A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series, 7-6...are 4-2 in Oakland and 3-4 in Texas...Oakland has lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons against the Rangers and are 32-38 against Texas since 2006...the A's are 273-282 against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 145-131 in Oakland and 128-151 in Texas...including 61-63 at Rangers Ballpark...have an alltime record of 370-364 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The shutout by Brett Tomko last night was the first complete game shutout by an A's pitcher at Rangers Ballpark...it was just the third time the A's shutout Texas in this ballpark: June 19, 1994 (5-0) and June 26, 2003 (13-0).

Andrew Bailey recorded his 24th save of the season Saturday, breaking Huston Street's Oakland rookie record of 23 set in 2005...has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities, which breaks the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street...leads ML rookies and ranks ninth among all AL pitchers in saves.

Mark Ellis hit his 76th career home run as a second baseman Friday night, tying Dick Green's all-time Athletics record for home runs by a second baseman.

Ryan Sweeney tied an Oakland record with three doubles last night.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On **September 15, 1931** the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommell defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...on **September 15, 1971** the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...on **September 15, 1990** Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137th game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games...have not won or lost more than three games in a row since June 29 and are 34-35 over that span...are 65-78 (.455) for the season, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...have spent each of the last 135 days (since May 3) and 141 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...have played 27 consecutive series since their last sweep, June 5-7 against Baltimore.

DEFICITS AND ELIMINATION: The A's were officially eliminated from the American League West Sunday in game 142...trail Boston by 19½ games in the Wild Card and the "tragic" number for elimination from the playoffs is one...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143...that marked the earliest the A's were eliminated from the West or the playoffs since they were eliminated in game 140 in 1997.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 17-25 (.405) against American League West teams, which is the third worst record against divisional foes in the AL...the only times in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .400 in division games is 1997 (11-25, .306) and 1979 (25-53, .321)...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 22-38 (.367) record against Western division teams and 43-40 (.518) against teams from the Central and East.

STARTING PITCHING: Brett Tomko tossed the A's second complete game of the season last night and both complete games have been shutouts...the two complete games are tied for the fewest in the American League and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...A's starting pitchers are now 44-56 with a 4.77 ERA...have the second fewest innings pitched (800.0) in the American League, the fourth fewest wins and the fourth highest ERA...the Oakland record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997...the A's have started a rookie pitcher 103 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 77 of the last 96 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a season high five bases two times over the last five games (Wednesday and Saturday) and now have a Major League leading 65 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, which are the most by an A's team after the break since 1992 (68)...have 119 steals for the season, which is fourth most in the American League and the majors...those are the second most stolen bases by an A's team over the last 16 years (had 131 in 1998).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .322 (77 for 239) over the first six games of the road trip and now have a .279 (558 for 2001) average since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the American League...hit .246 before the break...are hitting .259 overall, which matches the highest the average has been outside the first eight games of the season...however, it is the third lowest mark in the AL...rank last in the AL in home runs (123) and slugging percentage (.394), second to last in extra base hits (406), are tied for the second fewest triples (14) and have the fourth fewest runs scored (656) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.326)...have 466 walks and are on pace for 528 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...are on pace to hit 139 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

THE THREE SPOT: Ryan Sweeney is 10 for 21 (.476) in four starts in the three spot on the road trip but the A's number three hitters are hitting a combined .221 (126 for 569) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos...the four players with the most starts in the three spot are Jack Cust (33 starts, .156 average), Jason Giambi (29, .210), Scott Hairston (26, .252) and Kurt Suzuki (23, .189, 18 for 95).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last five games and now have 85 for the season...are on pace to commit 96 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (1-0)...need one more win to clinch their second winning road trip of more than one series this year...went 4-2 against Kansas City and Baltimore, August 7-12...are 31-42 (.425) on the road for the season and have clinched a losing record for the third consecutive season...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...return home following the game tomorrow for an eight-game homestand against Cleveland (four games) and Texas (four games).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-7)...the 10 extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...are 14-22 (.389) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 857 games, an average of 53.6 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 24th appearance and fourth start of the season...it will be the 39th start of his career...the A's have lost each of his three starting assignments this year and his teams are 12-26 (.176) when he starts in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was added to the starting rotation September 1 when the A's expanded to a six-man rotation and had a no decision that day against Kansas City...is now 0-1 with a 4.20 ERA (7 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts this year...was selected by Oakland on May 19 and made two starts before moving to the bullpen...is 0-1 with a 5.21 ERA (22 er in 38.0 ip) in 20 relief appearances...is now 8-20 with a 5.71 ERA (123 er in 194.0 ip) in 38 career starts and 6-3 with a 5.94 ERA (77 er in 116.2 ip) in 65 career relief appearances.

LIMITED ACTION: Pitched in relief last Wednesday at Chicago, which was just his second outing over the last 30 days...has pitched just three times over the last 37 days and four times over the last 43 days.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-0 with a 3.34 ERA (11 er in 29.2 ip) and .219 (23 for 105) opponents batting average in 14 games in Oakland and 0-2 with a 6.94 ERA (18 er in 23.1 ip) and .333 (33 for 99) average in nine games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .221 (21 for 95) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters and .321 (35 for 109) against left-handers...has 8 walks and 21 strikeouts against righties and 15 walks and 13 strikeouts against lefties...has yielded a .326 (31 for 95) average against the one through four hitters and .229 (25 for 109) to the five through nine hitters.

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run over his first 20 games and 45.1 innings...then allowed a home run to the first batter he faced on August 15 against Chicago (Thome)...has allowed just one home run in 53.0 innings this year, which equals the fewest home runs among American League pitchers with 20 or more innings pitched (Tejeda KC, 1 hr in 53.1 innings).

MORE RELIEF: Tossed at least 1.0 inning in each of his 20 relief appearances including 2.0 or more 11 times...his longest outing was 3.2 innings on August 8 at Kansas City...allowed 2 of 11 (18.2%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced hit .211 (4 for 19)...allowed just two runs over his first four relief appearances (7.0 ip, 2.57 ERA) but then allowed nine runs in 9.2 innings over his next five outings (8.38 ERA)...posted a 3.00 ERA (5 er in 15.0 ip) over an eight-game stretch from July 3 to August 2...has allowed six runs over his final three relief outings (6.1 ip, 8.53 ERA).

BRIEFLY: Was signed by the A's as a free agent to a minor league contract on February 9 and went 1-2 with a 10.93 ERA in six games, three starts, this spring...began the season at Triple-A Sacramento and was 3-2 with a 5.22 ERA in seven games, all starts, when he was selected by Oakland on May 19.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his A's debut, an 8-7 loss to Arizona in 11 innings May 23 in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Drew in the first inning and that began a stretch of nine consecutive batters retired...allowed four hits and a walk over the first five innings and then walked the first two batters in the sixth...was relieved by Wuertz with a 5-1 lead but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning to hand him a no decision.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the second game of the doubleheader on May 29 at Texas...the A's scored a run in the top of the first but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the first on RBI doubles by Hamilton and Blalock and a two-run single by Teagarden...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Young in the fourth inning.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss on September 1 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Olivo in the second...that was the only run he would allow in 5.0 innings pitched...left with the scored tied at 1-1 and the bullpen allowed three runs in the sixth inning for the loss.

LAST APPEARANCE: Tossed 1.2 innings of relief in the A's 4-3, 13 inning loss at Chicago last Wednesday...entered the game with runners on first and third and two outs in the 11th inning and after hitting Konerko, he got Dye to ground into a force out...allowed a one out RBI double to Pierzynski in the 13th inning and took the loss.

LAST WIN: Has not won a game since April 24, 2008 at Los Angeles (NL) while pitching for Arizona...allowed three runs on seven hits in 5.1 innings in a 6-4 Diamondbacks victory...is 0-4 with a 5.87 ERA (50 er in 76.2 ip) in 35 games, including four starts, since then.

GONZALEZ vs. TEXAS: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start this year on May 29 in the A's 5-2 loss in the second game of the doubleheader (see second start above).

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-2 with a 5.22 ERA in seven starts with Sacramento...allowed a .300 opponents batting average, including .323 (21 for 65) against left-handed hitters and .284 (27 for 95) against right-handers...allowed four home runs, but just one over his last five starts and 27.2 innings...was 2-1 with a 3.47 ERA in four starts at home and 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA in three starts on the road...tossed six or more innings in two of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer four

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (8-12, 4.74 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season and his career...is 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA and .244 opponents batting average over his last six starts...has set an Oakland rookie record with 26 home runs, his 12 losses are tied for fourth most and he will become the seventh rookie in Oakland history to start 30 games...20 of his 26 home runs have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for the most in the American League and is third most in Oakland history...20 have been solo shots...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss in 13 innings last Wednesday at Chicago (3.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (13.0 ip, 13 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in two career starts against Texas.
