A's vs. RANGERS

The A's lead the season series, 8-6...have won the first two games of this series and have not swept a series against the Rangers since July 21-24, 2005, a four-game series at Oakland...have not swept a series in Texas since September 12-14, 2003, a three-game series...are 4-2 in Oakland this year and 4-4 in Texas...Oakland has lost the season series in each of the previous three seasons against the Rangers and are 33-38 against Texas since 2006...the A's are 274-282 against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 145-131 in Oakland and 129-151 in Texas...including 62-63 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 371-364 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's allowed one run last night after shutting out the Rangers Monday...the last time Oakland allowed one run to Texas over a two-game stretch in the same series was August 3-4, 1992 at Texas (won 4-1 and 9-0).

Andrew Bailey recorded his 24th save of the season Saturday, breaking Huston Street's Oakland rookie record of 23 set in 2005...has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities, which breaks the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street...leads Major League rookies and ranks ninth among all American League pitchers in saves.

Rajai Davis stole his 37th base of the season last night, which is tied for fourth in the American League and the most by an Athletic not named Rickey Henderson since Carney Lansford had 37 steals in 1989...he is batting .347 (69 for 199) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best average in the All

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the first two games of this series and need a win today to record their first series sweep since June 5-7 against Baltimore in Oakland...have played 27 series since then...have not swept a series of three or more games on the road since June 13-15 of last year at San Francisco...have now won four of the last five games and seven of the last nine...went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 35-35 since then (June 29)...have spent each of the last 136 days (since May 3) and 142 days this year in sole possession of last place in the American League West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998).

ELIMINATED FROM THE PLAYOFFS: The A's were officially eliminated from the playoffs last night in game 144 as they trail Boston by 19½ games in the Wild Card with 18 games remaining...were officially eliminated from the American League West Sunday in game 142...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the West on September 7, an off day between games 142 and 143, and were eliminated from the playoffs on September 8 in game 143.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-2 on this eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (2-0) and have clinched just their second winning road trip of more than one series this year...went 4-2 against Kansas City and Baltimore, August 7-12...are now 13-10 (.565) over the last 23 road games but are 32-42 (.432) for the season...will finish with a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home...return home following the game tonight for an eight-game homestand against Cleveland (four games) and Texas (four games).

STARTING PITCHING: Edgar Gonzalez started last night after Brett Tomko started on Monday marking just the seventh time this year and the first time since May 9-10 the A's had back-to-back games in which they did not start a rookie...have started a rookie pitcher 103 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 77 of the last 97 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2...starters are 44-56 with a 4.76 ERA...have the second fewest innings pitched (804.0) in the American League, are tied for the third fewest wins and have the fourth highest ERA...the Oakland record for fewest innings pitched in a non-strike season is 858.2 in 1997...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the American League and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a season high five bases two times over the last six games (last Wednesday and Saturday) and now have a Major League leading 66 stolen bases since the All-Star Break, which are the most by an A's team after the break since 1992 (68)...have 120 steals for the season, which is fourth most in the American League and the majors...those are the second most stolen bases by an A's team over the last 16 years (had 131 in 1998).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .314 (87 for 277) over the first seven games of the road trip and now have a .279 (568 for 2039) average since the All-Star Break, which is third best in the American League...lead the AL in doubles after the break (128), rank third in runs (301) and are fourth in extra base hits (188)...for the season, the A's rank last in the AL in home runs (123) and slugging percentage (.394), second to last in extra base hits (408), are tied for the second fewest triples (15) and are fourth in lowest batting average (.259), lowest on-base percentage (.326) and fewest runs scored (662)...have 473 walks and are on pace for 532 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...are on pace to hit 138 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

THE THREE SPOT: Ryan Sweeney is 11 for 24 (.458) in five starts in the three spot on the road trip but the A's number three hitters are hitting a combined .222 (127 for 572) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos...the four players with the most starts in the three spot are Jack Cust (33 starts, .156 average), Jason Giambi (29, .210), Scott Hairston (26, .252) and Kurt Suzuki (23, .189, 18 for 95).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four consecutive games without an error and have 85 for the season...are on pace to commit 96 errors...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's have a four-game winning streak against American League West teams but are 18-25 (.418) for the season...the only times in Oakland history the A's finished with a winning percentage under .400 in division games is 1997 (11-25, .306) and 1979 (25-53, .321)...went 5-13 against the National League West giving the A's a 23-38 (.377) record against Western division teams and 43-40 (.518) against teams from the Central and East.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-10 (.231) in extra inning games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Pittsburgh, 2-8)...the 10 extra inning losses are the A's most in a season since 1996 when they lost 11 and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in extra inning games is .273 (3-8) in 1970...are 14-22 (.389) in one-run games, which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League...have not had a losing record in one-run games since 1998 (16-19) and the Oakland record for lowest winning percentage in one-run games is .381 (16-26) in 1980.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 863 games, an average of 53.9 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season and his career...the A's are 14-15 (.483) in his starting assignments...has tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 29 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

RECENTLY: Is 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA (13 er in 37.0 ip) and .244 (32 for 131) opponents batting average over his last six starts...however, is 3-7 with a 5.95 ERA (50 er in 75.2 ip) and .294 (88 for 295) opponents batting average over his last 14 starts (since June 27) after going 5-5 with a 3.68 ERA and .253 opponents batting average over his first 15 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in losses (12), tied for fourth in home runs (26), tied for sixth in runs (92), tied for seventh in starts (29) and tied for eighth in walks (66)...is averaging 4.52 strikeouts per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL...his strikeout to walk ratio of 1.23 is second lowest in the majors.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Has set an Oakland rookie record with 26 home runs, topping the previous mark of 24 set by John Wasdin in 1996...his 12 losses are tied for fourth most by a rookie in Oakland history...will become the seventh rookie in

Oakland history to start 30 games today...leads Major League rookies in games started (29)...ranks second among American League rookies in innings pitched (161.1) and tied for eighth in wins (8) and strikeouts (81).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 26 home runs and 20 of those have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for the most in the American League and is third most in Oakland history...20 have been hit at home, which is the most in the majors and a Coliseum record...however, 20 of the home runs have been solo shots...allowed just eight home runs in 238.2 career minor league innings...allowed at least one home run in nine consecutive games from June 22 to August 6 (15 home runs total), which equaled the third longest streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Gil Heredia had a nine-game streak from June 24-August 5, 2000.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received run support of two runs or less in 16 of his 29 starts and is 1-8 in those starts...however, has five games with run support of nine or more and has season run support of 5.91 (106 rs in 161.1 ip), which is eighth highest in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .273 opponents batting average, which drops to .226 (33 for 146) with runners in scoring position...including .188 (13 for 69) with RISP and two outs and .111 (1 for 9) with the bases loaded...has held the opponents number three hitters to a .183 (13 for 71) batting average, which is fifth lowest in the American League.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-3 with a 2.77 ERA (15 er in 48.2 ip) and .233 (41 for 176) opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West teams and 6-9 with a 5.59 ERA (70 er in 112.2 ip) and .289 (129 for 447) in 21 starts against everyone else.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed nine runs in the first inning this year and has a 2.79 ERA (9 er in 29.0 ip) and .225 (23 for 102) opponents batting average in the inning...has a 5.10 ERA (75 er in 132.1 ip) and .281 (147 for 524) opponents average after that.

21-YEAR OLDS: Will become the third pitcher under the age of 22 in Oakland history and the fifth in Athletics history to make 30 starts today...fellow 21-year old Brett Anderson has made starts...this is the first time in the history of the Athletics franchise the A's have had two pitchers under the age of 22 make at least 25 starts in the same season...the last Major League team to do it is the 1980 Chicago White Sox and the only other American League team to do it is the 1912 St. Louis Browns...according to baseball-reference.com, the A's are just the seventh ML team since 1900 to have two 21-year olds make at least 25 starts each...all ages are based on players age as of June 30.

CAHILL vs. TEXAS: Is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (13.0 ip, 13 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in two career starts...the win came in the A's 9-4 victory in Oakland on May 7...allowed just one run on five hits in 7.0 innings and did not walk a batter...allowed his only run in the fifth inning on a Davis home run....then took the loss in the A's 6-4 loss on August 6, also in Oakland...struck out a career high six...the A's scored twice in the first, but he allowed solo home run to Blalock in the second and Young in the third to tie the game...also allowed a Young RBI single in the fifth and a Byrd sacrifice fly in the sixth and was charged with one of the Rangers two runs in the seventh

RHP Clayton Mortensen (1-2, 6.88 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth appearance and fourth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento September 4 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA in two starts since his return...picked up his first Major League win in his last start Friday in Minnesota, a 12-5 A's win (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb)...has never faced the Indians in his career...was acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals along with Brett Wallace and Shane Peterson in the Matt Holliday trade on July 24 and was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento...combined for a 9-8 record and a 4.39 ERA in 23 minor league starts with Memphis and Sacramento.
