A's vs. WHITE SOX

The A's have won the season series for the seventh time in the last nine years (one tie) as they are 5-3 entering the final game today...lost two of three in Oakland but have won four of five in Chicago...are now 51-26 (.662) against the White Sox since 2001, which is the best record by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 278-256 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 146-125 in Oakland and 132-131 in Chicago...including 50-43 at U.S. Cellular Field...al-time, the A's are 955-1011 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's collected 20 hits last night, the first time in 70 years the A's recorded 20 hits at Chicago...the last time was July 13, 1939 when the Philadelphia A's had 22 hits...it was the A's third game of 20 or more hits this year...the only other time in Oakland history the A's had three or more 20-hit games in a season was in 2000 when they had four...the A's are the only Major League team with three 20-hit games this year.

Andrew Bailey recorded his 23rd save of the season on Sunday, tying the Oakland rookie record set by Huston Street in 2005...has now converted each of his last 18 save opportunities, which also ties the Oakland rookie record set by Street...leads ML rookies and is tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in saves.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

September 9, 1945 Dick Οn Fowler no-hits the St. Louis Browns, 1-0...on **September 9**, **1958** Preston Ward hits three consecutive home runs in Kansas Citv's 8-6 win against Baltimore...on September 9, 1988 Luis Polonia becomes the third player in Oakland history to score five runs in a game in the A's 14-6 win at Kansas City...Polonia is a perfect 5 for 5 on the day and also drives in three runs...on September 9, 1990 The A's defeat the New York Yankees 7-3 complete a sweep of the to season series, 12-0.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won each of the last three games, which is the A's longest winning streak since August 3-5 when they also won three straight...have won more than three in a row just once this year and that was from June 2-8 when they won seven consecutive games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 31-33 over that span...are 62-76 (.449) for the season, which is tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 129 days (since May 3) and 135 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...the A's are 41-38 (.519) against teams from the Central and the East and 21-38 (.356) against Western division teams.

DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION: The A's are 20½ games out of first place in the American League West and have a "tragic" number of five for elimination from the division race...trail Boston by 18 games in the Wild Card and the "tragic" number for elimination from the playoffs is seven...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

STARTING PITCHING: Trevor Cahill will make the 100th start by a rookie this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 73 of the last 91 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...starting pitchers are 7-7 with a 3.95 ERA (56 er in 127.2 ip) over the last 22 games...are 41-55 with a 4.79 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (772.0) in the American League, are tied for the second fewest wins and have the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in a season high seven consecutive games (nine home runs total)...the longest streak last year was eight games from May 17 to 25...however, have just 118 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and fifth fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 139 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

OFFENSE: The 20-hit game last night boosted the A's overall batting average two points to .258, the highest it has been outside the first eight games of the season...are now batting .277 (501 for 1807) since the All-Star Break after hitting .246 before the break...however, have the third lowest average in the American League...rank fourth in the AL and tied for fourth in the majors with 108 stolen bases...this marks just the second time in the last 14 years Oakland has reached the century plateau in steals...the last time was in 1998 when they had 131...rank last in the AL in slugging percentage (.391), have the second fewest extra base hits (383), the third fewest runs scored (628) and triples (14) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.324)...have 446 walks and are on pace for 524 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

THE THREE SPOT: Ryan Sweeney had four hits last night, the most by an A's batter in the three spot since September 16 of last year, when Sweeney went 4 for 5 against Los Angeles...it was just the fifth game of three or more hits by the A's three hitter this year and they are now batting .218 (119 for 545) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors (the White Sox are second lowest, .246)...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in their last eight games and have 82 errors for the season...are on pace to commit 96 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-0), Minnesota (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip and are 28-40 (.412) on the road for the season, which is the fourth worst mark in the American League...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season...went 32-48 last year and 36-45 in 2007...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four AL teams with a losing record at home.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-21 (.400) in one-run games, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980...are 3-9 (.250) in extra inning games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-7)...the nine extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's finished have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season, the first time they have done that since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...in the majors, only Baltimore and Washington have finished with a losing record in all five months this year...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 827 games, an average of 51.7 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.



FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season and his career...the A's are 14-14 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 28 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 18 times.

RECENTLY: Is 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (10 er in 32.0 ip) and .233 (27 for 116) opponents batting average over his last five starts...however, is 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (47 er in 72.2 ip) and .293 (83 for 284) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts (since June 27) after going 5-5 with a 3.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts.

WINS: Picked up his eighth win of the season in his last start, tying Braden and Anderson for the team lead...there have been just two seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not have a 10-game winner...John Wasdin led the A's with eight wins in 1996 and Aaron Small topped the club with nine in 1997.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in losses (12) and home runs (26), tied for sixth in starts (28) and runs (89) and tied for seventh in walks (64)...is averaging 4.49 strikeouts per nine innings, which is third lowest in the

AL...his strikeout to walk ratio of 1.23 is second lowest in the majors.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Has set an Oakland rookie record with 26 home runs, topping the previous mark of 24 set by John Wasdin in 1996...his 12 losses are tied for fourth most by a rookie in Oakland history...leads Major League rookies in games started (28) and innings pitched (158.1)...is tied for seventh among American League rookies in wins (8) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (79).

THE LONG BALL: Allowed his 26th home run of the season in his last start and 20 of those have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for the most in the American League and is third most in Oakland history...20 have been hit at home, which is the most in the majors and a Coliseum record...however, 20 of the home runs have been solo shots...allowed just eight home runs in 238.2 career minor league innings.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or less in 15 of his 28 starts and is 1-8 in those starts...however, has five games with run support of nine or more and has season run support of 5.91 (104 rs in 158.1 ip), which is eighth highest in the American League

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .271 opponents batting average, which drops to .232 (32 for 138) with runners in scoring position...including .197 (13 for 66) with RISP and two outs and .111 (1 for 9) with the bases loaded...has held the opponents number three hitters to a .186 (13 for 70) batting average, which is fifth lowest in the American League.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-3 with a 2.77 ERA (15 er in 48.2 ip) and .233 (41 for 176) opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West teams and 6-9 with a 5.50 ERA (67 er in 109.2 ip) and .287 (124 for 432) in 20 starts against everyone else.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed eight runs in the first inning this year and has a 2.57 ERA (8 er in 28.0 ip) and .216 (21 for 97) opponents batting average in the inning...has a 5.04 ERA (73 er in 130.1 ip) and .280 (144 for 514) opponents average after that.

21-YEAR OLDS: Is making his 29th start of the season, which is third in Oakland history and fifth in Athletics history by a player under the age of 22...fellow 21-year old Brett Anderson has made 26 starts...this is the first time in the history of the Athletics franchise the A's have had two pitchers under the age of 22 make at least 25 starts in the same season...the last Major League team to do it is the 1980 Chicago White Sox and the only other American League team to do it is the 1912 St. Louis Browns...according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the seventh ML team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 25 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-4 win over Kansas City a week ago today in Oakland...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on a DeJesus RBI double, a Callaspo RBI ground out and a Jacobs solo home run...those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work.

CAHILL vs. CHICAGO: Is 0-0 with a 3.09 ERA (11.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 1 hr) in two career starts...his first start came in a 6-2 A's loss at Chicago on June 1...allowed a Dye sacrifice fly in the first inning and a leadoff home run to Pierzynski in the bottom of the fifth...left after 5.2 innings with the score tied at 2-2 and the bullpen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the loss...had another no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Chicago on August 16 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings before allowing a Podsednik RBI triple and a Thome sacrifice fly in the sixth...left trailing 2-0 and the A's scored single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth for the win.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Clayton Mortensen (0-2, 9.82 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth appearance and third start of the season...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento last Friday for his second stint with the A's this year and started at lost that night against Seattle for an injured Vin Mazzaro (7.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...was acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals in the Matt Holliday trade along with Brett Wallace and Shane Peterson on July 24 and was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento...combined for a 9-8 record and a 4.39 ERA in 23 starts with Sacramento and Triple-A Memphis in the Cardinals organization...made his Major League debut with St. Louis this year on June 29 (3.0 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the Twins in his career.
