#### A's vs. INDIANS

The A's lost two of three in Cleveland in July in the only meeting between the two clubs this year...this is Cleveland's first visit to Oakland since April 4-6 of last year...the A's lost the season series last year, 4-5...won two of three in Oakland but lost four of six in Cleveland...have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and four of the last five...are 21-28 against the Indians since 2004...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 238-212 against the Indians...that breaks down to 125-93 in Oakland and 113-119 in Cleveland...all-time, the A's are 873-1005 against the Indians.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Bailey recorded his 24<sup>th</sup> save of the season last Saturday, breaking Huston Street's Oakland rookie record of 23 set in 2005...has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities, which breaks the Oakland rookie record of 18 set by Street...leads Major League rookies and ranks ninth among all American League pitchers in saves.

**Rajai Davis** stole his 38<sup>th</sup> base of the season last night, which is fourth in the American League and the most by an Athletic not named Rickey Henderson since Jose Canseco had 40 steals in 1988...he is batting .347 (70 for 202) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best average in the AL.

Landon Powell has seven home runs and 29 RBI in the first 40 games of his career...the RBI are second most in Oakland history to start a career and the home runs are tied for fifth most.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

On September 17, 1972 Jim "Catfish" Hunter pitches a two hitter as the A's defeat Texas 4-1...it is Hunter's 20th victory, his second of four straight 20 win seasons with the A's...on September 17, 1973 Bill North sets a club record by drawing five walks in the A's 3-2, 13 inning win against California. #### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won three straight, five of the last six and eight of the last 10 games...the three-game winning streak equals the A's second longest of the season...the only time the A's won more than three in a row was from June 2-8 when they had a seven-game winning streak...the A's went 31-43 over the first 74 games this year but are 36-35 since then (June 29)...were officially eliminated from the playoffs Tuesday night in game 144 and were eliminated from the American League West Sunday in game 142...last year, the A's were officially eliminated from the playoffs in game 143...have spent each of the last 137 days (since May 3) and 143 days this year in sole possession of last place in the AL West...the only seasons in Oakland history in which the A's spent more days all alone in last are 1997 (153) and 1979 (147)...have finished the season last in the AL West six times in Oakland history (1977, 1979, 1993, 1995, 1997, 1998)...the A's are 24-38 (.387) against Western division teams and 43-40 (.518) against teams from the Central and East.

A SWEEPING SUCCESS: The A's swept the three-game series at Texas, their third series sweep of the season and their first since June 5-7 against Baltimore in Oakland...that snapped a streak of 27 consecutive series without a sweep, which equaled the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the A's first sweep of a series of three or more games on the road since June 13-15 of last year at San Francisco...allowed just one run in the three-game series against the Rangers, equaling the fewest in a three-game series in Oakland history...it was the fifth time and the first time since August 5-7, 1991 against Seattle...prior to this last series, the A's had never allowed fewer than nine runs in a three-game series alloper series alloper series at Rangers Ballpark...the pitching staff held Texas to a .125 (11 for 88) batting average and the 11 hits also equal the fewest allowed in a three-game series in Oakland history...it was the fifth time and the first time since June 27-29, 1994 against California...the one-hitter last night marked just the second time Texas has been held to one hit in Rangers Ballpark and the other time was also this year on June 28 against San Diego...it was just the fourth game of one hit or less by the Rangers or their opponents in Rangers Ballpark.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's went 6-2 on the eight-game road trip to Chicago (1-1), Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0), marking just their second winning road trip of more than one series this year...went 4-2 against Kansas City and Baltimore, August 7-12...are now 14-10 (.583) over the last 24 road games but are 33-42 (.440) for the season...will finish with a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season...begin an eight-game homestand tonight against Cleveland (four games) and Texas (four games)...went 4-3 on the last homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Seattle (2-2) and are 34-36 (.486) at home for the season...are one of four American League teams with a losing record at home.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 30-29 since the All-Star Break...are batting .278 (577 for 2073), which is third best in the American League...hit .246 before the break...have a Major League leading 68 stolen bases since the break, which are the most post-break steals by an A's team since 1992 (68)...the last time the A's had more steals after the break was 1991 (71)...lead the AL in doubles after the break (131), rank third in runs (305) and in extra base hits (192).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone five consecutive games without an error and have 85 errors for the season with 17 games remaining...have made fewer than 100 errors in each of the previous five seasons, which equals the longest such streak in Major League history (Philadelphia, 2001-05).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have 15 stolen bases in the last eight games and rank fourth in the American League and the majors with 122 steals for the season...over the last 16 years, the only time the A's have stolen more bases was in 1998 when they had 131...rank last in the AL in home runs (124) and slugging percentage (.394), second to last in extra base hits (412), are tied for the second fewest triples (15) and are fourth in lowest batting average (.259), lowest on-base percentage (.326) and fewest runs scored (666)...have 473 walks and are on pace for 528 walks for the season...the last time the A's walked fewer than 537 times in a non-strike season was 1985 when they had 508...are on pace to hit 139 home runs...over the last 20 years, the only A's team to hit fewer than 142 home runs is last years club, which finished with 125.

**THE THREE SPOT:** Ryan Sweeney went 12 for 27 (.444) in six starts in the three spot on the road trip but the A's number three hitters are hitting a combined .223 (128 for 575) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors...since 1974, the lowest batting average by a team's number three hitters is .217 by the 1976 Montreal Expos.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 6-1 with a 3.33 ERA (19 er in 51.1 ip) over the last nine games and are 45-56 with a 4.72 ERA for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched (811.0) in the American League, the fourth fewest wins and the fourth highest ERA...have two complete games, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and in Oakland history (also had two in 1997)...Brett Tomko and Edgar Gonzalez start the first two games of the Texas series to begin the week, marking just the seventh time this year and the first time since May 9-10 the A's had back-to-back games in which they did not start a rookie...have started a rookie pitcher 104 times this year, which is an on-going Oakland record...the previous mark was 93 set by the 1983 club...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to have more starts by rookie pitchers is the 1998 Florida Marlins (124)...have started a rookie pitcher in 78 of the last 98 games and have had at least four rookies in the rotation since Vin Mazzaro was recalled on June 2.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's are 9-5 in the month of September...have finished with a losing record in each of the first five months of the season, the first time they have done that since 1993...the only time in Oakland history the A's had a losing record in all six months was in 1979...have not had a winning record in a month since last June (16-10) and the eight consecutive months without a winning record equals the second longest streak in Oakland history...also had eight straight at .500 or less from August, 1978 to September, 1979...the longest streak is 10 in a row from August, 1996 to May, 1998.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and 63 times since the start of the 2007 season...the 16 players have combined to miss 869 games, an average of 54.3 games per stint...currently have six players on the DL and for the third consecutive season will have at least three players on the DL for the entire season...have not had fewer than three players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento September 4 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts

since his return...began the season with Triple-A Memphis before earning a promotion to St. Louis on June 29...pitched just once and was optioned back to Memphis on July 1 before being dealt to Oakland in the Matt Holliday trade July 24...was assigned to Sacramento and had no decisions and a 1.64 ERA in two starts before he was brought up to Oakland August 8...started and lost that day at Kansas City and was optioned back to Sacramento the next day.

**TRADE:** Was acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals in the Matt Holliday trade...was sent to Oakland along with Brett Wallace and Shane Peterson on July 24 and was assigned to Triple-A Sacramento...was originally selected by St. Louis as a supplemental pick following the first round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft (36<sup>th</sup> selection overall)...was rated as the Cardinals sixth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2008 season after being rated number seven after the 2007 season.

**WITH ST. LOUIS:** Began the season at Triple-A Memphis in the Cardinals organization, but was promoted to St. Louis on June 29...pitched the final three innings of St. Louis' 10-0 loss to San Francisco that day...allowed six runs, two earned, on five hits and a walk while striking out two, and was optioned back to Memphis on July 1 after appearing in just one game (6.00 ERA).

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-6 loss at Kansas City on August 8...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a DeJesus RBI double and a Butler sacrifice fly...then allowed four runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Jacobs, a solo home run by Olivo and a DeJesus sacrifice fly...put the first two runners on base in the fifth inning and was relieved by Edgar Gonzalez, who allowed both runs to score.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Seattle September 4 in Oakland...tossed seven innings and allowed four runs, all in the second inning...retired each of the first five batters he faced before the next six batters reached base on four hits and two walks...Wilson had a two-run single and Suzuki and Gutierrez followed with RBI singles...he then retired 16 of the final 20 batters that he faced.

**LAST START:** He earned his first Major League win in the A's 12-5 win at Minnesota last Friday...allowed a leadoff home run to Span in the bottom of the first but then shutout the Twins on four hits and two walks the rest of the way...tossed 6.0 innings and did not strike out a batter.

MORTENSEN vs. CLEVELAND: Is making his first career appearance and start.

IN THE MINORS: Was 7-6 with a 4.37 ERA in 17 starts with Memphis before he was dealt to the A's organization on July 24...had no decisions and a 1.64 ERA in two starts with Sacramento before his promotion to Oakland on August 8 and then went 2-2 with a 5.91 ERA in four starts following his option...was 2-2 with a 4.45 ERA in six starts overall with the River Cats and combined for a 9-8 mark and a 4.39 ERA in 23 minor league starts overall...his teams were 12-11 (.522) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 23 starts, including one nine-inning complete game on June 7 against New Orleans...allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 13 times.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .271 opponents batting average, which included a .273 (75 for 275) mark against right-handed hitters and .270 (68 for 252) against left-handers...held the opposition to a .221 (30 for 136) average with runners in scoring position, including .190 (11 for 58) with RISP and two outs...allowed just 13 home runs in 137.1 innings, an average of 0.85 per nine innings.

**2009 MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Allowed just one earned run in each of his first five starts at Memphis, going 2-1 with a 1.44 ERA then loct each of his port

a 1.44 ERA...then lost each of his next two starts, allowing six runs in 6.0 innings on May 10 at Iowa and 7 runs in 5.0 innings on May 15 against Las Vegas...followed that with a season best four-game winning streak from May 22-June 7...compiled a 2.39 ERA during the winning streak...capped the streak on June 7 against New Orleans when he tossed a complete game six-hitter in the Redbirds 12-1 win...did not walk a batter and struck out a season high eight...allowed a season high nine runs in 3.1 innings in a loss on June 18 at Iowa...was 7-4 with a 4.24 ERA in 14 starts when he was promoted to St. Louis on June 29...went 0-2 with a 4.95 ERA in three starts following his option on July 1 and before his trade to the A's organization...allowed just one run in each of his first two starts with the River Cats but had a no decision in each outing...allowed nine hits and walked seven in 11.0 innings...tossed 7.0 innings in two of his four outings following his option, picking up the win each of those games.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (9-10, 4.37 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 28<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his career...has won each of his two starts in September (3.75 ERA) for the fourth two-game winning streak of his career...has never won three in a row...is 6-3 with a 3.31 ERA, .232 opponents batting average and six home runs over his last 14 starts after going 3-7 with a 5.74 ERA, .304 opponents batting average and 13 home runs over his first 13 starts...picked up his team leading ninth win of the season in his last start, a 4-2 A's win at Minnesota last Saturday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 so)...is attempting to become the third pitcher in Oakland history under the age of 22 to win 10 games and the seventh rookie 10-game winner...leads Major League rookies with 129 strikeouts, which is the third best rookie total in Oakland history...has never faced Cleveland in his career.

 fewest home runs (39), ranks second in innings pitched (487.1), tied for second in fewest walks (173) and third in save percentage (73.9%)...also leads the AL in first batter strikeouts (96) and ranks tied for second in first batter grounded into double plays (7)...has issued the third fewest walks (25) against first batters in the AL...has a 2.88 ERA (75 er in 234.2 ip), 12 home runs allowed and 66 walks issued in Oakland compared to a 4.31 RA (121 er in 252.2 ip), 27 home runs allowed and 107 walks issued on the road.
