A's vs. TWINS

The A's have won the season series for the first time since 2005 as they lead 6-3 entering the final game today...have won the first two games of this series and have not swept a three-game series in Minnesota since April 28-30, 2000...are 4-3 in Oakland...are now 17-19 against Minnesota since 2006, including 13-8 in Oakland and 4-11 in Minnesota...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 266-274 against the Twins...that includes 149-120 in Oakland and 117-154 in Minnesota...including 71-85 at the Metrodome...all-time, the A's are 970-979 against the Twins'.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded his 24th save of the season yesterday, breaking Huston Street's Oakland rookie record of 23 set in 2005...has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities, which breaks the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street...leads ML rookies and ranks ninth among all AL pitchers in saves.

Rajai Davis has stolen a base in four consecutive games, which is the longest streak by an Athletic since Stan Javier had a four-game streak from Aug. 31-Sept. 3, 1995.

Mark Ellis hit his 76th career home run as a second baseman Friday night, tying Dick Green's all-time Athletics record for home runs by a second baseman.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On September 13, 1953 Bob Trice becomes the first African-American to appear in a Major League game for the Athletics...on September 13, 1970 Bert Campaneris singles in the first game of a double-header at Kansas City for the 1000th hit of his Major League career...on September 13, 1971 Rick Monday's 11th inning RBI single scores Catfish Hunter to give the A's a 2-1 win at Kansas City...Hunter pitches 10 innings, allowing a run on four hits, to become the A's second 20-game winner.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and five of the last six games...with a win today, the A's would record their first sweep since June 5-7 against Baltimore in Oakland...have played 26 consecutive series without a sweep...have not swept a series of three or more games on the road since June 13-15 of last year at San Francisco...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 33-34 over that span...are 64-77 (.454) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 43-39 (.524) against teams from the Central and the East and 21-38 (.356) against Western division teams...have spent each of the last 133 days (since May 3) and 139 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION: The A's are 21 games out of first place in the American League West and have a "tragic" number of one for elimination from the division race...trail Boston by 18½ games in the Wild Card and the "tragic" number for elimination from the playoffs is four...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

POWER AND SPEED: The A's stole a season high tying five bases yesterday (also Wednesday in Chicago) after hitting a season high five home runs on Friday, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's had a five-steal game after a five-homer game (or vice versa)...the A's now have 12 stolen bases over the last four games, which are their most over a four-game span since June 2-6, 1993 when they also had 12...now have a Major League leading 65 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, which is the most by an A's team after the break since 1992 (68)...have 119 steals for the season, which is fourth most in the American League and the majors...those are the second most stolen bases by an A's team over the last 16 years (had 131 in 1998)...however, have hit just 123 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL...are on pace to hit 141 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125...the A's are 44-30 (.595) when stealing a base and 41-37 (.526) when hitting a home run.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 3.49 ERA (11 er in 28.1 ip) over the last five games, which is their second longest winning streak of the season...won seven consecutive games from June 2 to 8...are now 43-55 with a 4.76 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (788.0) in the American League and have the fourth fewest wins and the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997...the A's have started a rookie pitcher in 102 games this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 76 of the last 94 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

OFFENSE: The A's tied an Oakland record with three sacrifice flies yesterday (last: July 29, 2005 vs. Detroit)...are batting .333 (55 for 165) over the first four games of the road trip and now have a .278 (536 for 1927) average since the All-Star Break, which is fourth best in the American League...hit .246 before the break...are hitting .259 for the season, which matches the highest the average has been outside the first eight games of the season...however, it is the third lowest mark in the AL...rank last in the AL in slugging percentage (.394), second to last in extra base hits (398), have the third fewest triples (14), are tied for the third fewest runs scored (647) and have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fourth fewest strikeouts (900)...have 461 walks and are on pace for 530 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508.

THE THREE SPOT: A's number three hitters are hitting a combined .218 (122 for 559), which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos...the four players with the most starts in the three spot are Jack Cust (33 starts, .156 average), Jason Giambi (29, .210), Scott Hairston (26, .252) and Kurt Suzuki (22, .189, 17 for 90).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last three games and now have 85 for the season...are on pace to commit 98 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-0) and Texas (three games)...are 30-41 (.423) on the road for the season and have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost to Chicago 4-3 in 13 innings Wednesday to fall to 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games...that is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-7)...the 10 extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...dropped to 14-22 (.389) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.


THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 845 games, an average of 52.8 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 17^{th} appearance and 14^{th} start of the season...it will be the 21^{st} start of his career...the A's are 7-6 (.538) in his starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in five of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two or fewer five times.

LAST NINE STARTS: Is 4-3 with a 3.93 ERA (23 er in 52.2 ip) and .235 (46 for 196) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 1-2 with a 9.33 ERA and .378 opponents batting average over his first seven game, four starts.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 84 batters in 79.2 innings, an average of 9.49 strikeouts per nine innings...that is the sixth highest ratio in the American League among pitchers with 75 or more innings pitched...his 84 strikeouts rank seventh among AL rookies.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts in the month of August...it was the first time in his career he had an ERA under 7.00 in a month...this year, he had a 7.27 ERA in May, 7.27 in June and 7.48 in July...last year, he had a 7.25 ERA in August and 8.49 in September.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-4 with a 7.24 ERA (33 er in 41.0 ip) and .315 (52 for 165) opponents batting average in eight starts in Oakland compared to 3-1 with a 4.19 ERA (18 er in 38.2 ip) and .260 (39 for 150) opponents average in eight games, five starts on the road...has allowed 10 of his 12 home runs in Oakland.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-4 with a 7.05 ERA (35 er in 44.2 ip) and .326 (61 for 187) opponents batting average in 10 games, eight starts, at night compared to 3-1 with a 4.11 ERA (16 er in 35.0 ip) and .234 (30 for 128) opponents batting average in six games, five starts, during the day...has allowed 10 of his 12 home runs at night.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .289 opponents batting average, which includes a .342 (27 for 79) mark against left-handed hitters and .271 (64 for 236) against right-handers...has yielded five of his 12 home runs to lefties and has a .658 opponents slugging percentage against lefties and .424 against rightes.

SOME LIKE IT HOT: Is 4-2 with a 3.38 ERA (13 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts where game time temperature is 72 and above and 0-2 with a 12.42 ERA (23 er in 16.2 ip) in four starts with a temperature of 62 or less...is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts with the temp in between.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento for the third time on June 24 and is 5-5 with a 5.58 ERA (44 er in 71.0 ip) in 14 games, 13 starts, since his return...his first stint was from May 2 to 4 and he pitched 5.0 innings of relief on May 3 in the A's 8-7, 15-inning loss at Seattle (5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...his second stint was from May 18 to 19 and he pitched 3.2 innings of relief on the 18th at Tampa Bay (6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

23-YEAR OLD: Is 23 years old and along with Anderson, Cahill and Mazzaro is one four A's starting pitchers under the age of 24 to make at least 10 starts this year...this is the first time in Oakland history the A's have had four starting pitchers under the age of 24 with at least 10 starts...the last Major League team to do that is the 2006 Florida Marlins (Nolasco, Olsen, Johnson, Sanchez) but no American League team has done it since 1979 when both Detroit (Underwood, Baker, Rozema, Petry) and Toronto (Huffman, Stieb, Lemongello, Clancy) did it...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win over Seattle a week ago today...tossed a career high 7.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Lopez in the first inning and the A's scored a run in the fourth to tie the game...he then allowed a RBI single to Beltre in the sixth but Hairson hit a grand slam in the seventh inning for the win.

GONZALEZ vs. MINNESOTA: Had a no decision in his only career start, a 14-13 A's win on July 20 of this year in Oakland...allowed a career high 11 runs on a career high tying 10 hits in just 2.2 innings...is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to allow 11 or more runs in a game, the first since Barry Zito on April 9, 2005 (11 r, 3.1 ip)...is the first to do it in less than 3.0 innings...is the third pitcher to allow at least 11 earned runs along with Paul Mitchell (11 on June 26, 1976 against Minnesota) and Mike Oquist (14 on August 3, 1998 against New York)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is just the second starting pitcher since 1900 to avoid a loss in a game in which he pitched fewer than three innings and gave up at least 11 runs...the other was the Rangers' Scott Feldman last year on August 12 at Boston (2.2 ip, 12 r)...all 11 runs scored on home runs with two outs...Kubel had a three-run home run in the first, Morneau had a grand slam and Cuddyer a solo home run in the second and Morneau hit a three-run home run in the third...left trailing 11-2 and the Twins built a 12-2 lead before the A's came back with three in the third, two in the fourth and seven in the seventh.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 4-1 with a 2.51 ERA in 12 games, all starts, at Triple-Sacramento...ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his promotion...had the lowest opponents batting average (.194) and ranked second in strikeouts (71)...the batting average included a .188 (28 for 149) mark against right-handed hitters and .209 (14 for 67) against left-handers...allowed all five of his home runs to righties...his opponents batting average dropped to .160 (8 for 50) with runners in scoring position...the River Cats were 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in five of his 12 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer six times

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
