A's vs. TWINS

The A's lead the season series, 4-3...all seven games have been in Oakland as the A's make their first visit to Minnesota since August 18-20 of last year...the A's have not won a season series since 2005 (have two losses and a split) and are 15-19 against Minnesota since 2006...are 13-8 in Oakland over that span and 2-11 in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 264-274 against the Twins...that includes 149-120 in Oakland and 115-154 in Minnesota...including 69-85 at the Metrodome...all-time, the A's are 968-979 against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's used eight pitchers Wednesday night in Chicago, the seventh time in Oakland history they used eight or more pitchers in a game...the record is nine on September 20, 1997 in a 15-inning game against Seattle.

Andrew Bailey recorded his 23rd save of the season on Sunday, tying the Oakland rookie record set by Huston Street in 2005...has now converted each of his last 18 save opportunities, which also ties the Oakland rookie record set by Street...leads ML rookies and ranks ninth among all AL pitchers in saves

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On September 11, 1912 Eddie Collins steals six bases in the A's 9-7 win over Detroit, an AL record that he would match 11 days later...on September 11, 1936 Hod Lisenbee ties a ML record by allowing 26 hits in a 17-2 loss to Chicago...on September 11, 1976 Mike Torrez tosses his club record third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 1-0 win at Texas...the streak is part of a string of 38.1 consecutive scoreless innings...on September 11, 1999 Doug Jones records the final out of the A's 5-4 victory at Tampa Bay to become the 11 pitcher in ML history to record 300 saves...on September 11, 2006 Frank Thomas homers in his sixth consecutive game to set an Athletics record for consecutive games with a home run.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's had their three-game winning streak snapped on Wednesday...are now 6-6 over the last 12 games and 9-9 over the last 18 games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 31-34 over that span...are 62-77 (.446) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 131 days (since May 3) and 137 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...the A's are 41-39 (.513) against teams from the Central and the East and 21-38 (.356) against Western division teams.

DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION: The A's are a season high 22 games out of first place in the American League West and have a "tragic" number of two for elimination from the division race...trail Boston by 19 games in the Wild Card and the "tragic" number for elimination from the playoffs is five...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

ON THE BASES: The A's stole a season high five bases Wednesday night in Chicago, their second five-steal game in the last 14 years (also May 11 of last year at Texas)...were caught stealing three times and the eight stolen base attempts were the A's most in a game since July 29, 1989 when they had eight steals in eight attempts...now have 113 stolen bases for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League and the majors...those are the second most stolen bases by an A's team over the last 16 years (had 131 in 1998).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost to Chicago 4-3 in 13 innings Wednesday to fall to 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games...that is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-7)...the 10 extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...dropped to 14-22 (.389) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the American League (Kansas City, 13-22)...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season as the loss on Wednesday night in Chicago dropped Oakland to 28-41 (.406) in away games this year...have the fourth worst road record in the American League...are 1-1 on this eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four AL teams with a losing record at home.

STARTING PITCHING: The A's have started a rookie pitcher in 100 games this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 74 of the last 92 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...A's starting pitchers are 41-55 with a 4.81 ERA...have the second fewest innings pitched (775.0) in the American League, are tied for the second fewest wins and have the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997.

OFFENSE: The A's had their season best streak of seven consecutive games with a home run snapped on Wednesday...have 118 home runs, which is the fewest in the American League and fifth fewest in the majors...are on pace to hit 138 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125...are batting .277 (513 for 1854) since the All-Star Break after hitting .246 before the break...are hitting .258 for the season, matching the highest the team batting average has been outside the first eight games of the season...however, it is the third lowest mark in the AL...rank last in the AL in slugging percentage (.390) and extra base hits (386), have the third fewest runs scored (631), triples (14) and strikeouts (880) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.324)...have 449 walks and are on pace for 523 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

THE THREE SPOT: Ryan Sweeney started both games of the Chicago series hitting third and went 6 for 11 (.545)...however, the A's number three hitters are batting a combined .220 (121 for 550) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors on Wednesday and now have 84 for the season...are on pace to commit 98 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's finished have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season, the first time they have done that since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...in the majors, only Baltimore and Washington have finished with a losing record in all five months this year...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 833 games, an average of 52.1 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

lost that night against Seattle for an injured Vin Mazzaro...began the season with Triple-A Memphis before earning a promotion to St. Louis on June 29...pitched just once and was optioned back to Memphis on July 1 before being dealt to Oakland in the Matt Holliday trade July 24...was assigned to Sacramento and had no decisions and a 1.64 ERA in two starts before he was brought up to Oakland August 8...started and lost that day at Kansas City and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.

TRADE: Was acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals in the Matt Holliday trade...was sent to Oakland along with Brett Wallace and Shane Peterson on July 24 and was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento...was originally selected by St. Louis as a supplemental pick following the first round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft (36th selection overall)...was rated as the Cardinals sixth best prospect by Baseball America following the 2008 season after being rated number seven after the 2007 season.

WITH ST. LOUIS: Began the season at Triple-A Memphis in the Cardinals organization, but was promoted to St. Louis on June 29...pitched the final three innings of St. Louis' 10-0 loss to San Francisco that day...allowed six runs, two earned, on five hits and a walk while striking out two, and was optioned back to Memphis on July 1 after appearing in just one game (6.00 ERA).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-6 loss at Kansas City on August 8...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a DeJesus RBI double and a Butler sacrifice fly...then allowed four runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Jacobs, a solo home run by Olivo and a DeJesus sacrifice fly...put the first two runners on base in the fifth inning and was relieved by Edgar Gonzalez, who allowed both runs to score

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Seattle a week ago today in Oakland...tossed seven innings and allowed four runs, all in the second inning...retired each of the first five batters he faced before the next six batters reached base on four hits and two walks...Wilson had a two-run single and Suzuki and Gutierrez followed with RBI singles...he then retired 16 of the final 20 batters that he

MORTENSEN vs. MINNESOTA: Is making his first career appearance.

IN THE MINORS: Was 7-6 with a 4.37 MORTENSEN'S 2009 MINOR LEAGUE STARTS ERA in 17 starts with Memphis before he was dealt to the A's organization on July 24...had no decisions and a 1.64 ERA in two starts with Sacramento before his promotion to Oakland on August 8 and then went 2-2 with a 5.91 ERA in four starts following his option...was 2-2 with a 4.45 ERA in six starts overall with the River Cats and combined for a 9-8 mark and a 4.39 ERA in 23 minor league starts overall...his teams were 12-11 (.522) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 23 starts, including one nine-inning complete game on June 7 against New Orleans...allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .271 opponents batting average, which included a .273 (75 for 275) mark against right-handed hitters and .270 (68 for 252) against left-handers...held the opposition to a .221 (30 for 136) average with runners in scoring position, including .190 (11 for 58) with RISP and two outs...allowed just 13 home runs in 137.1 innings, an average of 0.85 per nine innings.

2009 MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed just one earned run in each of his first five starts at Memphis, going 2-1 with a 1.44 ERA...then lost each of his next

two starts, allowing six runs in 6.0 innings on May 10 at Iowa and 7 runs in 5.0 innings on May 15 against Las Vegas...followed that with a season best four-game winning streak from May 22-June 7...compiled a 2.39 ERA during the winning streak...capped the streak on June 7 against New Orleans when he tossed a complete game six-hitter in the Redbirds 12-1 win...did not walk a batter and struck out a season high eight...allowed a season high nine runs in 3.1 innings in a loss on June 18 at Iowa...was 7-4 with a 4.24 ERA in 14 starts when he was promoted to St. Louis on June 29...went 0-2 with a 4.95 ERA in three starts following his option on July 1 and before his trade to the A's organization...allowed just one run in each of his first two starts with the River Cats but had a no decision in each outing...allowed nine hits and walked seven in 11.0 innings...tossed 7.0 innings in two of his four outings following his option, picking up the win each of those games.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

HP Brett Anderson (8-10, 4.45 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 27th start of the season and his career...is 5-3 with a 3.38 ERA, .232 opponents batting average and six home runs over his last 13 starts after going 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs over his first 13 starts...has received run support of two runs or less in 13 of his 26 starts and his season run support of 4.51 is ninth lowest in the American League...leads Major League rookies with 125 strikeouts, which is the third best rookie total in Oakland history...is tied for second among AL rookies in starts (26), ranks third in innings pitched (151.2) and tied for seventh in wins (8)...his 27 starts are fourth in Oakland history and tied for sixth in Athletics history by a pitcher under the age of 22...his wins are tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a 21-year old...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-5 A's win over Seattle last Saturday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against Minnesota, a 10-5 loss on June 9 in Oakland (5.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

The A's bullpen tossed 9.1 innings on Wednesday, their most innings in a game since pitching 10.0 innings in June 17, 2006 against Los Angeles (NL) in a 17-inning game...the pen has allowed just one run in the last three games (15.0 ip, 0.60 ERA) and now has a 3.67 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the AL...also ranks second with 413 strikeouts, which is four short of the Oakland record for strikeouts by the bullpen set last year (417)...has the fewest home runs (39), ranks second in innings pitched (470.1), third in fewest walks (168) and fourth in save percentage (73.3%)...has allowed 73 of 199 (36.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...is tied for the AL lead in first batter strikeouts (91) and has issued the third fewest first batter walks (24)...has a 2.88 ERA (75 er in 234.2 ip), 12 home runs allowed and 66 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.47 ERA (117 er in 235.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 102 walks issued on the road...has a 2.78 ERA (10 er in 32.1 ip) in September...had a 2.81 ERA in August, 4.09 in July, 3.52 in June, 5.29 in May and 2.62 ERA in April.

- Recorded his 23rd save of the season last Sunday, tying the Oakland rookie record for saves set by Huston Street in 2005...leads Major League rookies and ranks ninth among all American League pitchers in saves.
- Has converted each of his last 18 save opportunities dating back to June 17 and is 2-2 with a 1.62 ERA (33.1 ip, 23 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 31 so, 2 hr) over that 29-game span...the 18 consecutive saves equal the Oakland rookie record set by Street.
- Ranks second among AL relievers in strikeouts (79), third in innings pitched (74.1), fourth in ERA (2.06), tied for fourth in wins (6) and fifth in opponents batting average (.181).
- Has retired each of his last 14 first batters faced and they are hitting .145 (8 for 55) for the season, which is seventh lowest in the AL.
- Has not walked a batter over his last 16 games and 16.2 innings.
- Ranks second among AL rookies in games pitched (59) and ninth in strikeouts (79)...only four rookies in Oakland history have pitched at least 60 games in a season (Small, 71 in 1997; Street, 67 in 2005; Lacey, 64 in 1977; Fingers, 60 in 1969).
- Has a save and two losses in three outings in three outings against Minnesota this year (4.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 2 so).
- Has allowed just one run (15.1 ip, 0.59 ERA) and has converted 10 of 11 save opportunities in 13 outings on no days rest.
- Had his 12.1-inning scoreless streak snapped in the ninth inning last Saturday night when he allowed a two-run homer to Jose Lopez...it was the first home run he allowed to a right-handed hitter this year...his longest scoreless streak this year was 15.1 innings from June 14-July 17. Was named the AL Rookie of the Month for the month of August...was the sixth Oakland rookie to be named to the AL All-Star team but did not
- pitch in the game...was the only rookie named to either All-Star team this year.
- Spent the entire 2008 season at Double-A Midland...began the season in the starting rotation and went 1-8 with a 6.18 ERA and .258 opponents batting average in his 15 starts...then went 4-1 with a 0.92 ERA and .207 opponents average over his final 22 appearances, all in relief.
