip).

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento for the third time on June 24 and is 4-5 with a 5.91 ERA (42 er in 64.0 ip) in 13 games, 12 starts, since his return...his first stint was from May 2 to 4 and he pitched 5.0 innings of relief on May 3 in the A's 8-7, 15-inning loss at Seattle (5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...his second stint was from May 18 to 19 and he pitched 3.2 innings of relief on the 18th at Tampa Bay (6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

23-YEAR OLD: Is 23 years old, making him the fourth youngest pitcher in the A's starting rotation behind Trevor Cahill (21), Brett Anderson (21) and Vin Mazzaro (22)...has made 12 starts this year, giving the A's have four starting pitchers under the age of 24 with at least 10 starts for the first time in Oakland history...the last ML team to do that is the 2006 Florida Marlins (Nolasco, Olsen, Johnson, Sanchez) but no AL team has done it since 1979 when both Detroit (Underwood, Baker, Rozema, Petry) and Toronto (Huffman, Stieb, Lemongello, Clancy) did it...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-5 win over Kansas City last Monday...allowed three runs in the first inning on a Teahen RBI double and a Callaspo two-run single...DeJesus hit a solo home run in the second inning but the A's scored five times in the third to give him a 5-4 lead...he allowed a RBI triple to Callaspo in the fifth and was relieve by Breslow with one out in the sixth inning and the scored tied at 5-5.

GONZALEZ vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 19 h, 11 r, 9 er, 11 bb, 19 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, two starts...all four outings have come at Safeco Field...is 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip) in his two starting assignments...is 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA (10.0 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 8 so) in two games, one start, this year...pitched in relief on May 3 in the A's 8-7, 15-inning loss (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...entered the game in the 10th inning and tossed 5.0 innings and 108 pitches...then took the loss in the A's 5-3 loss on August 26...allowed a two-run home run to Lopez in the first inning, a RBI single to Hall in the third and a Hall sacrifice fly in the fifth.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 2.51 ERA in 12 games, all starts, at Triple-A Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion...had the lowest opponents batting average (.194) and ranked second in strikeouts (71)...the batting average included a .188 (28 for 149) mark against right-handed hitters and .209 (14 for 67) against left-handers...allowed all five of his home runs to righties...his opponents batting average dropped to .160 with RISP...the River Cats were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in five of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Brett Tomko (3-3, 4.40 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 20th appearance and fifth start of the season...it will be his fifth start and appearance with the A's...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento August 17 and is 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA and .235 opponents batting average in four starts with Oakland...was 1-2 with a 5.23 ERA and .247 opponents batting average in 15 appearances with New York, all in relief...was released by the Yankees on July 29 and signed a minor league contract with the A's August 5...has allowed 10 home runs in 43.0 innings, an average of 2.09 per nine innings...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss to Seattle on Thursday (5.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 2-0 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 ip, 14 h, 5 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, one start, against Chicago.

The A's bullpen leads the American League in fewest home runs (39) and is tied for the lead in strikeouts (403)...the Oakland record for strikeouts Save/Save Opportunities: 32/44 (72.7%) by the bullpen is 417 set last year...the pen also ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (455.1) and fourth in ERA (3.78)...is tied for the AL lead in first batter strikeouts (88) and has issued the third fewest first batter walks (24)...has allowed 73 of 195 (37.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has a 2.90 ERA (75 er in 232.2 ip), 12 home runs allowed and 66 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.69 ERA (116 er in 222.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 99 walks issued on the road...had a 2.81 ERA in the month of August after posting a 4.09 ERA in July, a 3.52 ERA in June, a 5.29 ERA in May and a 2.62 ERA in April...has a 4.67 ERA (9 er in 17.1 ip) over the first five games of September.
