#### A's vs. TWINS

The A's lead the season series, 5-3...won the first meeting in Minnesota last night after going 4-3 in Oakland...the A's have not won a season series since 2005 (have two losses and a split) and are 16-19 against Minnesota since 2006...are 13-8 in Oakland over that span and 3-11 in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 265-274 against the Twins...that includes 149-120 in Oakland and 116-154 in Minnesota...including 70-85 at the Metrodome...all-time, the A's are 969-979 against the Twins/Senators

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's scored 12 runs last night, their fourth game of 12 or more runs this year...three of those games have come against Minnesota...had 17 hits and have five games of 17 or more hits, including three against the Twins.

Andrew Bailey has 23 saves, which ties the Oakland rookie record set by Huston Street in 2005...has converted each of his last 18 save opportunities, which also ties the Oakland rookie record set by Street...leads Major League rookies and ranks ninth among all American League pitchers in saves.

Mark Ellis hit his 76<sup>th</sup> career home run as a second baseman last night, tying Dick Green's all-time Athletics record for home runs by a second baseman.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On September 12, 1964 Bob Meyer tosses a one-hitter but the A's lose to Baltimore 1-0 as the Orioles Frank Bertaina also tosses a one-hitter...on September 12, 1980 Rick Langford pitches his club record 22nd consecutive complete game in the A's 9-5 win against Kansas City...he would go on to pitch an Oakland record 22 complete games...on September 12, 1986 Terry Steinbach homers in his first major league at bat off the Indians Greg Swindell at Cleveland Stadium...he would also homer in his last at bat as an Oakland Athletic.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won four of the last five games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 32-34 over that span...are 63-77 (.450) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 42-39 (.519) against teams from the Central and the East and 21-38 (.356) against Western division teams...have spent each of the last 132 days (since May 3) and 138 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

**DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION:** The A's are a season high 22 games out of first place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and have a "tragic" number of one for elimination from the division race...trail Boston by 18½ games in the Wild Card and the "tragic" number for elimination from the playoffs is five...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season high five home runs last night, their most home runs in a game since June 17 of last year when they hit six at Arizona...it was the first time the A's hit more than four home runs at the Metrodome...have now homered in eight of the last nine games (14 home runs total) but have just 123 for the season, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the American League...are on pace to hit 142 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have seven stolen bases in the last three games, including five Wednesday night in Chicago, their second five-steal game in the last 14 years (also May 11 of last year at Texas)...now have 114 stolen bases for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League and the majors...those are the second most stolen bases by an A's team over the last 16 years (had 131 in 1998).

**OFFENSE:** The A's had a season high tying 10 extra base hits last night (five doubles, five home runs)...the other time also came against Minnesota on July 20 (six doubles, four home runs)...it was the 10<sup>th</sup> game of 10 or more extra base hits in Oakland history and fell one short of the Oakland record of 11...now have 396 extra base hits for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...are batting .361 (49 for 136) over the first three games of the road trip and now have a .279 (530 for 1809) average since the All-Star Break after hitting .246 before the break...are hitting .259 for the season, which is the highest the average has been outside the first eight games of the season...however, it is the third lowest mark in the AL...rank last in the AL in slugging percentage (.395), have the third fewest triples (14) and strikeouts (890), are tied for the third fewest runs scored (643) and have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.325)...have 455 walks and are on pace for 527 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

**THE THREE SPOT:** Ryan Sweeney is 7 for 16 (.438) in three games batting third on the road trip but the A's number three hitters are hitting a combined .220 (122 for 555) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos

STARTING PITCHING: The A's have started a rookie pitcher in 101 games this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 75 of the last 93 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...A's starting pitchers are 42-55 with a 4.78 ERA...have the second fewest innings pitched (781.0) in the American League, are tied for the third fewest wins and have the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed three errors in the last two games and now have 85 for the season...are on pace to commit 98 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-1 on this eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (1-0) and Texas (three games)...are 29-41 (.414) on the road for the season and have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lost to Chicago 4-3 in 13 innings Wednesday to fall to 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games...that is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-7)...the 10 extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...dropped to 14-22 (.389) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's finished have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season, the first time they have done that since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 839 games, an average of 52.4 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 27<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his career...this is his third professional season...the A's are 11-15 (.423) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings 14 times, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 20 times.

LAST 13 STARTS: Is 5-3 with a 3.38 ERA (31 er in 82.2 ip), .232 (71 for 306) opponents batting average and six home runs over his last 13 starts after going 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs over his first 13

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or less in 13 of his 26 starts and his season run support of 4.51 (76 rs in 151.2 ip) is ninth lowest in the American League...is 0-9 in his 13 starts with run support of two runs or less and 8-1 with run support of three runs or more.

MORE LEADERS: Is tied for sixth in the American League in grounded into double plays (20), tied for eighth in unearned runs (10) and tied for ninth in losses (10).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on six days rest today...is 4-3 with a 3.67 ERA (30 er in 73.2 ip) in 13 starts on five or more days rest and 4-7 with a 5.19 ERA (45 er in 78.0 ip) in 13 starts

on four days rest. ROOKIE LEADERS: Leads Major League rookies with 125 strikeouts, which

is the third best rookie total in Oakland history...is tied for second among American League rookies in starts (26), ranks third in innings pitched (151.2) and tied for seventh in wins (8)...has one of four shutouts by an AL rookie this year and one of nine complete games.

WINS: Picked up his eighth win of the season in his last start, tying Braden and Cahill for the team lead...there have been just two seasons in Oakland history in which the A's did not have a 10-game winner...John Wasdin led the A's with eight wins in 1996 and Aaron Small topped the club with nine in 1997.

21-YEAR OLDS WITH 8 OR MORE WINS: Has eight wins, which is tied for the fourth highest total in Oakland history by a pitcher under the age of 22...fellow 21-year old Trevor Cahill also has eight wins giving the A's two 21-year olds with at least eight wins for the first time in Oakland history...that last time it happened in franchise history was in 1966 in Kansas City (Nash, 12 and Hunter, 9)...the last Major League team to have two pitchers under the age of 22 with at least eight wins is the 1986 Texas Rangers (Ed Correia, 12 and Mitch Williams, 8).

21-YEAR OLDS WITH 25 OR MORE STARTS: Is making his 27<sup>th</sup> start of the season, which is fourth in Oakland history and tied for sixth in Athletics history by a player under the age of 22...fellow 21year old Trevor Cahill has made 29 starts...this is the first time in the history of the Athletics franchise the A's have had two pitchers under the age of 22 make at least 25 starts in the same season...the last Major League team to do it is the 1980 Chicago White Sox and the only other American League team to do it is the 1912 St. Louis Browns...according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the seventh ML team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 25 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .220 (11 for 50) average with runners in scoring position over his last 13 starts after opponents hit .386 (27 for 70) with RISP over his first 13 starts...has allowed a .317 average with RISP for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...opponents are 6 for 12 (.500) with the bases loaded.

THE LONG BALL: Has yielded 13 of his 19 home runs on the road and nine with two outs...six have been hit by the opponents number seven hitter...allowed a three-run home run to Lowell in the first inning on July 29, snapping a six-start, 39.0-inning, 154-batters homerless streak.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-2 with a 4.66 ERA in six starts in the month of August after going 2-1 with a 1.87 ERA and .168 opponents batting average in five starts...led all American League pitchers in opponents batting average in July, ranked second in ERA (Washburn, SEA 1.44) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (33)...had an ERA of 5.00 or more in each of the first three months.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win over Seattle a week ago today in Oakland...allowed three runs in the second inning on a solo home run by Sweeney and a two-run single by Johnson...those were the only runs he would allow in five innings and the A's scored four times in the third to give him the lead.

ANDERSON vs. MINNESOTA: Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 10-5 loss on June 9 in Oakland...allowed five runs on a career high 10 hits in 5.2 innings...allowed a Young RBI single in the second inning but did not allow a hit over the next three innings...then allowed a leadoff home run to Morneau in the sixth followed later by a Young RBI double and a Gomez two-run double...left trailing 5-0.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Gio Gonzalez (5-5, 5.76 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 17th appearance and 14th start of the season...is 4-3 with a 3.93 ERA and .235 opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 1-2 with a 9.33 ERA and .378 opponents batting average over his first seven game, four starts...has struck out 84 batters in 79.2 innings, an average of 9.49 strikeouts per nine innings...that is the sixth highest ratio in the American League among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched...his 84 strikeouts rank seventh among AL rookies...is 2-4 with a 7.24 ERA and .315 opponents batting average in eight starts in Oakland compared to 3-1 with a 4.19 ERA and .260 opponents average in eight games, five starts on the road...has allowed 10 of his 12 home runs in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's win over Seattle last Sunday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...had a no decision in his only career start against Minnesota, a 14-13 A's win on July 20 of this year in Oakland (2.2 ip. 10 h. 11 r. 11 er. 3 bb. 1 so)...the A's overcame an Oakland record 10-run deficit to win.

The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.00 ERA (4 er in 18.0 ip) over the last four games and now has a 3.71 ERA for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...also ranks second with 414 strikeouts, which is three short of the Oakland record for strikeouts by the bullpen set last year (417)...has the fewest home runs in the AL (39), ranks second in innings pitched (473.1), third in fewest walks (169) and fourth in save percentage (73.3%)...is tied for the AL lead in first batter strikeouts (92), is tied for second in first batter grounded into double plays (7) and has issued the third fewest first batter walks (25)...has a 2.88 ERA (75 er in 234.2 ip), 12 home runs allowed and 66 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.53 ERA (120 er in 238.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 103 walks issued on the road...has a 3.31 ERA (13 er in 35.1 ip) in September...had a 2.81 ERA in August, 4.09 in July, 3.52 in June, 5.29 in May and 2.62 ERA in April.

- Recorded his 23<sup>rd</sup> save of the season last Sunday, tying the Oakland rookie record for saves set by Huston Street in 2005...leads Major League rookies and ranks ninth among all American League pitchers in saves.
- Has converted each of his last 18 save opportunities dating back to June 17 and is 2-2 with a 1.62 ERA (33.1 ip, 23 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 31 so, 2 hr) over that 29-game span...the 18 consecutive saves equal the Oakland rookie record set by Street.
- Ranks second among AL relievers in strikeouts (79), third in innings pitched (74.1), fourth in ERA (2.06) and opponents batting average (.181) and tied for fourth in wins (6).
- Has retired each of his last 14 first batters faced and they are hitting .145 (8 for 55) for the season, which is seventh lowest in the AL.
- Has not walked a batter over his last 16 games and 16.2 innings.
- Ranks second among AL rookies in games pitched (59) and ninth in strikeouts (79)...only four rookies in Oakland history have pitched at least 60 games in a season (Small, 71 in 1997; Street, 67 in 2005; Lacey, 64 in 1977; Fingers, 60 in 1969).
- Has a save and two losses in three outings in three outings against Minnesota this year (4.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 2 so).
- Has allowed just one run (15.1 ip, 0.59 ERA) and has converted 10 of 11 save opportunities in 13 outings on no days rest.
- Had his 12.1-inning scoreless streak snapped in the ninth inning a week ago tonight when he allowed a two-run homer to Jose Lopez...it was the first home run he allowed to a right-handed hitter this year...his longest scoreless streak this year was 15.1 innings from June 14-July 17.
