### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last seven games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 33-35 over that span...are 64-78 (.451) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 134 days (since May 3) and 140 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...have played 27 consecutive series since their last sweep, June 5-7 against Baltimore.

**DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION:** The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West yesterday in game 142 as they now trail Los Angeles by a season high tying 22 games with 20 games remaining...trail Boston by a season high 20 games in the Wild Card and the "tragic" number for elimination from the playoffs is one...the last time the A's were more than 20 games out of a playoff spot was the end of the 1997 season when they finished 25 games back in the AL West...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 16-25 (.391) against American League West teams, which is the third worst record against divisional foes in the AL...the only times in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .400 in division games is 1997 (11-25, .306) and 1979 (25-53, .321)...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 21-38 (.356) record against Western division teams and 43-40 (.518) against teams from the Central and East.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have stolen a season high five bases two times over the last four games (Wednesday and Saturday) and now have a Major League leading 65 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, which are the most by an A's team after the break since 1992 (68)...have 119 steals for the season, which is fourth most in the American League and the majors...those are the second most stolen bases by an A's team over the last 16 years (had 131 in 1998).

**OFFENSE:** The A's were shutout for the eighth time this year yesterday, the first time since July 19 against Los Angeles, a span of 51 games...that was the A's longest streak without being shutout over the last two years...are batting .323 (65 for 201) over the first five games of the road trip and now have a .278 (546 for 1963) average since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the American League...hit .246 before the break...are hitting .259 overall, which matches the highest the average has been outside the first eight games of the season...however, it is the third lowest mark in the AL...rank last in the AL in home runs (123), slugging percentage (.393) and extra base hits (399), are tied for the second fewest triples (14), have the third fewest runs scored (647) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.325)...have 464 walks and are on pace for 529 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...are on pace to hit 140 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

**THE THREE SPOT:** A's number three hitters are hitting a combined .218 (123 for 564), which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos...the four players with the most starts in the three spot are Jack Cust (33 starts, .156 average), Jason Giambi (29, .210), Scott Hairston (26, .252) and Kurt Suzuki (23, .189, 18 for 95).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 43-56 with a 4.82 ERA...have the second fewest innings pitched (791.0) in the American League, are tied for the third fewest wins and have the fourth highest ERA...are the only AL team with just one complete game...the Oakland record for fewest complete games is two in 1997 and the record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 103 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 77 of the last 95 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed three errors in the last four games and now have 85 for the season...are on pace to commit 97 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-2 on this eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (three games)...are 30-42 (.417) on the road for the season and have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...return home following the game Wednesday for an eight-game homestand against Cleveland (four games) and Texas (four games).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lost to Chicago 4-3 in 13 innings last Wednesday to fall to 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games...that is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-7)...the 10 extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...dropped to 14-22 (.389) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 851 games, an average of 53.2 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

### A's vs. RANGERS

The season series is even at six games each as the A's are 4-2 in Oakland and 2-4 in Texas...Oakland has lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons against the Rangers and are 31-38 against Texas since 2006...the A's are 272-282 against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 145-131 in Oakland and 127-151 in Texas...including 60-63 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 369-364 against the Rangers/Senators.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's were shutout yesterday 8-0 and collected 10 hits...it was the seventh time in Oakland history the A's collected 10 or more hits in a game without scoring a run, the first time since September 29, 1985 against Chicago when they tallied 10 hits in a 3-0 loss...left 12 runners on base, the fourth time in Oakland history they stranded at least 12 in a shutout loss.

**Andrew Bailey** recorded his 24<sup>th</sup> save of the season Saturday, breaking Huston Street's Oakland rookie record of 23 set in 2005...has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities, which breaks the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street...leads ML rookies and ranks ninth among all AL pitchers in saves.

**Mark Ellis** hit his 76<sup>th</sup> career home run as a second baseman Friday night, tying Dick Green's all-time Athletics record for home runs by a second baseman.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

On **September 14, 1929** the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox...on **September 14, 1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20<sup>th</sup> game for the fourth consecutive season...on **September 14, 1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269<sup>th</sup> career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs.

**FOR STARTERS:** Was selected from Triple-A Sacramento August 17 and will be making his sixth start with the A's...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments...it will be his 21<sup>st</sup> appearance and sixth start of the season as he also made 15 relief appearances with the Yankees this year...it will be the 266<sup>th</sup> start of his career.

**99 WINS:** Picked up the 99<sup>th</sup> win of his career in his last start last Tuesday in Chicago...is attempting to become one of 38 active pitchers with 100 wins...had 89 wins over his first 10 seasons from 1997-2006 but has just 10 wins over the last three years.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Is 3-1 with a 3.90 ERA (12 er in 27.2 ip) and .245 (26 for 106) opponents batting average in five appearances with Oakland, all as a starter...was 1-2 with a 5.23 ERA and .247 opponents batting average in 15 appearances with New York, all in relief...in his career, he is 91-92 with a 4.64 ERA (821 er in 1591.1 ip) in 265 career starts and 8-10 with a 4.95 ERA (109 er in 198.0 ip) in 123 relief appearances.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed five home runs in his last two starts (11.0 ip) and has 12 home runs in 48.1 innings for the season, an average of 2.23 per nine innings...has allowed nine of his 12 home runs against right-handed hitters.

**BRIEFLY:** Was signed by the Yankees to a minor league contract on February 20 and began the season at Triple-A Scranton-Wilkes Barre...went 1-0 with four saves and a 0.64 ERA in 10 relief appearances and was selected by New York on May 9...was 1-2 with a 5.23 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Yankees and was designated for assignment on July 21...was released on July 29 and signed a minor league contract with the A's organization on August 5...was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento and had no decisions and a 7.94 ERA in three games, two starts...selected by Oakland on August 17.

**VETERAN STARTER:** Made his first start for the A's at the age of 36 years, 132 days, making him the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's this year by nearly five years (Giese, 31 years, 352 days)...is the oldest pitcher to start a game for the A's since Tom Candiotti faced Tampa Bay on June 2, 1999 at 41 years, 275 days...today will be just the 11<sup>th</sup> game this year in which the A's starting pitcher has been at least 26 years of age...the average age of the 13 pitchers to start a game for the A's this year is 25.2 years.

**START BY START WITH OAKLAND:** Combined with Breslow, Ziegler and Bailey on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over New York **August 17**...tossed five of the innings and allowed five of the hits...the biggest threat came in the third inning when he loaded the bases with one out before getting Rodriguez to ground into a pitcher-to-home-first double play...it was his first win as a starter since May 16, 2008 at Florida...won his second consecutive start in the A's 9-4 win over Detroit **August 23**...threw six innings, allowing one run on a leadoff home run to Granderson...retired nine straight batters at one point, including retiring the sides in order in the second and third innings...had a no decision in the A's 11-7 loss at Los Angeles **August 28**...allowed just one run over the first five innings, a two-out solo home run by Morales in the second inning...had a 6-1 lead when he allowed a one-out single to Guerrero in the sixth inning...retired the next batter before he was relieved by Ziegler, who allowed the run to score...the Angels then scored seven unearned runs in the seventh inning and Ziegler was charged with the blown save and loss...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-4 loss to Seattle **September 3** in Oakland...allowed six runs in 5.2 innings after allowing three runs in 16.2 innings over his first three starts with the A's...allowed a pair of two-run home runs in the first inning to Gutierrez and Hall in the first inning, but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first and one more in the second...allowed another two-run home run to Johjima in the fourth inning.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-3 win at Chicago last Tuesday...the A's scored five times in the first and he had an 8-8 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Kotsay in the fourth inning...also allowed a solo home run to Konerko in the sixth and left after 5.1 innings with a 9-3 lead.

**TOMKO vs. TEXAS:** Is 1-3 with a 7.94 ERA (34.0 ip, 51 h, 30 r, 30 er, 16 bb, 21 so, 8 hr) and .352 (51 for 145) opponents batting average in 13 career appearances, five starts...is 1-2 with a 7.08 ERA (16 er in 20.1 ip) in nine games, two starts, in his home ballparks and 0-1 with a 9.22 ERA (14 er in 13.2 ip) in four games, three starts, at Rangers Ballpark...is 1-2 with an 8.74 ERA (22 er in 22.2 ip) in his five starting assignments...made two relief appearances against the Rangers earlier this year while pitching for New York and did not allow a run...pitched on consecutive days on June 2 (1.0 ip, 1 so) and 3 (3.0 ip, 2 h, 3 so).

**WITH NEW YORK:** Tossed two or more innings in five of his 15 relief appearances and allowed at least one run in seven of his appearances...stranded all six of his inherited runners and first batters faced were 3 for 15 (.200)...yielded just two runs over his first seven outings for a 2.16 ERA...then allowed seven runs over his next three outings (3.2 ip, 17.18 ERA), including four in 0.2 innings on June 12 at New York (NL) and three in 2.0 innings on June 21 at Florida...allowed two runs over his final four outings (6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA).

**MINOR LEAGUE RECAP:** Combined for a 1-0 record and a 2.75 ERA (19.2 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 25 so, 1 hr) in 13 games, including two starts, with Scranton-Wilkes Barre and Sacramento...converted all four of his save opportunities...allowed a .227 opponents batting average, including .261 (12 for 46) against right-handed hitters and .172 (5 for 29) against left-handers...opponents were 4 for 20 (.200) with runners in scoring position...was 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA in 10 relief appearances with the Yankees and 0-0 with a 7.94 ERA in three games, two starts, with the River Cats...did not allow a run in nine of his 10 outings with the SWB Yankees, including each of his first five (7.1 ip)...allowed one run in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning of a 17-14, 13-inning win at Rochester...did not allow a run over his final four outings and 4.2 innings before the Yankees called on May 9...tossed a scoreless inning of relief in his first outing with Sacramento on August 5 but his final two outings were starts...had no decisions and a 9.64 ERA in his two starts, tossing 1.2 innings on August 8 against Oklahoma City and August 12 against New Orleans as he built up his pitch count.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Edgar Gonzalez (0-2, 4.92 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 24<sup>th</sup> appearance and fourth start of the season...was added to the starting rotation September 1 when the A's expanded to a six-man rotation and had a no decision that day in a 4-3 loss to Kansas City (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 0-1 with a 4.20 ERA in three starts this year...pitched in relief last Wednesday in the A's 4-3, 13-inning loss at Chicago and took the loss (1.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er)...is 0-1 with a 5.21 ERA in 20 relief appearances...is 0-0 with a 3.34 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 14 games in Oakland and 0-2 with a 6.94 ERA and .333 average in nine games on the road...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Texas, a start this year on May 29 in the A's 5-2 loss in the second game of the doubleheader (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 4 so).
